ENTERTAINMENT, GOVERNMENT, POLITICS,
LEARNING, CULTURE AND SCIENCE, THE AMERICAN
PEOPLE HONOR YOU TODAY. EACH OF YOU HAS
ACHIEVED THAT HARDEST OF ALL THINGS TO
ACHIEVE IN THIS LIFE -- SOMETHING THAT WILL

COUNT BASIE - POSTHUMOUS

RECEIVED BY HIS SON, AARON WOODWARD

FOR MORE THAN HALF A CENTURY,
WILLIAM "COUNT" BASIE ENRAPPED THE PEOPLE
OF AMERICA WITH HIS BRILLIANT AND INNOVATIVE
WORK IN THE FIELD OF JAZZ. IN THE 1930'S
AND 1940'S, THE COUNT BECAME PART OF THE
FABRIC OF AMERICAN LIFE AS THE LEADER OF ONE

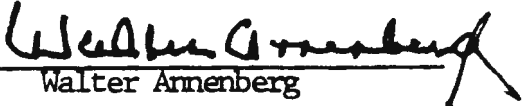

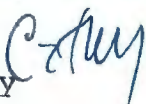
