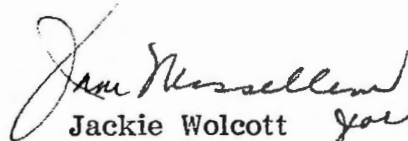

DRAFT PRESS RELEASE

The President today announced his intention to nominate Harry W. Shlaudeman, of California, a Career Member of the Senior Foreign Service, Class of Career Minister, as Ambassador to the Federative Republic of Brazil. He succeeds Diego C. Asencio.

Ambassador Shlaudeman in the early 1950s was a Real Estate Salesman and Property Manager with Hare, Brewer & Kelly in Palo Alto; a Trainee at Union Bank of Pasadena, and a Credit Manager at Richfield Oil Company in Los Angeles. He entered the Foreign Service in 1954 and served as a Vice Consul at Barranquilla, Colombia, 1955-56. He then went to Bogota, Colombia as Political Officer, 1956-58. From there he returned to Washington to attend the Foreign Service Institute studying Bulgarian and Area Training. From there in 1960 he went to Sofia, Bulgaria as Consul. In 1964 he became Political Officer in Santo Domingo, returning to Washington in 1964 as the Dominican Desk Officer. From 1965-66 Ambassador Shlaudeman was Assistant Director, Office of Caribbean Affairs, and Adviser to Ambassador Ellsworth Bunker during his mission to the Dominican Republic. Ambassador Shlaudeman served as Special Assistant to Secretary of State Dean Rusk, 1967-69. He became Deputy Chief of Mission in Santiago, Chile in 1969, and served there until 1973 when he returned to Washington as Deputy Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs. He was named Ambassador to Venezuela in 1976. He then became Assistant Secretary of State for Inter-American Affairs until 1977 when he was appointed Ambassador to Peru. He served in Lima until 1980 when he became Ambassador to Argentina. From 1983-84 he served as Executive Director of the National Bipartisan Commission on Central America, and in 1984 he was appointed Ambassador at Large and the President's Special Envoy for Central America.

Ambassador Shlaudeman was born May 17, 1926 in Los Angeles, California. He received his B.A. in 1952 from Stanford University, and served in the United States Marine Corps from 1944-46. Ambassador Shlaudeman is fluent in Spanish and Bulgarian. He received the Distinguished Honor Award in 1966, and the Presidential Meritorious Service Award in 1983. Ambassador Shlaudeman is married to the former Carol Jean Dickey and they have three children.

Ambassador Shlaudeman's ability to handle delicate issues with the governments with which he is involved and his strong feel for Washington policy-making considerations under four U.S. Presidents underlie his remarkably successful Foreign Service career. Except for one tour in Sofia and as Special Assistant to the Secretary of State, Ambassador Shlaudeman's service to date has been entirely in the Latin American area. This has included tours in Barranquilla, Bogota and Santo Domingo in consular, political and economic assignments; Santiago as Deputy Chief of Mission; Deputy Assistant Secretary in the Bureau of Inter-American Affairs; Ambassador to Venezuela; Assistant Secretary, Bureau of Inter-American Affairs; Ambassador to Peru; Ambassador to Argentina; Executive Director, National Bi-Partisan Commission on Central America, Department of State; and Ambassador-at-Large and Special Envoy for Central America, Department of State.

Ambassador Shlaudeman was praised for his virtuoso performance in working with key political elements in Peru to encourage a return to democratic, constitutional rule. His accomplishment in this delicate situation was an important factor in his being chosen to go as Ambassador to Argentina to handle an even more difficult assignment, made doubly so by Argentina's unexpected military action in the Falkland Islands. Former Assistant Secretary Enders noted that he "has consistently shown an appreciation of the full range of U.S. interests at stake in this crisis and has made major contributions to our efforts to preserve those interests."

Taciturn, urbane, with an attractive personality and balanced sense of humor, Ambassador Shlaudeman possesses a versatility, creativity, adaptability, drive and stamina which from the beginning of his career have marked him as an officer of great potential. Calm and dispassionate, he exercises exceptional powers of judgment, perspicacity, political observation and intellect. A fine organizer and leader, he infuses all with a great sense of unity.

In his Ambassadorial assignments, Ambassador Shlaudeman has demonstrated the highest degree of diplomatic forcefulness. He has the broad experience and skills required to handle the delicate issues involved in our relations with Brazil.

§ 208. Acts affecting a personal financial interest

Shall be fined not more than \$10,000, or imprisoned not more than two years, or both.

In the case of class A and B directors of Federal Reserve banks, the Board of Governors of the Federal Reserve System shall be the Government official responsible for appointment.
