


THE LOS ANGELES TIMES REPORT REFERRED TO REFTEL IS MOST PROBABLY THE TAD SZULC ARTICLE IN THE JANUARY 18 EDITION. ; SEE PARA 4 ON PAGE 2 OF STATE 16393, WHICH TRANSMITS THE TEXT OF THE SZULC ARTICLE.

3. THE STORY IS ALREADY SIX WEEKS OLD, AND THE ALLEGED MEMO IN THE LA TIMES PIECE IS DATED THE END OF NOVEMBER. I BELIEVE IT IS SUFFICIENT TO REITERATE TO THE TAIWAN AUTHORITIES THE ASSURANCES IN STATE 37789, WHICH YOU DELIVERED TO CCNAA FEBRUARY 13: WE ARE COMMITTED TO CONTINUING TO MEET TAIWAN'S LEGITIMATE DEFENSE NEEDS; WE ARE FIRMLY OPPOSED TO EXERTING PRESSURE ON TAIWAN TO FORCE IT INTO NEGOTIATIONS WITH BEIJING, WHICH IS A MATTER FOR THE CHINESE THEMSELVES TO RESOLVE; AND WE WILL STICK TO THE TRA. THESE ARE PRINCIPLES WE WILL CONTINUE TO ADHERE TO.

I REGRET THAT WE CAN'T GIVE YOU ANY FURTHER GUIDANCE AT THIS TIME. INCIDENTALLY, S.K. HU CAME TO SEE DAVID DEAN THIS MORNING WITH SIMILAR QUESTIONS.

#### Taiwan Seeks Clarification of Newspaper Report

In a telephone call to AIT Director Jim Lilley yesterday, foreign ministry official Chen:

- o Sought clarification of a Los Angeles Times report indicating Secretary Haig had suggested that if the PRC follows a peaceful policy towards Taiwan, the U.S. could hold its arms sales to Taiwan to levels below those of the last year of the Carter administration.
- o Said the report was of concern to the "highest levels" in Taiwan.

Lilley comments that other press reports over the weekend indicating arms sales to Taiwan would depend on the state of PRC-Taiwan relations are causing consternation and confusion. Lilly asks for information or reassurances he can pass to Taiwan authorities. (C)

SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 28, THE CHINESE-LANGUAGE "UNITED DAILY NEWS" CARRIED A WASHINGTON-DATELINED STORY BASED ON A "LOS ANGELES TIMES" REPORT (DATE NOT GIVEN) THAT SECRETARY HAIG HAS SUGGESTED THAT IF THE PRC FOLLOWS A PEACEFUL POLICY TOWARDS TAIWAN, THE U.S. COULD HOLD ITS ARMS SALES TO TAIWAN TO LEVELS BELOW THOSE OF THE LAST YEAR OF THE CARTER ADMINISTRATION.

3. ON MARCH 1, MOFA'S C.J. CHEN PHONED TO SAY THAT THIS REPORT WAS OF CONCERN TO THE "HIGHEST LEVELS" IN TAINAN, AND SOUGHT CLARIFICATION. I SAID I KNEW NOTHING ABOUT THIS REPORT BUT POINTED OUT TO CHEN A PRINCIPLE OF SORTS MAD BEEN ESTABLISHED IN THE SHANGHAI COMMUNIQUE THAT U.S. FORCES HOULD BE WITHDRAWN AS TENSIONS DIMINISHED.

; ND SCIENTIFIC EXCHANGE, TECHNOLOGY TRANSFER AND MANY OTHER FIELDS. WELL OVER ONE-HUNDRED THOUSAND AMERICANS AND CHINESE NOW FLOW BACK AND FORTH BETWEEN THE TWO COUNTRIES EACH YEAR, AND OUR RELATIONS CONTINUE TO DEVELOP THROUGH BOTH PEOPLE-TO-PEOPLE AND DIPLOMATIC CHANNELS.

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

- 4. CHANG EXPRESSED THANKS FOR THE PROMPTNESS OF WASHINGTON'S REPLY, THEN MADE THE FOLLOWING POINTS ON INSTRUCTIONS FROM FRED CHIEN. (1) WE STILL FEEL WE HAVE NOT BEEN ADEQUATELY INFORMED ABOUT YOUR TALKS WITH MAINLAND CHINA. WE APPRECIATE THE REASSURING WORDS AIT HAS TRANSMITTED BUT THESE WORDS HAVE NOT

MESSAGE (CONTINUED) :

