Our records show that income tax returns were timely filed for 1977 and 1978. An extension of time for filing the 1979 return was granted until June 15, 1980. The 1979 return was delinquentlly filed on June 16, 1980. There is no record of penalties for negligence during the tax years indicated above. There is no record of criminal tax investigations or civil penalties for fraud under the internal revenue laws.

Our records show that the taxpayer failed to pay interest within 10 days after notice and demand for the 1977 and 1978 tax returns.

The 1977 return was examined and interest of \$232.05 was assessed and a notice sent on September 17, 1979. A subsequent payment of \$232.05 was made on October 10, 1979, full paying the account.

Interest of \$108.02 for the 1978 return was assessed and a notice was sent on July 16, 1979. A subsequent payment of \$108.02 was made on July 27, 1979, full paying the account.

This completes our report.

The American Political Foundation was incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia on July 13, 1979, by leaders of the national Democratic and Republican parties.

The Foundation is non-profit, educational, and bipartisan. Its Chairman is William E. Brock III, Chairman of the Republican National Committee. Its Vice Chairman is Charles T. Manatt, Finance Chairman of the Democratic National Committee. Its Board of Directors consists of equal numbers of Democrats and Republicans. All offices will alternate between the parties at two year intervals.

This unprecedented joint venture reflects serious concern about the parties' responsibilities in a time of both domestic political fragmentation and increasing salience of international issues in all democratic countries. The concern is timely and important. As nations become increasingly interdependent, the need for information, understanding, and institutional competence also increases. Virtually all important sectors of American life -- business, labor, church, academic, etc. -- have addressed this need by developing mechanisms for international communication. So have important political parties in other countries.

The American Political Foundation will work in appropriate and feasible ways to fill the gaps in communication and information occasioned by the American parties not having their own international departments or party foundations, and to improve party function and the political process generally.

The specific objectives of the American Political Foundation are:

- 1) To promote foreign understanding of American politics.
- 2) To promote American understanding of foreign politics.
- 3) To promote international understanding of common political problems and issues.
- 4) To promote understanding and exchange of political methods and practices.

The program of the Foundation (details attached), which will be implemented as resources become available, includes projects to orient and assist foreign visitors to the United States, provide services for foreign political and press observers of the 1980

elections, send bipartisan American observer groups to conferences and other international meetings of foreign parties, study comparative political practices, and encourage communication between political scholars and practitioners.

The tentative \$300,000 annual budget for the first two years (details attached) is based on estimates of potentially available levels of support, as indicated by the funding received from foundations, corporations and individuals for the development of the Foundation, and by preliminary discussions with prospective donors. If the general level of funding should prove to be higher, or if special funding becomes available for particular projects, the Foundation will be able to expand its program substantively with relatively little addition to administrative costs.

The Foundation's immediate need is for seed money to open an office, engage in a comprehensive fund raising effort, and begin providing program services to American and foreign political leaders.

Because of the imminence of the 1980 elections, and the expected volume of foreign attention, it is important that the Foundation develop its service capabilities very quickly.

A grant or grants totaling \$100,000 -- half to be available immediately, and half by January or February of 1980 -- will assure that the Foundation can meet its budgetary and program targets for the next year.

ADDENDUM
