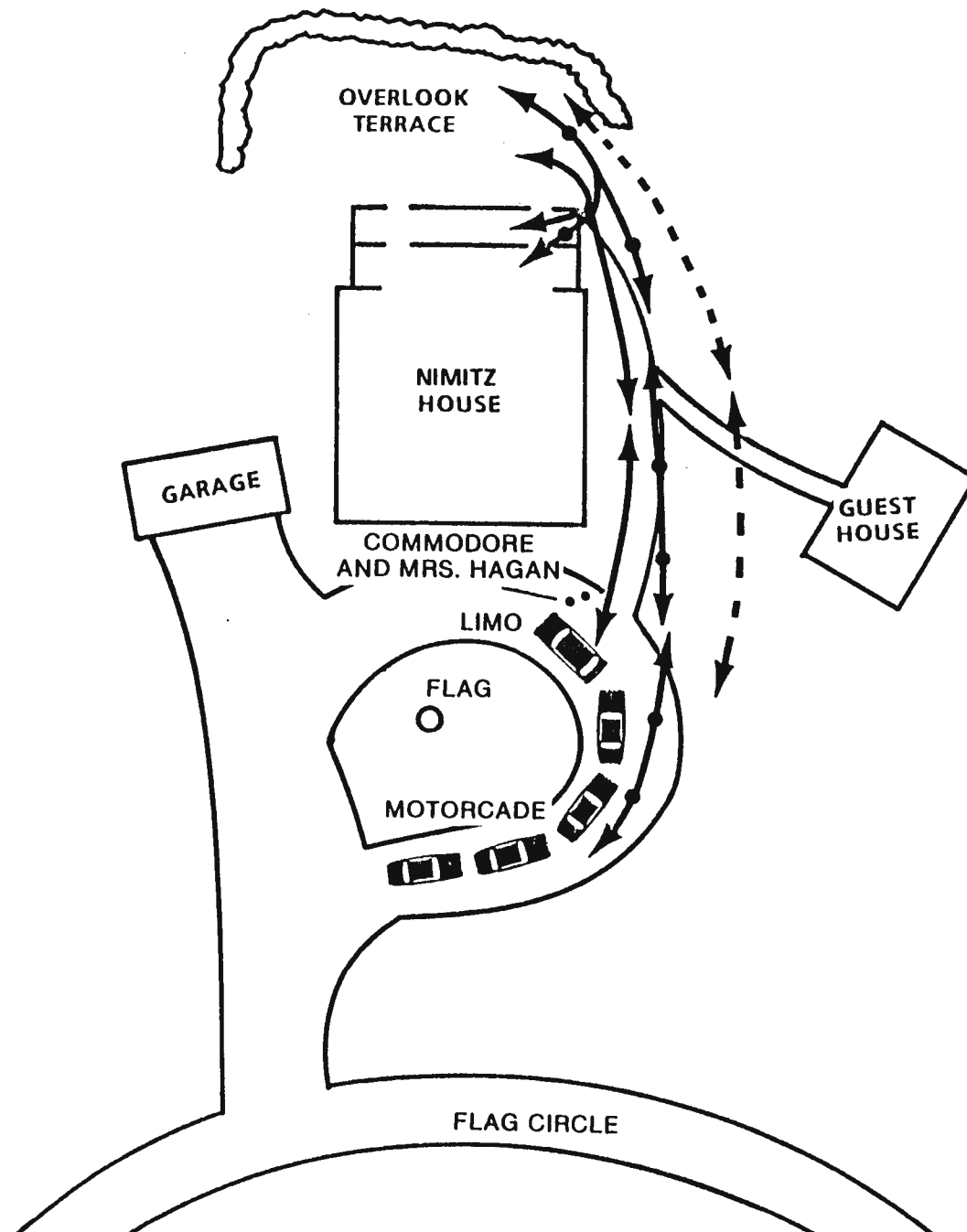

BEIJING CAPITAL AIRPORT BEIJING, PