Genial Envoy From Vatican

Pio Laghi

By KENNETH A. BRIGGS

Archbishop Pio Laghi, who was named yesterday by Pope John Paul II to be the Vatican's Ambassador to the United States, has become known as an artful church diplomat in the 32 years he has served as a papal representative abroad.

Man in the News

Formal diplomatic ties between the United States and the Vatican were restored on Jan. 10 after more than a century of

unofficial relations. President Reagan's appointment of William A. Wilson as the United States Ambassador to the Holy See was confirmed and Mr. Wilson was sworn in on March 9.

Archbishop Laghi, a genial man, is known within the church as an exceptionally intelligent prelate with an informal demeanor and a polished approach to diplomacy. One Roman Catholic official said the Archbishop's urbanity "represents what is best about the Vatican diplomatic service.'

Since 1980, the 61-year-old Archbishop has been the Apostolic Delegate to the Roman Catholic church in the United States and the Vatican's permanent observer to the Organization of American States. He was appointed to those posts after serving as Papal Nuncio, or full ambassador, to Argentina. His choice as the first Ambassador to this country in a century was generally expected among church officials.
"He was the natural choice," said

Msgr. John Tracy Ellis, a leading Catholic church historian. "If you were to canvas around, nobody would think of anybody else for the job. He has one quality for which there is no substitute. He has brains.'

Pope's Liaison to America

As Apostolic Delegate, Archbishop Laghi was the Pope's liaison to the Catholic church in America. Like his predecessors stretching back to the 1890's, he conveyed news of the church here to Rome and submitted names of possible candidates for the hierarchy to the Pope.

Archbishop Laghi is a tall, dignifiedlooking man with silver hair. As the Pope's representative in the United States, he has traveled widely, attending church meetings, ceremonies and conferences.

In the past week, Archbishop Laghi has played a visible part in the installations of two key Archbishops he helped to place - Archbishop John J. O'Connor of New York and Archbishop Bernard F. Law of Boston. At both events, he presided over the formalities, reading the Vatican documents in English heavily accented by his native Italian and embracing the new Archbishops in congratulations.

The manner in which Archbishop Laghi informed Bishop.O'Connor of his appointment tells much about his orderly but relaxed approach, church officials say. After engaging Bishop O'-Connor in general conversation at some length by telephone from his Washington office, he said, "Oh, by the way, you've been chosen by the Holy Father as next Archbishop of New York.'

Hand in Reshaping Hierarchy

Most church leaders say Archbishop Laghi has had a strong hand in helping reshape the hierarchy of the Catholic church in the United States along more conservative lines.

Pope John Paul II has voiced criticism of the extent of dissent from church teaching among American Catholics and many leaders believe the selection of new bishops and archbishops, aided by Archbishop Laghi, has been aimed at restoring church discipline.

According to church officials, Archbishop Laghi works quietly, behind the scenes, and keeps internal church business to himself.

While in Washington, he has refrained from granting interviews and guards his privacy. With regard to his part in filling hierarchical vacancies, it is believed that he chooses candidates who meet the Pope's general stand-

Monsignor Ellis said Archbishop Laghi has been "as open as anyone could be holding that position." When Monsignor Ellis once asked him to explain how bishops are chosen, the Archbishop gladly accomodated him and ran through a pending case. But as the final step was reached, the Archbishop discreetly placed his hand over the

Career Vatican Diplomat

Pio Laghi was born on May 21, 1922, in Castiglione, Italy, in the diocese of Forlì. He was ordained a priest on April 20, 1946, and entered the Vatican diplomatic service in 1952.

He filled various staff positions in Nicaragua, the United States and India before returning to Rome to serve on the Council of Public Affairs of the church. After being ordained Bishop on June 22, 1969, he was sent as Apostolic Delegate to Jerusalem and Palestine, then, in 1974, to Argentina.

As the Vatican's representative in the United States, Archbishop Laghi continues to live in the church's official diplomatic residence, a three story mansion, along embassy row in Wash-

Those who know him expect his life to change relatively little with his new assignment. He will continue his diligent monitoring of the church, associates say, and, when time permits, help keep trim with a game of tennis.

Dear Pope John Paul:

I write concerning your Ambassador to the United States.

