I. PURPOSE

To stress the importance of unified Republican support for the deficit reduction package and to review the current status of our Central America program.

II. BACKGROUND

Two items of primary interest on Capitol Hill this week are budget and Central America. The House will start consideration of the Budget Resolution on Thursday and the Senate will hopefully get to the reconciliation bill later in the week. Senate Republicans hope to pass our deficit reduction package prior to the Easter recess. House will also try to move revenue and reconciliation bills prior to the recess.

It is imperative that we have unified Republican support for the \$150 billion deficit reduction package. Bob Michel and Senator Baker have been working hard to achieve that unity. In the House an alternative proposal is being advanced by Congressmen Bill Dannemeyer and Jack Kemp. This proposal would maintain our recommended defense levels, but backs away from our agreed-on revenue levels and proposes politically unacceptable entitlement cuts that we have previously rejected.

On the matter of Central America: The emergency funding is still being debated in the Senate, the Senate Foreign Relations Committee is marking up the Kissinger Commission proposal, and negotiations continue with the House Leadership. Because of the urgent need for the funds, it is likely that the Administration will have to use emergency authority prior to final action by the Congress. Secretary Shultz will brief the Members on the Central America situation.

TALKING POINTS FOR MEETING WITH THE
HOUSE AND SENATE REPUBLICAN LEADERSHIP

- I know that we all have a full agenda this week. There are two items I would like to cover this morning -- our deficit reduction package and the situation with regard to Central America.
- In just a minute, I will ask George Shultz to give us an update on Central America, but first let me turn to the budget debate and review with you where we are.
- As we have discussed before, it is important for Republicans to unite behind our \$150 billion deficit reduction package. By working together, we have taken the initiative in proposing a realistic and achievable down payment.
- It is a balanced and fair package that avoids sensitive entitlement cuts, yet produces real savings in domestic spending, and I urge all of you to support it.
- Our opponents on the Hill have continued to delay action on the emergency funding for Nicaragua and El Salvador -- I cannot stress enough how critical the need is for these funds. We are trying to deal with these Central American issues in a responsible and bipartisan fashion -- but we need strong Republican support to force the Congress to act.
- At this point, let me call on George Shultz to discuss the Central American issues.

- Following Shultz's presentation and discussion, call on Howard Baker and Bob Michel for general discussion.



PRESIDENTIAL REMARKS: DROPBY BRIEFING OF THE NATIONAL
SECURITY TELECOMMUNICATIONS
ADVISORY COMMITTEE
TUESDAY, APRIL 3, 1984

Thank you Chairman Araskog. It's good to see you all here again. Much has occurred since we last met in this room. Bud McFarlane has kept me informed of the work you're doing and of the considerable activity generated in the Government in response to your input. You've been a vital stimulus in the area of national security telecommunications planning and capability enhancement. I want to take this opportunity to thank you, as a group and individually as well, for the contribution you are making. Our Nation is more secure and better prepared because of what you're doing.

The telecommunications expertise in this room is a powerful national security resource. I regard the NSTAC (N-STACK) and your willingness to serve as a model of private sector-Government cooperation. You are demonstrating what this kind of teamwork can accomplish, while in addressing issues of high national priority.

Your task is crucial. Ensuring the capability of the Nation's telecommunications assets, which the 30 corporations represented on the NSTAC largely compose, is vital to the national interest. I regard this challenge as a top Administration priority. The Nation's commercial telecommunications assets are key elements of our overall national security posture. And your guidance is a necessary part

of the equation if our valuable communications assets are to effectively contribute to our country's security. We continue to need your help and I urge you all to stay personally involved.

I have designated the National Communications System -- represented here today by Deputy Secretary Taft, General Powers, and the heads of several of its member departments and agencies -- as the vehicle for putting NSTAC recommendations in practice. It will also serve as the forum to coordinate Government telecommunications planning in meeting national security leadership requirements.

I am pleased that a national coordinating center, which was a high-level NSTAC recommendation, is already in the first stage of operation. With your active participation, it is at this very moment making a critical contribution to our telecommunications readiness. I have directed the N.C.S. to address your other recommendations with similar vigor. Government has to equal industry's performance in the NSTAC process and I have asked all N.C.S. member agencies to fully support this task.

Today, we've reached a milestone. When the NSTAC was formed, I asked Rand Araskog of I.T.T. Corporation to serve as the first chairman. The progress we have made to date is a testimony to his leadership. Now, as we move into your second year, I am pleased that Joe Charyk of COMSAT has agreed to serve as the NSTAC's new chairman. Ted Brophy of G.T.E. will be serving as the new NSTAC vice-chairman.

So that we might appropriately recognize this changing of the mantle, I would like to ask Rand and Joe to join me at the podium.

(Rand Araskog and Joe Charyk join Deputy Secretary Taft and Bud McFarlane on platform.)

(Presenting gold gavel to Rand Araskog) Rand, you have my personal thanks and the gratitude of the Nation for the contribution you have made as the NSTAC's first chairman. Your leadership in forging a cooperative spirit enabled us to achieve our initial objectives and get this operation on the way. I am especially pleased that you will continue to serve as a member of the NSTAC. On behalf of the American people, along with your colleagues in the industry, I would like to present you with this symbol of the leadership you provided. (Present gavel)

(Presenting wooden gavel to Joe Charyk) Joe, you are taking charge of the NSTAC with a number of vital issues still before us. You will provide the kind of continuity that will guarantee the NSTAC's further success. I look forward to working with you and the entire committee in meeting the challenges ahead. Given your task, I would like to present you with something you might be able to use on the job. (Present gavel) Thank you and congratulations.
