## I. PURPOSE

To draw attention to your defense and foreign policy priorities -- especially your support for continued nuclear testing -- in light of the pending Continuing Resolution.

## II. BACKGROUND

The Continuing Resolution being considered by Congress includes many provisions extremely harmful to your defense and foreign policy goals such as: moratorium on U.S. nuclear testing; prohibitions on exceeding SALT II limits; and further limits on SDI, ASAT, and chemical weapons.

Since you have not previously spoken on nuclear testing, where limitations would be especially detrimental to national security, it is appropriate for you to use nuclear testing as a symbol of the dangers in all such restrictions.

Your address would be preceded by a briefing on nuclear testing by senior Administration officials. The meeting agenda is at Tab A.
