As I am not going to Geneva, I have been asked to give an honest broker's recommendation on participation in the various events. I have worked closely with Bob Pearson in trying to be both fair and firm.

You are well aware of the jockeying to be in Geneva and to participate in the sessions. In January, Shultz invited reps from all concerned agencies to Geneva as a tool to help manage the interagency process; but participation in the meetings with the Soviets was very restricted. formula seemed to work and I suggest we try to follow it. Therefore, as a general approach, I have been fairly liberal with the official delegation list for the Swiss arrival and departure ceremonies and with participation in the U.S.-only pre-briefs and working lunches; but strict regarding the sessions with Gorbachev.

There are a number of difficult choices. For example, will Defense (Ikle) attend meetings with Soviets? Charley Wick reportedly hopes to sign the cultural agreement, should there be one. Then there is the arms control community, where such senior people as Ambassadors Kampelman, Tower and Glitman apparently will be back in Geneva and reportedly hope to participate. Rowney has also expressed interest in attending. Paul Nitze has normally been included. A decision not to include the Geneva negotiators would greatly reduce pressures for meeting seats.

At Tab A is a proposed participants list for each event (I apologize for its length). To repeat, I have tried to be accommodating in the U.S.-only sessions. I have also tried to balance competing interests, such as including Tower and Glitman in a pre-brief, and Kampelman in a working Our proposed list also reflects informal consultations with Bill Henkel in an effort to benefit from his vast experience and to take account The list reflects Bill's advice on the maximum of "White House needs". number -- 14 -- that can be comfortably seated in the briefing rooms.

I believe you are aware of Shultz' plan to have all his regional Assistant Secretaries in Geneva, so they can subsequently depart on briefing missions. While Shultz' plan is not directly related, I feel compel to state that the ten-strong NSC professional delegation may encourage or provide excuses for others to send large numbers.

As I am not going to Geneva, I have been asked to give an honest broker's recommendation on participation in the various events. I have worked closely with Bob Pearson in trying to be both fair and firm.

You are well aware of the jockeying to be in Geneva and to participate in the sessions. In January, Shultz invited reps from all concerned agencies to Geneva as a tool to help manage the interagency process; but participation in the meetings with the Soviets was very restricted. This formula seemed to work and I suggest we try to follow it. Therefore, as a general approach, I have been fairly liberal with the official delegation list for the Swiss arrival and departure ceremonies and with participation in the U.S.-only pre-briefs and working lunches; but strict regarding the sessions with Gorbachev.

There are a number of difficult choices. For example, will Defense (Ikle) attend meetings with Soviets? Charley Wick reportedly hopes to sign the cultural agreement, should there be one. Then there is the arms control community, where such senior people as Ambassadors Kampelman, Tower and Glitman apparently will be back in Geneva and reportedly hope to participate. Rowney has also expressed interest in attending. Paul Nitze has normally been included. A decision not to include the Geneva negotiators would greatly reduce pressures for meeting seats.

At Tab A is a proposed participants list for each event (I apologize for its length). To repeat, I have tried to be accommodating in the U.S.-only sessions. I have also tried to balance competing interests, such as including Tower and Glitman in a pre-brief, and Kampelman in a working lunch. Our proposed list also reflects informal consultations with Bill Henkel in an effort to benefit from his vast experience and to take account of "White House needs". The list reflects Bill's advice on the maximum number -- 14 -- that can be comfortably seated in the briefing rooms.

I believe you are aware of Shultz' plan to have all his regional Assistant Secretaries in Geneva, so they can subsequently depart on briefing missions. While Shultz' plan is not directly related, I feel compel to state that the ten-strong NSC professional delegation may encourage or provide excuses for others to send large numbers.

This memo is intended to continue the "honest broker" role you asked me to undertake last week. Pursuant to our conversation, we need, in my view, to immediately stop what I perceive as back-door efforts concerning Geneva participation.

I strongly recommend that the only way we forward changes to Henkel is via the formal memo route. To do otherwise is folly. In reviewing your November 11 memo to Henkel, I see the need for one change. When Elaine retyped the list on Monday, Wick was inadvertently dropped from the working lunch. Since that is the only session in which Wick will participate, we need to quickly correct the record.

Concerning talk of adding Nitze, Ridgway, and Palmer without a formal memo -- which Henkel tells me he is doing -- makes a mockery of the process we established last week. As you know, we went through an elaborate, balancing act and presented Bud clear options. To now make piecemeal additions is a disservice. If there are to be additions, Bud should receive a memo laying out the full implications.

While there may be arguments for making additions, we tried to take all these into account in giving Bud the options paper last week. Nitze, Ridgway, and Palmer are in many events, but not in all events. Their participation relates to the subjects to be discussed. To add them now to additional events would, in my view, overload State participation. Why should State get 3 to 4 slots and Defense one? Furthermore, while Palmer had done a good job and worked very hard, we have never had two EUR reps in any Presidential meeting. My final point is to reopen the participants list at this stage is to open pandora's box.
