COUNTRY: (U) HONDURAS (HO) NICARAGUA LNU) CUBA (CU) DEBRIEFING OF HO GUERILLA OTHER PEOPLES'S BEHAVIOR AND DECIDED TO JOIN THE GROUP KNOWN AS "GRUPO DE CELEBRADORES DE LA PALABRA". THE GROUP USUALLY MET IN JUTICALPA EVERY THREE (3) MONTHS AND DISCUSSED THEIR ACTIVITIES DURING THE PAST PERIOD. THE LEADER OF THE ORGANIZATION, BERNARD BULANG (A RADICAL CATHOLIC PRIEST WHO LIVED IN JUTICALPA FOR SEVE-RAL YEARS) WAS RESPONSIBLE FOR SELECTING THE BIBLICAL SUBJECTS TO BE COVERED DURING THE NEXT THREE MONTHS. PRIVATE CONFERENCES WERE ALSO CONDUCTED WITH BULANG AT THE COMPLETION OF EACH REUNION. INITIALLY, THE GROUP OF "CELEBRADORES DE LA PALABRA" CONSISTED OF 48 MEMBERS. THE NUMBER INCREASED RATHER FAST IN A SHORT PERIOD OF TIME, AND FOR THIS REASON, BULANG DECIDED TO CONDUCT THE FUTURE MEETINGS AT THE VILLAGE OF EACH MEMBER OF THE ORGANIZATION. BULANG BECAME THE SUPERVISOR OF THE GROUP'S ACTIVITIES FOR THE ENTIRE AREA AND THE "ORADOR INVITADO" (GUEST SPEAKER) DURING THE CONDUCT OF THE MEETIKGS.

- C. SOCIO/POLITICAL THEMES STRESSED BY BERNARD BULANG:
- (1) THE "CAMPESINOS" MUST ORGANIZE THEMSELVES TO ELEIHINATE THE PRIVILEGED CLASS.
- (2) THE CAMPESINOS MUST OBTAIN HIGHER EDUCATION. .
- (3) LAND REFORM IN HONDURAS MUST FAVOR THE CAMPESINOS.
 - (4) THE CAMPESINOS MUST PREPARE THEMSELVES POLITI-CALLY AND MILITARILY IN ORDER TO ASSUME THE LEADERSHIP OF THIS COUNTRY (HO).
- (5) MORE LAND, SCHOOLS AND JOBS ARE NEEDED FOR THE POOR CAMPESING CLASS.
- (6) ARMEO STRUGGLE BETWEEN THE WORKING CAMPESINO
 CLASS AND THE WEALTHY IS NEEDED TO ELIMINATE

- (7) THE FPR (FRENTE POPULAR REVOLUCIONARIA), IS A POLITICAL/HILITARY ORGANIZATION THAT PROVIDES SUPPORT TO THE CAMPESINOS IN HO.
 - (8) THE BIBLE SPEAKS THE TRUTH OF INJUSTICE.
- (9) STRUGGLE AGAINST THE PRIVILEGED CLASSES IN HONDURAS IS NECESSARY.
- D. THE FPR LORENZO ZELAYA: SHORTLY AFTER MEETING BERNARD BULANG, MONTOYA WAS RECRUITED BY BULANG AND A BERNARDO (NEI) INTO THE (FPR) "LORENZO ZELAYA". ITS HISSION IS TO INDOCTRINATE THE CAMPESINO POPULATION AND ESTABLISH A POPULAR REVOLUTIONARY GOVERNMENT IN HO. ACCORDING TO MONTOYA, THE FPR IS A SELF-SUFFICIENT ORGANIZATION. THEIR LEADERS ARE NOT ASSOCIATED NOR ARE THEY SUBORDINATED TO THE MAJOR CLANDESTINE ORGANIZATIONS SUCH AS THE PARTIDO REVOLUCIONARIO DE TRABAJADORES CENTROAMERICAMOS (PRTC). HE DOES NOT KNOW THE NAME OF THE LEADERS OF HIS ORGANIZATION, NOR IS HE FAMILIAR WITH THE ORGANIZATION STRUCTURE OF THE PRTC OR THE FPR. HIS IMMEDIATE LEADER, ALSO A HONDURAN

