Dear Mr. Esterline:

I am replying to your letter to President Reagan regarding the establishment of diplomatic relations between the United States and the Holy See. It was thoughtful of you to enclose a copy of Cosmic Conflict.

In the desire to further promote existing mutual friendly relations, the United States and the Holy See announced the establishment of diplomatic relations on January 10, 1984. This is not a question of recognition on our part. The United States has long recognized the Holy See as having an international personality distinct from the Roman Catholic Church.

The United States and the Vatican have maintained close contacts for some time. In recent years, we have had representation in Vatican City in the person of the President's Personal Representative to the Holy See. President Roosevelt established this practice in 1939. What we are doing now is establishing diplomatic relations.

Our Ambassador will be accredited to the Holy See, an international focal point of diplomatic contact. We join 107 other nations, including all our major Western allies, in establishing diplomatic relations with the Holy See. It is an internationally-recognized sovereign entity which is represented at such international organizations as the United Nations and the Organization of American States. The Holy See has entered into international treaties, some of which the U.S. Government has also signed. Vatican City is an independent city state, under the jurisdiction of the Holy See. The Holy See is in effect the government with which our embassy will deal.

Before making the decision to establish diplomatic relations with the Holy See, the Administration consulted with appropriate members and committees of Congress. Moreover, Congress recently repealed an 1867 statute which stated that federal funds could be used for a diplomatic mission to the Vatican.

This step does not violate constitutional strictures on separation of church and state. Diplomatic relations between the United States and the Vatican do not confer any special status on the Roman Catholic Church in this country or elsewhere. I would note that the United States and the Holy See maintained diplo-

matic relations between 1848 and 1868. They were allowed to lapse for historical reasons which are no longer clear, but seem to have involved Italian unification and the Holy See's loss of the Papal States.

Archbishop Laghi called last week to tell me that he was seeking authorization for the Holy Father's airplane to land at Anchorage, Alaska on May 2. The Pope will be enroute the Far East. Bishop Laghi very tactfully suggested that it would be appropriate to have a government representative there. I understand that Secretary Donovan was our representative the last time. He also wanted the various Senators and Congressmen to know of the arrival.

I told him that he could assume authorization had been granted and that I would convey his message to you. I mentioned this to Admiral Poindexter, but wanted to follow-up in writing.

Archbishop Laghi, 61, a native of Castiglione, Italy, entered the Vatican diplomatic service in 1952. He has served in Nicaragua, in India, and in the United States, as Secretary of the Apostolic Delegation from 1954 to 1961. He was Apostolic Delegate to Jerusalem and Palestine from 1969 to 1974 and Nuncio to Argentina from 1974 to 1980. He has also served in Rome with the Council for the Public Affairs of the Church. Since 1980 he has been Apostolic Delegate in Washington, D. C.
