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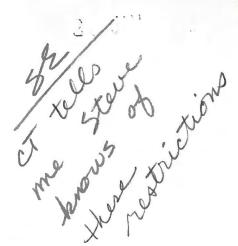

SUBJECT: Commercial Version of Teen Titans Comic Book

You have asked for our views on a proposal to issue a commercially marketed version of the "Teen Titans" comic book, including a copy of Mrs. Reagan's letter on White House stationery on the inside cover, with the proceeds to go to two charities active in fighting drug abuse. We have no objections, assuming that both the medium and the designated charities are acceptable to the First Lady. Consistent with our policy of avoiding any endorsements by the President or First Lady of commercial enterprises, however, we would insist that DC Comics not make any use of the First Lady's name in promotional material in connection with the marketing of the comic book, and that it be clearly indicated on the book that proceeds will be donated to fight drug abuse. This will help dissipate any suggestion -inevitably present to some degree in such projects -- that the First Lady has "endorsed" DC Comics or Keebler.

We also suggest deletion of the last paragraph of the letter that appeared in the version of the comic book that was distributed free of charge. This strikes us as necessary for two reasons. First, the paragraph constitutes an endorsement of the material. This was unobjectionable when the book was free, but when the book is being commercially marketed such an endorsement is really a free advertisement, and places the First Lady in the position of urging young readers to buy a DC Comics product -- even if the proceeds will go to charity. Second, the statement "generous corporations paid for it" will be far less true in this case than it was with the original edition. It is our understanding that only net proceeds will be donated to the charities, so with respect to this edition the cost of producing the book will be paid for by those who buy it.

Dear School Principal:

Over the past several years I have visited drug rehabilitation centers and prevention programs across the country to talk with as many young people as possible. What I have seen and heard is enough to make the strongest heart break.

Never have I felt as compelled to do something about an issue as I feel now about the problem of drug use among our school-age children. The children who are using drugs are younger all the time. Drugs are taking away their hope, their promise, their spirit and, sometimes even their lives.

I am writing to you because we need your help in solving this terrifying problem. No one can do it alone. All of us -- educators, parents and students -- need to work together.

Enclosed are packages of materials especially designed to help combat the drug problem. The packages contain clever comic books written on the subject, a classroom poster, a teachers guide and certificates for students participating in the project.

PRIVATE SECTOR DRUG ABUSE AWARENESS PROGRAM

The second in a series of drug abuse awareness comic books, this one for sixth graders, was announced today by Dr. Carlton Turner, Special Assistant to the President for Drug Abuse Policy.

Appearing with Dr. Turner were Bob W. Delauter, chairman of the National Soft Drink Association, and Jenette Kahn, president and publisher of DC Comics, a division of Warner Communications. The National Soft Drink Association sponsored the printing of one million comic books for distribution to 35,000 selected elementary schools. The comic books and related educational materials were written and edited as a contribution by Ms. Kahn's staff.

Attending a news conference and receiving the first supply of comic books were sixth grade classes from Congress Heights Elementary School in Washington, D. C., and Lynbrook Elementary School in Springfield, Virginia.

Each original, drug-fighting adventure comic book features superheroes known as the "New Teen Titans." The first in this series of comic books targeted to drug education was underwritten by the Keebler Company and distributed to one million fourth graders last April. In response to requests, it was necessary to reprint another million copies.

"This is an important boost to drug abuse education and prevention in this country," Dr. Turner said. "The soft drink industry reaches into every community, providing an unprecedented opportunity to deglamorize drugs and work toward a drug-free generation of Americans."

Dr. Turner said collaborative efforts are needed to answer those who use euphemisms such as "recreational use" to color the facts about drugs. He quoted President Reagan as saying "there is nothing recreational about those children whose lives have been lost, whose minds have been ruined. Too often we've fallen into the trap of using nice, easy, pleasant, liberal language about drugs. Well, language will not sugarcoat overdoses, suicides, and ruined lives."

