Last Day for Action

As soon as possible and before June 6, the day being designated
"D-Day National Remembrance Day."

Discussion

June 6, 1984, is the 40th anniversary of the D-Day invasion of Normandy during World War II. In commemoration of this event, and in tribute to those killed during the assault, H. J. Res. 487 designates June 6, 1984, as "D-Day National Remembrance Day" and requests the President to issue a proclamation calling upon the people of the United States to observe such day with appropriate ceremonies and activities.

The enrolled resolution passed the House and the Senate by voice vote. A draft proclamation, prepared in cooperation with the Department of Defense, has been forwarded for your consideration.
