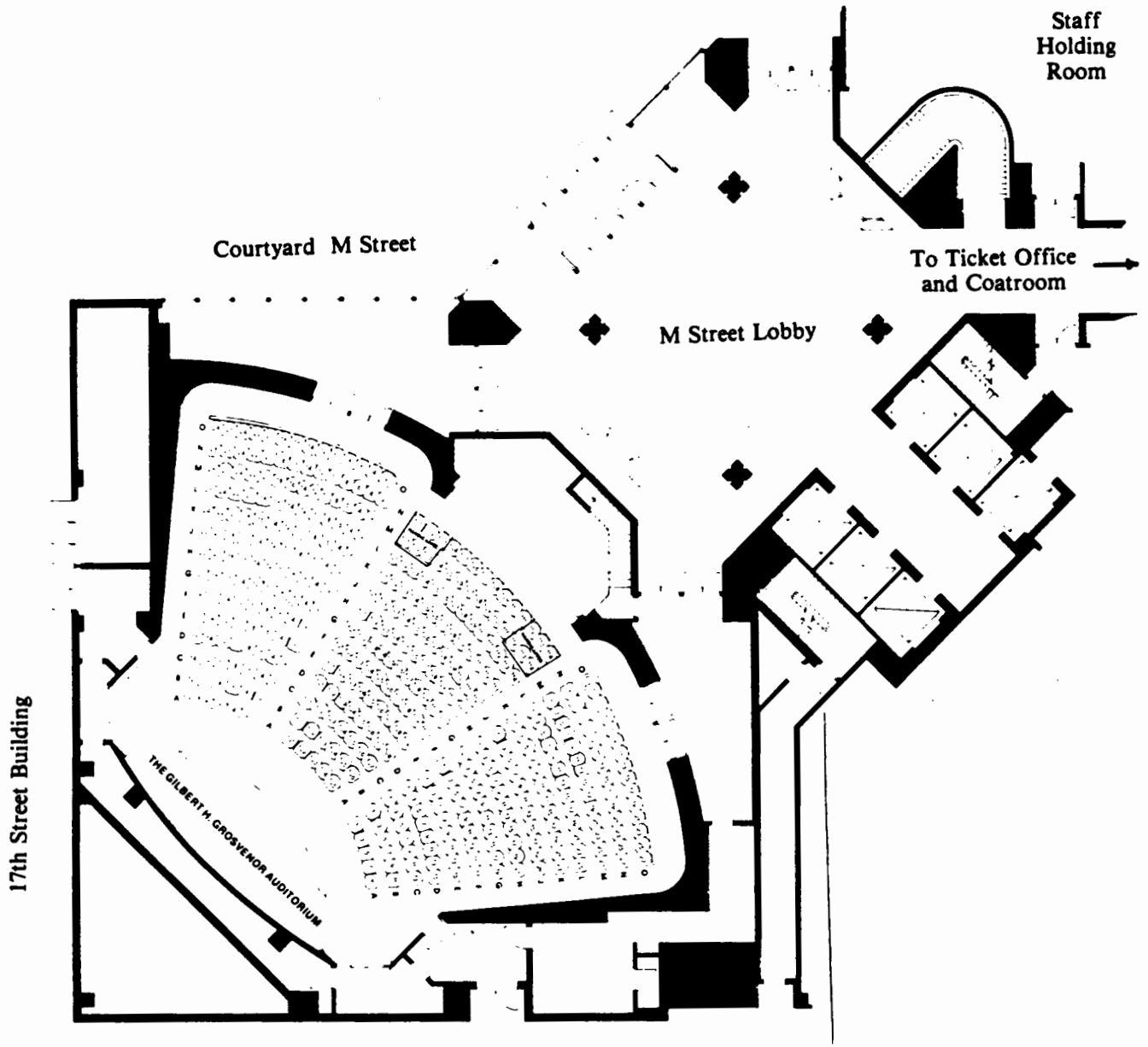

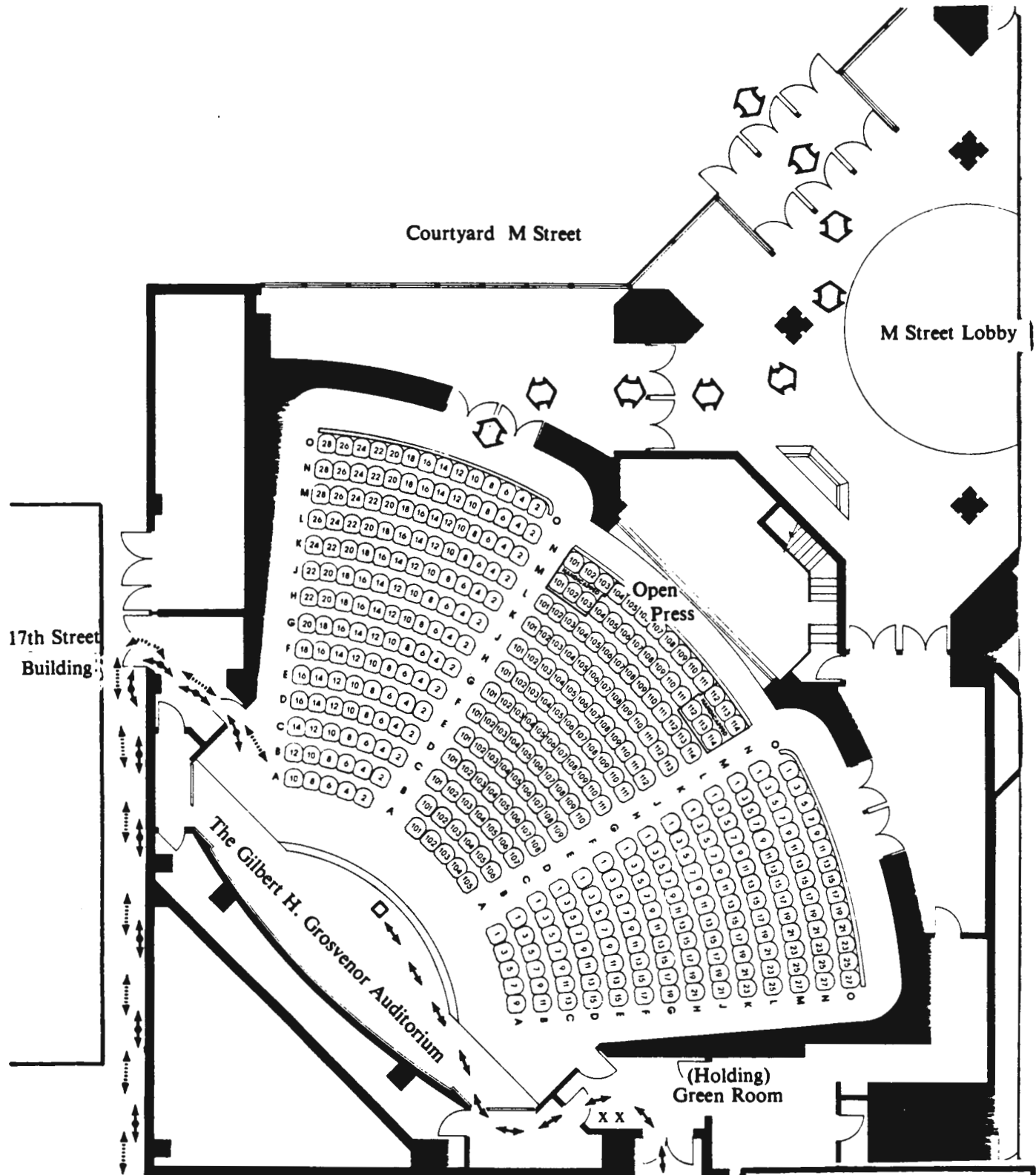

MEETING WITH HOUSE AND SENATE REPUBLICAN LEADERSHIP

DATE: Tuesday, June 19, 1984
LOCATION: The Cabinet Room

I. PURPOSE

To review the progress of the deficit reduction package; to update the status of the elements in our Central America package; and to review the agenda for the remainder of this month.

II. BACKGROUND

While Floor action in the House revolves around the immigration bill and the Senate finishes up the Defense Authorization bill, work is proceeding on the deficit reduction package. Also, negotiations are continuing on various legislative elements of our Central American policy.

The Ways and Means-Finance Committees conference, on its portion of the deficit reduction package, is expected to conclude Tuesday night. Their agreement will include important spending cuts and, hopefully, enterprise zones.

The other conference activity on budget issues is bogged down over spending cuts and priorities. Fortunately, House and Senate Republican leaders and the Republicans on both appropriation committees have agreed to allocation levels which will implement the Rose Garden agreement -- even if the Democrats refuse to agree to our spending levels in conference. This commitment by Congressional Republicans assures the votes to sustain any veto on appropriation bills and provides additional protection for important Administration priorities in the areas of security assistance and foreign operations, NASA, and law enforcement.