CITIZEN, IS KNOWN AS "RAMON". THE REAL NAMES OF OTHER LEADERS OR MEMBERS WERE NEVER DISCLOSED DUE TO THE SECURITY MEASURES ESTABLISHED BY THE ORGANIZATION (FPR). IN MARCH OF 1981, BERNARD BULANG EMPHASIZED THE IMPORBT

ACCORDING TO MONTOYA THE NAME OF THE ORGANIZATION WAS: "FUERZA POPULAR REVOLUCIONARIA (FPR) LORENZO ZELAYA". IN JUNE OF 1981, ARNYLFO WAS INTRODUCED BY THE FRENCH PRIEST TO A HONDURAN CITIZEN KNOWN AS "TONO". SINCE THEN, "TONO" MET WITH ARNULFO THREE (3) TIMES PRIOR TO HIS DEPARTURE FROM HONDURAS.

- (1) THE FIRST MEETING: AT THE FIRST MEETING (IN
- JUTICALPA), TONO BRIEFLY EXPLAINED THE ORGA-
- NIZATION (FPR). MONTOYA WAS PROMISED FREE
- EDUCATION AND AN EDUCATION THAT WOULD ALLOW
- HIM TO BETTER ORGANIZE THE CAMPESINOS TO FIGHT AGAINST OPRESSION AND INJUSTICE.
- ACCORDING TO MONTOYA, THE COURSE WAS TO BE
- CONDUCTED IN COSTA RICA, AND THE LENGTH OF THE
- TRAINING PERIOD WAS SIX (6) MONTHS.

(2) THE SECOND MEETING:

AT THE SECOND MEETING, MONTOYA RECALLS TONO PROMISING THE FOLLOWING, PROVIDING HE ACCEPTED THE SCHOOL OPPOERUNITIES: HIGHER EDUCATION, TRAVEL OPPORTUNITIES, ATTENTION AND ECONOMIC SUPPORT FOR HIS FAMILY AND CONSTANT COMMUNICA-

TION WITH HIS FAMILY WHILE HE WAS AWAY.

BECAUSE OF THE PROMISES AND HIS DIFFICULT SITUATION (7 CHILDREN TO SUPPORT), HE DECIDED TO ACCEPT THE OFFER TO JOIN THE FPR AND STUDY ABROAD. ON 30 JUL 1981, HE VISITED TONO'S RESIDENCE LOCATED IN JUTICALPA AND MET WITH TONO'S WIFE "LUISA", ALSO A HONDURAN CITIZEN OF APPROXIMATELY 24 YEARS OF AGE. AT TONO'S HOUSE MONTOYA MET EIGHT (8) OTHER CAMPESINOS WHO WERE ALSO RECRUITED FOR THE SAME PURPOSE. THE NEXT DAY, 31 JULY 1981. MONTOYA TRAVELLED TO TEGUCIGALPA WITH TONO IN ORDER TO GET PASSPORTS AND VISAS FOR COSTA RICA.

