1. LOD - ENTIRE TEXT

- 2. SUMMARY: FRG FOREIGN MINISTRY AND ENVIRONMENT MINISTRY OFFICIALS REITERATE THEIR SUPPORT FOR A STRONG AND EFFECTIVE PROTOCOL TO LIMIT PRODUCTION OF OZONE DEPLETING SUBSTANCES. THE FRG EMPHATICALLY OPPOSES THE EC "SINGLE UNIT" APPROACH AND MISHES TO EITHT PRODUCTION OF CFCS AND OTHER SIMILAR PRODUCTS WHILE PROHIBITING THEIR REPLACEMENT BY IMPORTS. THE FRG WISHES TO SPECIFICALLY INCLUDE THE HALONS 1211 AND 1391 IN ARTISLE 2. THE FRG POSITION IS TO SHOOT FOR A 50 PERCENT REDUCTION IS MORE LIKELY TO BE ACCEPTABLE TO OTHER EC PLAYERS. END SUMMARY.
- 3. BACKGROUND: SCICOUNS MET WITH FOREIGN OFFICE DAS WIEGAND PADGER AND ENVIRONMENT MINISTRY DIRECTOR OF THE OFFICE FOR ATMOSPHERIC POLLUTION, DR. ALLAN KRAUS, TO DISCUSS THE FRG POSITION ON UPCOMING NEGOTIATIONS TO CONCLUDE A PROTOCOL ON LIMITING SUBSTANCES THAT DEPLETE ATMOSPHERIC OZONE. KRAUS, THE MAIN FRG REPRESENTATIVE TO ATTEND THE MONTREAL NEGOTIATION MEETINGS, ONLY RETURNED FROM AN EXTENDED VACATION TWO DAYS PRIOR TO OUR CALL ON HIM. HE HAD NOT YET DIGESTED THE DEPARTMENT'S POSITION PAPER (REF A) BUT FREELY SHARED HIS VIEWS ON THE MAJOR ISSUES HE PERCEIVED WILL BE RAISED IN MONTREAL.
- 4. EC AS "SINGLE UNIT:" PABSCH AND KRAUS SAID THAT THE PROFOSAL TO TREAT THE EC AS A SINGLE UNIT FOR PRODUCTION/CONSUMPTION PURPOSES WAS RAISED BY THE EC COMMISSION WITHOUT PRIOR CONSULTATION WITH MEMBER NATIONS. THEY STATED THE FRE WOULD OPPOSE ANY PROPOSAL THAT PERMITTED OTHER EC HATIONS TO RAISE THE PRODUCTION OF CONFROLLED CFCS TO TAKE ADVANTAGE OF NATIONS LIKE THE FRE THAT LOWER PRODUCTION BELOW PRESCRIBED LIMITS. AN AIDE TO PABSCH, HERE LEMP, ADDED THAT THE EC COMMISSION ALSO WANTED THE EC TO SIGN FOR THE TWELVE -- A PROPOSAL THAT PABSCH SAID THE FRE WOULD STRONGLY OPPOSE. PABSCH CONCLUDED THAT IT WAS IN NO WAY CERTAIN, HOWEVER, THAT THE FRE VOICE WOULD CARRY THE COMMITTE. WITH EMPHASIS,

PABSCH NOTED THAT THE EC MEMBERS STATES CAN NOT MEGOTIATE
INTRA-EC TRADE IN CFCS AND IN PRODUCTS CONTAINING CFCS.

KRAUS EMPHASIZED THAT THE SINGLE UNIT CONCEPT ORIGINATED FROM THE COMMISSION AND NOT THE EC COUNCIL. WHEN ASKED IF THE EC POSITION WAS NOW CONSOLIDATED AMOUNG OTHER EC STATES, KRAUS SAID HE DID NOT THINK SO. HE SAID THERE SHOULD BE SOME FLEXIBILITY ON THIS ISSUE AT MONTREAL.

- 5. PRODUCTION V. CONSUMPTION: KRAUS CITED THE MAXIM: WHAT IS NOT PRODUCED CANNOT BE EMITTED. THUS HIS FOCUS FOR EMISSION LIMITATION WAS ON PRODUCTION. HE ALSO STATED THE CONCERN THAT IMPORTS, PARTICULARLY FROM DEVELOPING NATIONS, OD HOT REPLACE SUBSTANCES WHOSE PRODUCTION HAVE BEEN REDUCED BY THE PROTOCOL. KRAUS AGREED THAT THE US AND THE FRG SEEM TO SEEK THE SAME ENDS BUT FROM DIFFERENT STARTING POINTS.
- 6. THE HALONS: KRAUS EXPRESSED THE VIEW OF FRG ENVIRONMENT HINISTER TOEPFER THAT THE HALONS 1211 AND 13Ø1 SHOULD BE INCLUDED BY NAME IN ARTICLE 2 OF THE PROTOCOL. HE FELT THAT THE DAMAGE DONE BY THESE TWO SUBSTANCES WAS SIGNIFICANT ENOUGH TO WARRANT SPECIFIC MENTION IN THE PROTOCOL
- 7. 50 PERCENT REDUCTION: ACCORDING TO KRAUS, THE PRIMARY GOAL OF THE PRCTOCOL SHOULD BE TO REDUCE CFC EMMISSIONS BY 50 PERCENT. IN KRAUS' OPINION, THIS IDEA HAS NOT BEEN ACCEPTED BY ALL PARTIES.
 THE FRG NATIONAL PROGRAM IS GEARED TO THIS ALREADY.
 FRANCE AND THE UK, HE STATED, ARE NOT FAR FROM ACCEPTING 40 PERCENT IN THE THIRD STAGE (FIRST STAGE: FREEZE; SECOND STAGE: 20 PERCENT).
- 8. COOPERATION WITH THE US DELEGATION AT MONTREAL: KRAUS EXPRESSED THE DESIRE TO DISCUSS ALL MATTERS

CONCERNING THE PROTOCOL WITH THE US DELEGATION AT THE NEGCTIATING SESSIONS. HE CONFIRMED THE FRG HOPE FOR A STRONG AND WIDELY ACCEPTED PROTOCOL.

- POST PROVIDED SANITIZED VERSION OF TEXT CONTAINED REFTEL TO DR. CHRISTOPH RENTSCH OF THE SWISS FEDERAL OFFICE OF ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION. ECON COUNSELOR ECON COUNSELOR AND ECONOMIC OFFICER SUBSEQUENTLY MET WITH RENTSCH AUGUST 25. RENTSCH AT THAT TIME HAD, UNFORTUNATELY, NOT YET HAD AN OPPORTUNITY TO STUDY US TEXT IN DETAIL.

- 1. SCIOFF PROVIDED LATEST US PROPOSALS CONCERNING NEGOTIATIONS FOR A PROTOCOL ON OZONE-DEPLETING CHEMICALS 25 AUGUST BOTH TO JØRGEN HARTNACK, MFA OFFICIAL RESPONSIBLE FOR INTERNATIONAL ENVIRONMENTAL AFFAIRS, AND TO HENRI HERON, ENVIRONMENTAL AGENCY TECHNICAL EXPERT INVOLVED IN THE OZONE LAYER NEGOTIATIONS. (WE HAD PREVIOUSLY PASSED HARTNACK COPY OF TALKING POINTS REF. B BUT INTERVENING HOLIDAY PERIOD HAD DELAYED HIS RESPONSE.)
- 2. AT MEETING ON 26 AUGUST, HARTNACK INFORMED US THAT HE WOULD BE THE CHAIRMAN OF THE EC DELEGATION DURING THE FIRST WEEK OF THE MONTREAL MEETING, WHILE HERON WOULD BE HEADING THE DANISH NATIONAL DELEGATTION. THE ENVIRONMENT MINISTER IS EXPECTED TO ATTEND THE SEPTEMBER 14-16 PLENIPOTENTIARIES CONFERENCE UNLESS 8 SEPTEMBER DANISH PARLIAMENTARY ELECTION RESULTS IN A CHANGE OF GOVERNMENT OR A CABINET SHUFFLE, IN WHICH CASE HARTNACK MIGHT CONTINUE AS DANISH GOVERNMENT REPRESENTATIVE.
- 3. HARTNACK, WHO HAD DISCUSSED REFTEL A WITH HERON. TOLD SCIOFF THAT DANISH VIEWS REMAIN SIMILAR TO THOSE OF THE UNITED STATES: THE DANES WOULD LIKE TO SEE THE STRICTEST PROTOCOL POSSIBLE IN TERMS OF TYPES OF CHEMICALS COVERED BY THE PROTOCOL, TIMEFRAME AGREED UPON FOR REDUCTION, COMPLIANCE, TRADE DISINCENTIVES, CONTROL PLACED ON CONSUMPTION INSTEAD OF PRODUCTION, ETC. DENMARK CONSIDERED IT ESSENTIAL, HOWEVER, THAT IN THE END A PROTOCOL BE REACHED WHICH COULD BE AGREED UPON BY AS MANY PARTIES AS POSSIBLE. NO ONE ISSUE SHOULD STAND IN THE WAY OF AN AGREEMENT. AS AN EXAMPLE, HARTNACK SAID THAT HE PERSONALLY WOULD NOT WANT THE EC COMMISSION'S REQUIREMENT THAT THE EC BE TREATED AS A SINGLE PRODUCING UNIT BE A STUMBLING BLOCK TO A FINAL HARTNACK EMPHASIZED THAT A PROTOCOL SIGNED BY ONLY A FEW COUNTRIES SUCH AS THE NORDICS, THE USA AND CANADA WOULD AMOUNT TO NO PROTOCOL AT ALL. DENMARK THEREFORE HOPED THAT ALL PARTICIPANTS WOULD REMAIN FLEXIBLE ON "NUMBERS AND ISSUES" IN FINALIZING THE PROTOCOL.

4. AS IN OUR PAST CONVERSATIONS (REF C AND D) HARTNACK REITERATED TO SCIOFF THAT DENMARK'S VIEWS WERE NOT NECESSARILY THOSE OF ALL THE EC-12 AND THAT THERE WOULD OF NECESSITY BE MUCH COORDINATION WITH EC MEMBER DELEGATIONS DURING THE CONFERENCE IN AN ATTEMPT TO ARRIVE AT AN AGREEMENT. WHILE THERE HAD BEEN CONSIDERABLE DISCUSSION AMONG THE 12, THERE REMAINED A LONG WAY TO GO BEFORE ARRIVING AT A COMMON POSITION FOR MONTREAL. TODMANN

THE MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS PRESENTS ITS COMPLIMENTS
TO THE EMEASSY OF THE FEDERAL REPUBLIC OF GERMANY, AND WITH REGARD
TO THE EMEASSY'S ROLE IN WELLINGTON IN FULFILLING, ON BEHALF OF
DEMMARK, THE FUNCTIONS OF THE PRESIDENT OF THE EC, HAS THE HONOUR
TO REFER TO THE UNITED NATIONS ENVIRONMENT PROGRAMME'S DECISION TO
CONVENE A DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE IN MONTREAL FROM 14 TO 16
SEPTEMBER 1987 TO ADOPT A PROTOCOL ON CHLORO-FLUOROCARBONS (CFC)
TO THE VIENNA CONVENTION FOR THE PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER.

NEW ZEALAND, RECOGNISING THE POTENTIAL DANGER TO MANKIND FROM THE CONTINUING DEPLETION OF THE OZONE LAYER BY CRC EMISSIONS, HAS TAKEN AN ACTIVE PART IN THE UNEP WORKING GROUP OF EXPERTS WHO HAVE BEEN NEGOTIATING THE CONDITIONS FOR THE CFC PROTCCOL. THE INMEDIACY AND SERICUSNESS OF THE CFC PROELEM HAS INCCURAGED NEW ZEALAND TO PROMOTE EMISSION CONTROLS THAT COULD BE INTRODUCED QUICKLY AND WHICH AIM TO BE EFFECTIVE, PRAGMATIC AND FAIR. NEW ZEALAND IS, HOWEVER, CONCERNED THAT THE CONTROL MEASURES PROPOSED BY THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY DO NOT APPEAR LIKELY TO PROVIDE THE DEGREE OF CONTROL NECESSARY TO GIVE ADEQUATE PROTECTION TO THE OZONE LAYER, AND THIS MAY PRECLUDE REACHING AN AGREEMENT ON A PROTCCOL THAT OFFERS THE INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY SOME PROSPECT OF AN EFFECTIVELY PROTECTED OZONE ENVIRONMENT.

IN THE HOPE THAT IT MAY HELP TO CONTRIBUTE TO THE EARLY CONCLUSION OF AN ACCEPTABLE AND EFFECTIVE PROTOCOL ON CHLORO-FLUOROCAREONS, NEW ZEALAND HAS APREPARED THE ATTACHED EACHGROUND PAPER SETTING OUT IN MORE TECHNICAL DETAIL THE NATURE OF NEW ZEALAND'S CONCERNS.

IT WOULD BE APPRECIATED IF A COPY OF THIS PAPER COULD BE PASSED TO THE APPROPRIATE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY AUTHORITIES.

PRCTOCOLS ON CHLOROFLUORCCARBONS:

NEW ZEALAND VIEWFOINT

INTERNATIONAL SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENTS ARE NOW CONFIDENT THAT DAMAGE TO THE CZCNE LAYER WILL INCREASE, IF EMISSIONS OF THE MAN-MADE CHEMICALS OF THE CHLOROFLUOROCARBON (CFC) FAMILY TO THE ATMOSPHERE ARE NOT SIGNIFICANTLY REDUCED. CONTINUING OZONE DEPLETION WILL MAVE SERIOUS CONSEQUENCES FOR HUMAN HEALTH, THE ECOLOGY OF THE BIOSPHERE AND FOR THE GLOBAL CLIMATE.

NEW ZEALAND SIGNED THE VIENNA CONVENTION ON THE PROTECTION OF THE CZONE LAYER IN 1986 AND THE GOVERNMENT RATIFIED THE CONVENTION IN JUNE 987. NEW ZEALAND HAS ACTIVELY PARTICIPATED IN THE INTERNATIONAL EFFORTS ORGANISED BY UNEP TO REACH AGREEMENT ON THE REDUCTION OF CFC CONSUMPTION.

THE NEW CHALAND GOVERNMENT HAS A POLICY TO PROTECT THE OZONE LAYER BY PARTICIPATING IN INTERNATIONALLY AGREED CONTROLS ON CONSUMPTION OF CFC'S. AS FART OF THIS POLICY NEW ZEALAND SEEKS AN EARLY PREEZE ON PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION LEVELS OF CFC'S AND THAT EQUITABLE NATIONAL LIMITS BE SET TO ESTABLISH FUTURE CONSUMPTION FINITS FOR INDIVIDUAL NATIONS. IT CONSIDERS ALL MAN-MADE OZONE MODIFYING SUBSTANCES SHOULD BE INCLUDED IN THE INTERNATIONAL PROTOCOL AS SCIENTIFIC EVIDENCE INDICATES AND THAT GLOBAL CONSUMPTION SHOULD BE PROGRESSIVELY REDUCED AT A PATE DETERMINED BY CONTINUING SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENTS OF THE EVIDENCE.

NÉW ZEALAND DELEGATIONS HAVE ADVANCED IDEAS CONSISTENT WITH THIS POLICY AT WORKING GROUP MEETINGS CONVENED BY UNEP AT VIENNA AND GENEVA EARLIER THIS YEAR AND AT A SMALL WORKING GROUP ARRANGED BY DR TCLBA OF UNEP AT EC HEADQUARTERS IN BRUSSELS IN JUNE 1987.

