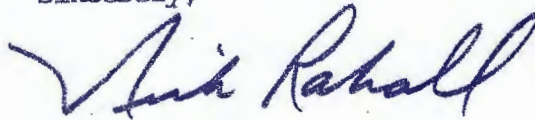

1. Petty Officer Gray applied for recall to active duty to the Commander, Naval Military Personnel Command (NMPC-212) on 4 June 1982.

2. Petty Officer Gray was informed on 5 August 1982, by LCDR L. R. Leggitt of the NMPC Augmentation, Resignation, Reenlistment and Recall Division that his application was turned down due to the fact that his rating (Aviation Structural Mechanic) had no positions open.

3. Petty Officer Gray has a Veterans' Administration certified 20% service-connected disability for hearing loss.

4. The following is a chronological summary of correspondence between the Department of the Navy and Congressman Rahall concerning AMSl Jerry Gray, USNFR:

a. Enclosure (1): From Congressman Rahall to CDR Joyce Weber, OLA, requesting assistance in recalling AMSl Gray to active duty.

b. Enclosure (2): From Congressman Rahall to CDR Joyce Weber, OLA, requesting assistance in recalling AMSl Gray to active duty, adding that AMSl Gray would prefer to be stationed on the West Coast.

c. Enclosure (3): From W. J. Dickinson, NMPC-03Cl, to Congressman Rahall stating that AMSl Gray should officially apply for recall through the appropriate channels.

d. Enclosure (4): From Congressman Rahall to Mr. Dickinson, NMPC-03Cl, requesting assistance in recalling AMSl Gray to active duty.

e. Enclosure (5): From W. J. Dickinson, NMPC-03Cl, to Congressman Rahall indicating that AMSl Gray's application was received by NMPC on 28 June 1982.

f. Enclosure (6): From Congressman Rahall to President Reagan requesting assistance in recalling AMS1 Gray to active duty.

g. Enclosure (7): From Mr. John S. Herrington, then the Assistant Secretary of the Navy for Manpower and Reserve Affairs, on behalf of the President to Congressman Rahall indicating that AMS1 Gray should contact his local Navy recruiter to determine the opportunities for recall to active duty. As of 8 August 1983, AMS1 Gray had not contacted the recruiters recommended in this letter.

h. Enclosure (8): From Congressman Rahall to Assistant Secretary Herrington requesting his assistance in recalling AMS1 Gray to active duty.

i. Enclosure (9): From LT Cruze, NMPC-03C1, responding for Assistant Secretary Herrington, to Congressman Rahall stating the reasons for which AMS1 Gray's request for recall was turned down by NMPC.

5. Currently, there is little demand for recalled petty officers during the rest of this fiscal year. This is especially true in the Aviation Structural Mechanic rating. A similar prognosis holds for the next fiscal year. Petty Officer Gray should keep in touch with his local recruiter should the needs of the Navy change.

Dear Senator Matsunaga:

We want to thank you for the work you are doing on behalf of world peace, and for the support you have given to the Nuclear Freeze concept. It is clear that great strides have been made in the peacemaking arena during recent months, especially with regard to public awareness of the world nuclear situation. Each one of us in Hawaii can consider ourselves fortunate that our legislature--Congressmen Heftel and Akaka, and Senator Inouye and yourself--have taken a strong stand in favor of the Freeze and the vision of a world without nuclear weapons.

At this time, we are requesting your support in another related area. In late July, a delegation of about two dozen individuals from Hawaii, representing Ground Zero/Hawaii, *The Pacific Journal of Peace*, and the Hawaii Coalition for a Nuclear Freeze, will be traveling to Washington, D.C., and then on to Moscow on what we are calling an "Aloha Peace Journey". The purpose of our trip will be to promote peace, good will, and cultural exchange between the two countries--and, hopefully, to establish a "Sister Cities" relationship between Honolulu and Sochi, a resort community in the USSR.

We will also be hand-carrying copies of the Nuclear Freeze petitions from Hawaii, with the intention of personally presenting them to the heads of state of the two governments. In this way, we will be representing the approximately 50,000 individuals in Hawaii who will have signed our petition by the time of our journey.

(As you may know, the Nuclear Freeze concept in Hawaii has received the support of Governor Ariyoshi, Lieutenant Governor John Waihee, and the majority of our elected officials throughout

the State; our City Council in Honolulu and the Hawaii State Legislature have both enacted Freeze Resolutions; and, of course, the U.S. House has now passed a resolution calling for a mutual US/USSR Freeze.)

