SUMMIT PASS BRIEFING

In our conversation yesterday, we discussed the need to address the allocation of the 15 blue passes for the Summit pass system at Lancaster House. As you requested, I have some suggestions regarding allocation of certain passes for logistical support personnel. First, however, I would like to offer a few details regarding how that system works as I understand it to date, in order to better help you and others to assess our proposals.

First of all, based upon the requests from various units in the White House which were sent to us through Karen Groomes (NSC so-called Rentschler group, etc.) there seems to be a fundamental misunderstanding of the security set-up, no doubt based upon our Williamsburg set up. For example, there have been requests for "access pins or passes" for persons who will need to move about London, but not necessarily to Lancaster House itself. There is no need for any kind of access identification during the Summit meetings on June 8-9 unless a person is going inside Lancaster House or to one of the luncheon or dinner sites (the former of which are covered among the 15 blue passes, the latter of which virtually no one is allowed to do). This is not Williamsburg, which was a geographic area, the perimeter of which was secured and required an access pass to travel into or within; remember that most of the lodging at Williamsburg was within that secured perimeter. In London, passing from hotel to hotel, to the U.S. press filing center at the Churchill, or to anywhere else except Lancaster House, St. James's Palace, Buckingham Palace, or #10 Downing Street will not require security passes. As I said before, everyone can forget getting into those other places, including you and I.

Next, before describing the Summit pass system at Lancaster House, let me briefly decribe access to the other sites, and who will and will not be allowed within.

Kensington Palace Gardens Arrival Ceremon

Persons arriving prior to the President's arrival will have to submitted to the Summit Office by May 30, with a pass to be issued for each person. We at this end expect that to include persons such as our advance personnel, Embassy guests, etc. Unless you instruct otherwise, we do not anticipate your end being involved in developement of this list, as it seems to involve only people already in town.

Persons arriving in either the Presidential motorcade or the Official Party motorcade will not need special access identification. The fact that they arrive in a vehicle tagged for entrance will suffice. We anticipate that the composition of this group will be generated by the motorcade manifests.

Buckingham Palace

The only persons allowed within the palace are as follows:

Site advance person, on scene for arrival
Military Aide, arriving with President
Doctor, arriving with President
USSS Agent, on scene before arrival, replaced by SAIC upon arrival.
WHCA officer, on scene before arrival.

The site advance person, the WHCA officer, and the USSS agent will be in a holding room prior to arrival of the President. Once the President arrives, the USSS agent will have to leave and be replaced by Mr. DeProspero. The site advance and WHCA officer will have to hold in place in the holding room, which is outside the Royal Apartments.

Note: the issue of David Fischer has not yet been addressed, and was not addressed on the pre-advance; it is our assumption that, should Fischer want to go inside, he would have to replace the site advance person, and we are anticipating this move pending your instruction. (If this is the plan, we need to present this "switch" of staff persons to Buckingham).

#10 Downing Street

Only the following persons will be granted access to #10:

Site Advance: Only on June 5, not on June 7.
Military Aide
Doctor
WHCA officer.
USSS Agent (to be replaced by SAIC upon arrival).

Note: The issue of David Fischer's access was not addressed on the pre-advance. Once again, we need guidance; should we propose that the site person be replaced by David upon arrival.

St. James's Palace

The U.S. delegation is getting a total of 20 invitations to the St. James's reception: The President, the 2 Cabinet Ministers, the Personal Rep, and Ambassador Price, plus 15 of our choosing. Beyond that, only the Military Aide, Doctor, USSS agent and WHCA representative are being granted access. It appears at this time as though the agent will be allowed to remain inside, along with DeProspero.

Portrait Gallery

Access to the National Portrait Gallery may be a little more flexible than the other sites. This by no means indicates that we'll be able to bring lots of people, and in fact, the person we are working with at the Gallery may be out of touch with Summit leaders regarding liberal granting of access; this will be checked asap. However, based upon conversations yesterday with the building manager of the Gallery, we can do the following:

Have our site advance person on the scene.

Pre-position an official photographer.

Have the military aide, the doctor, and the USSS agent allowed in, but held (along with our site advance) in holding room inside the entrance.

There is some ambiguity about access for those arriving with the President. Again, the building manager has indicated that anyone arriving with the President gains entry; however, this is not likely to hold, once the Summit team addresses the issue. If it does hold, even those who arrive with the President will most likely have to hold in the holding room. This is not a large room, and accomodates the telephone, the military aide, the WHCA rep, and the doctor for each delegation, as agreed on the pre-advance. No food will be served to this room.

