### I. Purpose

This is an opportunity for the governors to report on agriculture export concerns and the farm credit situation as a follow-up to a National Governors' Association (NGA) Agriculture Committee meeting.

### II. Background

The (NGA) Agriculture Committee met in Denver, Colorado on May 18, 1984 in Special Session to discuss the financial conditions of agriculture producers and options for addressing the economic stress that many farmers and ranchers are experiencing. According to discussions at the meeting, an estimated 15% of America's 2.4 million farms and ranches are in financial jeopardy and up to 5% of the farms in some states ceased operations prior to the current crop year because of financial difficulties.

The day-long session was chaired by Governor Ted Schwinden (D-Montana) and attended by other governors including Governors Terry Branstad (R-IA) and Allen Olson (R-ND).

As a result of the session, the Agriculture Committee staff, drafted resolutions for consideration during the NGA annual meeting in July. The resolutions call for greater cooperation between the private and public sectors at both the federal and state level "to develop and implement measures which will provide short-term relief and long-term promise to persons engaged in production, agriculture and related industries." One resolution also calls for the adoption of short-term measures which would allow lending institutions "to share forbearance toward and to develop greater programs for those agricultural producers with a strong potential for survival."

The Department of Agriculture has been conducting "listening sessions" on future food and farm policy prior to the final drafting of the 1985 Farm Bill. Sessions have been held in Chicago, Illinois (April 18), Riverside, California (April 28), Atlanta, Georgia (May 18) and Syracuse, New York (June 18). You announced this week that the next listening session would be in Dallas, Texas on July 19.

Governor Ted Schwinden (D-MT), a former legislator and Lieutenant Governor, took office in 1981. He is Chairman of the NGA Agriculture Committee. He has owned and operated a grain farm in Montana since 1954 and for two years was the elected President of the Montana Grain Growers Association.

Governor Schwinden will report on the May 18 Denver meeting and express on behalf of all farm state governors the growing concern about the farm credit situation. The Governor may mention a request for a meeting with you from Congressman Berkley Bedell (D-IA) and other House Agriculture members.

Governor Terry Branstad (R-IA) took office in 1983 and is a former legislator and Lieutenant Governor. He is an attorney and maintains an active interest in the Branstad family farm operation. He serves on the NGA Agriculture Committee. Governor Branstad is Chairman of Reagan-Bush '84 in Iowa.

Governor Branstad will report on the deep concern of farmers in Iowa and Nebraska over credit problems and high interest rates. He will cite studies by his administration that show that over the next two years 10% of the family farms (approximately 10,000 farms) will be out of business. He is also likely to stress the ripple effect of the farm credit problem on Iowa's non-farm economy. (This week 600 more employees were laid-off by the John Deere Company in Iowa because heavy tractor sales are down.)

Vice President Bush met with Governor Branstad in Iowa on June 15, at which time the governor suggested the Administration's work to stretch out time for the repayment of farm loans.

Governor Allen Olson (R-ND) took office in 1981 and is a former Attorney General. The Governor serves on the NGA Agriculture Committee and is Chairman of the NGA Task Force on Soil Conservation. Governor Olson is a candidate for re-election this year.

Governor Olson will outline the problems faced by farmers in the Upper Midwest and point out that land values have gone down. He may suggest the Administration look into ways of loosening up bank collateral policies.

SUGGESTED TALKING POINTS FOR THE MEETING WITH  
GOVERNORS SCHWINDEN, BRANSTAD, AND OLSON

- Thank you very much for your report.
- Governor Branstad (Terry) I understand you gave the Vice President a similar report when he visited Iowa on June 15.
- In April, I met with Secretary Block and the Cabinet Council on Food and Agriculture for an hour long discussion of the farm sector debt issue.
- Since that meeting two very good things have happened: Agriculture exports are up and crop prices are up. Unfortunately, interest rates are also up. But the overall picture has brightened and I'm told the default rate for farms is predicted to be lower than the 4% rate projected at the Cabinet meeting in April.
- We are certainly not looking to be in the farm liquidation business. That is why I directed the Farmers Home Administration to make full use of their discretionary authorities and to subordinate loans to commercial and the Farm Credit System lenders.
- Secretary Block assures me that he is also looking into additional options within FHMA's legal authority which may assist commercial farmers in the credit market.
- We have also moved to substantially strengthen and promote the Federal Crop Insurance program.

- Long term improvements in our farm policy will require greater flexibility. As you are aware, the Department of Agriculture has been conducting a number of listening sessions over the last several months as part of our preparation for the 1985 Farm Bill.
- Four listening sessions have already taken place and on Monday I announced the next one for July 19 in Dallas.
- Again, thank you for sharing your concerns and those of the farmers.