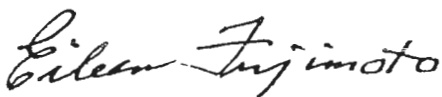
→ We would like to coordinate the "official" part of our trip through your office, and ideally have you and Senator Inouye as well as Congressmen Akaka and Heftel join us in presenting our petitions to the President or his representative. We also need your help in coordinating our trip through the State Department so that we can present copies of our petition to Mr. Andropov or his representative in Moscow. (And we would be thrilled if you and any of our other legislators will be able to accompany us on the trip to the Soviet Union!)

We spoke briefly with Vincent Versage in your Washington office by telephone last week, and he suggested that we write you about our needs, as well as send copies of the letter to the other legislators, which we are doing. Enclosed for your further information is a copy of the Sister Cities Resolution that is being presented to the Mayor and City Council in Honolulu, a copy of our planned itinerary, and a copy of the May issue of *The Pacific Journal of Peace*, which has a little more information on the Aloha Peace Journey.

We realize that time is short and that there is a great deal yet to be done. We very much appreciate your help in this matter.

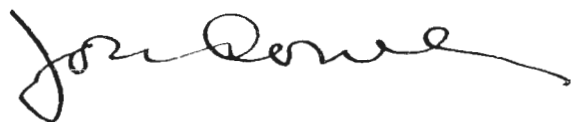

PUTTING a Bible in the hands of every school child and returning voluntary prayer to the classroom is the goal of the Rev. Cecil Todd.

The evangelist is the founder and director of the Revival Fires Ministries of Joplin, Mo., and the person most-often credited with convincing President Ronald Reagan to publicly support a constitutional amendment to return voluntary prayer to the public schools.

Todd was the keynote speaker at the Faith and Freedom rally at the First Assembly of God Church in Aberdeen last week. Before the meeting he spoke with the Aberdeen American News about his beliefs on voluntary prayer and Bibles in public schools.

"It seems tragic that students today can smoke,

buy drugs, get birth control pills and even have abortions, but cannot pray and read the Bible in school," says Todd, who has been crusading for voluntary prayer and Bible reading in public schools ever since the Supreme Court ruled such action unconstitutional 20 years ago this coming Friday.

"Since that infamous decision, things have not been the same in our schools or in our country. That decision was slapping God in the face. If the House and Senate members need prayer each day—and they do—why deny it to the children? They need it just as much. A good dose of the Holy Ghost will not only be good for the kids' eternal needs, it will help them be better kids all around," says Todd.

The minister, who rattles off facts and figures on youth abortions, suicides and drug use as easily as

most people recite the alphabet, has a saying: "When God speaks, E.F. Hutton, the Supreme Court, the American Civil Liberties Union and all the rest better listen."

Todd says he believes God is speaking—through weather and disasters. "Those things are acts of God, not man. God is using them to get our attention and let us know He's unhappy with that 20-year-old decision."

The evangelist and his teams have conducted America for Jesus crusades across the country in an effort to accomplish his goals. While most of the people attending the rallies are signing petitions to get the Bible and prayer back in the classroom, there is some opposition, admits Todd. "Most of it comes from people who are misguided, from the secular humanism crowd and those who have an indifferent attitude toward God, the Bible and prayer. There's also opposition from school officials," says Todd.

In spite of the opposition, Todd has engineered a crusade which has caught the national spotlight. Last April he delivered 1 million petitions calling for the return of prayer to the public schools to President Reagan. Three weeks later, the President announced he would support an amendment allowing voluntary Bible reading and prayer in public schools.

Currently Todd is collecting signatures on a petition longer than three football fields. He hopes to present the petition to House Speaker Tip O'Neill and Senate Majority Leader Howard Baker after Congress returns from its July Fourth recess.

By that time Todd expects to have collected 100,000 signatures on the scroll. Among the names close to the top of the list is that of William Murphy, the defendant in the 1963 court case which banned prayer and Bible reading in public schools.

The petition is aimed at getting some form of Congressional action and Todd says, "If we can get the support of the people in Washington, we could see prayer and the Bible back in the schools this fall."

For action to come that quickly, Congress would have to act in a way other than by constitutional amendment which requires two-thirds of the states to approve the amendment before ratification can take place. One alternative, according to Todd, is a Congressional resolution. "Of course there is the possibility there (resolution) the action could be declared unconstitutional by the Supreme Court," says Todd.

The evangelist wants to return the power and authority of what goes on in schools to the local level. "I want to make it the people's choice; let each community decide what best suits its needs. I don't expect to find Christian education in a primarily Jewish community for example, but I would like to see that community have the right to decide what it wants for its children.