One possible avenue for Fischer to use for entrance is that nations are allowed a "whisperer," or interpreter, for each Head of Delegation, to be seated behind the Head at dinner. It is uncertain whether or not the U.S. will be allowed an interpreter, since the prevailing language is English. (We are unlikely to be able to argue that we want an interpreter that speaks 5 languages). However, should we be given an interpreter

seat at dinner, perhaps Fischer could sit in as the "whisperer." This would mean, however, that DCF would have to sit behind the President throughout dinner.

LANCASTER HOUSE

Rather than rehash entirely the Summit pass system for you, I will briefly describe what is pertinent to us, including what we are allowed for access; following that, a simple description of the passes needed by color for each type of access.

In simplest terms, we have 4 persons who are "givens," and who have complete access to all rooms within the building at all times:

The President
Secretary Shultz
Secretary Regan
Notetaker (Allen Wallis is expected)

We also have 15 members of our delegation who will be allowed to sit in the U.S. Delegation office. This office is in fact two flights of stairs up from the room where the Heads will meet on the first floor, even though the British refer to it as the 2nd floor. We will also be allowed 15 other persons to hold in an office in the stable yard, across the courtyard from the main building...more about them later.

Of the 15 people in the U.S. Delegation office, one of them will be designated as the "link" person, who is allowed to sit in a room on the same floor as the Heads are meeting, and to be on call should the President want him; or, to deliver messages to the President, or confer with him. This is intended to be a senior member of the delegation, but the French are using their military aide-de-camp, and David Fischer performed this role in Willamsburg.

In addition, 4 more people from our 15 can move from the U.S. Delegation Office to the Heads meeting room to confer with the President, make deliveries, pass notes, etc., although only 3 at any one time may go in.

This means that a total of 5 out of our 15 can go inside to see the President: the "link" person plus the 4 others.

Of these 15 people, we have to submit the names of 10 of them. While we do not have to submit the names of the other 5, since they are transferable--explained next--we still must decide among ourselves who those 5 are.

If we want the President's personal secretary, an NSC transcriber, or any other type of support personnel inside the building, we will have to include them among the 15, whether it be in the list of 10 we submit, or the 5 we don't have to submit. This would include a WHCA person in case the phones break down, a staff person who knows the building and the process, etc.

Next, we will discuss the 15 persons who can wait in the stable yard offices and transferability.

Above and beyond the 15 people in the U.S. Delegation office who are described herein, as mentioned earlier we also can get 15 people into the stable yard offices. While this would seem a great gain for staff types, we must keep in mind that any USSS agents, WHCA personnel, SY or Secretary Shultz support that we want on hand must be on this list, or will not be granted access to the grounds. Since we must submit the names of 10 of these 15 people, the only real value in this situation is that the other 5, who we don't have to name, can exchange places with the 5 people in the U.S. Delegation office who we also did not have to name. In other words, the reason we do not have to name 5 of the people to be in the U.S. Delegation Office upstairs in the Lancaster House itself, and the reason we don't have to name 5 of the 15 people to be in the stable office, is that these 10 people (5 in each office) are "transferable."

This means that some thought is going to have to go into which names $\underline{\text{must}}$ be in the U.S. Delegation Office at all times (10), and which can yield for someone else who might have to go in, and who is waiting in the stable office (5).

Before making some suggestions/options, here is briefly how the system just described works:

- 1. The 15 people in the U.S. Delegation Office get blue passes.
- 2. The "link" person and the other 4 who can visit the President, all of whom are among the 15 blue pass holders, would hand in their blue pass at the door to the Heads meeting room in favor of a Red pass to enter the room. They would surrender the Red pass upon departing the meeting room, and pick up their blue pass to get back to the Delegation Office.
- 3. Among the 15 blue pass holders, and most likely not among the "link" person and the other 4 described in #2 above, there should be 5 whose names are not submitted to HMG, and whose passes are transferable with 5 people in the stable yard office.

- 4. The 15 people in the stable yard hold Brown passes; the 5 of them who will switch with 5 of the blue pass holders will not submit their names to HMG, and will hold transferable passes. The other 10, in my opinion, are basically worthless in theory, because they do nothing but get a person out of the cold. However, see point #5:
- 5. We do not think that the limit of 5 on transferability is enforceable. Since passes will not have photos, there is no way to keep us from trading transferable passes. What this buys us, I'm not sure, but we should keep it in mind.
- 6. The Military Aide, Doctor, and 2 USSS officers will hold green passes, and are limited to the ground floor of Lancaster House only, which is one floor below where the Heads are meeting, and actually three flights of steps below the U.S. Delegation office.
 - 7. Note: Press passes are yellow.