- E. TONO: MONTOYA DESCRIBED TONO AS A HONDURAN CITIZEN APPROXIMATELY 33 YRS OF AGE, 5'9" TALL, 178LBS, MUSCULAR, WHITE COMPLEXION, BLACK HAIR, AND ROUND FACE. HE ALWAYS DRESSED WELL (EXPENSIVE SHOES AND CLOTHING) AND SEEMED WELL EDUCATED, HE ACTED AS POLITICAL OFFICER/CONTACT MAN/INSPECTOR. AS A POLITICAL OFFICER, HE PREACHED THE SAME THEMES STRESSED BY BERNARD BULANG (REF SUB PARAGRAPH 2C). AS CONTACT MAN HE MADE INITIAL CONTACT WITH POTENTIAL STUDENTS. AS INSPECTOR. HE WAS OBSERVED INSPECTING THE TRAINING AT PINAR DEL RIO, CUBA AND IN NU. DURING THE TIME MONTOYA SPENT IN PINAR DEL RIO, CUBA, (18 AUG 81-85 MAY 83), TONO VISITED THE CUBAN CLANDESTINE TRAINING CENTER "P-38", ON TWO OCCASIONS.
- 3. (S/NF) MOVEMENT TO CUBA: MONTOYA TRAVELLED TO TEGU-CIGALPA BY BUS ON 31 JUL 81 AND STAYED IN A HOTEL

LOCATED NEAR THE BUS TERMINAL. IN TEGUCIGALPA, TONO HELPED THE GROUP OBTAIN THEIR PERSONAL DOCUMENTATION TO INCLUDE PASSPORTS AND VISAS FOR COSTA RICA. MONTOYA INDICATED THAT HIS PASSPORT ONLY REFLECTED A VISA FOR "COSTA RICA". HE NEVER SUSPECTED THAT HE WAS GOING TO NICARAGUA/CUBA. HE DEPARTED TEGUCIGALPA ON 9 AUG 81



SOON AFTER ARRIVING IN MANAGUA, THE GROUP'S CONTACT, AN INDIVIDUAL NAMED LUIS (NFI), GAVE THEM THE FOLLOWING LECTURE: "YOU ARE GOING TO CUBA FOR SIX MONTHS.
BEHAVE YOURSELF....LEARN AS MUCH AS POSSIBLE". THE GROUP WAS DIVIDED INTO SMALLER GROUPS OF THREE TO FOUR AND DEPARTED SANDINO AIRPORT, MANAGUA, ON 10 AUG 81 VIA CUBANA DE AVIACION. THEY ARRIVED AT JOSE MARTI AIRPORT IN HAVANA CU LATE AFTERNOON. THERE, A MAN KNOWN AS "OSMANI" WAS WAITING FOR THE GROUP. "OSMANI" WAS A CUBAN CITIZEN WHOSE MAIN RESPONSIBILITY WAS TO RECEIVE/WELCOME LATIN-AMERICAN STUDENTS. HE HANDLED ALL OF THE ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEDUTES AT THE AIRPORT AND TRANSPORTED THE GROUP BY BUS TO PINAR DEL RIO.

UPDN ARRIVAL IN CU, A SMALL BUS WAS USED TO TRANPORT THE HONDURAN GROUP OF NINE (9) TO THE CLANDESTINE SCHOOL IN PINAR DEL RIO KNOWN AS P-3Ø. MONTOYA AND HIS GROUP WERE GIVEN MEDICAL EXAM AND STAYED AT THE P-3Ø SCHOOL FDR

APPROXIMATELY 8 DAYS. FROM THERE, THEY WERE TRANSFERRED TO "MICRO 3", THE SMALLEST TRAINING CAMP WITHIN THE CLANDESTINE SCHOOL.

4. (S/NF) TRAINING IN CUBA:

A. THE P-30 CLANDESTINE SCHOOL IS LOCATED APPRO-XIMATELY 85 MILES FROM HAVANAAND IS DIVIDED INTO INDIVI-DUAL CAMPS. THE P-30 CAMP, WHERE HE REMAINED FOR 8 DAYS WAS SECURED WITH BARBED WIRE AND CONSISTED OF LIVING QUARTERS (BARRACKS), KITCHEN AND DINING HALL, CLASSROOM, TV ROOM, MAINTENANCE AREA, AND A PLAY GROUND. FOUR STATUES WERE DISPLAYED AT THE ENTRANCE OF THE CAMP (CHE GUEVARA, AND JOSE MARTI AMONG THEM, AND A PLAQUE CONSTRUCTED BY MEMBERS OF PARTIDO REVOLUCIONARIO DE TRABAJADORES CENTROAMERICANOS (REVOLUTINARY PARTY OF CENTRAL AMERICAN WORKERS), WAS DISPLAYED IN THE CENTER OF THE CAMP. AT THE SCHOOL THE RULES WERE: DO NOT TALK TO ANYONE ABOUT THE CAMP STRUCTURE AND TYPE OF TRAINING GIVEN, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO VISIT OTHER CAMPS, AND PAY ATTENTION TO THE INSTRUCTORS. A TOTAL OF 19 HONDURANS ATTENDED THE SCHOOL.

