SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR THE MEETING WITH THE NATIONAL CONFERENCE OF LIEUTENANT GOVERNORS

- -- Welcome back to the White House. Since our last formal meeting, it was two years ago, we have made quite a bit of progress and I am pleased to report that we have a much improved economy which is certainly more conducive to economic development.
- -- The most recent figures show that we are indeed experiencing continued economic expansion.
- -- New homes sales rose and the index of leading economic indicators was up a solid seven-tenths of one percent in February.
- -- The annual rate for new home sales of 721,000 in February was 22% higher than a year ago and 8% above the January rate.
- -- Housing starts and auto sales are surging. Housing starts for February hit a 2.2 million annual rate and domestic auto production is above the 8 million rate.
- -- <u>Inflation</u>: Below 4 percent in 1982 and 1983, continues at a moderate pace early in 1984.
- -- Unemployment: The drop has been dramatic, from 10.7% to 7.8% in just 15 months. More Americans are working now than ever in history and almost 5 million have found jobs in just the last 14 months. (New unemployment figures will be available today)
- -- In 1983, almost 600,000 new business were incorporated an all-time high in our history.

- -- GNP growth: The economy grew over 6% last year; the Administration has forecast growth of 4.5% this year and most economists agree it'll be in that range.
- -- As you know, reduction of the Federal budget deficit remains a major goal of mine. I don't like budget deficits and have offered a realistic three-year deficit reduction package providing for a \$150 billion cut in the projected deficit.
- -- It's a good first step that will allow us to "balance down" with lower tax rates and spending while permitting our economy to break free.
- -- Well, enough from me. I understand you have had a productive conference and I look forward to hearing a report from you, Bill.