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF CHINA

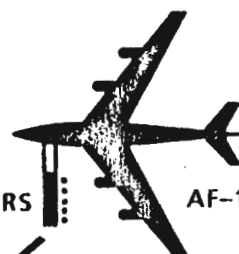

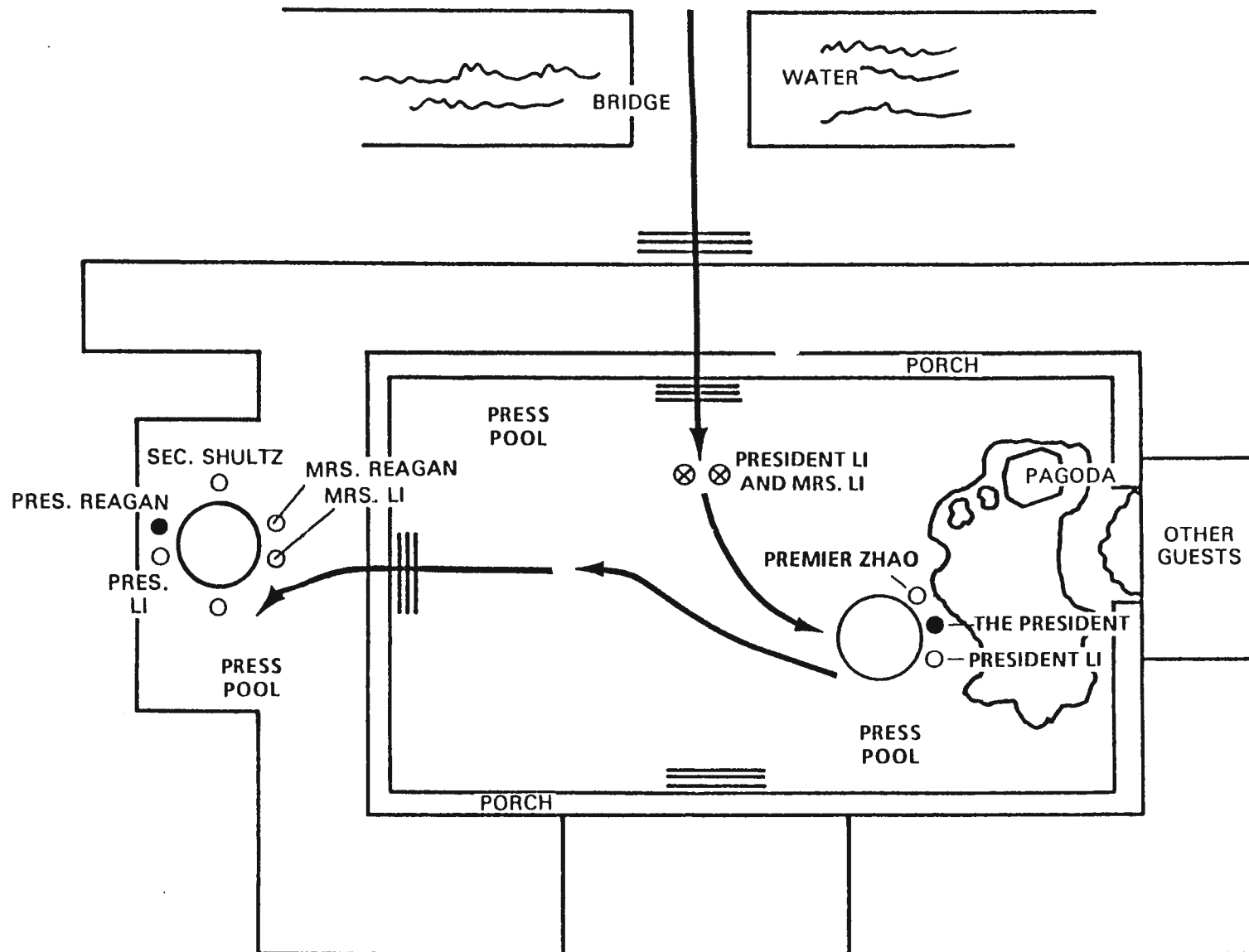

BAD WEATHER SITE