MOST OF THE PRINCIPLES NECESSARY FOR A CFC PROTOCOL NOW APPEAR TO DE INTERNATIONALLY AGREED, BUT NEVEWRTHELESS NEW ZEALAND IS PECOMING INCREASINGLY CONCERNED THAT AN EFFECTIVE AND WORKABLE PROTOCOL MAY NOT BE READY FOR SIGNING AT THE MONTREAL DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE. IT IS ENVISAGED THAT SUCH A SITUATION WOULD ARISE IF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY IS UNABLE TO SUPPORT SOME OF THE MORE EFFECTIVE CONTROLS WHICH ARE MORE WIDELY CONSIDERED TO BE NECESSARY FOR THE ADEQUATE PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER.

THE PRINCIPAL UNRESOLVED ISSUES WHICH CONCERN US, AND ON WHICH EC AGREEMENT HAS NOT BEEN POSSIBLE, RELATE TO ALL PARTS OF ARTICLE II OF THE 7TH REVISED DRAFT PROTCCOL.

(1) THE PROTOCOL SHOULD IN OUR VIEW INCLUDE HALONS 1211 AND 1301. ALTHOUGH THEIR USE IS RELATIVELY LOW THE OZONE DEPLETION POTENTIAL OF THESE COMPOUNDS IS HIGH. THERE IS SCIENTIFIC UNCERTAINTY ABOUT PRECISELY HOW GREAT THIS DEPLETION IS COMPARED WITH CTHER CFC'S. BUT IT IS CLEAR THAT ONE MEASURE OF HALON CAN CAUSE SEVERAL TIMES MORE OZONE DESTRUCTION THAN A SIMILAR MEASURE OF ANY OTHER CFC. BECAUSE OF FORESEEABLE DIFFICULTIES WITH ALTERNATIVES AND SUBSTITUTES A DELAY ON A FREEZE IS ACCEPTABLE. HOWEVER IT IS MOST IMPORTANT THAT A FREEZE ON HALONS IS SPECIFIED CLEARLY IN THE PROTOCOL, PREFERABLY WITH PROVISION FOR LATER REDUCTIONS IN USE. THE FREEZE ON HALONS COULD BE SPECIFIED AS COMING AFTER THE FIRST SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENT, WHICH WILL PROVIDE AL OFFORTUNITY FOR REFINEMENTS IN THE FREDZE OR REDUCTION SCHEDULE. IF A DEFINED FREEZE OR REDUCTION OF HALONS IS NOT MANTICHED IN THE PROTOCOL. THERE IS NO SIGNAL TO INDUSTRY FOR THE MEED FOR URGENT RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT OF ALTERNATIVES.

LUROPEAN COMMUNITY IS IN NEW TEALAND'S VIEW AN INSUFFICIENT REDUCTION FOR THE ADEQUATE PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER. THE 59% NEW MENTIONED IN THE DRAFT PROTOCOL IS PROEABLY STILL NOT ENOUGH BUT MAY BE SUFFICIENT TO ENCCURAGE URGENT DEVELOPMENT OF SUBSTITUTES AND IT SEEMS LIKELY THAT BY THE END OF A DECADE THERE WOULD BE LITTLE INDUSTRIAL INTEREST IN CONTINUING CFC PRODUCTION FURTHER INTO THE FUTURE. THE NEW ZEALAND PROPOSAL PUT FORWARD AT GENEVA IN APRIL 1987 ADVOCATED A 50% REDUCTION OF CFC'S OVER TEN YEARS. WE NOTE THAT THOSE COUNTRIES THAT HAVE ALREADY MADE CONSIDERABLE REDUCTIONS IN THE USE OF CFC'S FOR AEROSOL SPRAYS (EGUSA, NZ) STILL SATISFY CONSUMER DEMAND WITH SUBSTITUTES. AN EQUIVALENT REDUCTION IN USE OF CFC-CONTAINING SPRAY CANS IN THE ECCULD VIRTUALLY SATISFY THE NEED TO REDUCE CONSUMPTION BY 50%.



A FIFTY PERCENT PROTOCOL WOULD GIVE MEANINGFUL PROTECTION TO THE OWNER AND WOULD IN OUR VIEW APPEAR TO CONSTITUTE A REASONABLE COMPROMISE BETWEEN THOSE WHO HAVE ADVOCATED MUCH SMALLER REDUCTIONS AND THOSE WHO ARE SEEKING THE CPTIMUM IN WISHING TO PROVIDE FOR THE ELIMINATION OF CFC USE WITHIN ONE OR TWO DECADES.

- (3) IT IS NEW ZEALAND'S VIEW THAT THE EC'S PROFOSAL FOR BASING CONTROLS ON PRODUCTION RATHER THAN CONSUMPTIN OF CFC'S IS AN UNSUITABLE WAY TO PROCEED. NEW ZEALAND NOTED THAT AT GENEVA IN APRIL THE EC WAS PREPARED TO ACKNOWLEDGE THE CONCEPT OF CONSUMPTION-BASED CONTROLS COMING IN AFTER SEVERAL YEARS.

 MLVERTHELESS, AS A SMALL CFC-IMPORTING NATION, NEW ZEALAND BELIEVES CONTROL OF PRODUCTION WOULD HAVE THE FOLLOWING UNDESTRABLE EFFECTS.
- (A) THE CONTROL OF PRODUCTION BY REGULATION IN PRODUCING COUNTRIES WOULD (BECAUSE OF DOMESTIC DEMAND FOR THE SCARCE RESOURCE) RESTRICT AVAILABILITY TO IMPORTING COUNTRIES. THE LEGULATED SITUATION IS NOT A FREE MARKET AND MARKET FORCES CANNOT BE EXPECTED TO PRODUCE AN EQUITABLE INTERNATIONAL DISTRIBUTION OVER THE FIRST FEW YEARS, WHICH WOULD BE CRITICAL TO INDUSTRIES IN A SMALL ECONOMY.

CONSUMPTION BY IMPORTING COUNTRIES, WHICH MIGHT BE MADE AS A GESTURE TOWARDS THE PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER, WOULD HAVE LITTLE EFFECT AS THE OFFENDING CFC'S ARE LIKELY TO STILL BE FRODUCEL, FOR USE ELSEWHERE. THE SMALL AND LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES WOULD LOSE WHAT INFLUENCE THEY MIGHT OTHERWISE HAVE IN FROTECTING THE OZONE LAYER.

(C) THE SPECIAL PROVISIONS FOR LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES (LCC'S) RUN INTO ANOMALIES WITHIN A PRODUCTION CONTROL REGIME.

NEW ZEALAND CONSIDERS THAT THE USE OF CONSUMPTION-EASED CONTROLS SHOULD REMOVE THE FIRST TWO DIFFICULTIES MENTIONED ABOVE, WITHOUT ADVERSELY AFFECTING THE MAJOR PRODUCERS. THE RESOLUTION OF CONCESSIONS FOR THE LCC'S IS SIMPLIFIED IF CONSUMPTION-BASED CONTROLS ARE TO BE IN FORCE.

(4) AT ERUSSELS IN JUNE, THE LARGER PRODUCING COUNTRIES MADE A CASL FOR GREATER INFLUENCE IN THE COURSE OF THE PROTOCOL ON THE GROWNDS OF A GREATER ''STAKE'' IN ITS EFFECTS.

IT IS RECOGNISED THAT THE U.S. AND EC CERTAINLY HAVE A LARGE ECONOMIC STAKE IN THIS PROTOCOL, AND NEW ZEALAND ACCEPTS THAT THERE WILL BE NO EFFECTIVE PROTOCOL WITHOUT THE U.S. AND EC BEING FULLY INVOLVED. NEVERTHELESS, AS WELL AS THE FINANCIAL OR ECONOMIC STAKE IN THE SHORT TERM, THERE IS A SIGNIFICANT ENVIRONMENTAL ISSUE OF PARTICULAR CONCERN TO NEW ZEALAND AND OTHERS. IN TE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE, FOR EXAMPLE, RELATIVELY FEW CTC'S ARE CONSUMED, BUT MORE THAN HALF THE OZONE DEPLETION SO FAR IS IN THE SOUTHERN HEMISPHERE. IT IS ALSO NOTED THAT THE ECANDANAVIAN COUNTRIES, LOCATED AT HIGH LATITUDES, WHERE OZONE DEPLETION WILL BE GREATEST, HAVE EXPRESSED SIMILAR CONCERNS.

THE PROPORTION OF THE NEW ZEALAND ECONOMY THAT IS DEPENDENT ON THE CONTINUING USE OF CFC'S IS MUCH THE SAME AS THAT FOR THE COUNTRIES OF THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY.

NEW ZIALAND ALSO RECOGNISES THAT THERE ARE OTHER UNRESOLVED CFC ISSUES, SUCH AS THE TIMING OF REDUCTIONS, TRADE PROVISIONS, LCC PROVISIONS, WHICH NEW ZEALAND CONSIDERS IMPORTANT. HOWEVER, NEW ZEALAND HAS SOME CONFIDENCE THAT THESE LESS SUBSTANTIVE ISSUES CAN LE SATISFACTORILY RESOLVED DURING THE PREPARATORY SESSION CF THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE.

1. CONFIDENTIAL - ENTIRE TEXT.

2. SUMMARY AND INTRODUCTION

IN A RECENT CONFERENCE WITH THE GON REPRESENTATIVE TO THE OZONE NEGOTIATIONS, ECONOFF GOT A READOUT ON THE NORWEGIAN REACTION TO THE US VIEWS CONTAINED IN REFTEL. THE MINISTRY OFFICIAL EMPHASIZED NORWAY'S DESIRE TO CONCLUDE THE NEGOTIATIONS SUCCESSFULLY, BUT EXPRESSED RESERVATIONS ABOUT OUR POSITION ON HALONS, FUTURE DECISIONMAKING AND ENTRY-INTO-FORCE. OVERALL, HOWEVER, THE NORWEGIAN REPRESENTATIVE WAS ENCOURAGED BY THE USG VIEWS AND HOPED TO WORK OUT THE REMAINING DIFFERENCES IN FURTHER CONSULTATIONS. THE HINISTRY'S SECRETARY GENERAL, DR. OLAV SAETERSDAL MAY WISH TO DISCUSS NORWAY'S COMMENTS IN HIS SEPTEMBER 4 MEETING WITH DAS BENEDICK.

3. GON EAGER FOR AN AGREEMENT

AS REQUESTED, POST TRANSMITTED COPY OF US VIEWS ON THE DRAFT OZONE DEPLETION PROTOCOL TO GON MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT OFFICIALS. AFTER THE MINISTRY WAS ABLE TO REVIEW THE DOCUMENT, ECONOFF MET WITH PER BAKKEN, NORWAY'S REPRESENTATIVE AT THE NEGOTIATIONS. BAKKEN STRESSED THAT, ABOVE ALL, HIS GOVERNMENT WANTED THE UPCOMING CONFERENCE TO RESULT IN AN AGREEMENT, AND WOULD TAKE WHATEVER STEPS NECESSARY TO BRING ABOUT AN ACCORD. NORWAY, HE OBSERVED, FELT THAT ARTICLE 2 WAS THE HEART OF THE DRAFT PROTOCOL, AND BELIEVED THAT THE NEGOTIATING PARTIES SHOULD CONCENTRATE THEIR EFFORTS IN THAT AREA.

4. THE PROBLEM WITH HALONS

TURNING TO SPECIFICS, BAKKEN BEGAN TO ANALYZE THE POINTS RAISED BY THE US IN REFTEL. INTERPRETING OUR POSITION ON HALONS AS ONLY EMBRACING THE PRODUCTION LIMITATION APPROACH, HE CRITICIZED THE USG VIEW, ARGUING THAT NORWAY OPPOSED ANY ATTEMPT TO FREEZE THE PRODUCTION, BUT NOT THE CONSUMPTION. OF HALONS. A FREEZE MERELY

ON PRODUCTION AND IMPORT LEVELS, HE MAINTAINED, UNFAIRLY BURDENED THOSE COUNTRIES WHICH DO NOT MANUFACTURE THE SUBSTANCE, SINCE THEY DEPENDED UPON THE OPEN MARKET FOR THEIR SUPPLY. AND WHILE IN THE LONG RUN NORWAY MIGHT FIND ACCEPTABLE SUBSTITUTES FOR THESE CHEMICALS, IN THE SHORT-TERM INDIVIDUAL FIRMS MIGHT SUFFER. BAKKEN NOTED THAT ONE OF NORWAY'S MAJOR SHIPPING CLASSIFICATION FIRMS -- VERITAS-- REQUIRED THE USE OF HALONS IN VESSEL PREP.

- 5. BAKKEN COMMENTED THAT NORWAY WOULD PREFER THAT THE PARTIES ADOPT A PRODUCTION/CONSUMPTION FREEZE -- AS SUGGESTED FOR THE CFCS -- WITH RESPECT TO HALONS. THIS APPROACH, HE STATED, WOULD COMPEL THE PRODUCING NATIONS TO ACCEPT THEIR SHARE OF THE BURDEN. AN ALTERNATIVE, HE SAID, WOULD BE TO DEAL WITH HALONS IN A RESOLUTION OUTSIDE THE PROTOCOL. IN ANY EVENT, HE LABELLED THE USG VIEW ON HALONS AS IT NOW STANDS A "PROBLEM."
- 6. FINALLY, BAKKEN STATED THAT IN ADDITION TO HALONS 1211 AND 1301, THE NORWEGIANS WORRIED ABOUT HALON 2402 -- A SUBSTANCE NOT COVERED BY THE PROTOCOL BUT ONE WITH A HIGH OZONE-DEPLETING POTENTIAL. HE ADMITTED, HOWEVER, THAT IT MIGHT BE BETTER TO REGULATE HALON 2402 AND OTHER HIGH-DEPLETING VARIANTS IN A SEPARATE RESOLUTION.
- 7. WHO MAKES THE DECISIONS

THE NORWEGIANS ALSO VOICED OBJECTIONS TO THE USG VIEW ON FUTURE DECISIONMAKING AND ENTRY INTO FORCE, COMPLAINING SPECIFICALLY ABOUT THE WEIGHTED VOTE APPROACH. THIS PROCEDURE, BAKKEN ARGUED, WOULD DIMINISH THE INFLUENCE OF THE SMALL-ENVIRONMENTALLY CONSCIOUS NATIONS (E.G., NORWAY) IN FAVOR OF THE LARGE-PRODUCING COUNTRIES (E.G., THE US AND THE EC). IN PARTICULAR, THE 60 PERCENT THRESHOLD ON THE ENTRY-INTO-FORCE QUESTION WOULD GIVE THE EC EFFECTIVE CONTROL OVER THE ADOPTION OF THE ENTIRE PROTOCOL, HE STATED. FURTHER, BAKKEN CONTINUED, ALTHOUGH ON OCCASION IT HAS STRAYED FROM THE PRINCIPLE IN THE PAST, NORWAY SUPPORTS THE BASIC U.N. PHILOSOPHY OF QUE COUNTRY, ONE VOTE. AGAIN, HE TERMED THIS ISSUE A PROBLEM FOR HIS SIDE.

