SUBJECT: Reply from President Mitterrand

WPC

Attached at Tab I is a first translation of the reply we received last night from President Mitterrand to your letter (Tab II) concerning the handling of East-West economic relations at the Williamsburg Summit. You proposed to handle the subject in a low-key way at Williamsburg so long as there will be concrete achievements in the various studies being conducted in other bodies. Your letter enumerated just what those concrete achievements should be.

A first reading of Mitterrand's reply makes it clear that he is interested in the kind of arrangement you proposed. In each of the study areas he has stated frankly which aspects will cause him problems. We will review our own positions to see if there is sufficient common ground. What is important is that Mitterrand has made a warm, detailed and forthright reply to your proposal, and appears ready to work with us privately to find the common ground on these subjects and avoid a public quarrel.

We will forward to you shortly a more detailed analysis of the reply and an evaluation of whether we can work out a satisfactory compromise. If we cannot, then our fallback option will be to "agree to disagree" on this subject at Williamsburg.

DEAR FRANCOIS:

I HAVE FOLLOWED THE BOLD DOMESTIC ECONOMIC MEASURES ANNOUNCED BY YOUR GOVERNMENT WITH INTEREST. THEY ARE A COURAGEOUS EFFORT TO ENSURE A SUSTAINED NON-INFLATIONARY RECOVERY FOR FRANCE, AND I WISH YOU EVERY SUCCESS AND GOOD FORTUNE IN THIS EFFORT.

AS THE WILLIAMSBURG SUMMIT NEARS, I WANT TO REAFFIRM OUR STRONG MUTUAL DESIRE FOR HARMONIOUS AND CONSTRUCTIVE MEETINGS TO ADDRESS THE CRUCIAL ISSUES OF GLOBAL ECONOMIC GROWTH AND PROSPERITY. IN GENERAL, I AM SATISFIED WITH PROGRESS IN PREPARATION FOR WILLIAMSBURG, AND I AM GRATEFUL FOR YOUR COOPERATION AND SUPPORT.

I HAVE BEEN INFORMED OF THE CONCERNS EXPRESSED BY YOUR REPRESENTATIVE AT THE RECENT SAN DIEGO MEETING, PARTICULARLY REGARDING THE AGENDA ITEM ON EAST-WEST ECONOMIC RELATIONS. IT IS IMPORTANT THAT WE UNDERSTAND ONE ANOTHER FULLY ON THIS ISSUE

AND HAVE A TIMELY EXCHANGE OF VIEWS IN ORDER TO AVOID THE POSSIBILITY OF IT AGAIN EMERGING AS A CONTENTIOUS PUBLIC ISSUE BETWEEN US. THE ISSUE IS A COMPLEX ONE AND REQUIRES CARE TO FASHION THE BEST WAY TO ADDRESS COMMON CONCERNS WHILE RESPECTING NATIONAL SOVEREIGNTIES. I AM CONFIDENT THIS BALANCE CAN BE ACHIEVED. AS I HAVE OFTEN STATED, OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH FRANCE IS OF VITAL IMPORTANCE TO THE UNITED STATES AND THE CAUSE OF WESTERN FREEDOM. OUR OVERRIDING COMMON INTERESTS PROVIDE US WITH THE STRENGTH AND FLEXIBILITY TO OVERCOME ANY DIFFERENCES IN APPROACH. YOUR MOST RECENT COMMUNICATION ON INF HAS ENCOURAGED ME GREATLY AND ILLUSTRATES THE DEPTH OF THESE INTERESTS. MOREOVER, I BELIEVE WE SHARE THE FUNDAMENTAL ASSESSMENT THAT OUR HEAVY DEFENSE BURDENS SHOULD NOT BE MADE MORE DIFFICULT BY OUR ECONOMIC POLICIES TOWARDS THE SOVIET UNION.

IT IS MY UNDERSTANDING THAT YOUR FUNDAMENTAL CONCERNS ARE THESE: FIRST, THAT IN THE AREA OF EAST-WEST ECONOMIC RELATIONS WE CREATE NO NEW MULTILATERAL BODIES WHICH WILL INFRINGE ON NATIONAL DECISIONS; SECOND, THAT NO NEW MULTILATERAL WESTERN POLICIES ON EAST-WEST TRADE BE ANNOUNCED AT THE WILLIAMSBURG SUMMIT ITSELF. ON THE FIRST POINT, I CAN ASSURE YOU THAT WE ARE IN AGREEMENT. THE SECOND POINT SEEMS TO ME TO BE ONE ESSENTIALLY OF PUBLIC PRESENTATION. AS SECRETARY SHULTZ AND FOREIGN MINISTER CHEYSSON AGREED LAST YEAR, WHAT IS IMPORTANT IS TO ACCOMPLISH THE WORK ON THESE QUESTIONS IN THE APPROPRIATE BODIES OF THE OECD, IEA, COCOM AND NATO. THE WORK ACCOMPLISHED IN THESE APPROPRIATE FORA CAN AND SHOULD STAND ON ITS OWN WITHOUT UNDUE PUBLICITY AT THE SUMMIT OR THE APPEARANCE THAT THESE RESULTS HAVE EMERGED FROM THE SUMMIT ITSELF.