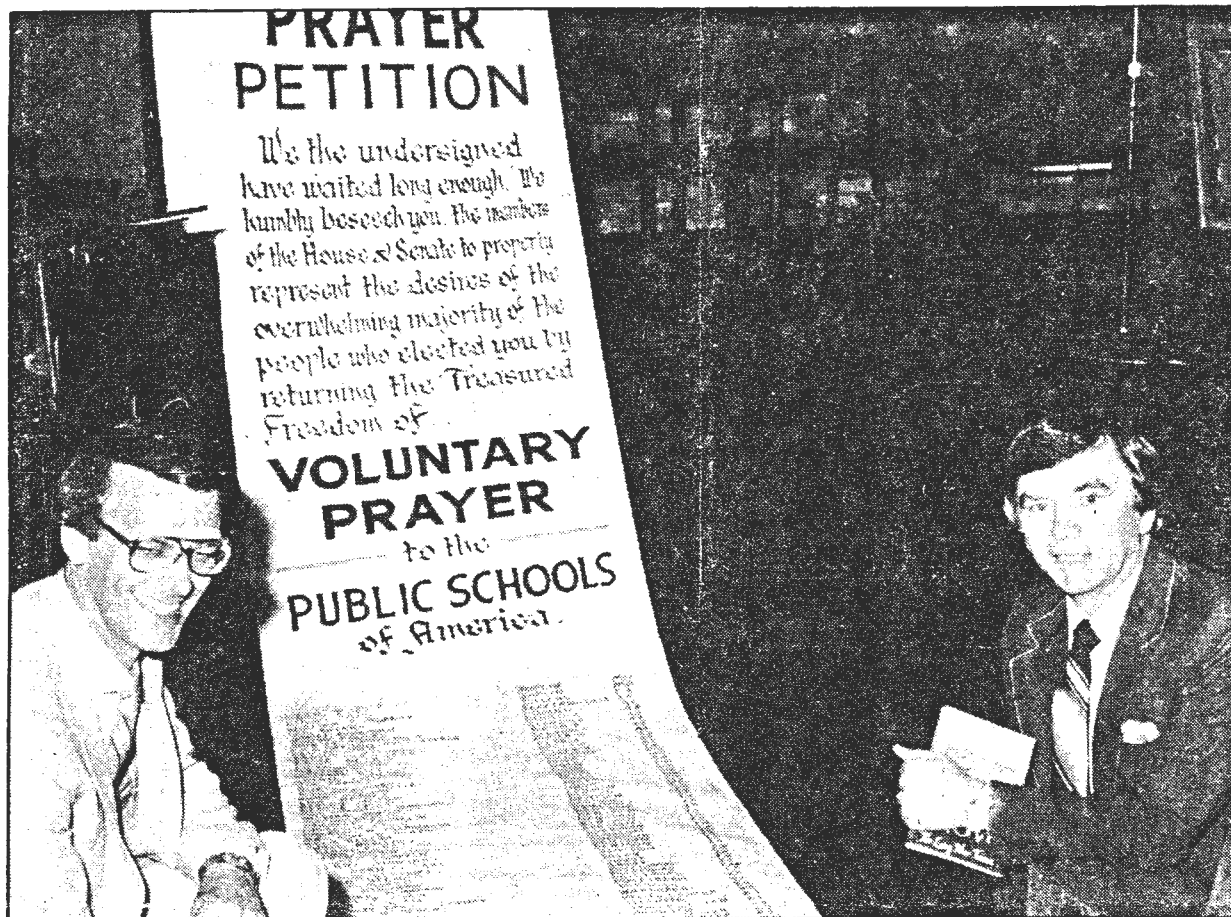
"I don't like to see the minority dictating to the majority and that's what has been happening for 20 years," Todd points to a Gallup survey to support his claim. "That survey shows 85 percent of Americans would like to have the chance to return prayer and the Bible to the public school," says Todd.

While Todd continues his crusade for Congressional action, he is putting Bibles in the hands of school children. Because this is the Year of the Bible (by presidential proclamation), Todd has doubled his annual goal of distributing 50,000 free "Love" Bibles to youth. The students receive a Bible on the promise they will carry it to school.

"The response has been tremendous," says Todd. "After I visited one city and passed out Bibles, I had a request from one of the school officials to provide a Bible for every student in school—all 2,500 of them. Why? Because that official said he saw a dramatic change in the students who had received the Bibles and were using them."

