Born in Ohio on December 23, 1927, Mr. Barbour graduated from the University of Tennessee in 1949. Mr. Barbour began his career in the Foreign Service in 1949, when he was assigned to Iraq. Since that time, he has served abroad in Tokyo, Saigon, Hue, Paris, Rome, London, and Madrid. While in Madrid from 1978 to 1984, Mr. Barbour was Deputy Chief of Mission. He has had a number of assignments in the Department of State, including Deputy Assistant Secretary of State For European Affairs from 1976 to 1978. He holds the career rank of Minister-Counselor in the Poreign Service. He assumed duties as United States Ambassador to the Republic of Suriname in October 1984.

Mr. Barbour speaks Spanish, Prench, Italian and Dutch. He is married to Nancy Barbour nee Francisco. They have three daughters whose names are Linda, Daphne and Hilary.
