Subject:

Establishing a Lebanon Hostage Working Group

Following the meeting on September 20 between the Vice President and the hostage families, the State Department restructured its procedures for dealing with the families of the hostages held in Lebanon, introducing professional, experienced counsellors to reinforce the effort.

The families complained to the Vice President and in public that the remaining hostages do not receive the same degree of attention as the TWA hostages for whom a task force was set up. They have requested a hostage task force and view it as a symbol of continuing USG commitment to obtain the release of their family members.

In order to improve both our ability to relate and respond to the families and the external perception of the Administration's responsiveness and concern, the State Department has formalized the existing informal system of cooperation among the Bureau of Near Eastern Affairs, the Bureau of Consular Affairs and the Office for Counter Terrorism, officially establishing a Lebanon Hostage Working Group. This group will also work regularly with the State Department Medical Division.

The Hostage Working Group, which includes staff members responsible for policy, public relations and family liaison, meets on a regular basis to review the most recent events and discuss communicating these developments to families. The Working Group will recommend conference calls and high level contacts as appropriate. The Department does not plan to make any public announcement about the existence of the Working Group because families might respond that this is merely a public relations gimmick, but we are explaining to them the more systematic approach that the working group permits. In addition, we are establishing a means whereby the families can contact members of the working group on an emergency basis by calling the Operations Center.

Subject: Proposed Presidential Letter to Syrian

President Hafiz al-Asad

Ambassador Vernon Walters will be traveling to Syria to urge President Asad to reinvigorate efforts to gain the release of the seven American hostages in Lebanon. During his visit to Damascus, he plans to meet with Syrian President Asad to make clear the urgency the U.S. attaches to the early release of the hostages.

We believe Walters' position in Damascus will be strengthened by delivery of a letter from the President. In the attached draft we have reminded Asad of his earlier statements that renewed efforts to free the hostages would be possible following the release of all detainees from Atlit, and urged that he work with us to resolve rapidly the hostage issue.

PROPOSED PRESIDENTIAL LETTER

Dear Mr. President:

Thank you, once again, for your message and best wishes as I was leaving the hospital in July. As I wrote to you at the time, I deeply appreciate the kind sentiments you expressed for my rapid recovery.

As you know, I have appointed Ambassador Walters as my Permanent Representative to the United Nations. However, despite the major responsibility that he bears as we prepare for the General Assembly, I have asked him to make this urgent visit to Damascus to discuss with you next steps in gaining the prompt, safe release of the seven Americans and other foreign hostages in Lebanon.

Ambassador Eagleton reported earlier to me your view that the continued detention of prisoners in Atlit complicated your efforts to achieve the release of the hostages in Lebanon. All the Atlit prisoners have now been returned to Lebanon. As I pledged to you, I reinforced with the Israeli government our



belief that the transfer of these prisoners out of Lebanon was a violation of the 4th Geneva Convention. With the Atlit issue now behind us, I am convinced that the moment has come for a renewed effort to achieve the hostages' release. I look forward to hearing from Ambassador Walters your views on what concrete steps can be taken to accomplish this.

The continued detention of innocent persons not only contributes to the unstable situation in Lebanon but casts a

pall over the view most Americans have of Lebanon and the region. I know you agree that there is no justification for the kidnapping of the seven Americans or the other foreign hostages, or for the brutal treatment they have received in detention. Moreover, acts of terrorism such as kidnapping detract from the authority of the central government of Lebanon and undermine the efforts of those who seek to restore law and order to that country. We must all work to combat more effectively these crimes against innocent victims.

Mr. President, this matter must be promptly and successfully resolved. Together, I believe we have the means to do so. As we move towards this goal, I sincerely hope that

we can build on this common interest while working to narrow our differences. I firmly believe that our joint efforts to achieve the release of these innocent victims of terrorism will demonstrate that we can work together to overcome an internationally abhorred scourge -- indiscriminate kidnapping for political ends. In this regard, I recall with satisfaction and appreciation your successful efforts to win the release of the TWA hostages this past summer.

I look forward to receiving your reply when Ambassador Walters returns to the U.S.



- AMERICAN HOSTAGES ARE NOW FAMOUS IN THE UNITED STATES, AND THAT THE ISSUE OF THEIR RETURN IS A TOP PRIORITY FOR THE AMERICAN PEOPLE AND FOR THE U.S. ADMINISTRATION. HE TOLD BARRI THAT HIS NAME IS NOW ALSO FAMOUS IN THE UNITED STATES. AND THE U.S. ADMINISTRATION AND THE AMERICAN PEOPLE WANTHIS HELP IN OBTAINING THE RELEASE OF THE SEVEN; INDEED. HE STRESSED AGAIN THAT AS BARRI KNEW FULL WELL FROM HIS MANY CONVERSATIONS WITH THE AMBASSADOR. THE U.S. COULD NOT AND WOULD NOT MAKE ANY DEAL OR COMMITMENT.

THE MESSAGES TO THE TWO PRESIDENTS WERE TO BE TRANSMITTED THROUGH THE U.N. REP IN DAMASCUS AND BEIRUT, TO THE AYATOLLAH THROUGH THE IRANIAN AMBASSADOR HERE AND TO BERRI "INDIRECTLY" SO AS NOT TO RUFFLE LEBANESE GOVERNMENT'S FEATHERS. HOWEVER, RENEWED FIGHTING IN BEIRUT LAST WEEK AND SYG'S SUBSEQUENT CALL FOR A CEASEFIRE LED SECRETARIAT OFFICIALS TO DELAY THE TRANSMISSION OF MESSAGES DEALING WITH HOSTAGES SO AS NOT TO MIX THE TWO ISSUES.

- SAID THE MESSAGES WOULD BE SENT AUG. 26 OR 27.
 THEY WILL BE ESSENTIALLY HUMANITARIAN APPEALS, REQUESTING


