Dear Hugh:

I read your note about Saad Jabr and appreciate your taking the time to act as a messenger. In all candor, I think it would be most unwise for anyone from the U.S. Government to see him. While it may be in his interest to undermine Saddam Hussein, we are not in the position of trying to undermine established governments, especially when those governments are on record as favoring an end to the war that we also want to see terminated. Moreover, recent events have made it even more imperative that we not in any way appear to be making concessions to an Iranian government that has yet to demonstrate its good faith in dealing with us. We won't rebuild our credibility in the area by acting in such a fashion. I am afraid that any meeting with Saad Jabr would send all the wrong signals and do far more harm than good.

In saying this, I don't mean to "shoot the messenger". But I do feel strongly about this, and I think it important that there be no misunderstandings.

Thanks for your good wishes and the best to you and your family in the new year.

*Dear Frank,*

I am writing to you about a visitor who came unexpectedly to see me this morning and is using me as an intermediary because of your known connection with Price & Pierce.

My visitor was Saad Jabr, son of a former Prime Minister of Iraq and the Leader of the Opposition Party to Saddam Hussein. I have known Saad for some years but not in a particularly intimate way. He is a man obviously of considerable resources and also of intelligence.

As you will see from the leaflet which I enclose, he is leading the 'New Nation' Party and publishing a newspaper which is, naturally, critical of the present Iraqi regime.

He has been invited by the President of Iran to go there next Sunday where he is spending a week discussing the opposition movement to Saddam Hussein.

In the second part of January 1987 he is coming to Washington, D.C. and has asked me to advise you that he would greatly welcome the opportunity of a discussion with the United States Authorities. He is a friend of General Scowcroft who has been advised of his forthcoming visit to the U.S.

In the course of a somewhat lengthy conversation this morning, it is clear that Saad feels that the time is opportune for Saddam Hussein and his group to be deposed and replaced by a new Government to be led by himself. He feels that a major pre-condition for the cessation of the war between his country and Iran is the removal of Saddam Hussein and such

a move could bring the war to an end. He considers that adequate international guarantees could be given to cover the eventuality of Iran taking advantage of such a change to intensify or renew their attack.

On the basis that "the enemy of my enemy is my friend" Saad finds himself in the unenviable position of having Syria, Libya and Iran as his friends but is most emphatic that he owes no allegiance to any of them nor, he tells me, does he receive any financial or other support, although it is freely available to him from these countries. His interest is in ending the repressive regime in Iraq and the war.

His information from within his country is that a majority of the population would support his aims and, in particular, would support the establishment of a democracy for the first time in Iraq's history. He realises that a democratic system of Government is alien to the Arab experience and can only cite the example of Iran, Israel and, more recently, The Sudan as working democracies.

Saad has a number of impressive connections with our Government here and clearly knows a number of members of your Government from the past. He feels that with the support of the United States and the United Kingdom the time is opportune to depose Saddam Hussein and end the war which is damaging not only to Iraq but also to Iran.

This is clearly a very sensitive matter and, as you will understand, I am only involved in sending this message to you by chance.

Saad has not yet decided where he will stay when in Washington as his personal security is, of necessity, very tight but has told me that he will advise me on his return from Teheran in a week's time so that I can convey this to you should you wish to have any conversation with him. He feels that his visit next week to Iran might throw up some matters which would be of interest to the United States Government should they wish to debrief him.

Again, let me wish you and your family a Merry Christmas and a successful New Year in your new position in the interests of all of us.

# ***The New Umma Party***

*(Iraq)*

The New Umma 'New Nation' Party was formed in London in 1982 by a group of leading Iraqi nationals who oppose the despotic rule of Saddam Hussein and his regime and whose aim is to bring about a freely elected democratic system of government.

The Party is an independent political movement embodying all the tenets of true democracy, particularly those based on human rights and freedom of the individual. It owes allegiance to the people of Iraq and respects the sovereign rights of neighbouring countries.

The New Umma Party is gaining the whole hearted support of the vast majority of the people of Iraq who are not only war weary but living in daily fear under the present vicious, dictatorial and cruel regime.

The New Umma Party undertakes to carry out the following programme:

- i) To bring to an end the Gulf War by helping to cause the removal of Saddam Hussein and his despotic rule, thus ending the carnage of both Iraqi and Iranian youth and the wastage of irreplaceable natural resources.
- ii) The introduction of Parliamentary Government and freely formed and elected political parties.
- iii) The drawing up of a constitution for submission to Parliament for approval. The constitution would be based on respect for human rights, freedom of the individual, freedom of speech, freedom to travel, freedom of religion and freedom of the press.
- iv) To promote and encourage free enterprise.
- v) To revive and restore Iraq's Islamic heritage with all its cultural and moral values.
- vi) To establish a Judiciary independent of Parliament and Government.
- vii) To formulate short and long term plans for the restoration and rebuilding of devastated areas and develop the industrial and agricultural infrastructure.
- viii) To reduce emphasis and expenditure on armaments, abolish the vast popular guard, and increase emphasis on education, training, science and technology.
- ix) To return to Iraq and resettlement of all refugees and deportees with full compensation.
- x) To conduct a plebiscite in Kurdistan to establish a consensus on Kurdish aspirations and achieve it, within the political framework of the Iraqi Republic.

