

2 Appointees Say Reagan Will Get More Black Votes

Two black appointees of President Reagan predicted Friday in Los Angeles that the President will do better with blacks this year than pollsters are predicting because there is a "growing, quiet support" for the President that is not showing up in the polls.

"In the Democratic primaries, the people voted for Jesse Jackson and the black leaders backed Mondale," said Francis S. Guess, a Reagan appointee to the U.S. Civil

Rights Commission. "We think a lot of the Jesse votes will go to Reagan if we can convince them that this Administration is not hostile to blacks."

Reagan received 10% of the black vote when he defeated Jimmy Carter in 1980. Blacks are considered the Democratic Party's most loyal constituent group and national polls have found that more than 90% support Walter F. Mondale.

Stephanie Lee-Miller, an assistant secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services, contended that Reagan will win 15% of the black vote, in part because of the decline in the inflation rate. "There is a new awakening, particularly among black working people who recognize that inflation hurt them just as much as it hurt whites," she said.

Black U.S. official defends president

Leaders told not to do schools 'disservice' in criticizing Reagan

The highest-ranking black woman in the Reagan administration told officials from 60 of the nation's 100 black colleges meeting in Atlanta Wednesday that black leaders are doing the schools a disservice in criticizing the president's economic policies.

Stephanie Lee-Miller, assistant secretary for public affairs of the Department of Health and Human Services, said the country's black leaders are "providing a disservice" by saying that "the black community is worse off than ever before" and by not saying the administration is paying attention to black schools.

There seemed to be some agreement among the college officials with Ms. Lee-Miller's advice that the school officials should be more aggressive in their pursuit of a fair share of federal grants and private endowments. "Go up to Washington and walk those halls," she said. "That's really what it takes. You've got to make them sick of you. You can't do it through the mail."

But her assessment of the Reagan administration caused unease among the officials, and there was some grumbling when Ms. Lee-Miller said she wanted "to start hearing a different message from the black colleges . . . to hear more of the credit about what this administration is doing."

"I'm not suggesting everything is roses," she said. "I'm suggesting

that you take a balanced look at the country."

Ms. Lee-Miller also said the Reagan administration channeled more than \$600 million in aid to black colleges in fiscal 1983, up 11 percent from fiscal 1981.


"I think she quoted some statistics where the figures are correct," said Walter Brown, director of development for Shaw University in Raleigh, N.C. "But in other areas, there are some other statistics that will kind of diminish or provide a conflict to what she said."

Brown said that while the Reagan administration may have increased its dole to black colleges, it has tried to cut funds that go to poor students so they can attend college.

Creigs Beverly, dean of the School of Social Work at Atlanta University, said he noticed "a sense of guarded acceptance" of Ms. Lee-Miller's comments. "I think it was kind of a dual reaction," he said, "essentially in the sense of there was a need to maintain a degree of respect for the speaker in light of her position."

Ms. Lee-Miller joined several key health and human services officials in the seminar, part of the Reagan administration's program to help black colleges and universities.

Ms. Lee-Miller announced that one of her department's current projects is a cable TV network through which top administration officials could appear on black college campuses.

Black Republicans Urge Black Demos to Back Reagan

Concerned about minority voters' lack of enthusiasm for their candidate, the Reagan re-election campaign yesterday launched a major media blitz to show the president has black supporters.

At a press conference in Oakland's Hyatt Hotel designed to "correct misconceptions among black voters about the Reagan administration," national and local black Republican leaders vowed their support for the president and implored other blacks to join them.

The black GOP figures said they hope to get 15 percent to 20 percent of the black vote for the president. In 1980, Democratic President Jimmy Carter got 92 percent of the black vote.

"The Democratic challengers have presented a distorted view of the Reagan administration record to black voters," said Stephanie Lee-Miller, assistant secretary of the Department of Health and Human Services.

Lee-Miller said the Reagan campaign is "sitting down and asking black voters to think — think about what we want for ourselves and our families. Black people want more money. They want to buy a car, a house and other material things."

