



I. PURPOSE

To focus national attention on your commitment to equal housing opportunity and to urge passage of the fair housing legislation pending in Congress.

II. BACKGROUND

The month of April has traditionally been designated "Fair Housing Month" since the Fair Housing Act of 1968 was passed and signed in April. The Department of Housing and Urban Development will be producing several events locally and in several cities across the nation to promote Fair Housing.

Two of HUD's major promotional efforts involve "Celebrities for Fair Housing" and the National Campaign of Public/Private Partnerships for Fair Housing. Both efforts are supported by private contributions of time and money.

Celebrities for Fair Housing is a committee of prominent private citizens who have donated their time to produce public service announcements and appear at fund raising events in support of Fair Housing initiatives on local levels. Phyllis Hyman is Chairman of the group, and such personalities as Stevie Wonder, Melba Moore, Dr. J., Harry Belafonte, Aretha Franklin, and Magic Johnson have agreed to participate.

The National Campaign of Public/Private Partnerships for Fair Housing is a broad-based public information effort that is supported by Chambers of Commerce, realtor groups, home builder associations and others.

The Administration's Fair Housing legislation (S-1220) is still pending in Congress. While compromise language is being negotiated, increased visibility to the pending legislation would likely aid in its passage.

I. PURPOSE

To sign H.R. 4072, the Agricultural Programs Adjustment Act of 1984.

II. BACKGROUND

H.R. 4072 began in the House as the "Wheat Improvement Act" sponsored by Tom Foley (D-Wash.) the Democratic Whip and Chairman of the Agriculture Subcommittee on Wheat.

In the Senate, the bill was strengthened to add measures relating to farm credit and export assistance. Commodity target prices were reduced to be in line with Administration recommendations.

Various special interest and single commodity advocates made strong efforts in conference to raise the cost and call for more direct Federal loan involvement. The Senate bill, supported by the Administration, essentially prevailed with House and Senate Republican support together with Congressman Foley and Agriculture Committee Chairman E. de la Garza (D-Texas).

By signing H.R. 4072, the President continues to demonstrate his commitment to forging important legislation through bipartisan support.
