AS SOUTH KOREAN PRESIDENT CHUN LEFT HAWAII ENROUTE TO SEOUL, HE SENT THE FOLLOWING MESSAGE TO THE PRESIDENT. THE SITUATION ROOM RECEIVED THE MESSAGE LAST EVENING.

APRIL 28, 1985

DEAR MR. RONALD REAGAN:

I HAVE JUST BOARDED A PLANE TO SEOUL AFTER A DELIGHTFUL FEW HOURS IN HONOLULU AT THE END OF A SATISFACTORY AND MEANINGFUL FIVE DAYS IN THE U.S. AS I DEPART YOUR GREAT COUNTRY, I WISH TO CONVEY TO YOU MY DEEPEST GRATITUDE FOR THE WARM RECEPTION AND GENEROUS HOSPITALITY THAT YOU AND THE AMERICAN PEOPLE HAVE SHOWN TO ME. MRS. CHUN AND THE MEMBERS OF MY ENTOURAGE. THE VISIT, COMING AT THE BEGINNING OF YOUR SECOND TERM AND MIDWAY THROUGH MY TERM, HAS PROVIDED AN OPPORTUNITY FOR TWO COUNTRIES TO FURTHER ENHANCE THEIR TRADITIONAL RELATIONSHIP OF FRIENDSHIP AND COOPERATION AND HAS CONFIRMED A MATURE PARTNERSHIP. THROUGH THE VISIT, I HAVE WITNESSED AN ENERGETIC DEVOTION OF THE AMERICAN PEOPLE TO THE TASK OF RECREATING A GREAT AMERICA. THIS IN TURN, HAS INSPIRED THE KOREAN PEOPLE TO RENEW THEIR DETERMINATION TO DEVELOP THE REPUBLIC AND MAKE IT PROSPER AND TO MAKE THE 1988 OLYMPICS A SUCCESS.

I HOPE WE WILL BE ABLE TO MEET OFTEN AS FRIENDS IN THE FUTURE TO DISCUSS OPENLY AND FRANKLY BILATERAL CONCERNS AND VARIOUS MATTERS RELATED TO THE CHANGING INTERNATIONAL SITUATION. MRS. CHUN JOINS ME IN WISHING YOU AND MRS. REAGAN CONTINUED GOOD HEALTH.
