



Dear Mr. President:

Under the National Emergencies Act, the November 14, 1979 declaration of national emergency with respect to Iran will terminate on November 14, 1986, unless, prior to that date, you publish in the Federal Register and transmit to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect. If the Iranian emergency were allowed to lapse, the present Iranian sanctions would also lapse, impairing our Government's ability to apply economic pressure on the Iranian government to continue to take actions pursuant to the Claims Settlement Agreement of January 19, 1981, and to take all other necessary actions leading to a return of normal relations.

For these reasons, I recommend that you sign, transmit to the Congress, and publish in the Federal Register the necessary notice of extension.

Dear Mr. President:

Under the National Emergencies Act, the November 14, 1979 declaration of national emergency with respect to Iran will terminate on November 14, 1986, unless, prior to that date, you publish in the Federal Register and transmit to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect. If the Iranian emergency were allowed to lapse, the present Iranian sanctions would also lapse, impairing our Government's ability to apply economic pressure on the Iranian government to continue to take actions pursuant to the Claims Settlement Agreement of January 19, 1981, and to take all other necessary actions leading to a return of normal relations.

For these reasons, I recommend that you sign, transmit to the Congress, and publish in the Federal Register the necessary notice of extension.

- A proposed letter transmitting the notice to the Congress.

TEXT OF A LETTER FROM THE
PRESIDENT TO THE SPEAKER OF THE

AND THE PRESIDENT OF THE SENATE

November 10, 1986

Dear Mr. Speaker: (Dear Mr. President:)

Section 202(d) of the National Emergencies Act (50 U.S.C. 1622(d)) provides for the automatic termination of a national emergency unless, prior to the anniversary date of its declaration, the President publishes in the Federal Register and transmits to the Congress a notice stating that the emergency is to continue in effect beyond the anniversary date. In accordance with this provision, I have sent the enclosed notice, stating that the Iran emergency is to continue in effect beyond November 14, 1986, to the Federal Register for publication. Similar notices were sent to the Congress and the Federal Register on November 12, 1980, November 12, 1981, November 8, 1982, November 4, 1983, November 7, 1984, and November 1, 1985.

The crisis between the United States and Iran that began in 1979 has not been fully resolved. Although the international tribunal established to adjudicate claims of U.S. nationals against Iran and of Iranian nationals against the United States continues to function, full normalization of commercial and diplomatic relations between the United States and Iran will require more time. In these circumstances, I have determined that it is necessary to maintain in force the broad authorities that may be needed in the process of implementing the January 1981 agreements with Iran and in the eventual normalization of relations with that country.
