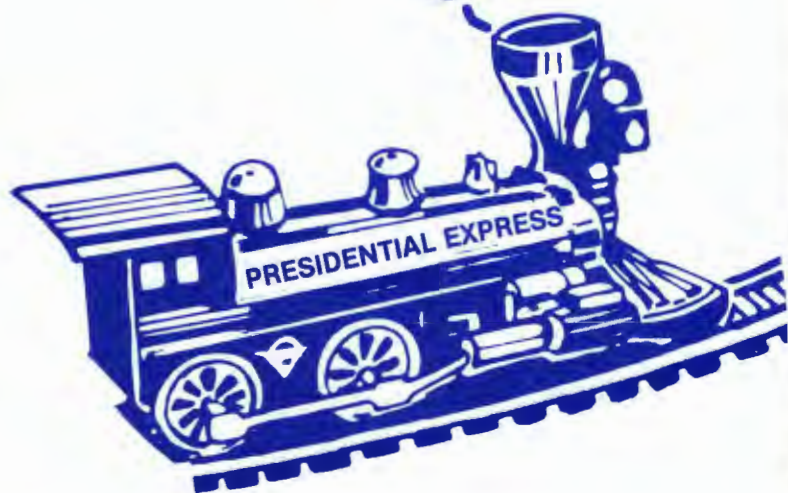

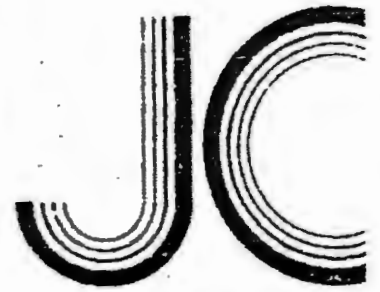

A sense of excitement, a feeling of being present in history is being made, is sweeping over the City of Perrysburg.

The daily newspapers, radio, and television have disseminated the news that President Ronald Reagan is to be in Perrysburg Friday evening, October 12, 1984.

The community, at first, received this news rather calmly, but as word spread that the Secret Service was in the city; measuring the height of the Sunny Service roof, putting equipment on the junior high building, walking the railroad tracks, etc., it suddenly became a reality — President Reagan is really coming to Perrysburg!

Mayor Sam Hunter was the first public official to confirm the news of the President's visit. Mayor Hunter broke the news at the

Candidate Harrison visited here

During the campaign of 1840, Harrison returned to the battleground at Fort Meigs where he had fought over 20 years before, to address the people of Perryburg and the surrounding territory. Over 6,000 people turned out on June 11 and 12, 1840, to hear this national hero.

Harrison had the support at that campaign rally and in the election of 1840, Harrison defeated Van Buren and became the first Whig president.

Perryburg has held Harrison Rally Days in June since 1980 to commemorate this visit.

Local resident Jan Gordon had made efforts before to get a presidential visit during Rally Days.

Her work with President Reagan's campaign scheduler may have helped in the decision to stop the train in this community.