School principals across the nation soon will be receiving a package that includes a letter from First Lady Nancy Reagan, comic books containing motivational exercises, certificates signed by Mrs. Reagan for each child who pledges to join the drug awareness program, a teacher's guide, and a poster featuring the "Be a Hero, Stay Drug-Free" New Teen Titan message.

"Since we are not able to include all of the nation's 51,000 elementary schools, some sixth graders won't see the comic book package right away," Dr. Turner said, "But the readership of New Teen Titans adventures is such that the comics have a way of circulating very fast." He said he expects many sixth graders will take the book home and their brothers and sisters also will read it.

Distribution to schools is a cooperative effort of the Department of Education, U. S. Customs Service, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention in the Department of Justice.

This comic book and classroom package is one element in a major White House effort to enlist private sector help in the war against drug abuse. Following the fourth and sixth-grade comic books will be a fifth-grade version, which is expected shortly. IBM, the National Federation of Parents for a Drug-Free Youth, and DC Comics are teaming up to provide the fifth-grade version.

A related project, the development of a drug abuse awareness activity book sponsored by E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. for youngsters below the fourth grade, is nearing completion and should reach younger children by the end of the year.

Dr. Turner explained the importance of an early awareness of the risks and family problems created by use of drugs and alcohol. "We need to teach our young children how to avoid peer pressure toward trying drugs," Turner said. "One of the best ways to do this is to encourage our youngsters to take the lead in applying positive peer pressure against drug-taking behavior."

NSDA Participates in White House Drug Awareness Program

The National Soft Drink Association (NSDA), in partnership with The White House and DC Comics Division of Warner Communications, announces the development of a drug awareness program targeted at sixth-grade students. The program package, which will be distributed to one million sixth graders in 35,000 schools, contains a teacher's guide, poster, diploma and 30 comic books. Warner Communications' DC Comics Division donated its artistic and writing talent to create an original drug-fighting adventure featuring the "New Teen Titans."

NSDA, through its affiliated franchise companies and local bottlers, sponsored the production of the package whose theme is "Be a Hero . . . Stay Drug Free." The program was initiated by the White House and utilizes the soft drink industry because of the unique nature of the industry.

NSDA members comprise 1,200 bottlers throughout the U.S. who have daily contact with large segments of the population. They work closely with civic leaders, local governments and schools.

hat's the message of an innovative program being introduced by President Reagan's Drug Awareness Campaign under the sponsorship of the soft drink industry.

As a public service, NSDA and the franchise companies are sponsoring the project to reach more than four million sixth-grade students with a message to help prevent drug abuse.

The program was initiated by the White House and is being produced by the DC Comics division of Warner Communications. The program is aimed at fourth-through-sixth graders with funding provided by other companies and industries for different age groups.

In this partnership of government and private industry, the government is responsible for coordinating, directing and distributing the comic book packages with industry providing the

operating funds. A complete educational kit is being developed and will be introduced in 35,000 schools nationwide. A million children will receive a 32-page color comic book, which is expected to be read by at least four other school friends, or friends at home. Each kit will include a teacher's guide to classroom activities, a bulletin board poster. and certificates for the students to sign when they make a vow to remain drug-free. The program is designed to reach young people through popular comic-book characters with a message about drug abuse.

The comic book will feature "The New Teen Titans," ™ the most popular comic book sold by DC Comics today. Its sales even outstrip "Superman," an old DC favorite.

"The Teen Titans were chosen be-

cause our research showed younger people look to teenagers today as role models," said Steve Jacobs, a representative of the President's Drug Awareness Campaign. "Students in the fourth-through-sixth grades look up to teenagers and seem to respect their opinions more than adult opinions," he said.

Comic books and supporting material will be distributed through the Education Department with a cover letter to school principals from Nancy Reagan. Mrs. Reagan has repeatedly expressed her concern about the effect America's drug epidemic has on the country's youth.

Dr. Carlton Turner, special assistant to the President for drug abuse policy, said, "Communicating the truth about drugs to users and potential users is one of the most effective weapons we have in the battle against drug abuse."