The announcement of the appointment of Archbishop Pio Laghi as your Ambassador raises the whole question of the relationship of your church to the state in the United States, the churches here to your church, and the propriety of even having an ambassador.

Kenneth R. Briggs, reporting in the NEW YORK TIMES, March 27, 1984, informed all that Archbishop Laghi has been your Apostolic Delegate and is now also your Ambassador — "the Pope's liaison to the Catholic Church in America. Like his predecessors stretching back to the 1890's, he conveyed news of the church here to Rome and submitted names of possible candidates for the hierarchy to the Pope."

Thus you have placed in his hands all these political relationships. These matters of church and state you have combined in one person. The NEW YORK TIMES story proceeds to explain your Apostolic Delegate's activities and how comprehensive they have been in your behalf.

The TIMES says: "In the past week, Archbishop Laghi has played a visible part in the installations of two key Archbishops he helped to place — Archbishop John J. O'Connor of New York and Archbishop Bernard F. Law of Boston. At both events, he presided over the formalities, reading the Vatican documents in English heavily accented by his native Italian and embracing new Archbishops in congratulations."

Nothing you could have done could have so offended our sensibilities on this issue of union of church and state.

This leads me to point out to you that in response to objections made by Protestants of this country and some of your own people, the State Department said that they were recognizing only the civil state aspect of your headquarters in Rome. You did not choose to send a layman or a non-cleric, but instead have appointed Laghi. The United States, on the other hand, has sent a layman who, of course, is a Roman Catholic. You have given the ambassadorial post to your choice cleric-spokesman with long experience in helping you to determine your church leadership in the United States.

The United States is especially sensitive on this issue just now, since the First Amendment, which requires separation of church and state, is being interpreted to remove silent prayer or even a moment of silence from the public schools. You also have been understood to be opposed to your own priests' becoming involved in seeking political office. The country understands because of this, that one of your priests who was serving in the U.S. Congress declined to continue to do so.

My appeal to you on behalf of our churches affiliated with the International Council of Christian Churches in this country is that you withdraw this appointment and inform our government that you do not intend to have an ambassador to this nation. As it is now you are placing your papal Apostolic Delegate in a preferred position with the State Department; and he is still, according to Mr. Briggs, continuing "to live in the church's official diplomatic residence, a three-story mansion, along embassy row in Washington."

Please respect the status of all religions in the United States, which does indeed give equality before the law for all

Roman Catholic churches together with all other religious bodies. Please do not be a party to having diplomatic relations in the United States in deference to all religious communities and contrary to the provision of the Constitution of this land, which requires the separation of church and state.

In making this appeal, I do so also on the basis of the common interest and civil good will of all, just plain fairness and justice.

It is essential to the good order and peace of this nation that the Roman Catholic Church accept the same status among us as all other churches. Appointing Archbishop Laghi as Ambassador would be like making the General Secretary of the National Council of Churches an ambassador, or the National Secretary of this council an ambassador. Both of these councils have churches spread across this country and have geographical locations, all of which are free from government taxation or interference.

An ambassador from the Vatican does not belong in this country or fit into the separation of state and church which provides for all the churches and people.

Archbishop Laghi, 61, a native of Castiglione, Italy, entered the Vatican diplomatic service in 1952. He has served in Nicaragua, in India, and in the United States, as Secretary of the Apostolic Delegation from 1954 to 1961. He was Apostolic Delegate to Jerusalem and Palestine from 1969 to 1974 and Nuncio to Argentina from 1974 to 1980. He has also served in Rome with the Council for the Public Affairs of the Church. Since 1980 he has been Apostolic Delegate in Washington, D. C.

The Holy See has inquired whether our Government agrees to the appointment of Archbishop Pio Laghi as Papal Pro-Nuncio to the United States (Tab 2). A biography of Archbishop Laghi is attached (Tab 1).

The Holy See has had a representative to the Catholic Church in the United States - known as an Apostolic Delegate - in Washington since 1893. There have been nine Apostolic Delegates before Archbishop Laghi, who has held the position since December 10, 1980. The Holy See's representative to the United States Government will have the title of Pro-Nuncio.

The Department believes from the information available that Archbishop Laghi will make an excellent representative of the Holy See and recommends that the President agree to the proposed appointment. If he concurs, the Department will inform the Holy See.