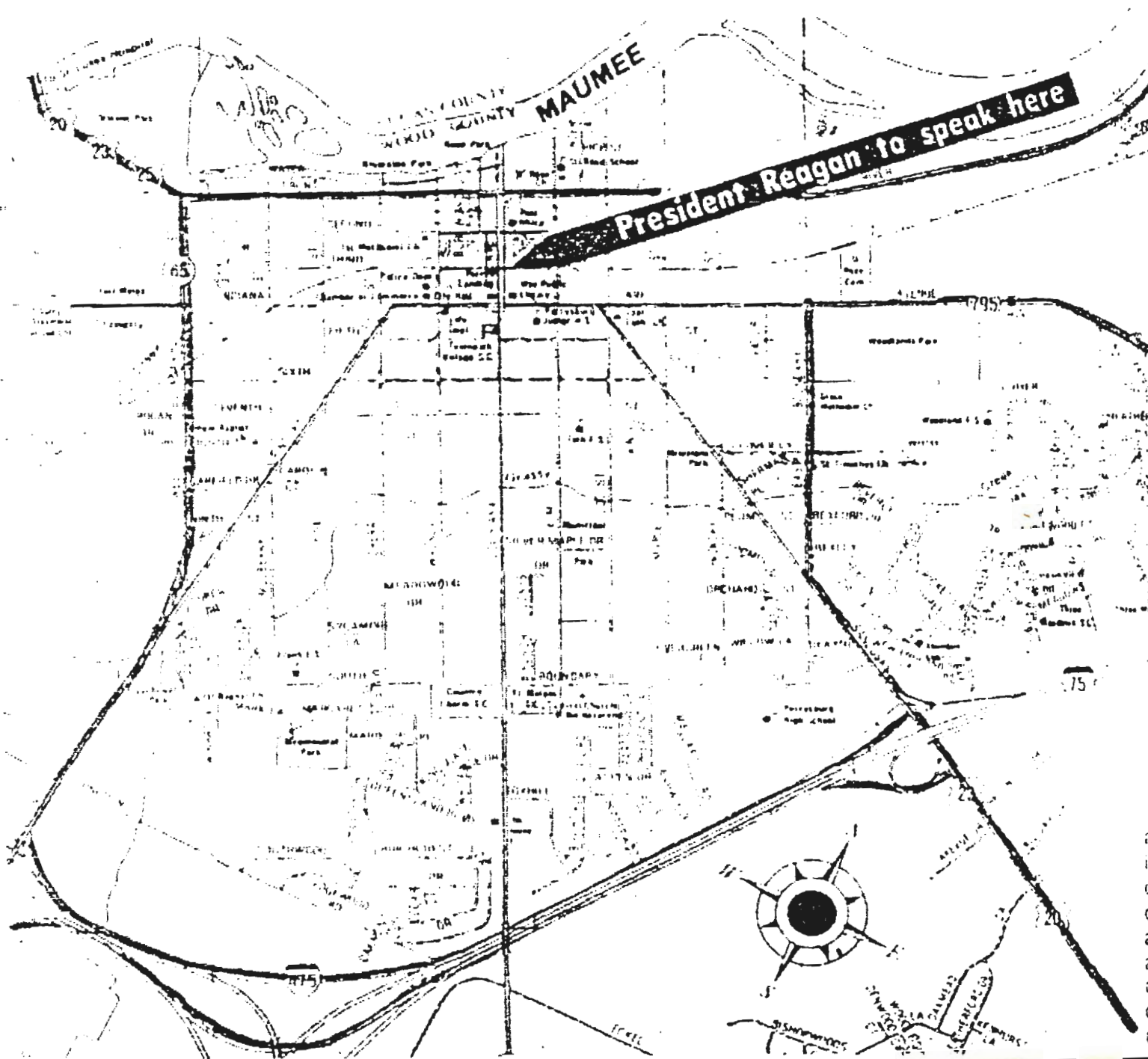
The Whig party first ran Harrison for president against Martin Van Buren in 1840. He lost in this first presidential race, but the

Whigs decided to try again in 1840.

William Henry Harrison, the ninth president of the United States, was the oldest man to become president and the first to die in office. On the day he was inaugurated, President Harrison caught cold, developed pneumonia, and died 30 days later.

During his brief term, Harrison showed an interest in running the government efficiently.

Harrison is best remembered as the first bal-

and here in 1840

of victory against the political campaign slogan "Tippecanoe and Tyler too." He received the nickname "Tippecanoe" after defeating the Shawnee Indians in 1811 at the Battle of Tippecanoe.

Harrison also was in command of Fort Mingo during the "War of 1812" and during his defense of the fort he inspired the "Tippecanoe" and his soldiers from the region from the British, marking the turning point of the war in the Northwest.

WHEREAS, the Honorable Ronald Wilson Reagan, President of the United States, has scheduled a visit to the City of Perrysburg, Ohio, on Friday, October 12, 1984, and

WHEREAS, Ronald W. Reagan is the first President of the United States to visit the City of Perrysburg, and

WHEREAS, the outstanding and noteworthy accomplishments and achievements of Ronald W. Reagan, both privately and publicly, should challenge and inspire the youth of this community, and

WHEREAS, the visit of an incumbent President to this municipality is a momentous and memorable event that should be publicly and permanently acknowledged, and

WHEREAS, the visit of Ronald W. Reagan will bring much-deserved recognition and distinction to the City of Perrysburg and the same should be lastingly commemorated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF PERRYSBURG, OHIO:

SECTION 1. That the Honorable Ronald Wilson Reagan, fortieth President of the United States of America, be officially welcomed to the City of Perrysburg, Ohio on October 12, 1984.

