



PURPOSE:

To congratulate Chairman Rostenkowski on the House passage of the Caribbean Basin Initiative and to express appreciation for the cooperation he has extended on this issue to the Administration.

BACKGROUND:

After having approved yesterday 212-204 a rule which precluded all amendments except five to be offered by the Ways and Reans Committee, the House today passed the Administration-backed trade and tax conponents of the Caribbean Basin Initiative.

The vote on the rule, which was supported by the Administration and vigorously opposed by labor because it prohibited the offering of three amendments they backed, became termous with only a two-vote difference at one time in the final minute. Eighty-one Democrats supported the rule while thirty Republicans voted against it.

The Senate has already approved similar provisions as a part of the legislation to repeal taxes withheld on interest and dividends. Last year the House, but not the Senate, passed 260-142 nearly identical legislation after having defeated Administration-opposed amendments on rum 171-226 and tobacco by voice vote.

A House-Senate conference is expected to convene next week on the bill. Legislation with the CBI provisions should be on the President's desk prior to the August recess.

BACKGROUND (CONT'D):

On the 19th, 20th, and 21st of July, Chairman Rostenkowski has scheduled Ways and Means Committee hearings on revenue-raising measures to comply with the reconciliation instructions of the recently passed Congressional budget. The Chairman has indicated little desire to raise revenues in FY '84 but is looking at the possibility of doing so in FY '85.