After the removal of the present regime in Iraq, the New Umma Party envisages a one year transitional period. During this period it will cooperate with the other opposition groups to re-establish law and order, and prepare the nation for a democratically elected Government. The forming of new political parties is seen as a prerequisite to the holding of elections throughout the country.

In this respect the New Umma Party is confident that it will attract, within a short period, the open support of the majority of the people of Iraq.

'AT-Tayar al-jadeed' has distinguished itself as the main opposition newspaper, during the past three years. It will continue to be the Party's political voice.

Dear Dr. Zibari:

Thank you for your letter to the President of April 5, 1988, concerning Iraqi use of chemical weapons. Much as he would like to, the President cannot respond to every inquiry, and your letter has been referred to me for reply.

On March 23, 1988, when we were first able to confirm chemical weapons use at Halabja, the State Department spokesman issued a statement condemning Iraqi use of chemical weapons there as a particularly grave violation of the 1925 Geneva Protocol on chemical warfare. White House spokesman Fitzwater made a similar statement expressing our outrage.

It should be noted that we believe Iran, too, used chemical weapons at Halabja. We condemn chemical weapons use by both sides in the Iran-Iraq war. We believe the best hope of ending these and other atrocities is to end the war. Last July, with the U.S. in the lead, the UN Security Council unanimously adopted Resolution 598, which mandates, among other things, a ceasefire leading to a negotiated settlement of the war. We believe this Resolution should be implemented. Although Iraq has agreed to this, Iran has not, and we believe the Security Council should adopt further measures to enforce Resolution 598. We are working actively for this in the conviction that only a comprehensive and lasting peace can end the suffering on both sides of this senseless and costly war.

Regarding the position of the Kurds in Iraq, I am enclosing a copy of our Human Rights Country Practices report on Iraq for 1987, which details what we know about Iraqi policies towards Kurds. The Report is a public document presented to Congress every year.

As your constituent and as a member of the Kurdish Medical Association in the United States, the American Medical Association, a candidate to the American College of Surgeons, and a surgical resident at Louisiana State University Medical Center in Shreveport, Louisiana, I write to ask your help in calling to the attention of the civilized world the wanton destruction of 5,000 of my people in Iraq, by the government of that country, the Kurdish town of Halabja in the Northeast.

Another 10,000 people were wounded. The victims, 70% of whom were civilians, were bombarded with chemical weapons including mustard gas, nerve gas and cyanide.

Unlike the Kurdish community in the United States who enjoy the freedoms of this country which celebrates ethnic diversity, our families back home are in imminent danger of ethnic annihilation.

This latest atrocity committed by the government of Iraq against its own citizens is part of a chronic policy intended to destroy the Kurds as a people.

As our president, we Kurds depend on you to condemn these atrocities and to help to bring to an end the suffering of my people - an endangered people.


I've attached a New York Times story on the proposed sale of a USX plant in Texas to Iraq. I've also enclosed Congressional letters to Secretaries Carlucci and Verity on the subject.

You should know:

- Senator Bentsen has come out against the sale to Iraq and the loss of hundreds of jobs in Texas that would be created if a domestic company were allowed to purchase the plant from USX. Five or six potential domestic purchasers exist.
- Senator Metzenbaum tried to introduce an amendment to prevent this sale to Iraq just before Congress recessed. He'll probably be back again after the recess, because he sees this as a big plus in both his own race against Voinovich and in the Presidential race.
- Jack Fields is very much opposed to the sale. He is looking ahead to a possible Senate race in Texas.
- This plant is one of the most modern steel plants built in the United States in the last 20 years.

I think the consequences of this are large enough to warrant a careful review. Wearing my Berman, Bergner & Boyette hat, I'd like to call you about it.

# Iraq Trying to Buy an Idled Steel Works in Texas

WASHINGTON, Aug. 18 — The USX Corporation wants to sell its idled Texas steel works to Iraq, lock, stock and barrel, for more than \$100 million.

Under the proposed sale, Iraq would buy a plant that once employed 2,000 American steelworkers with a payroll of \$35 million. The plant was shut two years ago amid labor turmoil and slack demand.

But Texas lawmakers, led by Jack

Fields, a Republican whose Congressional district embraces the Houston Ship Channel, one of the country's largest petrochemical complexes, oppose the sale on the ground that both jobs and steelmaking capacity would be permanently lost and that steel plate consumers would have to pay higher prices. They are trying to get the Government to block the sale.

Representative Fields said at least two domestic companies were prepared to offer USX payment equal to or greater than that offered by Iraq. He said USX had refused to negotiate with them because it "doesn't want competition in the domestic steel industry."

A USX spokesman declined to com-

ment. The Texas works was producing up to 1.3 million tons a year of large-diameter pipe, used for oil and natural gas pipelines. Completed 20 years ago, the works includes electric furnaces for melting scrap, casters to shape molten steel into slabs, and a mill for making slabs into large diameter drilling pipe.