8. TACTICAL SUGGESTIONS

WHILE THE GON SUPPORTED THE THRUST OF OUR VIEWS ON TRADE-IN-FORCE AND COMPLIANCE, BAKKEN SUGGESTED THAT IT MIGHT BE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE TO INTRODUCE NEW OR DETAILED PROVISIONS AT THIS LATE STAGE IN THE NEGOTIATIONS. THE DISCUSSION OF THESE PROVISIONS MIGHT MONOPOLIZE THE DEBATE, TAKING MUCH-NEEDED TIME WHICH COULD BE DEVOTED TO CRITICAL ARTICLE 2 TOPICS, HE THOUGHT. BAKKEN NOTED THAT THE US MIGHT WANT TO CONSIDER AMENDING ITS VIEW ON TRADE IN PRODUCTS TO COVER ONLY THE RELATIVELY SIMPLE QUESTION OF BULK CHEMICALS, WITH A STATEMENT OF INTENT FOR AID, TRADE, CREDIT AND NON-PARTIES. SIMILARLY, WITH REGARD TO THE PRODUCTION VS. CONSUMPTION FREEZE ISSUE, HE ARGUED THAT IT MIGHT PROVE WISE NOT TO BEGIN THE SESSION DISCUSSING THIS POINT IN ORDER TO PREVENT THE NEGOTIATIONS FROM STALLING AT THE OUTSET.

9. MINOR DIFFERENCES

(A) THE NORWEGIANS SUGGEST DELETING THE PHRASE "EXCEPT

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FOR USES FOR WHICH NO SUBSTITUTES ARE COMMERCIALLY

AVAILABLE" FROM ARTICLE 2, PARA 5 (ADDITIONAL REDUCTION

STEPS), EXPLAINING THAT THIS WORDING IS REDUNDANT

SINCE IN THE LONG RUN SUBSTITUTES CAN BE FOUND FOR ALL

OZONE-DEPLETING SUBSTANCES.

(B) THEY LABEL ARTICLE 3 (CALCULATION OF CONTROL LEVELS) A MINOR ISSUE, BUT RAISE NO OBJECTION TO IT.

(C) BAKKEN COMMENTED THAT THE NEGOTIATORS MAY WISH TO FIND A BETTER WORD THAN "GRACE PERIOD" IN ARTICLE 5 TO DESCRIBE THE TIME DURING WHICH THE LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES CAN INCREASE CONSUMPTION.

10. THE SECRETARY GENERAL'S VISIT

DR. OLAV SAETERSDAL, SECRETARY GENERAL OF THE GON MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT, WILL LIKELY WISH TO DISCUSS THE NORWEGIANS' REACTION TO THE US POSITION IN HIS SEPTEMBER 4 MEETING WITH DAS BENEDICK. SAETERSDAL MAY RAISE SOME OF THE POINTS OUTLINED ABOVE DURING THE DISCUSSION. STUART

- 1. SUMMARY: THE GHANAIAN "EXPERT" IN THESE NEGOTIATIONS WILL BE IN MONTREAL FOR THE FINAL SESSION BUT WAS UNSURE IF (WITHOUT OUR HELP) THE GOG WILL BE ABLE TO SEND SOMEONE TO SIGN THE PROTOCOL. WHILE CLAIMING MAJOR DIFFERENCES ALREADY HAVE BEEN IRONED OUT HE FORCEFULLY DEFENDED SPECIAL TREATMENT FOR THE DEVELOPING (LOWWCONSUMING) COUNTRIES, ESPECIALLY ON INCREASED SCOPE FOR CONSUMPTION. THE EXPERT WAFFLED ON WHETHER THE EC SHOULD BE TREATED AS A UNIT, BUT AVERRED THE RATIFICATION TRIGGER POINT OF 60 PERCENT OF PRODUCTION IS HIGH ENOUGH TO ENDUCE EC ADHERENCE. END SUMMARY.
- 2. ECON/COMM OFF MET AUG. 26 WITH SETH OSAFO, SECRETARY TO THE ENVIRONMENTAL PROTECTION COUNCIL (EPC), WHO HAS SERVED ON UNEP'S GROUP OF EXPERTS DURING THESE NEGOTIATIONS AND (WITH UNDP HELP, I.E., FUNDING) EXPECTS TO PARTICIPATE IN THE SEPT. 8-11 FINAL NEGOTIATIONS. HE HOPES THE GOG WILL SEND SOMEONE TO "THE SIGNING" (I.E., THE CONFERENCE OF PLENIPOTENTIARIES), AND HAS PROPOSED SUCH TO THE MINISTRY OF LOCAL GOVERNMENT AND SOCIAL WELFARE. HOWEVER, DUE TO THE "LATENESS OF EVENTS" AND THE GOG'S TIGHT BUDGET OSAFO WAS NOT SANGUINE ABOUT ITS ABILITY TO DO SO. HE ASKED ECON/COMM OFF WHETHER. THE USG COULD PROVIDE FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE; THE LATTER EXPRESSED EXTREME DOUBT THAT ANY HELP COULD BE GIVEN.
- 3. ECON/COMM OFF GAVE THE EPC OFFICIAL A COPY OF THE U.S. VIEWS SET FORTH IN REFTEL. (NOTE: THROUGH THE ENSUING EXCHANGE THE LATTER LARGELY USED THE TERM "DEVELOPING COUNTRIES" OR "LCD'S" IN PREFERENCE TO LOW-CONSUMING COUNTRIES (LCC'S).
- 4. OSAFO BEGAN BY ASSERTING THAT "THE REAL DIFFERENCES HAVE BEEN IRONED OUT." HE NOTED THAT THE UNEP EXECUTIVE CHAIRMAN HAD HELD A MEETING OF THE "CORE GROUP" (IN WHICH OSAFO HIMSELF PARTICIPATED "FOR THE LDC'S") TO IRON OUT THE CONTROVERSIAL PARTS. THERE WAS DISAGREEMENT, FOR EXAMPLE, ON CERTAIN PROVISIONS RELATING TO DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. E.G., AID PACKAGES TO THEM. IT WAS ARGUED THAT IF AN AID PACKAGE CONTAINED CHLOROFLUOROCARBONS (CFC'S) AND THE RECEIVING PARTY WAS NOT A SIGNATORY TO THE PROTOCOL, THE PACKAGE SHOULD NOT BE SENT. HOWEVER, DEVELOPING COUNTRIES ARGUED AGAINST SUCH RESTRICTIONS, AND THE MATTER HAS BEEN REVIEWED "MUCH

- S. IN APPARENT CONTRADICTION TO HIS INITIAL ASSERTION, OSAFO THEN WENT ON TO NOTE THE CONTINUED CONTROVERSY CENTERING ON CONTROL MEASURES AND THE FORMULA FOR CALCULATION. ONE PROBLEM IS DETERMINING CONSUMPTION PATTERNS. HE TERMED "INADEQUATE" DATA ON HOW MUCH IS BEING USED IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. THUS THE BASE YEAR (1986) FIGURES FOR CONSUMPTION --WHICH ARE TO FORM THE FUTURE CEILING -- BEING SET ARE ARBITRARY ONES. SINCE NO ONE CAN BE VERY SURE ABOUT THE FIGURES, THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES HAVE THE RIGHT TO REJECT THEM. BOTH SIDES HAVE TO AGREE ON A CERTAIN LEVEL.
- 6. THE GHANAIAN OFFICIAL AGREED THE MOST LOGICAL SOLUTION IS THE UNEP COMPROMISE (PARA 6, REFTEL) THAT BOTH PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION BE CONTROLLED. HE POOH-POOHED CONCERN (PARA 7) THAT EXISTING PRODUCTION IN DEVELOPED COUNTRIES WOULD BE REPLACED BY EXPANDED CAPACITY IN DEVELOPING ONES. OSAFO NOTED THAT THE U.S. AND EC PRODUCE 80-90 PERCENT OF CPC'S, AND THERE ARE PROVISIONS AGAINST TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER. DESPITE CONCERN THAT SOUTH KOREA (NOT TAKING PART IN THE NEGOTIATIONS) WILL DEVELOP THE TECHNOLOGY, HE DIDN'T SEE HOW IT OR ANY OTHER COUNTRY COULD DO IT. THE IMPORTANT THING, SAID OSAFO, IS TO ENSURE FULL ENFORCEMENT.
- 7. THE OFFICIAL CONCURRED (PARA 8) THAT THE EC WANTS TO KEEP CONTROL OF WHAT IS A "VERY LUCRATIVE AREA, " AND DOESN'T WANT ANY RESTRICTIONS. WHILE THE EC MEMBERS DON'T ALWAYS AGREE AMONG THEMSELVES ON ALL THESE ISSUES, THEY HAVE BEEN NEGOTIATING AS A UNIT AND "THINK THEY STAND ALONE." HE COULD ONLY HOPE THAT THE PROBLEM CAN BE IRONED OUT.
- 8. THE GHANAIAN EXPERT SAID SINCE HE IS A LAWYER, NOT A SCIENTIST, HE DOESN'T KNOW MUCH ABOUT THE HALONS ISSUE (PARAS 9-10). IN ADDITION, THE UNEP EXPERTS HAVEN'T TALKED MUCH ABOUT IT. HE OPINED THAT THE QUANTITIES INVOLVED ARE NOT NEARLY AS GREAT AS THOSE FOR THE CFC'S. HE BELIEVES THE CONCEPT THAT NON-PARTIES TO THE PROTOCOL NOT BE EXEMPTED (PARA 17) HAS BEEN ACCEPTED.
- 9. IN RESPONSE TO PARA 20'S CONCERN ABOUT LCC PRODUCERS, OSAFO STATED CATEGORICALLY "NONE OF THE LCC'S ARE PRODUCING; ALL ARE CONSUMERS." THE GRACE PERIOD IS NEEDED "TO ENSURE THAT THEIR CONSUMPTION LEVEL COMES UP TO AN ACCEPTABLE STANDARD. AT THE MOMENT THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES ARE VIRTUALLY UNLIMITED. IF WE ARE FROZEN AT THE PRESENT POINT, WHAT SCOPE DO WE HAVE?" OSAFO CONCLUDED BY ARGUING THAT IF THE WHOLE WORLD HAS TO SACRIFICE THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES ALSO WILL HAVE TO, IN ORDER TO COMPENSATE FOR INCREASED LCC CONSUMPTION." 10. THE EPC OFFICIAL NOTED THAT THE 60 PERCENT FIGURE FOR RATIFICATION (PARA 24) WAS AGREED TO ON THE BASIS THAT IF THE MAJOR CONSUMERS RATIFY, AND THE PROPORTION OF PRODUCTION REACHES 60 PERCENT, THE PROTOCOL COULD STILL GO AHEAD AND THE EC WILL FOLLOW. HE PERSONALLY THINKS THAT THE EC WILL ADHERE. WITH REGARD TO THE REIO'S ISSUE (PARA 26). OSAFO VIRTUALLY PARAPHRASED HIS PREVIOUS NONCOMMITAL COMMENT (SEE PARA 7 ABOVE) THAT THE EC THINKS SINCE IT HAS BEEN NEGOTIATING AS A UNIT, IT SHOULD BE TREATED AS SUCH. ONCE AGAIN HE DID NOT INDICATE HIS OPINION OF THIS POSITION.

- 2. POLOFF CALLED ON PETER AITKEN IN THE ECONOMIC DIVISION OF THE NEW ZEALAND MINISTRY OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS (MFA) TO PRESENT TEXT CONTAINED IN REF A. ALSO PRESENT WAS JOM CLARKSON OF THE NEW ZEALAND OFFICE OF METEOROLOGY, WHO HAS BEEN CONDUCTING THE TECHNICAL SIDE OF THE NEGOTIATIONS. BOTH CLARKSON AND AITKEN WILL BE ATTENDING THE CONFERENCE IN MONTREAL, AND LOOK FORWARD TO WORKING WITH U.S. REPRESENTATIVES TO OBTAIN A SATISFACTORY AGREEMENT.

2. ON AUGUST 26 IN THE ABSENCE OF PIERRE WOLTNER, SCIOFF
MET WITH PATRICK LAPORTE AND HENRI LEGRAND OF THE
MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT. MR. LEGRAND INDICATED THAT THE
GOF POSITION ON THE OZONE NEGOTIATIONS HAS BEEN RE-FINED.
IN CONTRAST WITH MR WOLTNER'S EXPRESSED OPTIMISM THAT THE
GOF WOULD AGREE TO THE PROPOSED 5Ø PERCENT REDUCTION

- 1. JAPANESE EMBASSY FIRST SECRETARY FOR ENVIRONMENT KOYA ISHINO GAVE DEPTOFF GOJ RESPONSE 8/28 TO U.S. POINTS MADE IN SMITH/SATO MEETING (REF B).
- 2. ISHING SAID THE GOJ AGREES THAT CONTROL OF CONSUMPTION (PRODUCTION PLUS IMPORTS MINUS EXPORTS TO PARTIES MINUS AMOUNTS DESTROYED) WOULD BE PREFERABLE TO CONTROL OF PRODUCTION OR OF BOTH PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION. HOWEVER, BASED ON THE EC'S STANCE AT EARLIER MEETINGS, THE GOJ FEELS THAT THE EC IS LIKELY TO BE VERY RESISTANT TO CONTROLLING ONLY CONSUMPTION. DEPTOFF NOTED THAT WE HAVE HAD INDICATIONS THAT SOME IN THE EC UNDERSTAND THE PROBLEMS CREATED BY PRODUCTION CONTROLS AND THAT SEVERAL COUNTRIES (E.G., CANADA, NEW ZEALAND, AUSTRALIA) HAVE RECENTLY EXPRESSED STRONG CONCERN THAT ONLY CONSUMPTION BE CONTROLLED, USSR SUPPORTED CONSUMPTION CONTROLS EARLY IN THE NEGOTIATIONS.

AND IT IS IN THE INTEREST OF DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND OTHER IMPORTERS THAT DNLY CONSUMPTION BE CONTROLLED IN ORDER TO AVOID SUPPLY PROBLEMS. DEPTOF COMMENTED THAT IF THESE COUNTRIES PLUS JAPAN AND U.S. STRONGLY SUPPORT CONSUMPTION FORMULA, THE EC MAY BE CONVINCED THAT THE PROTOCOL MUST CONTROL ONLY CONSUMPTION, DESPITE THE COMMERCIAL ADVANTAGE (LOCKING IN THE EC'S VIRTUAL MONOPOLY ON EXPORTS) WHICH THE EC WOULD OBTAIN UNDER PRODUCTION CONTROLS.

3. GIVEN MFA'S PESSIMISM ON CONVINCING THE EC TO DROP PRODUCTION CONTROLS, ISHINO'S INSTRUCTIONS PROPOSED THE FOLLOWING REVISED ART. 11, PARA 6:

"MOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISION OF PARAGRAPHS 1 TO 4 OF THIS ARTICLE, BY AGREEMENT BETWEEN TWO PARTIES CONCERNED, PRODUCTIONS OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF ONE PARTY MAY EXCEED THE LEVEL OF CONTROLS APPLICABLE TO THAT PARTY, PROVIDED THAT PRODUCTIONS OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE OTHER PARTY ARE LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF CONTROLS APPLICABLE TO THAT PARTY. IN SUCH CASES, THE SUM OF THE PRODUCTIONS OF THE TWO PARTIES SHALL NOT BE GREATER THAN THE COMBINED LEVELS OF CONTROLS OF PRODUCTIONS APPLICABLE TO THE TWO PARTIES PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPHS 1 TO 4. THE TWO PARTIES SHALL PROMPTLY INFORM THE SECRETARIAT OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TWO PARTIES."