In another town, a student told Todd he would get on his bicycle and deliver a Bible to everyone in his class if Todd would provide the Bibles.

"The Bibles cost me about \$5 each. I think that is the best investment I could make in a young person," says Todd.

Evangelists carry message through petition, music

Cecil Todd, an evangelist who delivered one million prayer petitions to President Reagan last year, is now working on a petition which he will present to Congress in mid-July to allow prayer in public schools.

The petition is "longer than three football fields," said Todd of the 1,000-foot document. It is transported to the crusades across the nation in a van, he added.

Todd, who has ministered in 55 nations around the world, held a crusade Sunday evening in Brookings.

As many as 2,500 names are projected to be added to the petition as a result of last night's rally, according to Todd.

Todd's "divine urge" to institute prayer into the school system comes partially from personal experiences with his son who had a recent "brush with death."

He said that his son succumbed to the peer pressure, which resulted

from a lack of religion in the schools. "Too many kids today have made Jesus a joke and the Bible a forbidden book," he said.

Todd said "the power needs to be returned to the people."

"They are public schools, not government schools. This is a democracy. If we can get the government out, we can get God back in," he said.

Todd said that he hopes his petition will have an impact on Congress, and that although it is "only 100,000 signatures that they will be looked upon as representative signatures."

Todd is being accompanied on his crusade by Evangelist Aaron Patrick who serves the Lord as an Elvis impersonator.

"The world cries out to be entertained," said Patrick who is a born-again Christian.

"I have reminded people of Elvis all my life," said the dark-complected man from Tulsa, Okla.

Patrick began his imitations seven years ago, and although his life was

leading to money and fame, he said he found himself "feeling empty."

"Music has power," said Patrick. "Before I was singing to people's weaknesses and feeding their sins. Now I tell them how to have life."

The 37-year-old singer gives testimonials and teaches as well.

He said that people may misunderstand what he is doing.

"There is no such thing as a Christian entertainer," he said.

"You can't take a stand like Cecil Todd and I and expect to be popular," he said. "People think it's a joke."

"This is the first time in my life I've been happy," he said.

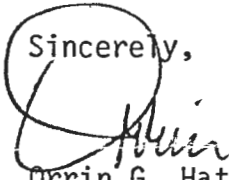
This is to respectfully request the opportunity to meet with you for a brief period to discuss S.J. Res 73, the proposed constitutional amendment relating to school prayer. Could we meet some time on Wednesday, June 8.

As you may know, the Senate Subcommittee on the Constitution, on which I serve as Chairman, has already postponed two proposed 'mark-up' sessions on this amendment in response to requests from the Administration. A third effort at 'mark-up' is now scheduled for Thursday, June 9.

Because of the differences that have apparently arisen between the Administration and Members of the Subcommittee on this extremely important measure, I believe that a meeting to discuss this could prove extremely valuable. I would request that Senator Thurmond and Senator Grassley, the other Republican members of the Subcommittee, also be permitted to join this meeting.

I am extremely concerned that there seems to be increasing potential for collision between the Administration and the Republican Members of the Subcommittee on an issue where there is equal potential for a substantial legislative victory on the part of the Administration. Thank you for your consideration of this request.

The National Safety Council is most interested in drawing national attention to "National Safe Boating Week" which will be observed June 5-11, and which is promoted by the United States Coast Guard. We very much would like to arrange a presentation of the first 1983 safe boating poster to president Reagan to coincide with the Presidential Proclamation announcing "National Safe Boating Week."

There are these points:

1. John Bernhartsen, who is with the U.S. Coast Guard at 210 Second Street, N.W., Washington, will have either the USCG Commandant or the Vice Commandant present at the White House for the brief ceremonies. (He is at 472-2373)
2. Depending on the date selected, Mr. T. C. Gilchrest, Executive Vice President & Acting President of the National Safety Council, will be present, or certainly will send a top representative.
3. Bill Seaton, director of corporate public relations for Sea World, San Diego, will make a "walk-around" of Shamu available. The National Safety Council has named Shamu as the spokeswhale for water safety this year. Sea World is funding the safe boating posters which will be distributed to marinas across the nation to promote boating safety. I believe you and Joe Holmes, director of military TV and radio services, know Bill.

The presentation of the safe boating poster to President Reagan, if this can be arranged, would be by the USCG Commandant, or Vice Commandant, and Mr. Gilchrest, with the Shamu walk-around on hand. Enclosed is a photo taken of Captain Wendell Driggers, USCG Deputy Chief, and Ms. Peggy Brock of our Public Safety Department, and the walk-around Shamu.