She said blacks who have traditionally voted Democratic "have to ask themselves what political party is more likely to help them achieve their goals."

"Clearly the economic policies of the Carter-Mondale years were more destructive to ailing black communities than the Reagan economic recovery," she said.

"What the black community needs is increased wealth — more purchasing power for the almighty dollar — and that's where the Reagan administration is succeeding."

an administration is succeeding."

Yesterday's press conference is a part of that fight. Several members of the Oakland panel also spoke in Los Angeles yesterday morning. Others will be visiting at least 15 cities across the country before the November 6 election.

The panels are part of a Reagan-Bush media campaign featuring prominent black Republicans who will barnstorm the nation to laud administration achievements.

In addition, the Reagan campaign is distributing a brochure called "Seven of the Best Kept Secrets About Blacks," which extolls the administration's record on minority affairs.

Several speakers yesterday said blacks who have faithfully voted Democratic in recent years got little in return.

For instance, the Rev. E. P. Hill, pastor of the Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Southern California and a former supporter of Jesse Jackson's presidential campaign, said that Reagan had shown a "practice of fairness" to all Americans, including blacks, "despite the lopsided way my community didn't support him."

Calling for blacks to consider voting Republican, Hill said, "At an early age, my mama told me not to put all of my eggs in one basket."

Campaign aims to improve Reagan image with black voters

Despite receiving only about 10 percent of the black vote in 1980, the campaign to re-elect President Reagan yesterday launched a national media blitz hoping to counter black opposition to the president.

At press conferences in Los Angeles and Oakland, a panel of black leaders said that the accomplishments of the Reagan administration have been mischaracterized, and that Reagan in fact has fostered greater support for black America than the previous administration of President Carter and his vice president, current Democratic nominee Walter F. Mondale.

"The Democratic challengers have presented a distorted view of the Reagan administration record to black voters," said Stephanie Lee-Miller, assistant secretary for the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, in Oakland.

"Clearly, the economic policies of the Carter-Mondale years were more destructive to ailing black communities than the Reagan economic recovery. What the black community needs is increased wealth — more purchasing power for the almighty dollar — and that's where the Reagan administration is succeeding.

"The Reagan administration owed us nothing, but reached out to us at every level," added the Rev. E.V. Hill, pastor of the Mount Zion Missionary Baptist Church in Los Angeles.

Hill, a Republican who supported the Rev. Jesse Jackson in the Democratic presidential primary this year, said Democrats "turned down the best man" in rejecting Jackson's nomination, adding, "How does a black man (then) stay" in the Democratic Party?

"Now we have to have no permanent friends, just permanent interests," he said.

Other black people who joined Hill on the panel at the Oakland Hyatt Regency insisted it was Reagan, and not Mondale, who had those permanent interests at heart.

"This administration spends \$26.2 million per hour on social programs, including health, Social Security, welfare, Headstart, handicapped programs, Medicare, Medicaid and programs for the elderly," said Lee-Miller.

"This is the highest rate of spending on these humanitarian programs in history."

Moreover, Lee-Miller and Oakland's C.J. Patterson, California chairman for Black Voters for Reagan-Bush, attributed the revitalization of Oakland, including the joint public-private venture that created the Hyatt Regency, in part to efforts of the

Reagan administration.

However, George Williams, director of the Office of Economic Development and Employment for the city of Oakland, said that in terms of "sheer money" more was received under the Carter administration than during the Reagan term.

While Williams said the city has fared well under both administrations, he said the real "impetus" for urban redevelopment came under the Carter administration.

During the Carter years, he said, the city received a \$13.8 million Urban Development Action Grant and applied for a \$7.2 million UDAG grant, which actually came under the Reagan administration.

Another \$3 million grant for the TransPacific Centre came under the Carter administration, while \$1.6 million was received for a park during Reagan's term.

Literature paid for by the Reagan-Bush effort and handed out at the press conference claimed Reagan increased employment of women and minorities in the federal work force over 1980 levels; increased by 12 percent the federal funding for colleges; realized Justice Department successes, including filing of 10 cases alleging civil rights violations; and witnessed extension of the Voting Rights Act.

