### ABOUT THE ARTIST: KATHY JAKOBSEN

One of the youngest of the contemporary American folk painters and one of the most widely collected, Kathy Jakobsen was born in Wyandotte, Michigan, in 1952. She now lives and works in the Chelsea area of New York City.

Kathy views her paintings as a message from her to the onlooker. "I think paintings are food for the spirit. They should communicate to the viewer and the viewer should be able to contribute and share in or relate to the painting. It is a

two-way thing." The appeal of her work lies not only in the brilliant colors and the great detail but also in the combination of activity and peace.

Kathy Jakobsen is one of the most widely collected of the current folk artists. Her paintings are in the Henry Ford Museum, the Smithsonian Institution, the Museum of American Folk Art, and the John Judkyn Memorial, Freshford Manor, Bath, England. They have been exhibited throughout the United States, western Europe and are in many private collections.

This outstanding painting, rendered in oils, depicts the high moment of the 1984 Republican National Convention. President Ronald Reagan has just completed his nomination acceptance speech. 

As you know, Fred Fielding's office and the convention office are receiving numerous requests to put the President's picture and/or signature on mementos to be sold at the Republican National Convention in Dallas in August.

I understand from our Chief Counsel that our approval isn't necessary for a company to use the President's picture. It isn't a legal but a "political" question.

I would like to recommend that, unless the project is exemplary...i.e. the "D" Magazine\* August issue which is being designated the Official Guide to Dallas for the convention...that we assume the position that the White House nor the RNC will be authorizing use of the President's picture or his signature on any item.

I welcome your comments. Thank you!

\*"D" Magazine has been approval to print a special edition in August 1984 which would focus on the Republican National Convention and be the Official Convention Guide to Dallas. It will sell for \$5 an issue, free to delegates & alternates. Those will be perfect bound and will be mailed in late June. An additional 125,000 will be printed for the Dallas news stands, the convention center and the hotels.

I wanted to inform you that the President signed and put his thumbprint on a sculpture created for the convention by Miley Busiek of Dallas (the herd of elephants). This was scheduled by Presidential Scheduling and took place on Tuesday, Nov. 22. This activity has been scheduled to take place when the President was in Dallas Oct. 27 but since he was unable to make that trip, the Vice President had put his signature on the single elephant the sculptor created by taking one elephant from the herd.

Also, some buttons with a suggested theme for the convention have circulated. We wanted to be sure you have seen them and understand that this is only a suggestion.

We know the development of a theme is not a priority to anyone now, but several projects which require early deadlines are on hold pending the theme decision.

I am enclosing two buttons prepared by the individual who proposed the theme "Together a Greater America", Richard Rovsek. Rovsek is preparing the convention catalog of official memorabilia items (which will include the elephant bronze by Miley Busiek. As soon as we get a listing of items for that catalog, I will share it with you.)

It is my privilege and honor to be commissioned by the Republican National Committee to design and produce the official bronze sculpture commemorating the coming 1984 Republican National Convention and Election.

The composition of the sculpture is a dramatic herd of elephants comprised of a powerful bull elephant leading a unified herd or family of bull, cow and calve elephant's - moving forward together in unity and strength.

The sculpture will be a major work in the classic manor of limited edition ideally suited for a presentation center piece, approximately 12 to 15 inches high by 26 to 28 inches long. It will be the exclusive property of the Republican National Committee for it's use and all proceeds thereof. I am presently sculpting the original model to be cast into bronze by the lost wax method. The final step before casting is the signing of the original work.

Upon the urging of key individuals I would like to make the following formal request.

- I. FORMAL REQUEST: That the President would be willing to personally sign and impress his thumb print (as in the tradition of Remington and Russell) into the original wax model so that it would become an actual and major element of the bronze sculpture.

This symbolic gesture could serve as;

- A. His personal means of emphasizing the importance of unity and supportiveness among all Republican Candidates, staff and volunteers in the coming months.
- B. Historically significant and would greatly enhance the value of the sculpture in benefiting the Republican Party.

If this request is granted I would like to offer the following suggestion in the form of a second request.

- II. FORMAT REQUEST: A brief appointment with the President by a formal delegation designated by the R.N.C. for the purpose of signing the sculpture and photographs for R.N.C. use. (I need not be present, but would be happy to provide the original wax model and sculpting plan in advance for your inspection and approval.)
- III. POSSIBLE DATE OF APPOINTMENT: We would like to be available at your convenience to have this appointment take place either at the White House or - there is a possible opportunity to consider in Dallas on October 27th, at which time the President is scheduled to be the honored guest for a formal banquet.

Mrs. Martha Weisend, Vice Chairwomen of the Dallas Republican Host Committee has very graciously offered to submit this request to you as a possible part of the President's schedual during his visit to Dallas on October 27.

May I emphasize that with great regard for the Presidents' valuable time, this is not a personal request. I am making it on behalf of the R.N.C., and the Dallas Republican Host Committee.

My greatest desire is that I may be of service to the President and the R.N.C. by providing this sculpture in a way that could be used to your utmost advantage. This is my voluntary way of making a contribution toward our success in 1984 and it is my pleasure to do so.