THIS PROVISION WOULD ALLOW FOR THE INCREASE IN PRODUCTION BY THE NEW DUPONT 113 PLANT TO REPLACE DUPONT PRODUCTION IN THE U.S. WHICH PREVIOUSLY WAS EXPORTED TO JAPAN. DEPTOFF NOTED THAT THE PROPOSAL WOULD NOT SIMPLY ALLOW DUPONT TO RATIONALIZE ITS OPERATIONS (AS CONTROL OF CONSUMPTION ONLY WOULD ALLOW) BUT WOULD REQUIRE THE U.S. TO AGREE TO REDUCE ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION IN ORDER TO ALLOW JAPAN TO INCREASE ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION, AND THAT THIS BROAD PROPOSAL WOULD NOT APPLY JUST TO THE SPECIFIC CASE BUT WOULD BE AN OPEN-ENDED PROVISION FOR TRADING OF PRODUCTION RIGHTS. DEPTOFF PROMISED TO CIRCULATE THIS PROPOSAL TO RESPONSIBLE USG OFFICIALS, BUT NOTED THE DIFFICULT SITUATION WHICH PRODUCTION CONTROLS WOULD CREATE FOR JAPAN'S 113 PLANT ILLUSTRATES THE IMPORTANCE OF HAVING THE PROTOCOL CONTROL ONLY CONSUMPTION.

- 4. ISHINO EXPRESSED MFA'S CONCERN ABOUT GATT
 COMPATIBILITY OF THE PROPDSED PROTOCOL'S TRADE
 RESTRICTIONS. DEPTOFF SAID THAT USG HAD CONCLUDED THAT
 UNDER GATT ART. XX EXCEPTIONS FOR THE PROTECTION OF
 HEALTH AND NATURAL RESOURCES, IT WOULD NOT BE
 DISCRIMINATORY FOR PROTOCOL PARTIES TO IMPOSE TRADE
 RESTRICTIONS ON NATIONS WHICH DO NOT UNDERTAKE THE FULL
 LONG-TERM COMMITMENT TO PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER
 WHICH PARTICIPATION IN THE PROTOCOL ENTAILS, EVEN IF THE
 NON-PARTY'S PRODUCTION OR CONSUMPTION IN A PARTICULAR
 YEAR IS BELOW THE LEVEL WHICH IT WOULD BE ALLOWED IF IT
 WERE A PARTY. DEPTOFF URGED ISHING TO DISCUSS THIS
 FURTHER WITH CONCERNED OFFICIAL AT USTR.
- 5. RE KANEKO'S QUERY ON "CALCULATION OF CONTROL LEVELS" REF A: "CONSUMPTION" AS ORIGINALLY PROPOSED WAS DEFINED AS PRODUCTION PLUS IMPORTS MINUS EXPORTS TO PARTIES MINUS AMOUNTS DESTROYED OR PERMANENTLY ENCAPSULATED. THE EC. HOWEVER, HAS INSISTED THAT ALL EXPORTS BE SUBTRACTED. RATHER THAN JUST EXPORTS TO PARTIES. THIS IS AN EFFORT BY THE EC, THE MAJOR EXPORTER, TO CONTINUE UNRESTRICTED PRODUCTION FOR EXPORT. EXPORTS TO PARTIES WOULD BE LIMITED, BECAUSE THE IMPORTING PARTY WOULD HAVE TO COUNT ITS IMPORTS AGAINST ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION. BUT EXPORTS TO NON-PARTIES WOULD HAVE NO LIMIT IF THEY ARE SUBTRACTED FROM THE PRODUCING/EXPORTING COUNTRY'S CONSUMPTION. THEREFORE, AND FOR THE REASONS OUTLINED IN PARA 16 OF REF B. WE STRONGLY BELIEVE THAT ONLY EXPORTS TO PARTIES SHOULD BE SUBTRACTED. ISHINO, WHO HAS FOLLOWED THIS ISSUE CLOSELY, SEEMED TO UNDERSTAND THIS POINT, AND EVEN SUGGESTED THAT PERHAPS THE JAPANESE DELEGATION SHOULD PROPOSE REINSERTION OF THE PHRASE "TO PARTIES" IN THE DEFINITION OF CONSUMPTION.
- 6. ISHINO SAID THAT MFA AND ENVIRONMENT AGENCY CONSIDER OTHER U.S. POINTS "SOMEWHAT ACCEPTABLE," INCLUDING THE FREEZE ON HALONS, THE SØ REDUCTION OF CFC'S, AND THE REQUIREMENT FOR A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF PRODUCTION OR CONSUMPTION TO BE REPRESENTED FOR ENTRY INTO FORCE AND FUTURE DECISIONS. HE SAID THEY ARE NOT MAKING A FORMAL STATEMENT, HOWEVER, SINCE DOMESTIC NEGOTIATIONS ARE NOT FINISHED. HE BELIEVED THE IDEA OF A COMPLIANCE PROVISION IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE MFA AND IS NOT CONTROVERSIAL.
- 7. ISHINO EMPHASIZED THAT HIS INSTRUCTIONS EMPHASIZED THAT THE GOJ WOULD APPROACH THESE NEGOTIATIONS FLEXIBLY AND HOPED TO CONCLUDE AND SIGN AN AGREEMENT. HE NOTED THAT IN THE PAST, JAPAN HAS BEEN SEEN AS RELUCTANT, BUT THIS IS NO LONGER THE CASE. NOW THE APPROPRIATE MINISTRIES ARE WORKING HARD AND POSITIVELY ON THE ISSUE, HE SAID, AND PLAN TO SUBHIT TO THE DIET IN DECEMBER LEGISLATION TO RATIFY THE CONVENTION AND THE PROTOCOL AND TO IMPLEMENT THEM.

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8. ISHING SAID SIX OFFICIALS FROM TOKYO WILL PARTICIPATE IN MONTREAL, BUT THE JAPANESE AMBASSADOR TO CANADA WILL MEAD THE DELEGATION TO THE CONFERENCE OF PLENIPOTENTIARIES. DEPTOFF NOTED THAT MANY OTHER NATIONS WILL BE REPRESENTED AT THE MINISTERIAL LEVEL. WHITEHEAD



ARIF NURI TUC, HEAD OF THE EXTERNAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT FOR THE TURKISH ENVIRONMENTAL DIRECTORATE, TO RECEIVE THE INITIAL TURKISH RESPONSE TO THE POINTS PROVIDED REFTEL. DR. ONE GROUP BELIEVES THAT TURKEY SHOULD POSITIONS, ONE GROUP BELIEVES THAT TURKEY SHOULD SIGN SUCH A CONVENTION, AS THE ENVIRONMENT NEEDS THE PROTECTION WHICH IT WOULD PROVIDE. IN ADDITION, HE SAID THEY FEEL THAT SINCE TURKEY WILL BE JOINING THE FUROREAN COMMUNITY ANYWAY, IT IS BETTER TO SIGN THIS EUROREAN COMMUNITY ANYWAY, IT IS BET CONVENTION SOONER RATHER THAN LATER.

TUC, THIS SECOND GROUP IS LOOKING FOR A WAY TO POSTPONE TURKISH ACCESSION TO SUCH A CONVENTION, AS NONE OF THE TURKISH AGENCIES WHO WILL BE RESPONSIBLE HAVE EITHER THE FUNDS OR THE TECHNICA CAPABILITIES TO CARRY OUT THE NECESSARY MONITORING. - 5. DR. TUC SAID THAT RESOLUTION OF THIS ISSUE WILL REQUIRE A POLITICAL DECISION, BUT THAT THE RELEVANT POLITICAL PLAYERS ARE ALL OUT STUMPING IN PREPARATION FOR A SEPTEMBER 6 NATIONAL REFERENDUM. AFTER THE REFERENDUM IS OVER, HE HOPED THAT THEY MIGHT ADDRESS THIS PROBLEM. UNTIL THEN, HE SAID, IT IS NOT CLEAR WHETHER TURKEY WILL SEND A TEAM TO THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE IN ANY CAPACITY. - 1. SCIENCE OFFICER DELIVERED TALKING POINTS OF REF A TO SATU NURMI IN THE FINNISH MINISTRY OF THE ENVIRONMENT ON AUGUST 26. REF B TALKING POINTS HAD BEEN RELAYED SEVERAL WEEKS EARLIER BEFORE THE NORDIC GROUP'S PREPARATORY MEETING IN STOCKHOLM AUGUST 25. AT THAT TIME THE FINNS HAD NO COMMENTS ON THE U.S. PROPOSALS EXCEPT FOR STATEMENT OF GENERAL SUPPORT FOR U.S. POSITION.
- 2. COMMENTING ON THE RESULTS OF THE STOCKHOLM MEETING, NURMI EXPRESSED NORDIC RESERVATION WITH TWO POINTS OF U.S. POSITION--ENTRY INTO FORCE AND TRADE RESTRICTIONS. THE GROUP FEELS THAT REQUIRING RATIFICATION BY COUNTRIES REPRESENTING NINETY PERCENT OF GLOBAL PRODUCTION BEFORE THE TREATY ENTERS INTO FORCE IS TOO SEVERE AND THAT SIXTY PERCENT WOULD BE MORE APPROPRIATE. - 1. SCIOFF PASSED NON-PAPER BASED OH REFTEL A AND DIS-CUSSED PROSPECTS FOR UPCOMING MONTREAL SESSION WITH MOFA UN BUREAU SOCIAL CCOPERATION DIVISION DIRECTOR, YOSHIKAZU WANEKO, AUGUST 25. AFTER CAREFULLY EXAMINING THE PAPER, KANEKO MADE THE FOLLOWING POINTS:
- GOJ IS UNLIKELY TO OPPOSE PROPOSED CHANGES IN COVERAGE/ TITLE OF THE CONFERENCE OR PROTOCOL.
- THE GOJ IS "CAREFULLY STUDYING" THE U.S. PROPOSAL TO EMPHASIZE CCHSUMPTION RATHER THAN PRODUCTION DATA WHEN IMPOSING CONTROLS UNDER ARTICLE 2. KANEKO POINTED OUT THAT THIS ISSUE WAS RAISED PROMINENTLY IN WASHINGTON DURING THE AUGUST 14 SMITH/SATO MEETING (REFTEL A). ANEKO EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT AN ONGOING JAPAH-U.S. JOINT VENTURE INVOLVING DUPONT CORPORATION IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CFC-113 PLANT. HE SEEMED PRETTY CONFIDENT SOME SORT OF COMPROMISE COULD BE REACHED REGARDING A FORMULA TO DECIDE UNDER WHICH COUNTRY'S TOTALS THE OUTPUT OF THIS PLANT WOULD BE CHARGED UNDER ARTICLE 2 CONTROLS.
- GOJ HAS LITTLE SYMPATHY WITH THE EC'S ATTEMPT TO BE TREATED AS A SINGLE PRODUCING UNIT. KANEKO OPINED THAT THIS COULD BE ONE OF THE MOST CONTENTIOUS ISSUES TO. BE RESCLUED IN MONTREAL.
- THE GOJ CAN "GO ALONG" WITH A FREEZE ON HALON PRODUCTION AT 1986 LEVELS AS LONG AS ANY DECISION ON REDUCTIONS IS POSTPONED PENDING FURTHER SCIENTIFIC STUDY. KANEKO SAID THAT ONE OF THE HARDEST CHORES FOR THE GOJ HAS BEEN CONVINCING THE HALON PRODUCERS TO ACCEDE TO A FREEZE, AND THAT TRYING TO GET THEM TO AGREE TO REDUCTIONS WOULD BE PROBLEMATICAL AT THIS POINT.
- KANEKO WAS UNCLEAR AS TO WHAT EXACTLY WAS BEING PROPOSED UNDER "CALCULATION OF CONTROL LEVELS" (ARTICLE 3). HE REQUESTED FURTHER CLARIFICATION. SCIOFF WAS NOT SUFFICIENTLY WELL-VERSED ON THE EVOLUTION OF THIS ISSUE TO PROVIDE A COGENT EXPLANATION. REQUEST DEPT PROVIDE FURTHER CLARIFICATION ON THE ESSENCE OF THIS PROPOSAL.
- KANEKO FELT THAT THE USSR WOULD HAVE PROPLEMS WITH THE U.S. PROPOSALS REGARDING COMPLIANCE.
- 2. COMMENT: KANEKO SEEMED MUCH HORE OPTIMISTIC THAN IN THE PAST (REFTEL B) THAT AGREEMENT WOULD BE REACHED AT THE UPCOMING SESSIONS IN MONTREAL. WE ATTRIBUTE THIS

MOOD SHIFT IN LARGE MEASURE TO THE POSITIVE OUTCOME OF THE SMITH/SATO MEETING IN WASHINGTON. IN HIS COMMENTS, KANEKO REFERRED FREQUENTLY TO A REPORT ON THIS MEETING THAT HE HAD RECEIVED FROM THE JAPANESE ENBASSY IN WASHINGTON.

3. IN OTHER CCIMENTS OF SPECIAL NOTE, KANEKO SAID DIRECTLY WHAT WE HAVE LONG SURMISED, 1.E., THAT AN IMPLACABLE EC POSITION IN MONTREAL WOULD GIVE JAPAN "AN EXCUSE" TO DELAY GIVING ITS OWN CONSENT TO THE AGREEMENT. WITH RESPECT TO THE RATIFICATION PROCESS WITHIN JAPAN, KANEKO POINTEO OUT THAT SOME DELAY WOULD BE UNAVOIDABLE IF JAPANESE DOMESTIC LAWS HAD TO BE CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THE PROTOCOL. WHILE STRESSING THAT ANY DELAY WOULD ONLY BE THE RESULT OF THE BUREAUCRATIC NECESSITY OF GETTING LAW CHANGES IMPLEMENTED THROUGH THE DIET, HE ADDED THAT IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE TO PREDICT HOW THIS PROCESS WOULD EVOLVE. END COMMENT.

MADHAV SHARMA, JOINT SECRETARY, MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT AND FORESTS (MOEF) ON AUGUST 25, 1987 TO INQUIRE ABOUT GOI PARTICIPATION AT FINAL NEGOTIATION MEETING AT MONTREAL AND GOI STAND ON THE VARIOUS ISSUES. THE U.S. VIEWS ON THE REVISED PROTOCOL PROVIDED IN REFTEL WERE HANDED OVER TO MR. SHARMA.

1. SUMMARY: DIFFICULT BUT PRODUCTIVE PROTOCOL
NEGOTIATING SESSION ENDED WITH PARTICIPATING NATIONS IN
REACH OF FINAL AGREEMENT BY SEPTEMBER DIPLOMATIC
CONFERENCE IN MONTREAL. AD HOC "CHAIRMAN'S GROUP",

AIDED BY HARD-DRIVING AND EFFECTIVE LEADERSHIP OF UNEP EXECUTIVE DIRECT TOLBA, MADE CONSIDERABLE PROGRESS IN NARROWING DIFFERENCES ON CONTROL STRINGENCY AND TING. BASED ON HIS DISCUSSIONS WITH SMALLER SUB-GROUP DE THIS GROUP, TOLA DEVELOPED A COMPROME CONTROL ARTICLE TEXT WITH STRINGENCY AND TIMING LEVELS BETWEEN THAT OF INITIAL (DEC. 1986) EC AND U.S. NEGOTIATING POSITIONS, WHICH HE INTENDS TO USE AS NEGOTIATING TEXT FOR SUBSEQUENT HEETING OF SUB-GROUP (SEE PARA. 111.