The comic being produced for NSDA sponsorship will feature a story line of drug pushers and users in a school setting. Increasingly, drugs are becoming more openly available in elementary and middle schools, rather

than being distributed in dark alleys. The superhero Titans engage in lots of action tangling with the "bad guys" to keep the youngsters' interest.

Plans are now under way to encourage local bottler involvement in this effort. The target date for distribution of the package is October 1983.

"Certainly drug abuse is an important community concern wherever NSDA bottlers are located," said NSDA President Dwight Reed. "The White House drug abuse office has presented us with alarming statistics showing how widespread the drug problem has become. Drug abuse appears to be just as prevalent in rural middle American settings as in urban areas."

The NSDA Industry Issues Committee first heard a presentation about the private sector program in conjunction with the White House last November. The project was subsequently funded by that committee and the NSDA Executive Board.

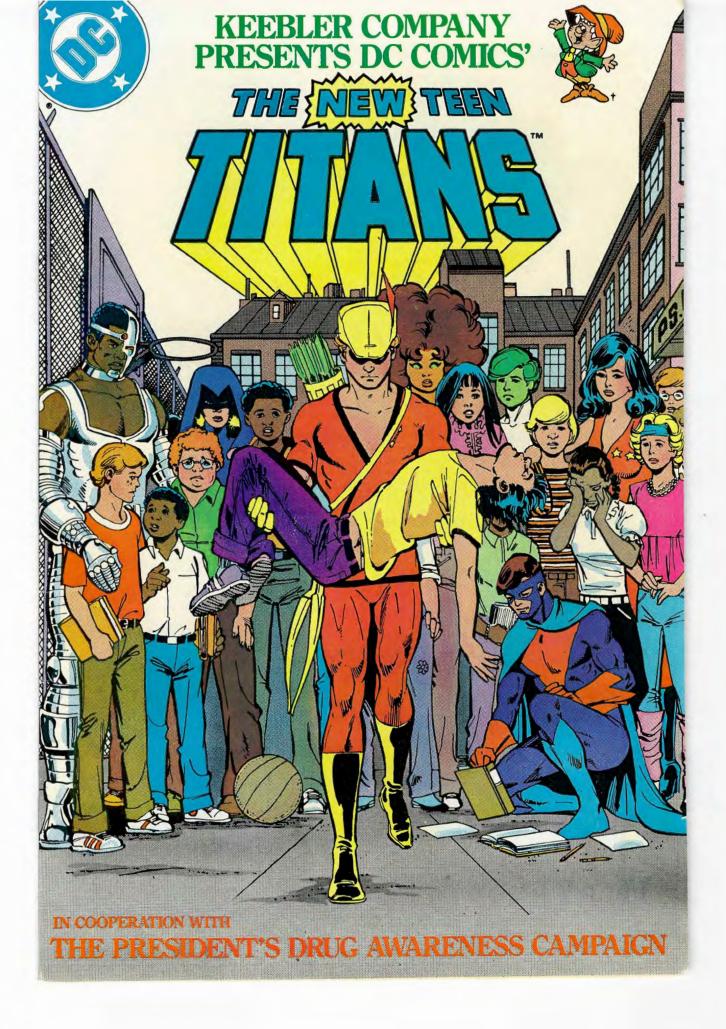
"The leaders of our industry recognized that this was the type of positive community program in which we would want to take part. We can be proud of the industry's efforts thus far, and I'm sure many bottlers will want to become even more involved in local programs in their communities," Reed said.

NSDA bottler members will receive complete kits when they become available later this summer.

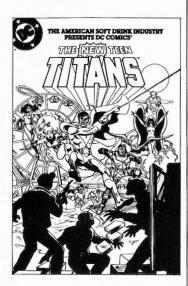
This suggested sixth-grade program is part of the President's Drug Awareness Campaign, created in partnership with the generous support of private corporations. Suggested programs are being prepared for each of the elementary grade levels. This is the second in an ongoing series. 1983.