MY STRONG HOPE IS THAT THE WORK IN THESE OTHER BODIES WILL PROGRESS SATISFACTORILY BETWEEN NOW AND THE SUMMIT. IF THAT IS THE CASE, I ENVISION THE OUTCOME AND PUBLIC PRESENTATION OF OUR DISCUSSIONS ON THIS SUBJECT AT WILLIAMSBURG TO BE QUITE LIMITED. THE HEADS WOULD ENDORSE AND ENCOURAGE THE CONCRETE PROGRESS AND PRELIMINARY RESULTS ACHIEVED IN THE OTHER INSTITUTIONS AND

RECOGNIZE THE IMPORTANT BENEFIT TO THE WEST OF THIS ON-GOING WORK.

SINCE IT IS CRITICAL THAT THE WORK IN THESE OTHER ORGANIZATIONS BE FAR ENOUGH ALONG THAT WE DO NOT HAVE TO BELABOR THESE ISSUES AT THE SUMMIT, I THOUGHT IT USEFUL TO DESCRIBE FOR YOU WHAT I ANTICIPATE CAN AND WILL BE ACHIEVED IN THE VARIOUS WORK PROGRAMS BY THE TIME OF THE WILLIAMSBURG SUMMIT:

IN COCOM, WE ARE WORKING TOWARD A CONSENSUS ON AN AGREEMENT TO IMPLEMENT IMMEDIATELY CONTROLS ON ITEMS ALREADY AGREED TO DURING THE FIRST ROUND OF THE LIST REVIEW; ON AGREEMENT IN PRINCIPLE TO CONTROL OR WATCH SO-CALLED "DISEMBODIED TECHNOLOGIES" AND EMERGING TECHNOLOGIES; ON EARLY AGREEMENT IN THE LIST REVIEW ON THE HIGH-PRIORITY ITEMS OF COMMUNICATIONS SWITCHING EQUIPMENT, COMPUTER HARDWARE AND SOFTWARE AND ROBOTICS; ON SEVERAL TECHNICAL AND ADMINISTRATIVE MEASURES TO IMPROVE THE EFFECTIVENESS OF BOTH NATIONAL ENFORCEMENT MEASURES AND THE COCOM SECRETARIAT; AND ON AGREEMENT TO CONDUCT A STUDY ON OTHER HIGH TECHNOLOGY ITEMS, INCLUDING OIL AND GAS EQUIPMENT.

IN THE AREA OF ENERGY SECURITY, THE CONCLUSIONS PROPOSED BY ULF LANTZKE OF THE IEA ARE FULLY SATISFACTORY TO US AND SHOULD BE THE BASIS FOR AGREEMENT BY THE IEA AND ENDORSEMENT AT THE OECD MINISTERIAL. THOSE CONCLUSIONS OF PARTICULAR INTEREST INCLUDE AN AGREEMENT TO LIMIT NON-OECD GAS IMPORTS FROM ANY ONE SUPPLIER TO 30 PERCENT OF TOTAL GAS SUPPLIES; ENCOURAGEMENT OF ACCELERATED DEVELOPMENT OF MAJOR WESTERN ALTERNATIVES, ESPECIALLY THE TROLL FIELD; AND UNDERTAKING SECURITY MEASURES TO PROTECT AGAINST GAS SUPPLY DISRUPTIONS.

THE STUDY UNDERWAY IN THE NATO ECONOMIC COMMITTEE, ABLY LED BY FRANCE'S REPRESENTATIVE, IS MAKING AVAILABLE VALUABLE NEW INFORMATION ON THE SECURITY DIMENSIONS OF EAST-WEST TRADE TO GUIDE US IN FORMULATING INDEPENDENTLY OUR POLICIES IN THIS AREA IN THE FUTURE. THE NATO MINSITERIAL IN JUNE, WHICH FOLLOWS THE

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WILLIAMSBURG SUMMIT, IS EXPECTED TO DRAW IMPORTANT CONCLUSIONS FROM THIS WORK AND TO STRENGTHEN THE ECONOMIC COMMITTEE TO CONTINUE ITS WORK IN THIS AREA IN THE FUTURE.

