MEMORANDUM FOR MR. ROBERT C. McFARLANE THE WHITE HOUSE

Ambassador Motley met January 30 and over the weekend with nine players on the Central America legislation. They were Henry Kissinger, Lane Kirkland, Dante Fascell, Mac Mathias, Bob Strauss, Lloyd Bentsen, Bill Broomfield, Jack Kemp and Pete Domenici.

Ken Dam and/or Jim Michel will try to meet with Inouye, Barnes, Kirkpatrick, Wright, Murtha, Percy and Kasten to round off the first line.

Our overall impressions are as follows:

- 1. There seems to be a consensus to move the legislation expeditiously, but not, repeat not, at the expense of foregoing sufficient consultation with the key Congressional players before the President makes his public pronouncement.
- 2. All believe that in an election year this bill is going to be a difficult chore.
- 3. All agree that a single bill providing for comprehensive implementation of the main recommendations is a good idea, although authorization of appropriations beyond FY 1985 is doubtful.
- 4. As expected, there were some varying opinions as to the treatment of CADO and conditionality, but basically they all understood our rationale.
- 5. Many thought a small coalition of actively supportive Members of each the House and Senate side, is critical.

Our recommendations are as follows:

- l. A small <u>must</u> list of players should be invited to the White House some day prior to the public event for a consulting session. This should include at a minimum, Fascell, Wright, Broomfield, Kemp, Domenici, Howard Baker, Inouye, Percy. (Jim Baker has agreed to host this event on Wednesday, February 1 at 3:00 p.m.; it should be attended by, among others, Ken Dam.)
- 2. We should pursue with Fascell, Broomfield and Kemp the identification of a small working group for the House side. We should do the same on the Senate side with Howard Baker and Pete Domenici.

On a separate sheet attached you will find the individuial comments for the nine members.

Lane Kirkland

- -- Believes "some sort of kitty" should be established for CADO.
- -- Believes eventually that there will be certification, but understands our linkage of the conditionality issue to full money.
- -- Believes the election in El Salvador is key, and that if D'Aubuisson wins "the ballgame is over."
- -- Feels a sense of urgency to bring a bill down soon.
- -- Acknowledges will not work against military assistance (on principle) but will not work for it.
- -- Wants copy of the bill.
- 2. Dante Fascell (the fourth session I've had with him)
- -- Wants to work together, believes we should bring it down soon.
- -- Believes a strategy group must be put together in order to finesse the Trent Lotts as well as the Doc Longs.

(In my conversation with Dante it is obvious he sees our attaching importance to this Central American bill as mutually beneficial; he can wrap it into what he wants which is a global FY 1985 Foreign Assistance Authorization Bill. He sees where we can benefit from working together.)

3. Mac Mathias

-- Believes we should work with Byrd and Inouye; is disturbed that Byrd "boycotted" the Kissinger meeting with the Senate.

4. Bob Strauss

-- Very vocal about certification, obviously a political posture he feels he must take.

5. Lloyd Bentsen

-- Strong on conditionality; believes we should bring the bill down now, "let it cook" for a while, and then move to strike an accommodation.

6. Bill Broomfield

-- Believes strongly that Dante Fascell must be fully consulted before the bill is brought down.

7. Jack Kemp

- -- Believes on the Democratic side Jack Murtha is the key to not only getting Tip's acquiecense, but also in bringing Wright on board.
- -- Believes strongly a high level meeting with key Congressional players should be held before the President makes the announcement.

8. Pete Domenici

- -- Domenici is working throught Howard Baker and is suggesting a negotiating team. Domenici is giving Howard Baker his conditionality language.
- -- Wants a copy of the bill.
