

I. PURPOSE

To increase the public's awareness of the Olympic Coin Program and the need to raise funds to help our athletes meet the challenge of international competition.

II. BACKGROUND

The Olympic Commemorative Coin Act, signed into law in July 1982, authorizes the Department of the Treasury to mint and sell gold and silver coins commemorating the 1984 Summer Games. The three coins minted are a 1983 silver dollar, a 1984 silver dollar, and a 1984 ten dollar gold coin.

The Act stipulates that a surcharge of \$10 from the sale of each silver coin and \$50 from each gold coin be divided equally between the United States Olympic Committee and the Los Angeles Olympic Organizing Committee. This financial support provides for the training of our American athletes, their travel to the Games, and other expenses that help achieve the goal of Olympic excellence. In addition, it will help our young athletes prepare for future Olympics. To date, this program has contributed over \$31 million to the Committees. Your participation will help to promote Treasury's marketing theme, "Support the Home Team."

I. PURPOSE

To sign H.R. 3635 (Sawyer, R-Mich., et. al.), the Child Protection Act of 1984, strengthening prosecuting authority for child pornography, and to announce the formation of a national commission on pornography.

II. BACKGROUND

H.R. 3635 is the only <u>Republican sponsored</u> crime related legislation to clear the House Judiciary Committee and to be enacted by the 98th Congress. The principal sponsor is retiring Representative Harold Sawyer, (R-Mich.). The prime Senate advocate is Senator Arlen Specter (R-Pa.).

The bill strengthens prosecuting authority, creates stiffer penalties and extends investigating capability with respect to production and distribution of pornographic materials involving children 17 years of age or younger.

Additionally, six Members of Congress wrote to the President on March 22, 1984 urging the creation of a National Commission on Pornography to address the growing impact of this problems on victims, especially families, children and women. Subsequent meetings with the White House, Office of Policy Development, Department of Justice and Congressional advocates have produced an agreement on the formation of a National Commission on Pornography, which the President will announce at the ceremony.