- -- PRODUCTIVE DISCUSSIONS WITHIN TRADE GROUP RESULTED IN PROPOSAL FOR COMPROMISE PRODUCTION/CONSUMPTION "FORMULA" FOR DEFINING WHAT IS TO BE CONTROLLED. MOWEVER, GROUP WAS UNABLE TO RESOLVE SUBSTANTIVE DIFFERENCES ON CONTROL OF TRADE BETWEEN PARTIES AND NON-PARTIES. SILLARLY, NO AGREEMENT EMERGED ON REATMENT OF DEVELOPING COUNTRIES.
- -- SCIENTIFIC GROUP, DRAWING ON RESULTS OF RECENT UNEP-SPONSORED MEETING OF SCIENTISTS TO COMPARE OZONE-DEPLETION UNDER ALTERNATIVE CONTROL STRATEGIES, GAVE STRONG SUPPORT FOR THE NEED FOR BROAD CHEMICAL GOVERAGE. THE GROUP ALSO CONFIRMED THAT A FREEZE WOULD NOT PREVENT LONG-TERM DEPLETION, STRENGTHENING THE VIEW THAT FURTHER REDUCTONS WERE NECESSARY TO ADEQUATELY PROTECT THE OZONE LAYER.
- -- SESSION CONCLUDED WITH PLANS FOR FURTHER INFORMAL MEETINGS IN JUNE AND JULY, A FORMAL WORKING GROUP , SESSION SEPTEMBER 8-11 AND DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE IN MONTREAL SEPTEMBER 14-16. END SUMMARY.
- 2. PARTICIPATING COUNTRIES: ARGENTINA, AUSTRALIA, AUSTRIA, CANADA, COLOMBIA, BELGIUM, DENMARK, EGYPT, FINLAND, FRANCE, FRG, GHAHA, HUNGARY, ITALY, JAPAN, KENYA, LUXEMBOURG, MALAYSIA, MEXICO, NETHERLANDS, NEW ZEALAND, NIGERIA, NORWAY, POLANO, QATAR, SWEDEN, SWITZERLAND, USSR, UK, US, VENEZUELA.
- 3. STRINGENCY AND TIMING: CHAIRMAN LANG'S (AUSTRIA) GROUP, WHICH INITIALLY CONSISTED OF ALL HEADS OF DELEGATIONS WITH ADVISORS, WAS SUPPLANTED BY A SMALLER AD HOC GROUP CONSISTING ONLY OF HEADS OF DELEGATION FOR THE U.S., EC (UK, DENMARK, BELGIUM, AND THE

COMMISSION), CANADA, NORWAY, USSR, AND JAPAN. TOLA TOOK OVER CHAIRMANSHIP OF THIGROUP ON WEDNESDAY, AFTER LANG WAS UNEXPECTEDLY CALLED BACK TO VIENNA. WITH THE ASSISTANCE OF THE SMALLER GROUP, TOLBA PRODUCED A COMPROMISE TEXT FOR USE IN SUBSEQUENT NEGOTIATIONS. TEXT CALLS FOR:

- -- (A) A FREEZE AT 1986 LEVELS WITHIN TWO YEARS OF PROTOCOL'S ENTRY INTO FORCE (EIF) (TOLA STRONGLY URGED THAT PROTOCOL BE RATIFIED BY 1988, SO THAT THE FREEZE WOULD TAKE EFFECT BY 1990);

 WHICH TWO OPTIONS WERE PROVIDED: (1) WITHIN SIX YEARS

- -- NONE OF THE DELEGATIONS REPRESENTED AT GENEVA GAVE FORMAL ASSENT TO THS CONTROL PACKAGE, WITH SOME (CANADA, HORDICS, SWITZERLAND, NEW ZEALAND) INDICATING THAT IT MIGHT BE "TOO WEAK", AND OTHERS (EC, USSR, JAPAN) THAT IT MIGHT BE "TOO STRONG". U.S. STATED THAT WE WOULD CAREFULLY STUDY THE DETAILS, HOTING, INTER ALIA, THAT TEXT HAY HEED FURTHER REFIREMENT TO ENSURE PROPER SYNCHRONIZATION BETWEEN SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENT AND CONTROL DECISIONS. NEVERTHELESS, THERE WAS GENERAL AGREEHENT AMONG DELEGATIONS THAT THTEXT REPRESENTS THE CLOSEST TO A CONSENSUS YET ATTAINED ON THE CONTENTIOUS ISSUE OF CONTROL STRINGENCY AND TING.
- 4. SCOPE OF CHEMICAL COVERAGE: THE CHAIR'S GROUP MOVED CLOSER TO CONSENSUS ON WHICH CHEMICALS TO INCLUDE FOR CONTROL. U.S., CANADA, AND NORDICS PUSHED FOR INCLUSION ON CFC 11, 12, 113, 114, 115, AND HALONS 1211 AND 1381 FOR AT LEAST THE FREEZE, PERHAPS WITH ONLY 11, 12, AND 113 INCLUDED FOR SUBSEQUENT REDUCTION PHASES. THE EC'S OPENING POSITION WAS TO INCLUDE ONLY 11 AND 12, BUT THEY SUBSEQUENTLY ADDED 113 AND -- WHILE NOT CONSENTING -- AGREED TO CONSIDER INCLUSION OF OTHERS. BY CONTRAST. AT THE OUTSET OF DISCUSSIONS, JAPAN ACTIVELY OPPOSED INCLUSION OF 113. BY END OF WEEK, HOWEVER, GOJ DELEGATION HAD AGREED TO TAKE QUESTION BACK TO TOKYO FOR RECONSIDERATION IN LIGHT OF "BROAD CONSENSUS" AT THE MEETING (PORTANT ELEMENT FOR JAPAN WAS AGREEMENT BY OTHER DELEGATIONS TO AGGREGATED EMISSIONS, WITH EACH CHEMICAL WEIGHTED BY ITS OZONE DEPLETION POTENTIAL). USSR STILL OPPOSED INCLUDING MALONS, DUE TO LEGAL QUESTIONS OF WHETHER INCLUSION IS ALLOWED BY WORKING GROUP'S FORMAL MANDATE. HOWEVER, SOVIETS APPEARED MORE SYMPATHETIC TO THE SCIENTIFIC RATIONALE FOR INCLUDING HALONS, AND TOLBA AGREED TO SEEK ENLARGEMENT OF THE MANDATE AT THE UNEP GOVERNING COUNCIL IN JUNE. OVERALL, MOVEMENT TOWARD U.S. POSITION ON THISSUE WAS FACILITATED BY CONCLUSIONS OF SCIENTIFIC GROUP EMPHASIZING NEED FOR BROAD CHEMICAL COVERAGE (SEE PARA. 9).
- 5. FURTHER, IT WAS AGREED THAT THE CHEMICALS WOULD BE GROUPED TOGETHER AND WEIGHTED ACCORDING TO THEIR OZONE-OEPLETION POTENTIAL (SEE PARA. 9). THIS WOULD ENABLE INDIVIDUAL COUNTRIES TO "TRADE OFF" FREEZE OR REDUCTIONS AMONG INDIVIDUAL CHEMICALS WITHIN THE BASKET, SO LONG AS THE WEIGHTED TOTAL FOR THE ENTIRE BASKET MET THE PROTOCOL FREEZE/REDUCTION TARGET. THS FLEXILITY WAS CRITICAL IN MOVING JAPAN TO AT LEAST CONSIDER INCLUSION OF CFC 113.
- 6. CONTROL FORMULA: THE QUESTION OF THE CONTROL "FORMULA" (I.E., WHETHER TO FREEZE AND REDUCE NATIONAL PRODUCTION, ADJUSTED PRODUCTION, OR SOME HYBRID FORMULATION) WAS TAKEN UP BY THE TRADE SUB-GROUP. U.S., CANADA, NORDICS, AND NEW ZEALAND SUPPORTED ADJUSTED PRODUCTION (AP) FORMULA (PRODUCTION IMPORTS - EXPORTS TO PARTIES - AMOUNT DESTROYED). WITH MAIN OPPOSITION TO IT COMING FROM THE EC. EC'S STATED REASONS FOR OPPOSING AP FORMULA WERE: (A) IT WOULD BE DIFFICULT TO IMPLEMENT AND ENFORCE; (B) ADEQUATE DATA TO CALCULATE BASE YEAR LEVEL MIGHT NOT BE AVAILABLE FOR MANY COUNTRIES (THEY PROPOSED USING 1998 FOR BASE YEAR); (C) SUBTRACTING ONLY EXPORTS TO PARTIES MIGHT PUT THE EC'AT A DISADVANTAGE, SINCE THEY COULD NOT ENSURE THAT THEIR EXISTING EXPORT MARKET WOULD BECOME PARTIES; (D) SUBTRACTING EXPORTS MIGHT CREATE AN INCENTIVE FOR SOME PARTIES TO MAINTAIN OR INCREASE PRODUCTION. BASED ON A SWEDISH PROPOSAL TO COMBINE BOTH APPROACHES, TRADE GROUP

DEVELOPED AN AD REFERENDUM DRAFT TEXT, WHICH CALLS FOR INITIALLLY FREEZING PRODUCTION AND IMPORTS SEPARATELY, AND THEN REDUCING BOTH PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION IN PARALLEL WITH THE LATTER DEFINED AS ADJUSTED PRODUCTION BUT WITH ALL EXPORTS SUBTRACTED). PARTIES WOULD SUSEQUENTLY ASSESS TREATMENT OF THE EXPORT TERM (E.G., WHETHER IT WOULD APPLY FOR EXPORTS TO PARTIES ONLY). TEXT REMALMS BRACKETED, HOWEVER, BECAUSE NORDICS, NEW ZEALAND, AND SOME LDCS INSISTED ON A PROVISION TO ALLOW NON-PRODUCING COUNTRIES TO PRODUCE UP TO THEIR ALLOCATED LEVEL OF IMPORTS, PROVIDING THAT IMPORTS ARE REDUCED BY AN EQUAL AMOUNT. JAPAN PROPOSED A SECOND ALTERNATIVE ALLOWING FOR INTER-PARTY TRANSFER OF PRODUCTION CAPACITY, PROVIDING THAT TOTAL GLOBAL PRODUCTION DOES NOT INCREASE. EC OPPOSED BOTH PROPOSALS. BEYOND THESE SUBSTANTIVE DIFFERENCES, FULL CONSENSUS ON THIS COMPROMISE FORMULATION WAS NOT REACHED. BECAUSE MANY DELEGATIONS EXPRESSED NEED TO ASSESS IMPLICATIONS OF COMPROMISE FORMULA IN MORE DETAIL.

- -- IN ADDITION, THE TRADE GROUP AGREED THAT THE PROTOCOL SHOULD PROVIDE CREDIT TO A PARTY FOR THE AMOUNT OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES DESTROYED, PROVIDED THAT DESTRUCTION IS BY TECHNIQUES APPROVED BY THE PARTIES. THIS PRESERVED U.S. INTEREST IN CREATING AN INCENTIVE FOR THE DEVELOPMENT OF CFC DESTRUCTION TECHNOLOGIES, WHILE ALLAYING PRIOR USSR CONCERN THAT THE AMOUNTS REPORTED FOR SOME COUNTRIES MIGHT NOT BE RELIABLE UNTIL THE TECHNOLOGIES ARE KNOWN AND WIDELY ACCEPTED.
- 7. TRADE BETWEEN PARTIES AND NON-PARTIES: EC INSISTANCE THAT GATT REPRESENTATIVE BE PRESENT BEFORE TRADE GROUP COULD TAKE UP DISCUSSIONS OF TRACE ARTICLE PREVENTED TRACE GROUP FROM DEVOTING ADEQUATE TIME FOR DISCUSSION OF TRADE ARTICLE. HOWEVER, THIS TACTIC BACKFIRED SOMEWHAT WHEN GATT LEGAL ADVISOR APPEARED AND ICONTRARY TO EXPECTATIONS OF UK AND EC REPS) STATED THAT IN HIS OPINION NON-PARTY IMPORT RESTRICTIONS WOULD BE SUPPORTABLE UNDER ARTICLE 20 OF THE GATT (ALTHOUGH FINAL DETERMINATION WOULD BE BY GATT MEMBERS). WHEN TRADE GROUP TOOK UP CONSIDERATION OF SUBSTANTIVE ELELMENTS OF TRADE ARTICLE, IT BECAME CLEAR THAT THE EC COMMISSION (AT LEAST AT THE STAFF LEVEL) AND THE UK ARE OPPOSED TO ANY RESTRICTIONS (EXPORT OR IMPORT) EXCEPT FOR BULK CHEMICALS. THEIR OSTENSIVE REASONS WERE: (A) INCREASED POSSIBILITY OF BEING CHALLENGED WITHIN THE GATT, AND (B) POSSIBLE CONFLICT WITH BITLATERAL TRADE AGREEMENTS. OTHER THAN CANADA, WHICH SUPPORTED U.S. OUT OF PRINCIPLE, OTHER PARTICIPANTS WERE NON-COMMITTAL ON TRADE ISSUE. OTHER THAN AGREEMENT TO REMOVE EXEMPTION FOR NON-PARTY COMPLIANCE (WHICH WAS REPLACED WITH A MORE RESTRICTIVE PROVISION FOR DEVELOPING COUNTRIES) RESULT WAS LITTLE MOVEMENT SINCE LAST MEETING, A HEAVILY BRACKETED TEXT, WITH SUBSTANTIAL DIFFERENCES IN POSITIONS OF U.S. AND EC, AND POSITIONS OF OTHER KEY PLAYERS AS YET UNARTICU-
- 8. DEVELOPING COUNTRIES: VERY LITTLE TIME WAS SPENT ON THE LDC ISSUE, DESPITE SOMEWHAT GREATER NUMBER OF LDC REPRESENTATIVES PRESENT AND MORE VOCAL PARTICIPATION. ONLY SUBSTANTIVE PROPOSAL, BY CANADA (AND AMENDED BY OTHERS), WOULD EXEMPT PARTIES WITH PER CAPITA CONSUMPTION. LESS THAN 0.1 .0.2 KG/YR FROM THE CONTROLS FOR THE FIRST 5 10 YEARS OF THE PROTOCOL, AFTER WHICH THEY BE SUBJECT TO THE CONTROLS IN A MANNER "PARALLEL" TO OTHER PARTIES. ALTHOUGH THERE APPEARED TO BE SENTIMENT FOR CANADIAN APPROACH OF ONLY ALLOWING LDCS TO BE EXEMPTED FOR A PERIOD OF YEARS (RATHER THAN INDEFINITELY), GROUP

CONCLUDED THAT CANADIAN PROPOSAL, AS WELL AS PROPOSALS FROM PREVIOUS SESSIONS, BE ASSESSED FURTHER PRIOR TO NEXT NEGOTIATING SESSION. LACK OF DATA ON CURRENT LEVELS OF

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DEVELOPING COUNTRY CONSUMPTION CONTINUES TO HAMPER
RESOLUTION OF THIS ISSUE.

9. SCIENTIFIC GROUP: SCIENTIFIC GROUP ISSUED VERY STRONG REPORT WHICH SUPPORTED USG POSITIONS ON: (A) THE NEED FOR BROAD CHEMICAL COVERAGE OF ALL FULLY-HALOGENATED COMPOUNDS, AND (B) THE NEED FOR REDUCTION STEPS BEYOND A FREEZE. LATTER POINT WAS BUTTRESSED BY THE GROUP'S HIGHLIGHTING THE IMPORTANCE OF POTENTIAL CHANGES IN THE VERTICAL DISTRIBUTION OF OZONE AND LATITUDINAL GRADIENTS IN ESTIMATES OF TOTAL COLUMN OZONE DEPLETION. GROUP ALSO AGREED ON OZONE DEPLETION POTENTIAL VALUES FOR ALL OF THE CHEMICALS UNDER DISCUSSION, WHICH WERE RECOMMENDED FOR USE IN THE PROTOCOL FOR CALCULATING WEIGHTED EMISSIONS. IN ADDITION, SCIENTIFIC GROUP REAFFIRMED NEED FOR MAJOR SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENT EVERY FOUR YEARS, AND THE NEED TO DEVELOP AN IMPROVED GROUND-BASED STRATOSPHERIC MONITORING SYSTEM.