The legislative battle to implement our Central American policy has become increasingly partisan and is not proceeding as well as we would like. The emergency supplemental (containing \$62 million for El Salvador and is the vehicle for Nicaragua funds) is waiting for action in the Senate. We have asked the Senate to hold up action until we could reach a compromise with House Democrats to get some money for covert

activities in Nicaragua. Prospects are dim and Speaker O'Neill is using this delay to berate us for holding up the funding for the summer jobs program, which is also in this supplemental. Markup for the regular supplemental is scheduled in House Appropriations this week. House Democrats have basically zeroed out funds for Central America; Republicans will try to amend the bill in committee and on the Floor -- but it is unlikely that we can get the spending levels we have requested. We have asked Senator Baker to bring up the 1985 foreign assistance authorization bill as soon as possible. This is a very difficult and time-consuming bill. When this bill is considered, Senator Mathias will offer an amendment to implement the Kissinger Commission report. The legislative road for our Central American policy is rocky and we anticipate a difficult fight for the remainder of this session.

In the two weeks remaining before the July recess, the Congress will have to extend debt ceiling and the bankruptcy laws. They also hope to complete several appropriation bills.

I. PURPOSE

To recognize the 1984 Presidential Scholars and to celebrate the 20th anniversary of the program.

II. BACKGROUND

This year marks the 20th anniversary of the Presidential Scholars Program, which was established by an Executive Order of the President. The Presidential Scholar honor is the Nation's highest distinction bestowed upon exceptional high school students.

There are 141 graduating high school seniors who have been named as the 1984 Presidential Scholars. Of the 141 winners, 121 were selected on the basis of their academic achievements, leadership qualities and involvement in community and school activities. The other 20 were recognized for superior achievements in the arts -- including dance, music, theater, visual arts and creative writing.

The winners include one young man and one young woman from each State, the District of Columbia, Puerto Rico and U.S. families living abroad; 15 students chosen at-large; and 20 from the arts. Academic scholars were selected on the basis of their test scores, transcripts, questionnaires and essays. The arts scholars were selected in cooperation with the National Foundation for the Advancement in the Arts, which oversees the Arts Recognition and Talent Search (ARTS) program for high school students. Final selection of the Scholars was made by the Commission on Presidential Scholars, a group of 51 eminent private citizens appointed by the President.

The scholars will receive the Presidential Scholar medallion and a check for \$1,000 from the Geraldine R. Dodge Foundation, a private philanthropic organization.

I. PURPOSE

To sign four wilderness bills, the first of what is expected to be a large number of such measures to win congressional approval this year.

II. BACKGROUND

Since 1979, Congress has been working its way, state by state, through the recommendations of the Carter-era Second Roadless Area Review and Evaluation (RARE II) study identifying undeveloped national forest lands for permanent protection as national wilderness. Although the House has passed a number of wilderness bills, most remained frozen in the Senate.

A primary issue dividing the two chambers was debate over the "release" language between the environmentalists on the one hand, and timber, mining, and recreational industries on the other. "Release" provisions would allow lands not designated as wilderness to be used for logging, other forms of development, and for recreational purposes such as snowmobiling for a determined amount of time. The "release" language in these bills represents a compromise forged by Representatives Udall (D-Arizona) and Seiberling (D-Ohio), who wanted short-term release so that the wilderness option could be considered each time a land management plan is amended, and Senators McClure and Helms who wanted long-term release so that the timber, mining and recreational industries could make planning decisions with greater certainty. The compromise language, which we supported, makes it clear that the wilderness option would not have to be reconsidered for the released lands until the next round of land management plans, typically in 10 to 15 years.

The four bills that you will sign today are eastern wilderness bills, which are basically non-controversial because they involve small amounts of acreage designated as wilderness and have little or no multiple use impact. The western bills are just the opposite. They contain large amounts of acreages being withdrawn with subsequent displacement of multiple use. We anticipate that despite differences of opinion over the acreage, western bills will be forwarded for your signature later this summer and fall.

The bills that you will sign today were sponsored and supported, on a bipartisan basis, by the members of each delegation. The bills were ultimately adopted by voice vote in the House and by unanimous consent in the Senate.

- o North Carolina (H.R. 3960) designates 68,750 acres as wilderness, requires an additional 25,816 acres for study as potential wilderness, and releases for multiple use those National Forest System (NFS) lands not designated as wilderness until the mid 1990's.
- o Wisconsin (H.R. 3578) designates 24,339 acres as wilderness, provides protective management in other areas, and releases other NFS lands for multiple use.
- o Vermont (H.R. 4198) designates four new (not RARE II recommended) wilderness areas totalling 40,180 acres and an additional 22,400 acres as a national recreation area in the Green Mountain National Forest. This bill contains the compromise "release" for other NFS lands.
- o New Hampshire (H.R. 3921) names as wilderness 77,000 acres in the White Mountain National Forest. It also requires a study of a segment of the Wild Cat Brook for wilderness designation. This bill contains the compromise "release" for other NFS lands.