However, according to a recent study by the nonpartisan Urban Institute, aid to low-income Americans will be 8.8 percent lower this year than under Carter administration policies.

Moreover, opponents of the Reagan civil rights record argue he has dramatically altered and redirected the way the laws are applied, thus weakening their effect.

But administration officials say their policies represent a renewal of the original intent of the civil rights laws, which

they argue are aimed at the individual, not a group.

Research shows that under Reagan, the Department of Justice has filed 21 fair housing suits, eight school desegregation suits, 41 job discrimination suits and 55 voting rights suits.

Under Carter, the department filed 61 fair housing suits, 11 school discrimination suits, 34 job discrimination suits and 64 voting rights suits.

In addition, the Reagan administration is credited with defeating the Civil Rights Act of 1984 and with delaying passage of the Voting Rights Act of 1982.

Despite the vigorous effort of the black leaders in support of Reagan, the Joint Center for Political Studies reports support for Reagan among black voters has risen from 7 to 13 percent, indicating a vast majority remain loyal to the Democratic Party.

Also, slightly less than 90 percent of those polled rate Reagan's job performance as poor.

"I don't detect any groundswell of support among blacks for Reagan," said Tom Cavanagh, senior research associate for the Joint Center.

Reagan health official defends his programs

BERKELEY — President Reagan's highest ranking black woman, Stephanie Lee-Miller, stopped here yesterday on a round of national appearances intended to publicize "some of the compassionate sides of the administration."

Lee-Miller, assistant secretary for public affairs in the Department of Health and Human Services, appeared as guest of honor last night at a reception given by the Bay Area Black United Fund.

She told BABUF members, "I welcome this opportunity to set the record straight about the intentions of the Reagan administration toward improving the health and welfare of black Americans."

She cited "our efforts to strengthen the economy," the federal government's "programs to assure that every American maintains a decent standard of living" and the Reagan administration's "special steps" on issues "of particular concern to blacks."

But on the issue of public assistance through welfare grants, Lee-Miller said, "Let me emphasize that public assistance should not be used as an alternative to work."

In an interview with The Tribune, the 34-year-old native Californian praised her department's leadership in several areas: The medical crisis involving AIDS, Acquired Immune Deficiency Syndrome, Reagan's task force on the homeless problem, another Reagan task force on black health needs and generous budget support for the Headstart program.

Speaking of the shelter-for-the-homeless program, she told BABUF members, "We are not just dropping a dime into the poor's cup while we go about our business. We are already concerned with next winter and the winters thereafter and with the causes and effects of some 2 million Americans being without the basic necessities."

Lee-Miller also announced the

human services department has launched "an initiative" through Congress aimed at increasing the government's collection of delinquent child-support payments from absent fathers.

She said a federal bill, expected to be adopted by Congress this month and signed into law by Reagan in August, will expand government's efforts to locate missing parents and make them pay court-ordered child support.

She linked the delinquent child-support problem to the dire straits faced by millions of American women — many of them black women — who head single-parent households with little but the public dole to depend on for financial support.

The new federal law will call on states to implement "mandatory income withholding" against absent parents. This means that when an absent father is located, deductions will be taken from his paycheck for child support.

This will be possible, Lee-Miller said, through a new federal-state information-sharing program aimed at tracking down the missing fathers. She said the system was put into effect six months ago and was effective in locating 70 percent of the fathers out of 1 million requests for help received from abandoned mothers.

She pointed out that in 1983, \$2.7 billion in delinquent child-support payments was recovered at a cost of \$691 million.

"But we estimate that there is \$4 billion a year outstanding that is owed to the children of America. To recover that would make a tremendous difference in their lifestyles," she said.

She said the new federal-state push to enforce child support will make use of information from motor vehicle registrations, Social Security, unemployment insurance benefits, income tax returns, post office records, military records and criminal records in tracking down absent fathers.
