Dear Mr. President:

As President of France you obviously have the right to protect your billion dollars worth of trade with Colonel Quddafi's Libya. As an American citizen who had been planning a two-week trip with my family of five to France in late June, I have the right to react to your refusal to allow my Nation's planes to cross French airspace as part of our recent raid on terrorist Libya.

Your lack of cooperation in protecting the Western world from Quddafi's relentless slaughter of innocent Westerners is consistent with long standing French policy of acquiesence to international terrorism. Your latest actions, however, jeopardized the lives of American servicemen, and may have been responsible for the loss of an American FIII and two young American Air Force men. I find this totally unacceptable, and therefore have cancelled my plans to have my family holiday in your country. I would not be surprised if thousands of other Americans make similar changes in their schedules.

Lest you think this letter comes from a Republican Reagan supporter, I want you to be aware that I am a liberal Democrat, who serves on the governing body of my party, the Democratic National Committee.

The President's appropriate response to international terrorism enjoys broad, bipartisan support in my country. We would have hoped it would have enjoyed similar support from our allies in whose defense we have spent hundreds of thousands of young

American lives in this century. At some point I would hope that you would reevaluate your position on the matter or terrorism, and also on the mutual responsibilities of bilateral relations with the United States.



MEMORANDUM FOR AL KINGON

SUBJECT: French Political Situation

As you indicated in our conversation the other day, the upcoming (March 16) French elections pose an unprecedented challenge for the stability of the French political system.

- -- The Constitution of the Fifth French Republic (post-1958) formally confers quite limited powers in the hands of the President. However, DeGaulle still managed to project an image of a strong Head of State and his successors, including the current (Socialist) President, Francois Mitterrand, have comported themselves in a similar manner.
- -- If the polls are accurate, it is probable that the ruling Socialist Party will not only lose its parliamentary majority in the upcoming elections, but will suffer a major defeat. With Mitterrand continuing as President (his term does not expire until 1988), he would likely have to appoint a representative from the opposition (Conservative) parties as Prime Minister (Head of Government). This would usher in a period of "cohabitation."
- -- Should Mitterrand not be able to appoint a PM whose views are compatible with his own, the French will face a major governmental crisis. In this instance Mitterrand might choose to resign; more likely, however, he would "cohabitate" with a PM forced on him by the opposition, but threaten to call new elections -- which he can do at a time of his choosing after a year has passed.

It is by no means clear what the March 16 elections will herald. The Socialist Party (PS) has rallied recently and it now appears that they will garner about 30% of the vote. The combined Conservative opposition parties, the RPR/UDF (Rally for the Republic-Union for French Democracy) appear to have about 45%; the Communists just under 10%, the ultra-right National Front about 5%; and various other smaller parties account for the difference.

- -- Thus the PS now has renewed hope of retaining its position as France's largest single party and, more importantly, preventing the RPR/UDF from securing an absolute majority. However, with 45% of the vote, the RPR/UDF (Conservatives) could still win a parliamentary majority. Under this scenario, we would expect that a Conservative, perhaps Paris Mayor Chirac or former President Giscard, would accept the Prime Ministership.
- -- Even under this circumstance, it is by no means clear that Mitterrand and "his PM" could function smoothly together. Certainly the PM would demand a major policy role. Mitterrand has indicated that he envisages himself assuming the stewardship of defense/foreign policy issues, while the PM would concentrate on domestic and economic affairs. This arrangement would not excite either Chirac or Giscard, and Mitterrand has few trumps to play. He would not have the power to dissolve the government and appoint a new PM, and he would have to wait a year to call elections.

One thing is clear from all of this -- absolutely no one, here or in France, has any idea how the post-election arrangements will transpire. Stay tuned -- we will endeavor to keep you apprised of this quintessentially French experience. Vive la France!

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

Arms Control Briefing for Mitterrand

State has informed us that Joe Rodgers has come in with a recommendation that we provide President Mitterrand with a special briefing on arms control and Soviet-American issues during the July 4/Statue of Liberty Commemoration. Rodgers notes that such a briefing would be particularly useful given Mitterrand's trip to Moscow the following week.

Rodgers has recommended that the briefing be given by a senior administration official, such as you or Paul Nitze. Since you will be in New York, and recalling Mitterrand's special effort to seek you out following his meeting with the President in Tokyo, we recommend that you agree to provide this briefing for Mitterrand.

#### RECOMMENDATION

That you authorize us to inform State that you would be available to brief President Mitterrand in New York on arms control and Soviet-American issues. State (Ambassador Nitze/EUR) concur.


