You, Mr. President, have in the past graced this celebration by signing the Proclamation in ceremony. It is our hope that once again we will be granted this privilege.

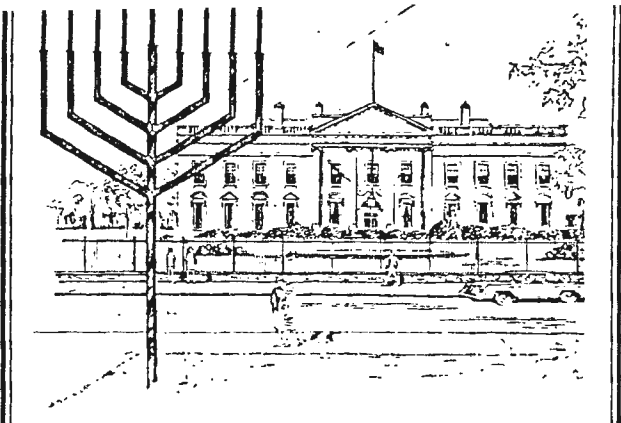

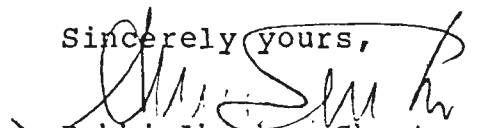

Dear Mr. President:

A few months ago I wrote to you expressing my concern for Evgeny and Irina Lein and their sixteen-year-old son Alex who live in Leningrad. This Russian Jewish family has been denied permission to emigrate to Israel for several years. On October 16, 1987 they again were denied exit visas. In frustration and desperation they began a hungerstrike on November 7, 1987 to protest the tyranny of Soviet authority. I urged you in that letter to do all in your power to help them. I have not received a response from you or your staff and therefore I have presumed upon my husband, who is scheduled to meet with you today, to hand deliver this message bringing to your attention the plight of this family. I am hoping you will personally endeavor to ascertain their present physical condition as a result of their hungerstrike as well as urge Secretary Gorbachev to arrange their immediate release.

Many of the refuseniks who have been allowed to leave the Soviet Union in past years credit their release to world public opinion and pressure on the Soviet government. The more visible an individual or family becomes, the more their names are read or heard by government authorities at all levels, the better they feel their chances are for freedom. The Leins have consistently been in such a position but obviously it has not been enough and now they feel they must take this potentially fatal course to dramatize their desire for freedom. In writing this message to you, I am hopeful that you too will hear their pleas and be able to find a way to apply pressure on the Soviet government to facilitate their release.

This spring, your meeting with Secretary Gorbachev will be vitally important for thousands of Soviet Jews who see this as an opportunity for you to intercede on their behalf. I know you are sympathetic to their desire to emigrate to Israel and you are a committed champion of human rights issues. But this message I am sending you today is to help just one family before it is too late for them. I have not received any correspondence from them since November and I fear the worst.

Thank you for caring and trying to help this family. I have faith you will endeavor to find a way to obtain information about their condition and maybe even be responsible for obtaining their freedom. G-d bless you in all your efforts.

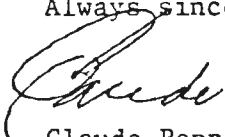

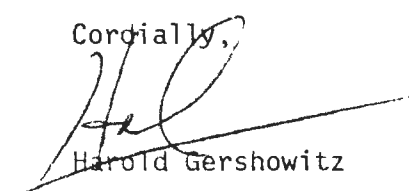
We will, of course, provide specific information concerning the event and provide whatever other assistance we can in the development of an appropriate script.

PRESIDENTS REAGAN'S REMARKS TO BE SHOWN ON VIDEO TAPE IN CHICAGO ON APRIL 28 AT 75TH ANNIVERSARY DINNER OF THE ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE.

PRESIDENT REAGAN

The ADL is almost exactly as old as I am, so during my lifetime I've seen the many dramatic changes in American society that the League has worked so hard to bring about.

We think of the United States as "the land of the free." But freedom isn't something that's settled, once and for all -- it's an ideal that we are constantly striving to get closer to.

As a result of your efforts, and the efforts of your predecessors, more Americans are more fully free today than we were a year ago or 10 years ago -- and certainly more free than we were 75 years ago.

I'm talking about freedom from religious and racial persecution. Freedom to live where we choose, and to prosper in our work according to our abilities. Freedom from vicious stereotypes.

PRESIDENT REAGAN - (cont'd)

It would take me an hour or more to do justice to the full range of your activities -- your publications, your work in the schools, your assistance to the police and the courts, your meticulous research, your advocacy of forward-looking legislation in state houses across the country, and on and on.

Instead, I'd like to touch on the two aspects of your work that I most admire and that could well serve as a model for all the private organizations that seek to improve our society.

The first is your scrupulous fairness. Your tone is always moderate. You are always vigilant but never hysterical. You keep your sense of proportion -- you call the shots as you see them, but if they came from a peashooter you don't tell the world it was a cannon. You make no accusation until you're sure of the evidence.

The second thing I admire is your broad view of your role. The fact that you are a part of a worldwide Jewish organization has never blinded you to the fact that anti-semitism won't disappear until bigotry itself has been pulled out by the roots. As a result, you have stood against all forms of racial and religious intolerance. And you have held out your hand to other religions, seeking to increase the understanding of each for the beliefs and ways of others.

PRESIDENT REAGAN - (cont'd)

Tonight you are celebrating the 75th Anniversary of your founding in Chicago. I know that your evening has been planned by Hal Gershowitz, Joel Sprayregen, Hersch Klaff, and Richard Jaffee. If they've planned it with anything like the zest and imagination they put into your cause, I'm sure you're having a wonderful time. And I'd like to congratulate Tom Homburger, your chairman, for keeping his eye on your 75 year-old principles and for keeping them so alive and so relevant here in the late 1980's.

I wish all of you Godspeed in the wonderful work you're doing to make America more American for all of us.