18.FUTURE WORK: CANADA CONFIRMED THAT THE DIPLOMATIC CONFERENCE WILL BE HELD IN MONTREAL SEPTEMBER 14-16, TO BE PRECEEDED BY A FOURTH WORKING GROUP SESSION SEPTEMBER 8-11. PRIOR TO THAT, TWO INFORMAL MEETINGS HAVE BEEN SCHEDULED: THE CHAIR'S GROUP WILL MEET JUNE 29-38 IN BRUSSELS AND A LEGAL DRAFTING GROUP WILL MEET JULY 6-8 IN THE HAGUE. TOLBA REQUESTED THAT DELEGATIONS SUBHIT TO HIM, BY JUNE 19, COMMENTS ON THE CONTROL ARTICLE TEXT.

- 11. NEXT STEPS: THE U.S. DELEGATION RECOMMENDS THAT:
- -- (A) LOW-KEY AND CAREFULLY PLANNED BILATERAL CONTACTS WITH THE OTHER COUNTRIES IN THE CHAIR'S GROUP BEGIN.
 AS SOON AS POSSIBLE, IN ORDER TO MAXIMIZE THE LIKELIHOOD OF AN OUTCOME FAVORABLE TO USG OBJECTIVES
 (SPECIFIC GUIDANCE WILL FOLLOW FOR RELELVANT POSTS);
- --- (B) TIMING OF CONTROL ARTICLE STEPS SHOULD BE REVIEWED TO ENSURE THAT THEY ARE PROPOERLY SYNCHRONIZED WITH THE PERIODIC SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENTS;
- -- (C) THE RELEVANT USG AGENCIES ASSESS THE COMPROMISE CONTROL "FORMULA" DEVELOPED BY THE TRADE GROUP, TO SEE WHETHER IT PROTECTS U.S. INTERESTS, WHETHER IT IS FEASIBLE FROM A DOMESTIC REGULATORY STANDPOINT (INCLUDING THE OUESTION OF DATA AVAILABILTLY), AND WHETHER THERE ARE ANY SIMPLER ALTERNATIVES WHICH ACCOMPLISH THE SAME THING:
- -- (D) CONSIDERATION BE GIVEN TO HOW THE REMAINING SUBSTANTIVE AREAS FOR WHICH CONSENSUS HAS NOT BEEN REACHED (E.G., NON-PARTY TRADE, LDCS) MIGHT BE MOVED TOWARD RESOLUTION PRIOR TO THE SEPTEMBER WORKING GROUP SESSION; IN PARTICULAR, WHETHER IT WOULD BE USEFUL TO GAUGE THE INTEREST OF OTHER COUNTRIES IN: (1) AN ADDITIONAL INFORMAL MEETING TO DISCUSS TRADE ISSUES, AND (2) INFORMAL DISCUSSIONS OF THE LDC ISSUES, UNING THE UNEP GOVERNING COUNCIL (LATTER WAS ALREADY DISCUSSED WITH PETER USHER, UNEP SECRETARIAT). - 1. FOLLOWING SUMMARIZES PROGRESS OF OZONE PROTOCOL NEGOTIATIONS DURING SECOND DAY CARRIED OUT THROUGH (A) CHAIRMAN'S GROUP ON CONTROL MEASURES; (B) WORKING GROUP ON TRADE; AND (C) WORKING GROUP ON SCIENCE.
- 2. CHAIRMAN'S GROUP: DISCUSSIONS ADDRESSED SCOPE, STRINGENCY AND TIMING OF CFC CONTROL STRATEGY. THERE WAS GENERAL AGREEMENT THAT NOT ALL CHEMICALS SHOULD BE INCLUDED ON SAME REDUCTION SCHEDULE. USDEL PROPOSED AN IMMEDIATE FREEZE ON CFC'S 11, 12, 113, 114, 115 AND HALONS 1211 AND 1301; TO BE FOLLOWED BY REDUCTION STEPS COVERING CFC'S 11, 12 AND 113. OTHER CHEMICALS, INCLUDING HALONS FOR WHICH PRODUCTION DATA IS CURRENTLY QUITE LIMITED, WOULD BE TREATED SEPARATELY WITHIN PROTOCOL. THIS WAS SUPPORTED BY MANY, ALTHOUGH NOT ALL, DELEGATIONS. DISCUSSIONS ON STRINGENCY AND TIMING COVERED A WIDE RANGE OF POSSIBLE REDUCTIONS OVER THE SHORT AND MEDIUM TERM (UP TO 10 YEARS). THE CHAIRMAN'S TEXT (INTRODUCED IN PREVIOUS ROUND OF NEGOTIATIONS) WAS MODIFIED TO INCLUDE AN AUTOMATIC REDUCTION STEP OF 20 PERCENT IN A PERIOD OF 2-6 YEARS. ALSO, PROVISION MADE FOR FURTHER REDUCTION OF ADDITIONAL 20-40 PERCENT IN AN UNSPECIFIED NUMBER OF YEARS WHICH WOULD TAKE EFFECT UNLESS PARTIES BY TWO-THIRDS MAJORITY DECIDE OTHERWISE IN LIGHT OF SCIENTIFIC-ECONOMIC-TECHNOLOGICAL ASSESSMENT. EC, JAPAN AND USSR STRONGLY OPPOSED THIS SECOND STEP REDUCTION. REDUCTION LEVELS AND YEARS REMAIN IN BRACKETS AND WILL BE SUBJECT TO FURTHER DELIBERATION BY CHAIRMAN'S GROUP, AND LATER BY PLENARY. IN ADDITION, USDEL PLANS TO WORK FOR ELABORATION OF PROPOSED FINAL STEP IN CONTROL ARTICLE WHICH CALLS FOR FURTHER DECISION BY PARTIES ON QUOTE NEW SUBSTANCES TO BE INCLUDED AND FURTHER REDUCTIONS OF 1986 LEVELS UNQUOTE.
- 3. TRADE WORKING GROUP: FOCUS WAS ON ALTERNATIVE FORMULAS FOR CALCULATING EMISSIONS (E.G., ADJUSTED PRODUCTION, EC PRODUCTION/IMPORTS APPROACH). SOME

HOVEMENT TOWARD A CONSENSUS WAS CATALYZED BY SWEDISH PROPOSAL TO CONTROL BOTH PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION. AS REVISED, CURRENT VERSION OF SWEDISH PROPOSAL WOULD FIRST FREEZE PRODUCTION AND IMPORTS, AND THEN FOR SUBSEQUENT STEPS REDUCE PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION IN PARALLEL. EC HAS INDICATED GENERAL SUPPORT FOR THIS APPROACH, BUT OPPOSITION TO DEFINING CONSUMPTION AS PI-E AT THIS TIME. GROUP AGREED TO INCLUDE A -D TERM (AMOUNT DESTROYED) IN DEFINITION OF PRODUCTION, FOR ALL DESTRUCTION TECHNIQUES APPROVED BY THE PARTIES. 4. SCIENCE WORKING GROUP: CHEMICALS IN QUESTION WERE DIVIDED INTO THREE GROUPS, EACH TO BE TREATED AS SEPARATE CLASS, BASED ON OZONE DEPLETION POTENTIAL AND 1986 GLOBAL EMISSION RATES. GROUP NOTED UNCERTAINTIES WHICH EXIST REGARDING REDUCTION LEVELS FOR HALONS AND CFC'S 114 AND 115. CFC 22 AND METHYL CHLOROFORM WERE VIEWED AS PART OF SOLUTION RATHER THAN AS PROBLEM, AT LEAST OVER NEAR TERM. GROUP REEMPHASIZED PREVIOUS SUPPORT FOR A 4-YEAR SCIENTIFIC ASSESSMENT SCHEDULE, AND TO DEVELOP AN IMPROVED GROUND-BASED MONITORING SYSTEM. IT ALSO NOTED THE IMPORTANCE OF PAYING INCREASED ATTENTION TO VERTICAL REDISTRIBUTION OF OZONE AND LATITUDINAL GRADIENTS UNDER OZONE DEPLETION SITUATIONS, NOT ONLY TO TOTAL COLUMN OZONE CHANGE. BASED ON A REVIEW OF THE FINDINGS OF THE RECENT UNEP SCIENCE PANEL ON MODELLING AND COMTROL STRATEGIES (WURZBURG, FRG), IT AGREED THAT ALL MODEL SCENARIOS USING CURRENT RATES OF GROWTH FOR CFC'S METHANE, CARBON DIOXIDE AND NITROUS OXIDE REVEAL THAT CHLORINE COMCENTRATIONS IN THE ATMOSPHEPE CONTINUE TO INCREASE. 5. FUTURE WORK: CHAIRMAN'S GROUP AND TRADE WORKING GROUP WILL RECONVENE ON WEDNESDAY, ALONG WITH DEVELOPING COUNTRY WORKING GROUP WHICH WILL MEET FOR FIRST TIME, TO BE FOLLOWED BY LATE AFTERNOON PLENARY.

- 1. SUMMARY: FOLLOWING ARE HIGHLIGHTS OF OPENING DAY (MONDAY, 27 APRIL) PLENARY SESSION OF UNEP AD HOC WORKING GROUP ON STRATOSPHERIC OZONE PROTOCOL BEING HELD IN GENEVA (APRIL 27-30). EMPHASIS WAS ON PROPOSALS ENUNCIATED BY NATIONAL DELEGATIONS, AND RECOMMENDED BY UNEP, ON CONTROL STRATEGY FOR EMISSIONS OF OZONE-DEPLETING SUBSTANCES. SIGNIFICANTLY, ALL PROPOSALS FOLLOW U.S. CONTROL STRUCTURE OF INITIAL FREEZE FOLLOWED BY REDUCTIONS. TEXT OF U.S. STATEMENT, AS DELIVERED BY HEAD OF USDEL RICHARD BENEDICK, TRANSMITTED SEPTEL. END SUMMARY.
- 2. UNEP: 'IN STRONG OPENING STATEMENT, UNEP EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR TOLBA OREW ON RECENT SCIENTIFIC EVALUATION OF OZONE DEPLETION MODELS (WURZBURG, FRG) TO EMPHASIZE THAT QUOTE GOVERNMENTS CAN NO LONGER HIDE BEHIND ACCUSATIONS OF SCIENTIFIC UNCERTAINTY UNQUOTE, ANO TO CALL FOR QUICK ACTION TO CONCLUDE PROTOCOL BECAUSE QUOTE SO LONG AS THERE IS A PRIMA FACIE CASE AGAINST A CHEMICAL, WE MUST URGE CAUTION UNQUOTE. JAPAN: INTERVENTION AVOIDED SPECIFICS OF CONTROL STRATEGY, EMPHASIZING INSTEAD GENERAL CALL FOR QUOTE REALISTIC UNQUOTE APPROACH TO ENSURE BROAD PARTICIPATION IN PROTOCOL, AND NEED FOR INTERNATIONAL COMMUNITY TO EXPEDITE QUOTE SHARING AND EQUAL ACCESS UNQUOTE BY PARTIES TO SUBSTITUTE TECHNOLOGIES. (FYI: IN CHAIRMAN'S WORKING GROUP (SEE PARA 10), JAPANESE DELEGATE MADE CLEAR STATEMENT THAT JAPAN COULD NOT SIGN PROTOCOL IF CFC 113 WERE INCLUDED. U.S. RESPONDED BY INDICATING OUR INABILITY TO AGREE TO CONTROL MEASURES WHICH FAIL TO INCLUDE ALL PRINCIPAL OZONE DEPLETERS, INCLUDING CFC 113. ENO FYI.)
- 8. FRG: CALLED FOR TOTAL BAN ON CFC EMISSIONS, WITHOUT SPECIFYING REDUCTION STEPS AND TIMING, IN CAREFULLY CRAFTED STATEMENT INDICATING BREAK FROM EC POSITION, QUOTE GREAT INTEREST UNQUOTE IN SWISS AND NEW ZEALAND PROPOSALS; AND WILLINGNESS TO MOVE UNILATERALLY WITH HORE AGGRESSIVE CONTROLS.

2. ON AUGUST 26 IN THE ABSENCE OF PIERRE WOLTNER, SCIOFF MET WITH PATRICK LAPORTE AND HENRI LEGRAND OF THE MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT. MR. LEGRAND INDICATED T MINISTRY OF ENVIRONMENT. MR. LEGRAND INDICATED THAT THE GOF POSITION ON THE OZONE NEGOTIATIONS HAS BEEN RE-FINED. IN CONTRAST WITH MR WOLTNER'S EXPRESSED OPTIMISM THAT THE GOF WOULD AGREE TO THE PROPOSED 50 PERCENT REDUCTION LEVELS IN CFC PRODUCTION, MR. - 2. SUMMARY: ON AUGUST 27 ECONOFF MET WITH DR. ARIF NURI TUC, HEAD OF THE EXTERNAL AFFAIRS DEPARTMENT FOR THE TURKISH ENVIRONMENTAL DIRECTORATE, TO RECEIVE THE INITIAL TURKISH RESPONSE TO THE POINTS PROVIDED REFTEL. DR. TUC NOTED THAT THERE IS PRESENTLY AN INTERNAL DEADLOCK ON WHETHER TURKEY SHOULD SIGN A PROTOCOL TO CONTROL OZONE-DEPLE'ING CHEMICALS AT THIS TIME, AND THAT A POLITICAL-LEVEL DECISION, IF AT ALL, WILL NOT BE POSSIBLE UNTIL SOMETIME DURING THE WEEK PRECEEDING THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE. END SUMMARY.
- 3. DR. TUC NOTED THAT IN INTERMINISTERIAL MEETINGS TO DATE ON THIS ISSUE, THERE HAVE BEEN TWO CONFLICTING POSITIONS. ONE GROUP BELIEVES THAT TURKEY SHOULD SIGN SUCH A CONVENTION, AS THE ENVIRONMENT NEEDS THE PROTECTION WHICH IT WOULD PROVIDE. IN ADDITION, HE SAID THEY FEEL THAT SINCE TURKEY WILL BE JOINING THE EUROPEAN COMMUNITY ANYWAY, IT IS BETTER TO SIGN THIS CONVENTION SOONER RATHER THAN LATER.
- 4. THE OTHER GROUP, HE SAID, IS FOCUSING ON THE MONITORING REQUIREMENTS INVOLVED IN CARRYING OUT THEIR RESPONSIBILITIES UNDER ANY SUCH CONVENTION. ACCORDING TO DR. TUC, THIS SECOND GROUP IS LOOKING FOR A WAY TO POSTPONE TURKISH ACCESSION TO SUCH A CONVENTION, AS NONE OF THE TURKISH AGENCIES WHO WILL BE RESPONSIBLE HAVE EITHER THE FUNDS OR THE TECHNICAL CAPABILITIES TO CARRY OUT THE NECESSARY MONITORING.
- 5. DR. TUC SAID THAT RESOLUTION OF THIS ISSUE WILL REQUIRE A POLITICAL DECISION, BUT THAT THE RELEVANT POLITICAL PLAYERS ARE ALL OUT STUMPING IN PREPARATION FOR A SEPTEMBER 6 NATIONAL REFERENDUM. AFTER THE REFERENDUM IS OVER, HE HOPED THAT THEY MIGHT ADDRESS THIS PROBLEM. UNTIL THEN, HE SAID, IT IS NOT CLEAR WHETHER TURKEY WILL SEND A TEAM TO THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE IN ANY CAPACITY.