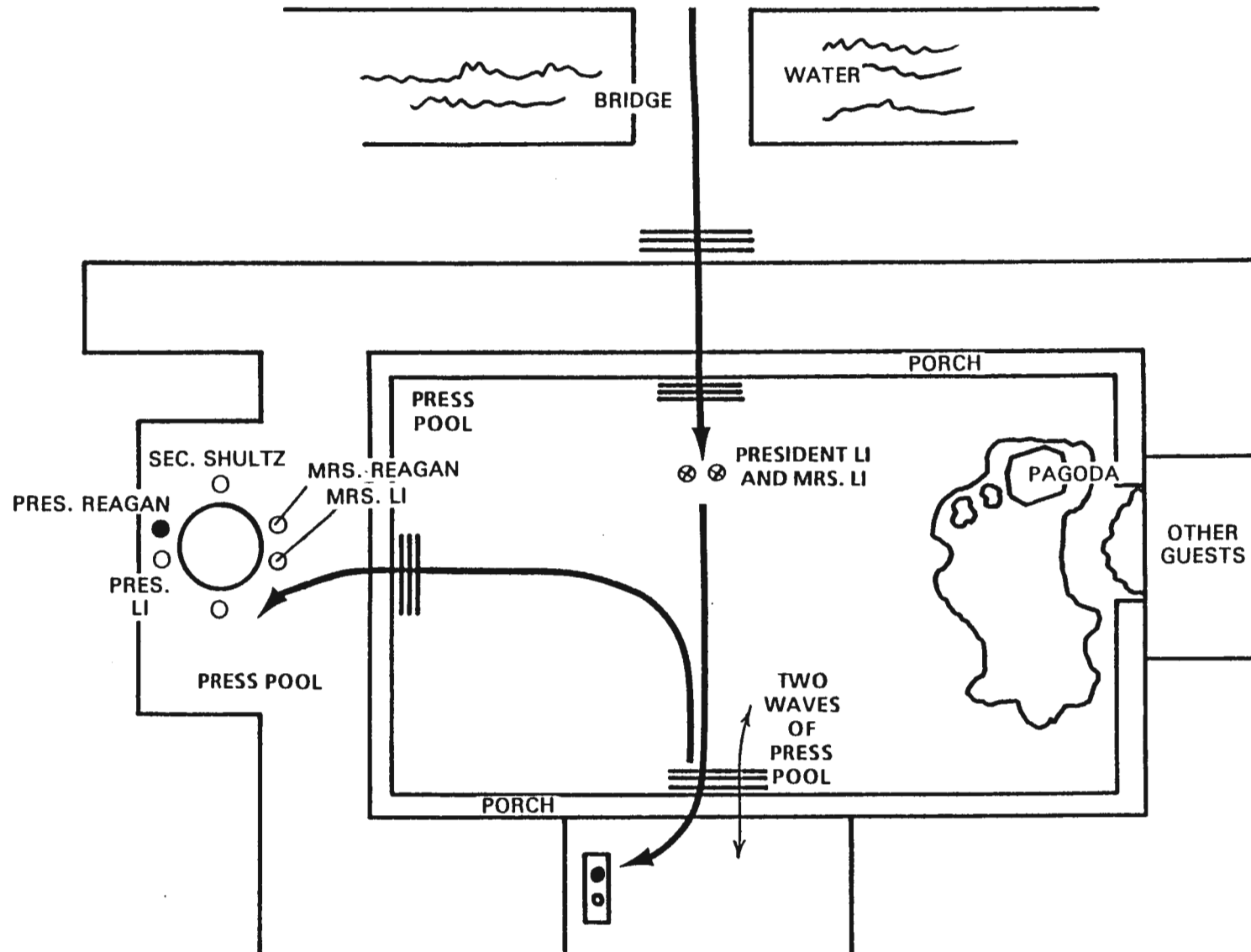

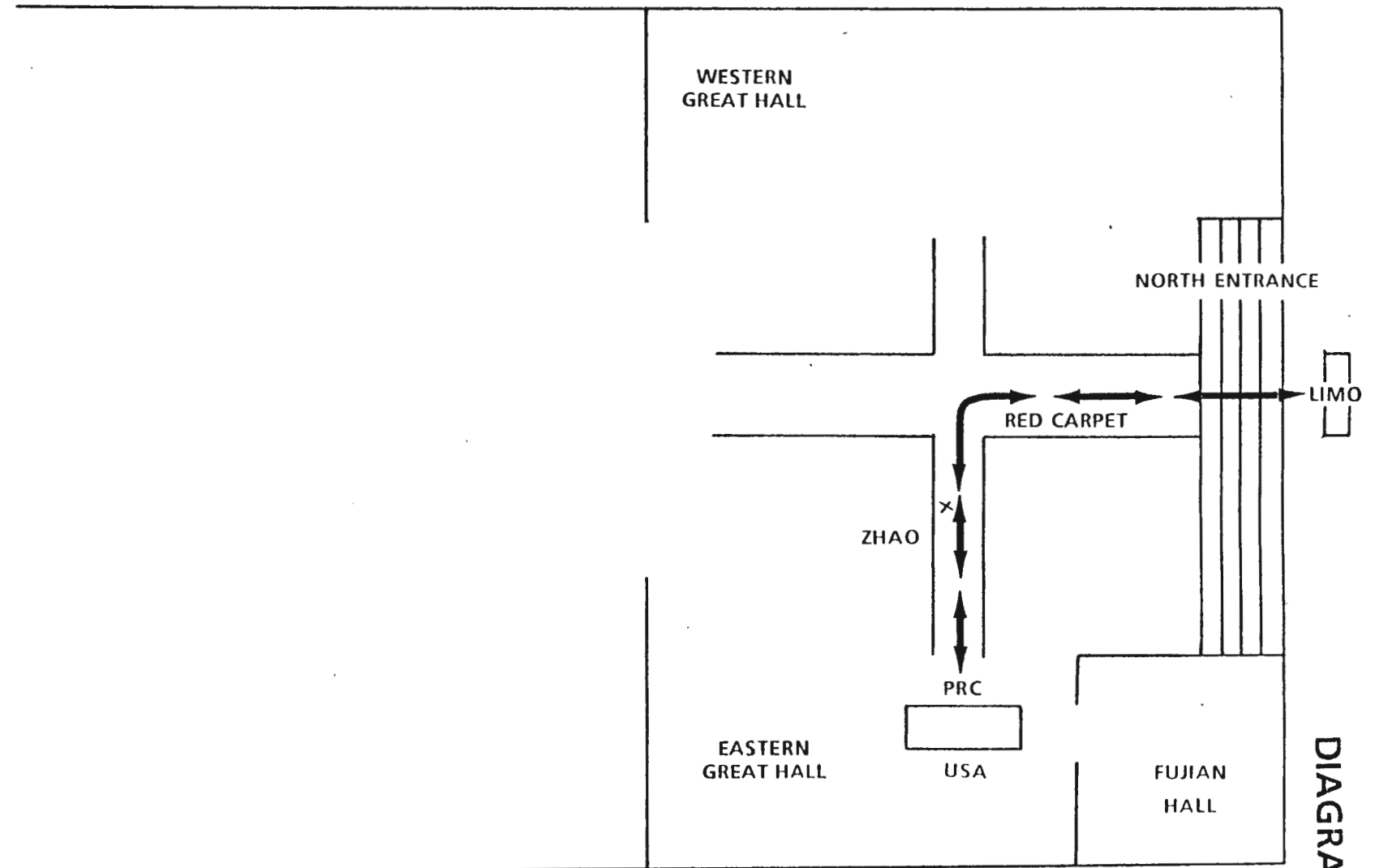