B. TRAINING: THE OVERALL DIRECTOR OF THE P-3Ø SCHOOL WAS A CUBAN CITIZEN AND COLONEL IN THECU ARMY NOWN AS "ANTONIO". UPON ARRIVAL AT THE P-3Ø SCHOOL THE 19 HONDURANS (18 MEN AND 1 WOMAN NAMED CAMILA) WERE TOLD BY ANTONIO THAT THE TRAINING WAS STRICTLY OF POLITICAL/MILITARY NATURE. THE NIMETEEN HONDURANS REMAINED AT THE P-3Ø APPROXIMATELY EIGHT DAYS. FROM THERE, THEY WERE TRANSFERRED TO "MICRO 3", WHERE THEY REMAINED SEVEN (7) MONTHS. CAMILA BECAME THE LEADER OF THE GROUP. AT THE "MICRO 3" THE ENTIRE GROUP RECEIVED MILITARY TRAINING IN THE FOLLOWING SUBJECTS:

- (1) MARKSMANSHIP: CAPTAIN RAUL, BASIC AND ADVANCED
- (2) MILITARY TACTICS: 1LT MEDINA
- (3) ENGINEER: 1LT LUIS, EXPLOSIVES, FIELD FORTI FICATIONS, PREPARATION OF CHARGES FOR BRIDGE
 DESTRUCTION.

D. TYPES OF WEAPONS:

FAL, M-16, CALIL MACHINE GUNS 30 CAL AND 50 CAL, 75 & 57 MM ARTILLERY, 60 & 81MM MORTARS, RPG-7, MACHINE GUN B-Z, PISTOL CAL 45, BROWNING, UZI, MAC, M1 AND M2, CARBINES AK-47, PISTOL TT, MARAKOV, AND 38 CAL.

E. END OF COURSE:

THE INITIAL 6 MONTHS OF TRAINING ENDED IN FEBRUARY 1982.

DURING THAT PERIOD, THE CUBANS PROVIDED EXTENSIVE TRAINING MATERIALS TO INCLUDE BOOKS, PAMPHLETS, NOTEBOOKS, ETC.

WHICH WERE LEFT BEHIND AT THE SCHOOL. NOTHING WAS BROUGHT BACK TO NICARAGUA. ALL STUDENTS WERE PHYSICALLY SEARCHED PRIOR TO LEAVING THE SCHOOL. PHYSICAL SECURITY VIOLATIONS WERE STRICTLY ENFORCED AT THE SCHOOL.

- F. END OF COURSE GRADUATION TOOK PLACE IN FEBRUARY 1982 AND THE LEADERSHIP OF THE FPR WAS PRESENT AT THE GRADUATION CEREMONY. "CAMILA" WAS THE LEADER OF THE 19 HONDURANS. AFTER GRADUATION THEY WERE FORCED TO WORK IN THE FIELD, (TRABAJO VOLUNTARIO). IN APRIL 1982, THE CUBAN AND LEADERS OF THE FPR TOLD THE STUDENTS TO PACK THEIR BAG BECAUSE THEY WERE RETURNING TO NICARAGUA.
- 5. (S/NF) RETURN TO NICARAGUA AND ACTIVITIES THERE.