EASED THE DOUBTS EXISTING IN OUR MINDS. WE REQUESTED ON FEBRUARY 13 AND REQUEST AGAIN THAT WE BE DULY AND ADEQUATELY INFORMED ABOUT THE CONTENT OF THESE TALKS. (2) WE FEEL SERIOUS CONCERN OVER THE FOLLOWING DEVELOPMENTS IN THE PAST FEW WEEKS: -- SECRETARY HAIG'S REMARKS FEBRUARY 27 AT THE CONSERVATIVE POLITICAL ACTION CONFERENCE, SUGGESTING A MORE FAVORABLE ATTITUDE TOWARD MAINLAND CHINA; -- THE LOS ANGELES TIMES ARTICLE (RAISED ALREADY BY C. J. CHEN! REPORTING THE SECRETARY'S RECOMMENDATIONS IN NOVEMBER ABOUT POLICY DN ARMS SALES TO TAIWAN; -- FORMER PRESIDENT NIXON'S ARTICLE IN THE FEBRUARY 26 NEW YORK TIMES; -- THE EVIDENT REFERENCES TO TAIWAN IN THE US-PRC

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EXCHANGE OF LETTERS ON THE TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF THE SHANGHAI COMMUNIQUE;

-- THE PERCEPTION THAT THE STATE DEPARTMENT IS CONTINUING TO DELAY NOTIFICATION TO THE CONGRESS OF THE US\$97 MILLION SALE OF MILITARY EQUIPMENT TO TAIWAN.

(3) WITH REGARD TO A REPORT BY AFP (WASHINGTON, D.C., MARCH 1) WHICH APPEARED IN THE MARCH 3 UNITED DAILY NEWS: "WE WANT TO TELL THE U.S. SIDE FORMALLY THAT IF IT READS THE SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT AS A SYMBOL OF A THAWING OUT OF THE RELATIONSHIP BETWEEN TAIWAN AND THE MAINLAND, IT IS MAKING A SERIOUS MISTAKE."

CHANG POINTED OUT THE FOLLOWING PHRASES IN THE AFP REPORT: "THE U.S. HOPES RELATIONS BETWEEN BEIJING AND TAIWAN WILL THAW OUT IN ORDER TO ENLARGE THE SCOPE FOR U.S. INITIATIVES. THE PRC'S ANNOUNCEMENT THAT IT WILL SEND REPRESENTATIVES TO PARTICIPATE IN THE WORLD WOMEN'S SOFTBALL TOURNAMENT IN TAIPEI IS A SYMBOL OF THIS THAWING."

5. HAVING CONCLUDED HIS FORMAL PRESENTATION, CHANG NOTED THAT THE FIRST AND THIRD POINTS WERE THE MOST IMPORTANT, ALTHOUGH THE SECOND WAS ALSO IMPORTANT. HE PERSONALLY WANTED TO EMPHASIZE THAT TAIWAN'S LEADERS ARE REALLY UNEASY. THEY SEE PRESS REPORTS LIKE THOSE CITED ABOVE AND LACK AUTHORITATIVE INFORMATION ON WHAT ACTUALLY IS HAPPENING BETWEEN WASHINGTON AND BEIJING. THIS IS NO WAY TO TREAT

AS EXAMPLES OF WHAT THEY WOULD LIKE TO LEARN ABOUT THE TALKS, CHANG CITED ANYTHING WE COULD SHARE AS TO THE GENERAL CONTENT OF US-PRC EXCHANGES CONCERNING A TIME LIMITATION ON U.S. WEAPONS SALES TO TAIWAN, OR AN AGREEMENT TO KEEP LEVELS BELOW THOSE OF THE CARTER YEARS.

CONFIDENTIAL SECTION 02 OF 02 TAIPEI 01155 EXDIS PRESIDENT REAGAN HAD A WARM CONVERSATION WITH TSAI WEI-PING AT THIS SMALL RECEPTION. A CCNAA OFFICIAL DESCRIBED THE REAGAN-TSAI MEETING AS WARM AND PLEASANT. TSAI HAS BEEN ACQUAINTED WITH PRESIDENT REAGAN FOR A LONG TIME. IN 1971, WHILE GOVERNOR OF CALIFORNIA, REAGAN WAS DISPATCHED BY FORMER PRESIDENT NIXON AS SPECIAL ENVOY TO CONVEY CONGRAT-ULATIONS ON THE 60TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE FOUNDING OF THE NATIONALIST REGIME. AT THAT TIME, TSAI PARTICI-PATED IN THE RECEPTION OF GOVERNOR REAGAN. WHEN REAGAN VISITED TAIPEI IN SPRING 1978, TSAI, THEN VICE MINISTER OF FOREIGN AFFAIRS, MET WITH REAGAN AGAIN.