SUGGESTIONS/OPTIONS REGARDING PASSES FOR LANCASTER HOUSE

1. As previously discussed, it is imperative for our site advance person to have access to the U.S. Delegation, for reasons stated. One possible option would be to have the USSS site advance agent and our site person hold mutually transferable passes (one a blue, the other a brown) which they could trade back and forth according to need. The USSS site person could move with the President into and out of the building for arrival/departure, and within the building between sessions. The staff site person would use to pass to serve the U.S. Delegation during sessions. This won't satisfy all needs, but if only one blue pass is available, this is an option. Keep in mind, however, that the USSS site agent would be the only agent moving with the President when he leaves the meeting room for the U.S. Delegation office, assuming we don't get more access for Mr. DeProspero and that he abides by the Summit team dictum that he remain downstairs. Therefore, another option might be prreferable:

We could give the USSS site agent a permanent blue pass, and have our site staffer trade a transferable pass back and forth with you, as needed. The staff site would be there for arrival, move the U.S. Delegation to their office, get them settled, accomodate their needs, answer their questions, etc. The USSS site agent would walk with the President to at least the First floor, then be able to "hang out" at the U.S. Delegation office

until it was time for the President to move again. In the meantime, you could call the staff site on the radio to come to the stable and trade access with you as needed.


- 2. We will suggest to the USSS Lead here that, if you grant the agents a blue pass of their own, that the site agent try to work out trading his blue pass with Bob DeProspero's green one when the President moves, meaning that DeProspero could move with the President while the site agent remains downstairs, then trade back. The drawback is that Mr. D does not know the building, and therefore would have difficulty leading. This, of course, would be their decision, if they get a pass.
- 3. Depending upon the need, which you may be able to judge better than me based upon your talks with Bill Martin and others, 3 or 4 of the substantive types from NSC and State could be among the 5 transferable passes, and trade them off and on depending upon the nature of the talks going on, the topic on the agenda, etc.
- 4. Depending upon clerical support needs, perhaps Kathy Osborne and an NSC clerical person could trade off and on, Kathy using the blue pass when the President is in the U.S. office between meetings, and the NSC person during meeting sessions.


How much secretarial support will be needed for the group in the Delegation office? Is Kathy going to be needed? Will there be a need for secretarial support for the substantive group? If so, he/she must have a blue pass from among the 15.

We could have secretarial support from NSC or WHS on stand-by in the stable office for calls from the Delegation office; however, keep in mind that the technical rule from the Summit is that only 5 passes can be traded between blue and brown.

5. The stable offices should include a WHCA person and some agents (at least 4 by Kevin's request) among the 10 permament, non-transferable brown passes. This gives them a "down room" in which to have response agents at the ready; otherwise, all agents who do not hold passes must leave, with the secure package cars, to the park nearby. This would leave only Mr. DeProspero, another agent holding a green pass, and the site agent (if he gets a blue pass) with the President. Also, SY certainly ought to be given the one brown transferable pass they have asked for, since their people will not even get into Lancaster House with Shultz at all.

Once more, I don't think that the stable yard offers anything to our substantive people, beyond the transferable 5. I would





think that if the NSC-State-WHS people don't get on the 15 blue or 5 brown-transferable access list, they ought to stay at the hotel.

Beyond this, Bill, I don't think there is much I can add. You, much better than me, can flesh out the lists of 15, and I don't think this is what you wanted me to do. I have suggested some among our group who ought to be considered, and tried to explain some of the problems. Please let us know your response in order to turn in the list Tuesday morning, our time.

LONDON ECONOMIC SUMMIT: SECURITY PASSES

A minor change has been made to the arrangements for Summit passes as set out in the information sheet which I left at your office on 7 May. It concerns the interchangeability of blue and brown passes. The new arrangement is as follows

> 5 of the 15 blue passes will not be named, but will be overstamped 'T' to indicate that they may be transferred. Transfers may be effected with holders of brown overprinted 'O' passes for which purpose the issue of the latter to each delegation will be increased to a maximum of

- The transfer of blue 'T' and brown 'O' passes may be carried out at the Reception Desk in Stable Yard House beside Lancaster House. It will be necessary for the holder of the blue transferable pass to go personally to this point where the Security Officer will transfer the blue pass to a brown 'O' pass holder (whose brown 'O' pass will be withdrawn until the blue pass is returned). The former blue pass holder will be issued a brown transferable pass in order to remain in the secure area.
- 3. You are therefore invited to nominate 10 named blue pass holders and 15 named brown '0' pass holders. I recognise that you may need to liaise with your London Embassy on this if some of the blue and brown pass holders are to be support staff, eg secretaries, from the Embassy.
