

Subject: The World Environment 1972-1982, as Transmitted
to President Reagan by UNEP's Executive Director

Attached for Presidential signature is a proposed response to Mostafa Tolba, Executive Director of the United Nations Environment Program (UNEP), who, by letter of April 27, sent to President Reagan a copy of a major new UNEP report, The World Environment 1972-1982. The package was, in fact, hand carried from Nairobi by EPA Administrator Gorsuch following the recent Session of Special Character.

The document appears to be a balanced, non-alarmist and carefully researched analysis of global environmental changes, both positive and negative, over the past decade. Commissioned by UNEP in 1978 for the recent tenth anniversary commemoration of the 1972 Stockholm Conference on the Human Environment, it is based on a series of papers prepared by leading scientists from 15 countries, including the United States. Dr. Gilbert White of the University of Colorado served as one of the three principal editors.

The report was widely praised at the Session of Special Character in Nairobi, and the U.S. delegation joined a consensus that it should be included in the list of "principal environmental achievements over the decade" which will appear in the final report of the Special Session.





Subject: High-Level Meetings with UN Secretary
General Perez de Cuellar

We recommend that the President extend an invitation to Perez de Cuellar, the newly elected UN Secretary General, to visit Washington to meet with him and Vice President Bush in January or February. This would demonstrate the importance we attach to Perez' office, signal that we want to work closely with him, and allow us an opportunity to outline the US position on important UN-related issues such as Poland, Namibia, the Middle East, Afghanistan, and the employment of US citizens in the UN Secretariat.

If the President chooses to invite Perez de Cuellar to Washington, the Secretary would offer him a lunch, as we did for Waldheim earlier this year.

Recommendation

That the President agree in principle to invite Secretary General Perez de Cuellar to Washington in January or February, with the date to be worked out with his staff.