The plant is at Baytown, east of Houston. Under the deal, it would be dismantled and transported to Iraq as part of that country's efforts to expand

dil production following a cease-fire in its eight-year war with Iran. Iraq's oil reserves are the second largest in the Middle East after Saudi Arabia's.

Abdul-Rahman Jamil, press counselor at the Iraqi Embassy here, said he believed Iraq needed the pipe both to expand petroleum exploration and increase irrigation networks to improve food output.

The negotiations with USX began around the time of a visit here in May by Iraq's oil minister, Issam Abdul-Rahim al-Chalabi, who announced ambitious plans to raise his country's oil production and export capacity.

The lawmakers objecting to the deal say the plant should be reopened. Members of the Senate steel caucus said in a letter to Commerce Secretary C. William Verity Jr.:

"Clearly, a market exists in the United States which justifies reopening the Baytown works. We view such a sale as a serious threat to the long-term health of the American steel industry." The caucus includes Lloyd Bentsen of Texas, the Democratic Vice Presidential candidate,

"U.S. Steel is a metaphor for the country," said Howard M. Wachtel,

professor of international economics at American University. "That Texas plant represents just another dismantlement of the guts and fiber of the industrial economy."

The American steel industry is protected by four-year-old restraints that limit imports to around 20 percent of the domestic market. Under the program, waivers may be granted to import steel in short supply.

So far this year, Representative Fields said, short-supply waivers

have been given for 50,000 tons of steel plate and 800,000 tons of steel slab, showing, he added, that domestic demand was far greater than domestic production capacity.

### Blockage of Sale Sought

In letters not only to Mr. Verity but to President Reagan, Defense Secretary Frank C. Carlucci and Attorney General Edwin Meese 3d, groups of lawmakers are trying to get the Administration to block the sale.

They have argued that it could augment Iraq's military capabilities, and, as one communication from 10 lawmakers, including Senator Bentsen, put it Aug. 3: "Iraq is certainly not a friend of the United States."

The Government can bar strategic exports to Iraq, but as one Commerce Department official noted: "This is not viewed as something that would require an export license." However, he added that he was speaking in a personal capacity and that the department had the matter "under review."

William P. Ryder, a USX spokesman in Pittsburgh, said Iraq's Ministry of Industry initiated the negotiations and that both sides were hoping for an early completion of the sale.

Since the technology involved was 20 years old, he said, he saw no reason why its export should represent any

security problems for the United States.

One steel industry specialist, who asked not to be identified, said that if U.S. Steel was unable to turn a profit at Baytown, he doubted that any other domestic company would be very successful.

### Skeleton Crew Mans Facility

Although the plant had employed 2,000 in the 1970's, employment was down to 750 when it was shut in 1986 during a labor dispute in which the company maintained that workers were on strike and United Steelworkers Union leaders said the company had locked the workers out.

Since then, only a skeleton crew has manned the facility, which is on 4,000 acres on the edge of Baytown.

The sale of a steelmaking plant abroad is not unprecedented. Other plants have been shipped to China and the Philippines. USX's Fairless Rod Mill in Bucks County, Pa., was physically transported to China last year.

Hit by fierce import competition, chiefly from newly industrialized countries, USX and other steelmakers in recent years have sharply reduced domestic production capacity.

At the same time, many of the steelmakers, led by USX, which used to be the United States Steel Corporation, have diversified into financial services, energy and other activities.

As members of the Senate Steel Caucus, we were shocked to learn of USX Corporation's proposed sale of its Baytown, Texas steel facility to Iraq. We understand that Iraq intends to dismantle the plant and ship it overseas. We view such a sale as a serious threat to the long-term health of the American steel industry.

The Baytown plant should remain in the United States to meet our domestic steel needs. It is a modern facility which includes two electric furnaces, a continuous caster, and advanced computers and is capable of producing a million tons of semifinished steel annually. Before the USX work stoppage, Baytown manufactured pipe and tube products critical to the economy of oil patch states and supplied smaller mills with steel slabs. Since the Baytown plant closed its doors, those smaller mills have become dependent on foreign suppliers.


It is not in our national interest to ship the Baytown facility overseas. Semifinished steel slabs are desperately needed by domestic rolling mills unable to fill demand. Furthermore, steel market experts agree that demand for semifinished slab will increase for at least the next eight years. Clearly, a market exists in the United States which justifies reopening the Baytown works. If USX is hesitant to do so, surely a willing domestic buyer can be found. It is our understanding that numerous domestic companies and the plant's employees have approached USX about purchasing the plant. These overtures have been rebuffed.


Unless a domestic buyer is found, some of the most modern steelmaking equipment in the United States and over two thousand American jobs will be lost. Such a result -- facilitating the development of steelmaking capacity abroad at the cost of American jobs -- also undermines the aims of the Voluntary Restraint Agreement program.


We urge the Commerce Department to postpone granting an export license to ship the Baytown works' equipment to Iraq until the impact of such a move on the United States' steel industry can be fully evaluated. We look forward to hearing your views on this issue.


