SUBJECT: Proposed Thanksgiving and Christmas/New Year's Day Messages to the Armed Forces

The President customarily approves Thanksgiving and Christmas/New Year's Day messages for the Armed Forces. Proposed messages are attached.

To permit worldwide dissemination in an orderly and timely manner, it is necessary to have a signed text for print release by September 9, and an audio and video recording for radio and television release by September 23, 1988.

We are informed that the Naval Audiovisual Unit at the White House is amenable to recording the message. However, should the recording be done commercially, request 1/4" reel-to-reel at 7-1/2 ips for audio; 1" Type C videotape or 3/4" U-Matic video cassette for television.

The Department of Defense plans to release the message to:

- -- more than 1,100 Armed Forces newspapers worldwide.
- -- military radio and television outlets in the United States.
- -- military radio and television outlets overseas and to Navy ships through the facilities of the Armed Forces Radio and Television Service.
- -- all DoD activities via message.
