I hate to beat a supposedly dead horse, but I fear this story is going to jump up and bite us once the attention is diverted from the budget, etc.

Although this was not a government-to-government sale/purchase, that is of little consequence as long as it was approved by Energy and State. The explanation -- that the price was right -- is not the right mirage. Yet that is banishing what Energy spokesman said.

There is no official, legal boycott in existence; up to now, and since January 21, 1982 there was a de facto one, which would appear to now be lifted.

STATEMENT BY THE PRINCIPAL DEPUTY
PRESS SECRETARY TO THE PRESIDENT

The United States Government has remained from the beginning, and will remain, neutral in the war between Iran and Iraq. We remain deeply concerned, however, about the continuation of this conflict and the attendant loss of life and destruction. The United States supports the independence and territorial integrity of both Iran and Iraq, as well as that of other states in the region. In keeping with our policy worldwide, we oppose the seizure of territory by force. We urge an immediate end to hostilities and a negotiated settlement. We support constructive international efforts for a peaceful solution to the conflict on the basis of each state's respect for the territorial integrity of its neighbors and each state's freedom from external coercion. In keeping with this policy we have joined with other members of the United Nations Security Council in 1980 and on July 12 of this year in resolutions calling for an end to the conflict.

Our support for the security of friendly states in the region which might feel threatened by the conflict is well known and the United States is prepared to consult with these states on appropriate steps to support their security.

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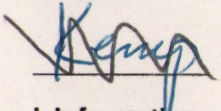

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The Iran/Iraq War and the Oil Market of 1982

In the first part of July, just prior to the current Iranian offensive, Iran was producing about 2.5 MMB/D and Iraq was producing 0.7 MMB/D. Combined production from Iran and Iraq was supplying approximately 7.3 percent of the Free World's estimated consumption of 44.0 MMB/D.

A temporary loss of oil production and exports from the two warring countries could be readily offset by increased production elsewhere. Table 1 shows that estimated unused crude oil production capacity outside of Iran and Iraq is currently 6.7 to 10.4 MMB/D, with the upper end of the range reflecting the ability of several producers to temporarily increase production above preferred levels if they should decide to do so.

Table 2 and 2a show the relative dependencies of IEA countries on oil imports from Iran and Iraq during the first half of 1982 and estimates for the most recent two months, June and July. Turkey is by far the most dependent IEA country. Imports from Iran and Iraq account for approximately 60 percent of Turkey's net imports and 55 percent of Turkey's overall oil needs. The other countries with relatively high dependence on oil imports from Iran and Iraq include the Netherlands, Portugal, Spain, Italy and Greece. In the first half of 1982, the U.S. depended on Iran and Iraq for only 0.2 percent of its overall oil requirements and 1.0 percent of its net oil imports.

While the dependencies of several of the IEA countries on oil supplies from Iran and Iraq are relatively high, the overall volumes of oil are relatively small; accounting for 170 MB/D in the case of Turkey, for example, during the first half of 1982. The IEA as a whole imported approximately 1.3 MMB/D from Iran and Iraq during the first half of this year. In addition, inventories in most countries, including those countries with relatively high dependencies on oil from Iran and Iraq, are still relatively high in terms of days of forward consumption and days of net oil imports.

Nevertheless, in the period immediately ahead, until more becomes known about the scale of the fighting, the extent of possible damage to oil production and export facilities, and the willingness of other countries to increase their production, spot markets for crude oil and petroleum products could become nervous. However, in the absence of an escalation of the fighting to other countries outside of Iran and Iraq, and with an increase in production from other countries with spare capacity, there is little reason to expect that a temporary runup in spot market prices will result in a lasting increase of term-contract prices of any significant magnitude.