SECTION 2. That this greeting is proclaimed by the Mayor and Council of the City of Perrysburg on behalf of all the citizens of this municipality.

SECTION 3. That the Clerk of Council is hereby directed to forward an executed and certified copy of this Resolution to President Ronald Wilson Reagan at the White House, Washington, DC.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall take effect immediately so that the entire community will have the opportunity to

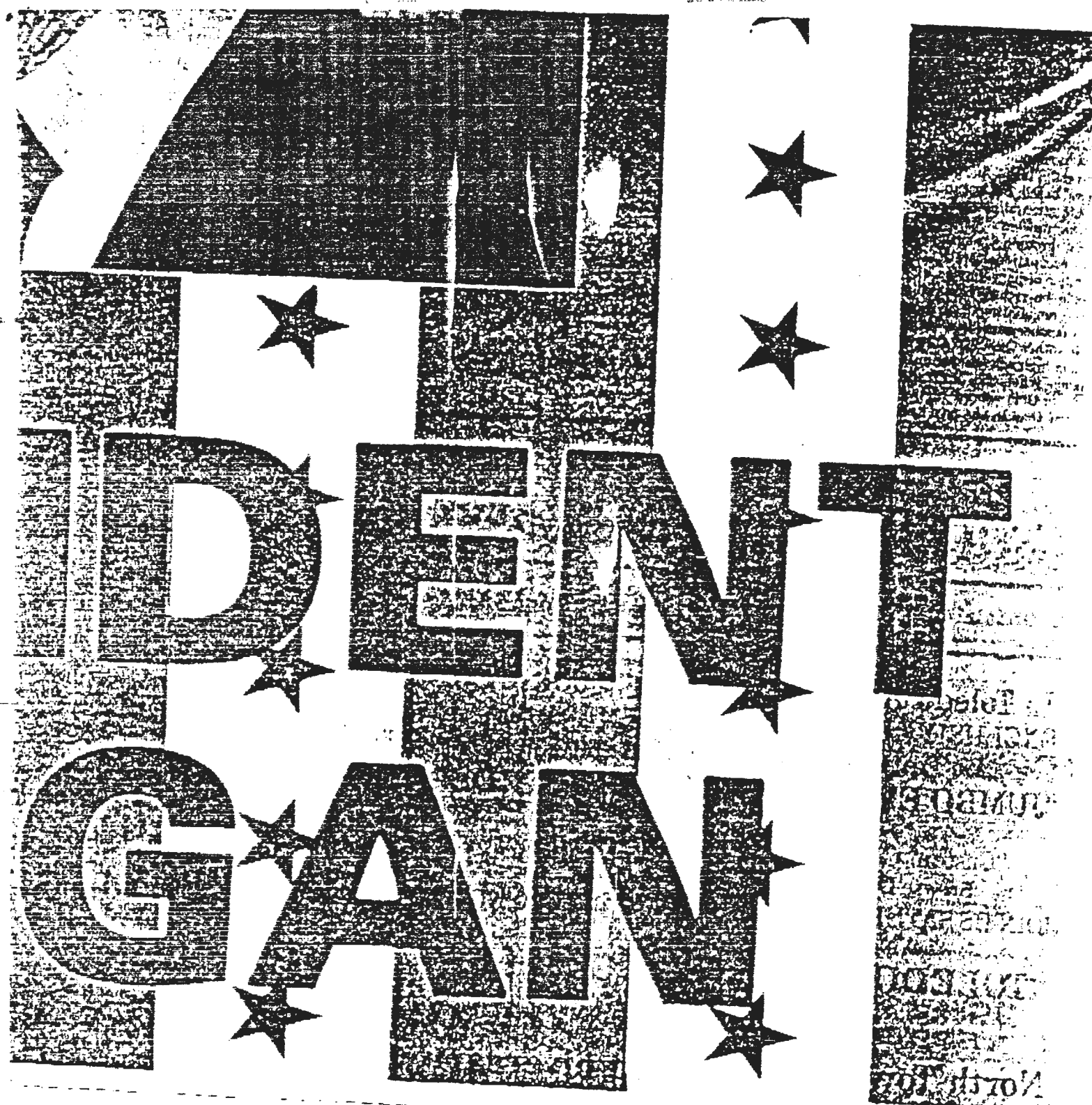
