Subject: Governor Reagan's meeting with Cardinal Cooke (No. 7)

1. I suggest that Governor Reagan, when meeting with Cardinal Cooke, after a general discussion and a review of domestic matters, introduce several international subjects.

2. They should be:

- A. Strengthen our representation to the Vatican. He will appoint a first class, strong, special envoy.
- B. Compassion in responding to sudden international disasters like earthquakes, hurricanes, tornadoes, etc. The United States, as a major power and in accordance with its Judeo-Christian heritage, will respond immediately and with generosity. In a Reagan administration more use will be made of relief groups like Catholic Relief Services.
- C. To find more effective ways to help Lebanon (Cardinal recently visited there).