 A. ON 15 APRIL 1982, THEIR PLANE DEPARTED CUBA AND ARRIVED IN MANAGUA, BUT THE HONDURANS DID NOT HAVE AN OPPORTUNITY TO DEPLANE. THEY REMAINED APPROXIMATELY TWO (2) HOURS ABOARD THE AIRCRAFT WHILE IN MANAGUA AND RETURNE TO CUBA ON THE SAME DAY. THE GROUP WAS TOLD THAT THE "CURRENT SITUATION IN NICARAGUA AND HONDURAS WAS CRITICAL, THEREFORE, "IT WAS BETTER TO RETURN TO CUBA UNTIL FURTHER NOTICE." THE 19 HONDURANS RETURNED TO PINAR DEL RIO AND RECEIVED ADDITIONAL HILITARY TRAINING AT THE P-38 SCHOOL.

FINALLY, ON 15 MAY 1983, THE GROUP ARRIVED IN NICARAGUA,
(SANDINO 1AP). AT THE AIRPORT, THE GROUP WAS MET BY
"CAHILA" AND "DANIEL." (COMMENT: THE PHYSICAL CHARACTERISTICS OF CAHILA AS DESCRIBED BY MONTOYA ARE: WHITE
COMPLEXTION, MEDIUM, SLENDER EYES, BLACK CURLY HAIR, ALWAY
WORE TROUSERS, APPEARED TO BE A WELL EDUCATED WOMAN, APP.
24 YEARS OF AGE. MONTOYA HAS NOT SEEN HER SINCE JULY 83.)

B. AIRPORT TO SAFEHOUSE:

THE ENTIRE GROUP REMAINED IN A "SAFE HOUSE" IN MANAGUA FOR APPROXIMATELY 30 DAYS, UNTIL 15 MAY 83. FROM THERE, THEY WERE TRANSPORTED TO A COFFEE PLANTATION KNOWN AS "EL CRECERO" AND REMIANED AT TIS LOCATION UNTIL 0/A 15 JUL 83. FROM THE COFFEE PLANTATION, THE ENTIRE GROUP HOVED TO JINOTEGA (1305N/8600W), ON A SEARCH OPERATION AGAINST THE CONTRAS. ON 20 JUL 83, A MEMBER OF THE GROUP KNOWN AS "FAUSTO" DEFECTED FROM THE HOVEMENT. (COMMENT: THE DEFFECTION OF FAUSTO AND THE FAILURE OF THE REYES MATTA GROUP LIKELY LED TO THE CANCELLATION OF THE

GROUP'S INFILTRATION INTO OLANCHO.

C. DURING THE JULY-AUGUST 83 TIME FRAME THE FPR FOUGHT THE CONTRAS IN THE VICINITY OF JINOTEGA LAKE (1318N 8600W). ON 18 JULY 1983, HIS GROUP (HO FPR-19 MEMBERS), WAS JOINED BY 48 MEMBERS OF THE "VANGUARDIA POPULAR DE COSTA RICA" (POPULAR VANGUARD OF CS) AND 21 MEMBERS OF THE "HONDURAN CINCHONEROS" ORGANIZATION. THE GROUPS CONDUCTED MILITARY OPERATIONS TOGETHER FOR APPROXIMATELY 2 HONTHS. THREE SANDINISTA OFFICERS WERE IN CHARGE OF THIS INTER-NATIONAL ORGANIZATION, KNOWN AS THE "BRIGADA INTERNACIONA-LISTA." THE SANDINISTA OFFICER IN CHARGE OF THE FPR GROUP WAS 1LT RUBEN FLORES. ITS MISSION WAS TO FIGHT THE CONTRAS. DURING THE FIRST FIRE-FIGHT THE BRIGADA INTER-NACIONALISTA LOST TWO COSTA RICAN FIGHTERS (ONE MALE AND ONE FEMALE GUERILLA KIA). ON 23 JULY 1983, ONE CS AND ONE SANDINISTA LT WERE KILLED. ON 26 JULY 83 A SECOND CLASH OCCURRED WITH THE CONTRAS WHEN THE PLATOON "VANGUARDIA POPULAR DE CS" MADE CONTACT WITH THE CONTRAS. THE COSTA RICANS SUFFERED TWO KIA WHILE CASUALTIES ON THE CONTRA SIDE WERE NEVER DETERMINED. DEAD CONTRA SOLDIERS WERE NEVER FOUND NOR OBSERVED BY HONTOYA, HOWEVER, THE NICARA-GUANS ALWAYS EXAGGERATED THE CASUALTY RATE AMONG THE