- 1. SCIOFF PASSED MON-PAPER BASED ON REFTEL A AND DIS-CUSSED PROSPECTS FOR UPCOMING MONTREAL SESSION WITH MOFA UN BUREAU SOCIAL COOPERATION DIVISION DIRECTOR, YOSHIKAZU KANEKO, AUGUST 25. AFTER CAREFULLY EXAMINING THE PAPER, KANEKO MADE THE FOLLOWING POINTS:
- GOJ IS UNLIKELY TO OPPOSE PROPOSED CHANGES IN COVERAGE/ TITLE OF THE CONFERENCE OR PROTOCOL.
- THE GOJ IS "CAREFULLY STUDYING" THE U.S. PROPOSAL TO EMPHASIZE CONSUMPTION RATHER THAN PRODUCTION DATA WHEN IMPOSING CONTROLS UNDER ARTICLE 2. KANEKO POINTED OUT THAT THIS ISSUE WAS RAISED PROMINENTLY IN WASHINGTON DURING THE AUGUST 14 SHITH/SATO MEETING (REFTEL A). ANEKO EXPRESSED CONCERN ABOUT AN ONGOING JAPAN-U.S. JOINT VENTURE INVOLVING DUPONT CORPORATION IN THE CONSTRUCTION OF A CFC-113 PLANT. HE SEEMED PRETTY CONFIDENT SOME SORT OF COMPROMISE COULD BE REACHED REGARDING A FORMULA TO DECIDE UNDER WHICH COUNTRY'S TOTALS THE OUTPUT OF THIS PLANT WOULD BE CHARGED UNDER ARTICLE 2 CONTROLS.
- GOJ HAS LITTLE SYMPATHY WITH THE EC'S ATTEMPT TO BE TREATED AS A SINGLE PRODUCING UNIT. KANEKO OPINED THAT THIS COULD BE ONE OF THE MOST CONTENTIOUS ISSUES TO BE RESOLVED IN MONTREAL.
- THE GOJ CAN "GO ALONG" WITH A FREEZE ON MALON PRODUCTION AT 1986 LEVELS AS LONG AS ANY DECISION ON REDUCTIONS IS POSTPONED PENDING FURTHER SCIENTIFIC STUDY. KANEKO SAID "THAT ONE OF THE HARDEST CHORES FOR THE GOJ HAS BEEN CONVINCING THE HALON PRODUCERS TO ACCEDE TO A FREEZE, AND THAT TRYING TO GET THEM TO AGREE TO REDUCTIONS WOULD BE PROBLEMATICAL AT THIS POINT.
- KANEKU WAS UNCLEAR AS TO WHAT EXACTLY WAS BEING PROPOSED UNDER "CALCULATION OF CONTROL LEVELS" (ARTIGLE 3). HE REQUESTED FURTHER CLARIFICATION. SCIOFF WAS NOT SUFFICIENTLY WELL-VERSED ON THE EVOLUTION OF THIS ISSUE TO PROVIDE A COGENT EXPLANATION. REQUEST DEPT PROVIDE FURTHER CLARIFICATION ON THE ESSENCE OF THIS PROPOSAL.
- KANEKO FELT THAT THE USSR WOULD HAVE PROBLEMS WITH THE U.S. PROPOSALS REGARDING COMPLIANCE.
- 2. COMMENT: KANEKO SEEMED MUCH MORE OPTIMISTIC THAN IN THE PAST (REFTEL B) THAT AGREEMENT WOULD BE REACHED AT THE UPCOMING SESSIONS IN MONTREAL. WE ATTRIBUTE THIS

MOOD SHIFT IN LARGE MEASURE TO THE POSITIVE OUTCOME OF THE SMITH/SATO MEETING IN WASHINGTON. IN HIS COMMENTS, KANEKO REFERRED FREQUENTLY TO A REPORT ON THIS MEETING THAT HE HAD RECEIVED FROM THE JAPANESE EMBASSY IN WASHINGTON.

3. IN OTHER COMMENTS OF SPECIAL NOTE, KANEKO SAID DIRECTLY WHAT WE HAVE LONG SURMISED, I.E., THAT AN IMPLACABLE EC POSITION IN MONTREAL WOULD GIVE JAPAN "AN EXCUSE" TO DELAY GIVING ITS OWN CONSENT TO THE AGREEMENT. WITH RESPECT TO THE RATIFICATION PROCESS WITHIN JAPAN, KANEKO POINTED OUT THAT SOME DELAY WOULD BE UNAVOIDABLE IF JAPANESE DOMESTIC LAWS HAD TO BE CHANGED AS A RESULT OF THE PROTOCOL. WHILE STRESSING THAT ANY DELAY WOULD ONLY BE THE RESULT OF THE BUREAUCRATIC NECESSITY OF GETTING LAW CHANGES IMPLEMENTED THROUGH THE DIET, HE ADDED THAT IT WAS NOT POSSIBLE TO PREDICT HOW THIS PROCESS WOULD EVOLVE. END COMMENT.

- 1. JAPANESE EMBASSY FIRST SECRETARY FOR ENVIRONMENT KOYA ISHINO GAVE DEPTOFF GOJ RESPONSE 8/28 TO U.S. POINTS MADE IN SMITH/SATO MEETING (REF B).
- 2. ISHINO SAID THE GOJ AGREES THAT CONTROL OF CONSUMPTION (PRODUCTION PLUS IMPORTS MINUS EXPORTS TO PARTIES MINUS AMOUNTS DESTROYED) WOULD BE PREFERABLE TO CONTROL OF PRODUCTION OR OF BOTH PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION. HOWEVER, BASED ON THE EC'S STANCE AT EARLIER MEETINGS, THE GO, FEELS THAT THE EC IS LIKELY TO BE VERY RESISTANT TO CONTROLLING ONLY CONSUMPTION. DEPTOFF NOTED THAT WE HAVE HAD INDICATIONS THAT SOME IN THE EC UNDERSTAND THE PROBLEMS CREATED BY PRODUCTION CONTROLS AND THAT SEVERAL COUNTRIES (E.G., CANADA, NEW ZEALAND, AUSTRALIA) HAVE RECENTLY EXPRESSED STRONG CONCERN THAT ONLY CONSUMPTION BE CONTROLLED, USSR SUPPORTED CONSUMPTION CONTROLS EARLY IN THE NEGOTIATIONS,

AND IT IS IN THE INTEREST OF DEVELOPING COUNTRIES AND OTHER IMPORTERS THAT ONLY CONSUMPTION BE CONTROLLED IN ORDER TO AVOID SUPPLY PROBLEMS. DEPTOFF COMMENTED THAT IF THESE COUNTRIES PLUS JAPAN AND U.S. STRONGLY SUPPORT CONSUMPTION FORMULA, THE EC MAY BE CONVINCED THAT THE PROTOCOL MUST CONTROL ONLY CONSUMPTION, DESPITE THE COMMERCIAL ADVANTAGE (LOCKING IN THE EC'S VIRTUAL MONOPOLY ON EXPORTS) WHICH THE EC WOULD OBTAIN UNDER PRODUCTION CONTROLS.

3. GIVEN MFA'S PESSIMISM ON CONVINCING THE EC TO DROP PRODUCTION CONTROLS, ISHINO'S INSTRUCTIONS PROPOSED THE FOLLOWING REVISED ART. II, PARA 6:

"NOTWITHSTANDING THE PROVISION OF PARAGRAPHS 1 TO 4 OF THIS ARTICLE, BY AGREEMENT BETWEEN TWO PARTIES CONCERNED, PRODUCTIONS OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF ONE PARTY MAY EXCEED THE LEVEL OF CONTROLS APPLICABLE TO THAT PARTY, PROVIDED THAT PRODUCTIONS OF THE CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES UNDER THE JURISDICTION OF THE OTHER PARTY ARE LESS THAN THE LEVEL OF CONTROLS APPLICABLE TO THAT PARTY. IN SUCH CASES, THE SUM OF THE PRODUCTIONS OF THE TWO PARTIES SHALL NOT BE GREATER THAN THE COMBINED LEVEL'S OF CONTROLS OF PRODUCTIONS APPLICABLE TO THE TWO PARTIES PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPHS 1 TO 4. THE TWO PARTIES SHALL PROMPTLY INFORM THE SECRETARIAT OF THE AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE TWO PARTIES." THIS PROVISION WOULD ALLOW FOR THE INCREASE IN PRODUCTION BY THE NEW DUPONT 113 PLANT TO REPLACE DUPONT PRODUCTION IN THE U.S. WHICH PREVIOUSLY WAS EXPORTED TO JAPAN. DEPTOFF NOTED THAT THE PROPOSAL WOULD NOT SIMPLY ALLOW DUPONT TO RATIONALIZE ITS OPERATIONS (AS CONTROL OF CONSUMPTION ONLY WOULD ALLOW) BUT WOULD REQUIRE THE U.S. TO AGREE TO REDUCE ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION IN ORDER TO ALLOW JAPAN TO INCREASE ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION, AND THAT THIS BROAD PROPOSAL WOULD NOT APPLY JUST TO THE SPECIFIC CASE BUT WOULD BE AN OPEN-ENDED PROVISION FOR TRADING OF PRODUCTION RIGHTS. DEPTOFF PROMISED TO CIRCULATE THIS PROPOSAL TO RESPONSIBLE USG OFFICIALS, BUT NOTED THE DIFFICULT SITUATION WHICH PRODUCTION CONTROLS WOULD CREATE FOR JAPAN'S 113 PLANT ILLUSTRATES THE IMPORTANCE OF HAVING THE PROTOCOL CONTROL ONLY CONSUMPTION.

- 4. ISHINO EXPRESSED MFA'S CONCERN ABOUT GATT COMPATIBILITY OF THE PROPOSED PROTOCOL'S TRADE RESTRICTIONS. DEPTOFF SAID THAT USG HAD CONCLUDED THAT UNDER GATT ART. XX EXCEPTIONS FOR THE PROTECTION OF HEALTH AND NATURAL RESOURCES, IT WOULD NOT BE DISCRIMINATORY FOR PROTOCOL PARTIES TO IMPOSE TRADE RESTRICTIONS ON NATIONS WHICH DO NOT UNDERTAKE THE FULL LONG-TERM COMMITMENT TO PROTECTION OF THE OZONE LAYER WHICH PARTICIPATION IN THE PROTOCOL ENTAILS, EVEN IF THE NON-PARTY'S PRODUCTION OR CONSUMPTION IN A PARTICULAR YEAR IS BELOW THE LEVEL WHICH IT WOULD BE ALLOWED IF IT WERE A PARTY. DEPTOFF URGED ISHING TO DISCUSS THIS FURTHER WITH CONCERNED OFFICIAL AT USTR.
- 5. RE KANEKO'S QUERY ON "CALCULATION OF CONTROL LEVELS" REF A: "CONSUMPTION" AS ORIGINALLY PROPOSED WAS DEFINED AS PRODUCTION PLUS IMPORTS MINUS EXPORTS TO PARTIES MINUS AMOUNTS DESTROYED OR PERMANENTLY ENCAPSULATED. THE EC. HOWEVER, HAS INSISTED THAT ALL EXPORTS BE SUBTRACTED, RATHER THAN JUST EXPORTS TO PARTIES. THIS IS AN EFFORT BY THE EC, THE MAJOR EXPORTER, TO CONTINUE UNRESTRICTED PRODUCTION FOR EXPORT. EXPORTS TO PARTIES WOULD BE LIMITED, BECAUSE THE IMPORTING PARTY WOULD HAVE TO COUNT ITS IMPORTS AGAINST ITS NATIONAL ALLOCATION. BUT EXPORTS TO NON-PARTIES WOULD HAVE NO LIMIT IF THEY ARE SUBTRACTED FROM THE PRODUCING/EXPORTING COUNTRY'S CONSUMPTION. THEREFORE, AND FOR THE REASONS OUTLINED IN PARA 16 OF REF B, WE STRONGLY BELIEVE THAT ONLY EXPORTS TO PARTIES SHOULD BE SUBTRACTED. ISHINO, WHO HAS FOLLOWED THIS ISSUE CLOSELY, SEEMED TO UNDERSTAND THIS POINT, AND EVEN SUGGESTED THAT PERHAPS THE JAPANESE DELEGATION SHOULD PROPOSE REINSERTION OF THE PHRASE "TO PARTIES" IN THE DEFINITION OF CONSUMPTION.
- 6. ISHINO SAID THAT MFA AND ENVIRONMENT AGENCY CONSIDER OTHER U.S. POINTS "SOMEWHAT ACCEPTABLE," INCLUDING THE FREEZE ON HALONS, THE 50 REDUCTION OF CFC'S, AND THE REQUIREMENT FOR A CERTAIN PERCENTAGE OF PRODUCTION OR CONSUMPTION TO BE REPRESENTED FOR ENTRY INTO FORCE AND FUTURE DECISIONS. HE SAID THEY ARE NOT MAKING A FORMAL STATEMENT, HOWEVER, SINCE DOMESTIC NEGOTIATIONS ARE NOT FINISHED. HE BELIEVED THE IDEA OF A COMPLIANCE PROVISION IS ACCEPTABLE TO THE MFA AND IS NOT CONTROVERSIAL.
- 7. ISHINO EMPHASIZED THAT HIS INSTRUCTIONS EMPHASIZED THAT THE GOJ WOULD APPROACH THESE NEGOTIATIONS FLEXIBLY AND HOPED TO CONCLUDE AND SIGN AN AGREEMENT. HE NOTED THAT IN THE PAST, JAPAN HAS BEEN SEEN AS RELUCTANT, BUT THIS IS NO LONGER THE CASE. NOW THE APPROPRIATE MINISTRIES ARE WORKING HARD AND POSITIVELY ON THE ISSUE. WASHINGTON. Aug. 28 Kyodo - The likelihood has grown that the production and consumption of chloroflurocarbon (CFC) and other ozone-depleting substances may be reduced by 50 percent within eight to 10 years.

Richard Benedick, Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Ocean; and International Environmental and Scientific Affairs, said he was convinced that over 2D countries, including the U.S. and Canada, would sign a draft protocol on the issue at an international conference in Canada in mid-September.

The United Nations Environment Program's (UNEP) secretariat worked out the draft after the treaty was adopted with the support of

50 countries in March 1985.

CFC. better known as fluoric gases, are used in sprayers, refrigerators and semiconductor chips as a electric resistant, cooling madium or cleansing agent.

Reduction in crops resulting from the "greenhouse effect," which stems from climatic changes brought on by damage to the earth's brone layer, is another grave concern of environmental scientists.

Twenty-eight countries have signed the international treaty, and 10 for them have natified it; but differences regarding concrete steps to control the chemicals has stalled its implementation.

The United States has taken the lead in curtailing these substances except those for medical use.

Japan has yet to ratify the treaty because it contains no concrete control measures and because the cause-effect relationship between dissipation of fluoric gases into the air and the alleged destruction of the ozone layer has not been scientifically established.

