It is good news for all Americans that the Congress has again demonstrated bipartisan unity in pursuit of two vital national goals -- strategic modernization and arms control. Their recent authorization of production of the MX Peacekeeper missile reaffirms our nation's united approach to the protection of peace.

During our gathering in May, I stressed the importance of these two goals and I asked for your support. Thanks to your help, we are now in a stronger position to build on the progress we have already made at the START negotiations. But we're not home free yet. Maintaining bipartisan unity will require our best efforts, and you can still play an important role in this effort.

In September, Congress will again take up the Peacekeeper program. We look to the Congress to send an important message to the Soviets by passing the appropriation bill to fund the Peacekeeper missile.

The challenge remains before us. I for my part will continue to consult and work closely with members of the Congress on both sides of the aisle. I hope I can count on your continued help in keeping our national consensus, which is necessary both for peace and national security.