I TAKE SOME CARE IN DESCRIBING THESE ANTICIPATED RESULTS BECAUSE I WANT YOU TO KNOW MY THINKING AND TO ASK YOU TO CONTINUE TO ENCOURAGE THIS WORK IN EVERY WAY POSSIBLE TO ACHIEVE EXPEDITIOUS RESULTS. I HAVE NO DESIRE TO ACCORD EAST-WEST ECONOMIC RELATIONS A PROMINENT POSITION IN THE SUMMIT AGENDA OR IN THE PUBLIC DISCUSSION AROUND THE SUMMIT. I AM FAR MORE CONCERNED THAT WE ACHIEVE THE REAL RESULTS BEING DEVELOPED IN THE OTHER ORGANIZATIONS. IT WOULD BENEFIT ONLY THE SOVIET UNION IF EITHER OF OUR COUNTRIES FELT IT NECESSARY TO HIGHLIGHT DIFFERENCES ON THESE ISSUES IN A PUBLIC WAY. AND THIS CAN ONLY HAPPEN IF WE FAIL TO COMMUNICATE NOW WITH CLARITY AND CANDOR ABOUT OUR EXPECTATIONS FOR THE RESULTS OF CURRENT EFFORTS IN THESE BODIES AND SPECIFIC SUBSTANTIVE CONCERNS ON PROGRESS TO BE ACHIEVED BY THE TIME OF THE SUMMIT.

IF IT IS ALSO YOUR UNDERSTANDING THAT BY MID-MAY WE WILL HAVE ACHIEVED THE SPECIFIC RESULTS I HAVE INDICATED, WE COULD AT THAT TIME AGREE UPON THE PUBLIC PRESENTATION OF THIS ISSUE IN CONNECTION WITH THE SUMMIT INCLUDING HOW WE HANDLE IT IN THE JOINT PRESS STATEMENT. A PREDETERMINED ACCORD BETWEEN US ON THE PUBLIC HANDLING OF THIS AGENDA ITEM WILL ALMOST CERTAINLY ENSURE THE OVERALL SUCCESS OF THE SUMMIT FOR ALL PARTICIPANTS AT A VITAL MOMENT IN THE WORLD'S ECONOMIC DESTINY.

I WOULD APPRECIATE RECEIVING YOUR VIEWS AND EXPECTATIONS ON THESE ISSUES. I ALSO HOPE THAT WE CAN MEET TOGETHER PERSONALLY PRIOR TO THE SUMMIT AND WILL BE IN TOUCH WITH YOU SHORTLY ABOUT POSSIBLE TIME AND PLACE. I AM DETERMINED TO USE EVERY OPPORTUNITY AND RESOURCE AT MY DISPOSAL TO EXERCISE STRONG MUTUAL LEADERSHIP WITH YOU AND OUR OTHER SUMMIT PARTNERS TO ACHIEVE A UNIFIED SUMMIT THAT MARKS QUIET PROGRESS ON SECURITY-RELATED ECONOMIC ISSUES AND RALLIES PUBLIC CONFIDENCE ON THE CRUCIAL ISSUES OF ECONOMIC GROWTH AND EMPLOYMENT FOR OUR FREE SOCIETIES.



Dear Francois:

With our Summit meeting now behind us, I would like to express my appreciation for the significant contribution you made to the success of Williamsburg. I personally am very satisfied that as a result of our meeting, and in particular the spirit of cooperation which marked our discussions, we have projected a strong message of unity among the world's largest industrialized democracies. That message, both in its economic and political dimensions, was crucial at this time of questioning in our countries and of challenge from the Soviet Union and its allies.

If I take satisfaction in this, I believe you should also take satisfaction in having drawn our attention to the critical issue of the world monetary system. Your presentation gave a focus to our discussion of key issues affecting both industrialized and developing nations. In this connection, the concerns you expressed regarding the special problems of developing nations are, I believe, fully reflected in our joint statement. That statement, the "Williamsburg Declaration on Economic Recovery," was a victory for the future, laying out as it did the key principles of non-inflationary growth, open markets, adequate liquidity and economic stability which can guide the budding recovery. I sincerely believe the words I used to conclude the press statement: "Our meeting has shown a spirit of confidence, optimism and certainty-- confidence that recovery is underway, optimism that it will be durable, and certainty that economic policy and security ties among us will be strengthened in the future." to our unity of purpose, sent a signal to the Soviets and comforted our people, and that it will be helpful in the pursuit of our arms control goals.

You have my solemn assurance, so far as the United States is concerned, that I shall now do everything in my power to translate the commitments we made together at Williamsburg into tangible legislative action. With that end in mind, I met with the bipartisan leadership of the Congress on June 8 and urged early progress on anti-protectionist measures, increasing our IMF quotas, and further limits on the growth of federal expenditures as a means to reduce budgetary deficits.

Finally, I would also like to thank you for the frankness of your views, for your constructive suggestions, and for the cooperative attitude with which you approached the basic issues. I look forward to continuing our dialogue over the coming months, and to welcoming you here in Washington on a State Visit early next year.






