

Dear Mr. Chairman:

Your letter of May 10 sought the Department's comments on a resolution by the 63rd annual convention of the Macedonian Patriotic Organization (MPO) relating to Macedonians living in Greece, Bulgaria and Yugoslavia.

The MPO's resolution calls for, among other things, the establishment of a free Macedonia, presumably to be created out of territory of Bulgaria, Yugoslavia and Greece. The United States strongly supports the provisions of the Helsinki Final Act concerning the rights of national minorities to enjoyment of their culture and language, as well as equality before the law. However, it is also longstanding U.S. policy, reaffirmed in Principle VI of the Final Act, to support the territorial integrity of all countries in Europe, including the three named in the resolution. The goal of the resolution, therefore, is inconsistent with U.S. policy, and the resolution cannot be endorsed by the Department of State.

The Macedonian Patriotic Organization is an American Organization, the purpose of which is to protect the human rights of the Dulgarian Macedonians in Greece, Yugoslavia, and Bulgaria as well as to strive for the creation of a Free and Independent Macedonia, wherein the Macedonian Bulgarians and all ethnic nationalities within the geographic burders of Macedonia can live in peace and freedom.

The Resolution enclosed asks that Greece, Yugoslavia, and Bulgaria comply with the ideals of human and civil rights as expressed in the Helainki Accord to which these three governments were signatories.

The Resolution further demands that these governments proceed forthwith to confer basic and human rights upon their citizens so that the people within the boundaries of Macedonia may evolve culturally, economically, politically, and religiously as free citizens in a free society.

We would appreciate your efforts to have this Resolution included into the Congressional REcord and your sending me a copy of the Record containing the publication of this Resolution.

Resolution 63rd MPO Convention

WHEREAS, The Helsinki Accord expressed the ideal of human and civil rights for all peoples of Europe; and,

WHEREAS, The governments of Greece, Yugoslavia and Bulgaria, through the actions of Prime Minister Constantine Caramanlis of Oresce, President Joseph Broz Tito of Yugoslavia, and Chairman Todor Zhivkov of Bulgaria, respectively, are signatories to this agreement; and,

WHEREAS, The governments of Greece and Yuguslavia have not abided with said Accord by denying human and civil rights to the ethnic Bulgarians and Romanians in their countries by not allowing them to conduct their own schools, cultural and political activities; and,

WHEREAS, The government of Bulgaria does not grant civil rights to the Macedono-Bulgarian communities in Bulgaria for free expression of their aspirations;

WHEREAS, None of these countries permits open and free activity to promote the recognition of a united, independent, democratic, and non-Communist state of Macedonia; and,

WHEREAS, The Macedonian Patriotic Organization of the United States and Canada are assembled at their Sixty-third Annual Convention in Niagara Falls, New York, on September 1, 2, 3, 1984; and.

WHEREAS, The Macedonian Patriotic Organization of the United States and Canada are staunch defenders of the human and civil rights of all ethnic groups living within the geographic boundaries of Macedonia; and,

WHEREAS. The Macedonian Patriotic Organization of the United States and Canada are striving in a legal manner to create a free and independent Macedonia wherein all athnic groups within Macedonia may live in freedom and peace;

IT IS THEREFORE RESOLVED: That the Sixty-third Annual Convention of The Macedonian Patriotic Organization of the United States and Canada strongly gensures the aforementioned governments for their neglect of basic human and civil rights and demands that these governments proceed forthwith to confer such rights upon their citizens, so that the people of Macedonia may evolve culturally, economically, politically and religiously as free citizens in a free society in order that they may create a free and independent Macedonia.
