

The French Embassy and State have asked that you meet, at least briefly, with Monsieur Fillon, Chairman of the French equivalent of the Armed Services Committee. Fillon is a senior member of the National Assembly and of the RPR Party. He reportedly is close to Party Chairman, Prime Minister Chirac.

Appointment Request: Monsieur Fillon

Fillon, who is coming in early July, will be accompanied by four to five other French deputies. Since one is a Communist and another is from the National Front Party, State does not think you should meet with the entire delegation.

We suggest that Bob Linhard and myself host the delegation in a White House Situation Room meeting and during the course of the round table discussion Ty would bring Fillon to your office for a 10 - 15 minute meeting.

Bob Linhard and Ty Cobb concur.
