

- -- WE ARE WORKING INTENSIVELY TO SECURE THE RELEASE OF THE MISSING AMERICANS IN LEBANON. WE WOULD LIKE TO SHARE WITH YOU THE STATUS OF OUR CURRENT EFFORTS.
- -- THE MAIN FOCUS OF OUR EFFORTS REMAINS THE SYRIANS. WE HAVE HAD REGULAR ACCESS TO FOREIGN MINISTER SHAR'A. AND

- -- WE HAVE EMPHASIZED TO THE SYRIANS THAT KIDNAPPING IS UNACCEPTABLE AND NOT IN THEIR OWN REGIONAL INTERESTS. IT UNDERMINES THE STABILITY THEY SEEK IN LEBANON AND DAMAGES THEIR OWN AND LEBANON'S INTERNATIONAL REPUTATION. WE BELIEVE THAT PRESIDENT ASAD IS PERSONALLY COMMITTED TO EFFORTS ON BEHALF OF THE FOREIGN HOSTAGES AND THAT VICE PRESIDENT KHADDAM HAS BEEN WORKING ON THIS PROBLEM AT THE PRESIDENT'S INSTRUCTION.
- -- IT IS OUR ASSESSMENT THAT THE SYRIANS COULD DO MORE TO ATTAIN THE RELEASE OF THE HOSTAGES BUT ARE CONSTRAINED BY OTHER INTERESTS. INCLUDING THE PRESERVATION OF THEIR RELATIONS WITH IRAN AND A DESIRE TO IMPROVE RELATIONS WITH ALL LEBANESE FACTIONS.
- -- WE ARE ALSO WORKING WITH A VARIETY OF OTHER INTERMEDIARIES WHO HAVE SHOWN AN ABILITY OR HAVE THE POTENTIAL TO CONTACT THE KIDNAPPERS.
- -- WE ARE NOT CERTAIN WHO IS HOLDING THE HOSTAGES NOR
 THEIR EXACT LOCATION. IT IS LIKELY THAT THEY ARE MOVED
 FREQUENTLY, INCLUDING POSSIBLE MOVES BETWEEN THE BIOA AND
 THE SOUTHERN SUBURBS OF BEIRUT.

- -- WE CONTINUE TO BELIEVE THAT MOST KINDS OF PUBLICITY RETARD EFFORTS TO LIBERATE THE HOSTAGES. PUBLICITY DISCOURAGES CONFIDENTIAL INTERMEDIARIES. AND IT CAN GIVE THE KIDNAPPERS MOTIVATIONS FOR CONTINUING TO HOLD THEIR CAPTIVES.

CONGRESSMAN O'BRIEN'S VISIT TO DAMASCUS HAS BEEN USEFUL IN OBTAINING REASSURANCES FROM PRESIDENT ASAD, VICE PRESIDENT KHADDAM AND FOREIGN MINISTER SHARA' THAT SYRIA WILL CONTINUE ITS EFFORTS TO OBTAIN THE RELEASE OF ALL ELEVEN HOSTAGES. VICE PRESIDENT KHADDAM WAS MOST DIRECT OF THE THREE IN EXPRESSING SYRIAN UNHAPPINESS WITH THE CONTINUING DELAY OF THE RELEASE OF THE ATLIT PRISONERS. HE WAS ALSO THE MOST EXPLICIT IN LINKING THIS DELAY WITH DIFFICULTIES THAT SYRIA IS HAVING WITH HIZBALLAH ON THE AMERICAN HOSTAGE QUESTION.




