As of early Sunday morning, the hijacked aircraft has again returned to Beirut from Algeria. [REDACTED]

[REDACTED] When the plane approached Beirut the tower twice refused landing clearance, but ultimately permitted the plane to land when the pilot radioed that he had only minutes of fuel left. The aircraft is now on the ground. The hijackers have asked for food and fuel and for the Government of Israel to release 50 former Ansar prisoners as a return gesture for the three additional hostages released yesterday in Algiers. An Amal representative is in discussion with the hijackers.

There has been no further release of any passengers since three were released in Algiers Saturday evening. We believe there are about 42 hostages left on the plane. Several others -- perhaps six or eight -- were removed from the plane during a previous stop in Beirut and remain captive there. [REDACTED]
