BACKGROUND FOR MRS. REAGAN'S TEA WITH MRS. MUBARAK ON JANUARY 27 AT 11:00 A.M.

Mrs. Suzan Mubarak is accompanying her husband during his working visit to the United States. She will be in Washington on January 26-28 and will then fly to New York for one day before leaving for Canada.

This will be Mrs. Mubarak's third visit to the U.S. She was here last during the State visit of February 1982 when you met her. While in Washington, she will tour the Smithsonian and attend a dinner hosted by Vice President and Mrs. Bush. She will also give a speech on Egyptian education at American University and will be guest of honor at luncheons hosted by Mrs. Shultz and Mrs. Percy.

The visit of President and Mrs. Mubarak is important for U.S.-Egyptian relations. Egypt is one of our closest allies in the Middle East and is a principal partner in our search for peace in that region. President Mubarak has repeatedly affirmed his strong support for the President's September 1 peace initiative for the Middle East. We will discuss with him the peace process and our very large (roughly \$1 billion this year) economic assistance program with Egypt.

Mrs. Mubarak is knowledgeable about world affairs and is influential with her husband in some matters. She is particularly interested in promoting public services and community involvement to help the urban poor. This was the focus of her Masters Degree studies in the sociology of education at the American University of Cairo. She has also organized groups which emphasize self-help and voluntarism as a way of helping the poor. For example, she has set up school lunch programs to fight malnutrition, reading programs, youth centers and anti-pollution efforts. She has expressed an interest in locating audio-visual aids in the U.S. (such as Arabic language tapes) that will assist young children to develop better reading skills.

TALKING POINTS

- -- Emphasize how appreciative you and the President are of President and Mrs. Mubarak's visit.
- -- Reiterate the importance of our close relationship with Egypt and the value we attach to Mubarak's support of President Reagan's peace initiative.
- -- Inquire about the many self-help oriented organizations which Mrs. Mubarak has created. Specifically, you could ask about the construction of a youth center (with U.S. economic assistance) in the Heliopolis district of Cairo--one of her projects.
- -- Explain your own efforts to sponsor programs to help young people in the United States.
