



### II. BACKGROUND

Public Law 99-298, which you signed into law on May 13, 1986, authorized the award of special Congressional Gold Medals to Natan and Avital Shcharansky in honor of their work for human rights and the freedom of Soviet Jewry. The Shcharanskys are citizens of Israel who emigrated from the Soviet Union. Mr. Shcharansky will accept his wife Avital's medal on her behalf.

Mr. Shcharansky was active in the effort of Soviet dissidents to publicize the failure of the Soviet Government to observe basic human rights in accordance with its international obligations. He was arrested by Soviet authorities in 1977 and imprisoned for nine years on false charges of espionage and treason. During his incarceration, Mrs. Shcharansky continued to campaign for the freedom of her husband and other Soviet prisoners of conscience. The Soviets released Mr. Shcharansky in 1986 in an East-West arrangement involving the release of a number of prisoners. The legislation authorizing the Gold Medals for the Shcharanskys became law later that year.

The U.S. mint recently completed the complicated technical process of striking the Gold Medals.

Mr. Scharansky, three members of his family, and the wife of Congressman Ben Gilman, who sponsored the legislation to authorize the medals, will attend.