D. THE CINCHONERO GROUP: MONTOYA WAS INFORMED THAT THE CINCHONERO GROUP WAS FORMED BY HONDURAN CITIZENS (CAMPESINOS), WHO WERE IN COMPLETE DISAGREEMENT WITH THE CURRENT HONDURAN GOVERNMENT. HOWEVER, HE AND OTHER MEMBER OF THE FPR WERE PROBIBITED TO TALK TO THEM. THE SANDINISTAS ALWAYS STRESSED THAT OPERATIONS/INFORMATION BE COMPARTMENTED, THAT THIS IS THE BASIC MEASURE TO SURVIVE ON THE BATTLE FIELD. IN SPITE OF THE RESTRICTIONS IMPOSED BY THE SANDINISTAS, THE MEMBERS OF THESE ORGANIZATIONS MADE CLANDESTINE CONTACTS TO DISCUSS THE PROBLEMS AFFECTING THE MORALE OF THE GROUPS. HONTOYA MET A PERSON KNOWN AS

"MARTIN", WHO WAS A LEADER OF THE "CINCHONERO GROUP."
(COMMENT: ACCORDING TO MONTDYA "MARTIN: WAS A LEADER OF A
"COOPERATIVA" UNION SOMEWHERE ON THE HONDURAN NORTHERN
COASTLINE. MONTDYA RECALLS THE FOLLOWING STATEMENT BEING
MADE BY MARTIN: "I ALREADY HAVE PEOPLE WAITING FOR ME IN

TODAY TOLD A NEWS CONFERENCE ARRANGED BY THE HONDURAN ARMY THEY HAD DEFECTED FROM THE POPULAR REVOLUTIONARY FORCES (FPR) WHICH HAD SENT THEM FOR TRAINING IN CUBA AND NICARAGUA.

THEY SAID THE TRAINING WAS INTENDED TO REVIVE THE HONDURAN GUERRILLA MOVEMENT WHICH THE MILITARY CRUSHED IN A SERIES OF COUNTER-INSURGENCY SWEEPS LAST YEAR.

WHILE IN NICARAGUA THEY HAD FOUGHT ANTI-SANDINIST REBELS, THEY SAID. ""IN ALL, THERE WERE 120 HONDURAN GUERRILLAS FIGHTING THE CONTRAS (REBELS) IN THE MOUNTAINS OF NICARAGUA."" THEY SAID.

ARMY SPOKESMAN CAPT. ROBERTO ACOSTA TOLD THE NEWS CONFERENCE THE DEFECTORS WOULD BE BROUGHT BEFORE A MILITARY JUDGE WHO WOULD DECIDE IF THEY SHOULD BE FREED OR PUT ON TRIAL.

MONTOYA AND PACON SAID THEY HAD BEEN RECRUITED WITH 13 OTHERS IN 1981 AND HAD SINCE BEEN IN NICARAGUA AND CUBA BEFORE RETURNING TO HONDURAS LAST MONTH.

THEY SAID THEY HAD TURNED THEMSELVES IN EIGHT DAYS LATER BECAUSE THEY WANTED TO BE WITH THEIR FAMILIES.

ACOSTA SAID ANOTHER DOZEN GUERRILLAS WHO HAD RETURNED AT THE SAME TIME WERE STILL AT LARGE IN THE PROVINCE OF EL PARAISO BORDERING NICARAGUA.
