#### I. PURPOSE

To brief the Republican leadership on the current situation in Lebanon, to update the group on the status of the deficit reduction negotiations with the Democrats, and to encourage all Senate Republicans to vote for the School Prayer Amendment.

#### II. BACKGROUND

This is the first opportunity to meet with the Republican leadership since the decision was made to redeploy the Marines to the ships offshore from Lebanon. Our Republicans on the Hill were very concerned prior to the recess because they thought the Administration was backing away from the announced decision to redeploy. Recent action should have clarified the questions regarding redeployment but other news reports and speculation regarding Lebanon will undoubtedly prompt considerable questioning from the leadership group.

The Democratic leadership continues to drag its feet on the negotiations for the deficit reduction package you called for in your State of the Union Address. Following an initial meeting where the Democrats called for a \$100 billion cut in defense, the Democrats refused to meet until the Congressional Budget Office developed their re-estimate of our budget.

- -- You should know that the United States will always be willing and ready to discuss solutions to the many troubles this world faces with our Soviet counterparts. It is my sincere hope that our counterparts in the new Soviet leadership will be receptive to representatives exemplifying such high moral persuation, as does this delegation.