Japan is ready: however: to support the draft protocol which will be submitted to the three-day ambassadorial conference opening in Montreal: Canada: September 14.

Prime Minister Yasuhiro Nakasone expressed the nation's readiness to cooperate with other countries to protect the ozone layer and to take domestic steps in this connection at a parliamentary panel meeting set for August 25.

Japan has already informed the U.S. of this policy shift, Hirotoshi Goto of the Environment Agency's Air Quality Protection Bureau said. ==More

According to the draft of the protocol, agreement has been reached to reduce by 50 percent the output and consumption of five environmentally destructive strains of fluoric gases: fluoride-11, 12, 113, 114, and 115 within eight to 10 years after the protocol goes into effect.

Views differ among the treaty signatory countries, however, on the standard year for setting controlled production and the restricting of such chemical trade, as well as the way to decide on stiffened controls in future, the draft shows.

The draft was obtained by Kyodo News Service from the U.S. government.

However, Benedick, who is representing the U.S. government at the ambassadorial conference, said 20 to 25 treaty nations are expected to sign the draft.

- 1. SUMMARY. FROM A QUICK READING OF THE PAPER IN REFTEL, COMMISSION STAFF OFFICIAL EXPRESSED DISAPPOINTMENT WITH THE BALANCE IN THE DISCUSSION OF CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION CONTROLS. HE AGREED WITH THE NEED TO DEVELOP A MECHANISM FOR DEALING WITH THE PROBLEM OF LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES (LCCS) AND OFFERED IDEAS FOR A POSSIBLE WAY OF DEALING WITH THE ISSUE. HE ALSO EXPLAINED THE NEED FOR TREATING THE EC AS A SINGLE UNIT, MOTING THIS POSITION HAD BEEN MANDATED BY THE COUNCIL. MOREOVER, THE ALTERNATIVE MIGHT BE SOME MEMBER STATES WOULD NOT JOIN THE PROTOCOL. END SUMMARY.
- 2. MISSION OFFICER DELIVERED TEXT OF REFTEL TO COMMISSION DG XI (ENVIRONMENT) STAFF ON AUGUST 31, DELAY BEING DUE TO ABSENCE OF OFFICIALS ON VACATION LAST WEEK. STAFF OFFICIAL GLANCED THROUGH THE PAPER AND OFFERED THAT IT CONTAINED NO GREAT SURPRISES. HE WAS A LITTLE DISAPPOINTED, HOWEVER, WITH THE EMPHASIS ON TWO ITEMS -- (1) THE BALANCE BETWEEN CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION CONTROLS AND (2) THE QUESTION OF THE EC BEING TREATED AS A SINGLE UNIT.
- 3. CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION CONTROLS

STAFF MEMBER SAID IN APRIL A POSSIBLE COMPROMISE WAS IDENTIFIED INVOLVING CONTROLS OF LIMITING CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION IN THE LONGER TERM. IF THE U.S. PAPER IS TRYING TO SAY THAT THAT COMPROMISE IS NOT ACCEPTABLE AND THAT THE U.S. IS INSISTING ON CONSUMPTION CONTROLS ALONE, THEN THE APPARENT DRAWING BACK FROM A COMPROMISE WORKED OUT IS NOT LIKELY TO BE CONDUCIVE TO REACHING AGREEMENT IN MONTREAL.

4. IF, HOWEVER, THE PAPER IS MERELY SAYING WE NOTE COMPROMISE IS THERE, BUT THE U.S. STILL HAS A BASIC PREFERENCE FOR CONSUMPTION CONTROLS ALONE, AND THE COMPROMISE COULD BE ACCEPTED, THAT'S UNDERSTANDABLE. THE OTHER SIDE OF THE COIN IS THAT THE EC STILL HAS A STRONG PREFERENCE FOR PRODUCTION ALONE, BUT IS PREPARED

TO ACCEPT A COMPROMISE. ANY ATTEMPT TO RENOUNCE THAT COMPROMISE WOULD DEFINITELY BE COUNTERPRODUCTIVE.

5. LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES

STAFF MEMBER ALSO DREW ATTENTION TO THE FOLLOWING SENTENCE IN PARAGRAPH 21 ON LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES (LCCS): "IF THE EC CONTINUES TO REJECT CONTROLLING. CONSUMPTION ALONE, WE WILL NEED TO DEVELOP A MECHANISM FOR MEETING LCC NEEDS BY ALLOWING EXEMPTION FROM PRODUCTION CONTROLS FOR EXPORTS TO LCC'S." IF THE IMPLICATION OF THAT SENTENCE IS THAT WE CAN FIND A SOLUTION TO THE LCC PROBLEM, THAT CONTROLS ON PRODUCTION AND CONSUMPTION WOULD BE ACCEPTABLE, THAT IS NOT SOMETHING THE COMMUNITY WOULD DISAGREE WITH. THE COMMISSION RECOGNIZES THE LCC PROBLEM AS A VERY DIFFICULT ONE AND IS THINKING ABOUT IT. "ALLOWING EXEMPTION FOR PRODUCTION CONTROLS" IS ONE WAY OF DOING IT. DEALING WITH THE PROBLEM WILL REQUIRE COOPERATION FROM ALL PARTIES IN MONTREAL.

- 6. HE SAID HE DISAGREES ENTIRELY, HOWEVER, WITH THE PAPER'S ARGUMENT THAT TO CONTROL CONSUMPTION ALONE WOULD SOLVE THE PROBLEM OF THE LOW CONSUMING COUNTRIES

 (LCCS). BASICALLY, IF AS HAS BEEN SUGGESTED THERE IS CONTROL ON CONSUMPTION ONLY AND THE LCCS ARE EXEMPT FROM THAT CONTROL, THEN THERE IS NOTHING TO STOP PRODUCTION FROM INCREASING, ALL THE INCREASE GOING TO THE LCCS. LCCS USE CFCS TO MANUFACTURE DOWNSTREAM PRODUCTS AND EXPORT THEM TO THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES. HE IS DISAPPOINTED WITH THE VIEW THAT CONSUMPTION CONTROL IS A SOLUTION BECAUSE HE SAYS IT IS RECOGNIZED THAT IT WILL NOT SOLVE THE PROBLEM.
- 7. STAFF OFFICIAL AGREED WE NEED TO DEVELOP A MECHANISM FOR MEETING LCC NEEDS. HE OFFERED HIS PERSONAL THOUGHTS

ON A POSSIBLE MECHANISM THAT MIGHT BE A WAY AROUND THE PROBLEM (WITH THE CAVEAT THAT THESE WERE SIMPLY IDEAS THAT HAD NOT YET BEEN DISCUSSED WITHIN THE COMMISSION). HE VIEWED THE CURRENT SITUATION AS FOLLOWS. TO TAKE A 20 PERCENT REDUCTION AS AN EXAMPLE, THE U.S. PREFERRED POSITION APPEARS TO BE THAT THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES SHOULD REDUCE THEIR CONSUMPTION ONLY BY 20 PERCENT, AND THAT THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES SHOULD BE EXEMPT. THE COMPROMISE POSITION IS THERE SHOULD BE IN GENERAL A REDUCTION OF 20 PERCENT ON BOTH PRODUCTION AND ON CONSUMPTION, EXCEPT THAT THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES SHOULD BE EXEMPT FROM CONSUMPTION CONTROLS. HE SAID THE SUGGESTION IN THE PAPER SEEMS TO BE SPECIFIC EXEMPTION FOR SPECIFIC AMOUNTS OF EXEMPTED PRODUCTS, WITH A REQUIREMENT TO SHOW THE PRODUCTS WENT TO THE LCCS.

8. HIS ALTERNATIVE PROPOSAL FOR DEALING WITH THE ISSUE WOULD BE: (1) A 20 PERCENT REDUCTION IN CONSUMPTION IN THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES; (2) AN EXEMPTION FROM CONSUMPTION CONTROLS IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES; (3) A 15 PERCENT REDUCTION IN PRODUCTION IN DEVELOPED COUNTRIES: (4) AND A FREEZE ON PRODUCTION IN DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. THIS WOULD MEAN THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES WOULD BE ABLE TO PRODUCE 85 PERCENT OF WHAT THEY PRODUCED IN 1986, BUT COULD ONLY CONSUME 80 PERCENT OF WHAT THEY CONSUMED IN 1986. THE DEVELOPED COUNTRIES COULD THEREFORE PRODUCE A SURPLUS WHICH THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES COULD COMPETE FOR IN THE MARKET. HE DOESN'T KNOW WHAT IT WOULD MEAN IN FIGURES. IT WOULD DEPEND ON WHAT PRODUCTS HAVE BEEN CONSUMED IN DEVELOPED COUNTRIES. PRODUCTION WOULD FALL IN DEVELOPED COUNTRIES AT A LOWER RATE THAN CONSUMPTION, AND SURPLUS WOULD MORE THAN MEET POSSIBLE INCREASED DEMAND FROM THE DEVELOPING COUNTRIES. THE OVERWHELMING

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ADVANTAGE WOULD BE THAT IT WOULD STILL HAVE A SPECIFIC LIMIT ON THE AMOUNT OF CFCS THAT CAN BE PRODUCED IN THE WORLD WITH NO LOOPHOLES. COMMENT. THE FIGURES USED IN THE EXAMPLE WERE FOR ILLUSTRATIVE PURPOSES ONLY. END COMMENT.

EC AS A SINGLE UNIT

STAFF OFFICIAL ALSO EXPRESSED DISAPPOINTHENT AT THE INTEREST THE US IS TAKING IN THE PAPER REGARDING THE COMMUNITY'S PLANS TO IMPLEMENT THE PROVISIONS OF THE PROTOCOL, EXPLAINING THAT ALL OF THESE QUESTIONS, I.E., WITH REGARD TO THE EC AS A SINGLE UNIT AND THE CONTROLS ON CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION, ARE INTER-RELATED. IT IS BECAUSE OF THE COMPROMISE -- THE REQUIREMENT TO CONTROL CONSUMPTION -- THAT THIS ISSUE BECAME SO IMPORTANT TO THE EC.

10. HE SAID THE ISSUE OF JUST WHAT THE CONVENTION MEANS FOR THE EC, DEPENDING ON HOW IT IS TREATED, IS OCCUPYING A GREAT DEAL OF EFFORT IN THE COMMISSION AND WITHIN MEMBER STATES, AND IS RECEIVING A GREAT DEAL OF CONSIDERATION BY LEGAL PEOPLE AS WELL. ONE VIEW EXPRESSED HAS BEEN THAT IF THE EC IS NOT TREATED AS A SINGLE UNIT, THEN THE COMMUNITY'S OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE PROTOCOL HIGHT ONLY APPLY TO CONSUMPTION AND PRODUCTION WITHIN THOSE MEMBER STATES WHO HAVE BECOME PARTIES. IF THE COMMUNITY'S RIGHTS WERE LIMITED IN THAT WAY, THEN THERE IS AN ARGUMENT THAT ITS OBLIGATIONS WOULD ALSO BE

11. WHILE AVOIDING SPECULATION AS TO WHICH MEMBER STATES WOULD OR WOULD NOT RATIFY, HE SAID THAT NOT TREATING THE EC AS A SINGLE UNIT WOULD HURT SMALLER MEMBER STATES. FOR EXAMPLE, HE NOTED THAT THERE IS A BRAND NEW FACILITY IN LUXEMBOURG THAT USES BUT DOES NOT PRODUCE CFCS. WHILE IT IS ON STREAM NOW, IT WAS NOT IN 1986. IF LUXEMBOURG WERE REQUIRED UNDER THE PROTOCOL TO LIMIT ITS CONSUMPTION OF CFCS TO 1986 LEVELS, IT WOULD HAVE NO OPTION BUT TO CLOSE THE NEW FACILITY. SOME SMALL STATES WOULD FIND IT VERY DIFFICULT TO SIGN UNDER THE CIRCUMSTANCES. HE OPINED THAT IT WAS PROBABLY BECAUSE OF THIS AND SIMILAR CONSIDERATIONS THAT THE COUNCIL'S MANDATE TO THE COMMISSION IS THAT THE EC HAS TO BE TREATED AS A SINGLE UNIT.

12. THUS, IF THE EC IS NOT TREATED AS A SINGLE UNIT, THERE ARE PROBLEMS. FIRST, THE COMMISSION WOULD HAVE FAILED THE COUNCIL'S MANDATE. SECOND, IT COULD BE ARGUED THAT IF ONLY SOME MEMBER STATES BECAME PARTIES, THE COMMUNITY WOULD ONLY HAVE TO IMPLEMENT WITH RESPECT TO THOSE STATES, AND THEREFORE THERE MIGHT BE NO CONTROLS WITH RESPECT TO OTHER MEMBER STATES.

13. COMMISSION OFFICIAL CONCEDED THAT IT MIGHT BE POSSIBLE TO A MINOR EXTENT TO LOWER EMISSIONS SLIGHTLY IN THE EC AS A WHOLE IF EVERY MEMBER STATE WERE TO IMPLEMENT INDIVIDUALLY. BUT THAT ASSUMES THAT IS THE ONLY ALTERNATIVE TO TREATING THE EC AS A SINGLE UNIT. ANOTHER ALTERNATIVE IS THAT NOT ALL MEMBER STATES JOIN THE PROTOCOL.

14. MONTREAL CONVENTION

DIRECTOR GENERAL BRINKHORST, GOFFREDO DEL BINO, AND STEVE LEE BAPTY OF DGXI WILL BE ON THE COMMUNITY'S DELEGATION TO MONTREAL. FINNISH MINISTRY OF THE ENVIRONMENT, IN THE PERSON OF STAFF ENGINEER MARKKU HEITTOMAKI, HAS RESPONDED IN DETAIL TO U.S. VIEWS ON PROPOSED PROTOCOL ON OZONE-DEPLETING SUBSTANCES (REF A) AS PROMISED EARLIER (REF B). HEITTOMAKI PREFACED HIS COMMENTS WITH THE GENERAL OBSERVATION THAT THE MONTREAL CONFERENCE'S FOUR WORKING DAYS ALLOW VERY LITTLE TIME TO DISCUSS NEW IDEAS. THE FOLLOWING COMMENTS ARE KEYED TO PARAGRAPH NUMBERS IN REF A:

PARA 5 DO NOT FAVOR CHANGE IN PROTOCOL NAME;

PARA S HALONS SHOULD BE DEALT WITH IN THE PROTOCOL IN ONE WAY OR ANOTHER. OTHER MECHANISMS BESIDES U.S. PROPOSAL ARE POSSIBLE;

AGREE WITH U.S. POSITION;

PARA 13 "OBJECTIVE OF EVENTUAL ELIMINATION" PROVISION NOT NEEDED;

PARA 17 FINNISH GATT EXPERIS DISAGREE WITH U.S. THAT TRADE BAN FOR NON-PARTIES IS CONSISTENT WITH GATT. FINLAND FEARS THAT NON-PARTIES WOULD SUE:

PARA 18 AS A SMALL COUNTRY WITH HEAVY DEPENDENCE ON TRADE, FINLAND CANNOT SUPPORT CONTROL OF TRADE, AND DOES NOT HAVE LEGISLATION TO IMPLEMENT IT;

PARA 21 BASICALLY, ARE NOT IN FAVOR OF THIS PROPOSAL, WHICH THEY SEE AS VERY NEW AND WHICH RISKS CREATING A MONOPOLY SITUATION:

PARA 24 SEE REF B REGARDING FINNISH VIEWS ON ENTRY INTO FORCE REQUIREMENTS;