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A Message from Dr. Carlton Turner, Director, Drug Abuse Policy Office, The White House



We have a unique opportunity at this time to begin developing a drug-free generation of American youth. Over one-fourth of our youngster's between the ages of 12 and 17 are currently using drugs or alcohol. As a nation, and as families and individuals across the country, we can no longer accept the price of drug abuse and we are doing something about it. As teachers, you may hold the very future of America in your hands in ways that you did not anticipate.

One of the most effective weapons we have against drug abuse is communicating the truth about drugs to the user and potential user. The artificial glamorization of mind-altering and moodchanging drugs, including alcohol, confuses young people. Many of them are not aware of the profound dangers posed to their health and their futures. Our experience has shown that adults and children alike, if well-informed about the effects of drugs and how to deal with the situation. will say "no" to drug abuse. Adults can play a critical leadership role in this decision for children, and teachers have a special importance.

Frankly, we had little success with so-called prevention programs during the past decade. The Federal prevention programs were little more than education efforts which were criticized as "teaching the young people how to identify drugs" and as tending to encourage experimentation. In the past two years, peer

pressure has had a very positive impact, and young people are receptive to learning how to say "no" to things they do not really want to do. The need for social acceptance is especially important to young people, and a negative view of drug-oriented behavior is strong prevention.

With accurate and credible information available and in the hands of parents and community groups, students, school officials and health professionals, prevention efforts are taking hold. The number of Americans who use various illicit drugs has dropped significantly between 1979 and 1983. We still have an unacceptable level of drug abuse in the United States, and we are making a difference. If we can achieve a single generation free of drug abuse, it would set the pattern for the future.

The New Teen Titans program, developed in cooperation with the President's Drug Awareness Campaign, is an excellent demonstration of an ongoing educational program for your school. This sixthgrade package, developed by the American Soft Drink Industry, in cooperation with the National Soft Drink Association and DC Comics, is intended to help youngsters become aware of the problems associated with drug and alcohol abuse. We hope that, as a result of the classroom activities, the student will take a stand on his or her wellbeing, declare that he or she will be drug free, and will be committed to putting his or

her vision for the future above any temporary fascination drugs may hold.

We appreciate the support of private corporations in making it possible to supply you with *The New Teen Titans* program. Their encouragement and financial support allowed for the creation of this program without tax dollars. This sixth-grade program is the result of the American Soft Drink Industry's commitment, dedication, and financial sup-

port; the use of Super Heroes characters and the enormous creative ability of writers and artists of Warner Communications/DC Comics; and our editorial input and control. I can say with confidence that this is part of an ongoing series of programs which will make a positive and lasting contribution to your students, their families, and our communities. Please join in this important effort.

Activity One

"Choices, Choices!"

This activity asks students to understand and recognize how and when they allow peer pressure to affect their decisions, and examines to what extent other people influence their lives.

The exercise is designed to emphasize the availability of choices that each person has in any given situation.

Questions for discussion:

1. Is it hard to stand behind your choices?

- **2.** Who can best describe what's right for you? Do you often take the advice of your friends?
- **3.** Is it ever okay to let someone else make a choice for you?
- **4.** Can you relate, from your own experience, a situation when you had to make a tough choice? How do you react when someone wants you to do something that you think is not the best choice for you?



Activity Two

"Being Responsible!"

These activities are designed to help students understand that they are each responsible for themselves and that there are decisions in each of their lives that no one else can make for them.

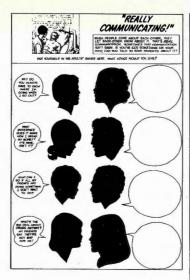
It would be valuable to discuss responsibility from the perspective of being "able to answer for one's conduct and obligations." (Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary) Suggest that students view responsibility as a framework in which they see themselves as the source of events in their lives. They should understand

that responsibility is not a burden but an important building block of an individual's character.

Questions for discussion:

- 1. What is responsibility? How much responsibility do you have for yourself at home? At school? What are you responsible for?
- 2. Have you ever been responsible for someone else's actions?
- **3.** Is anyone responsible for you?
- **4.** Did you ever try to blame someone else for a mistake that you made?





Activity Three

"Really Communicating!"

This role reversal exercise puts the students in the position of the adult and has them answer some common questions. Young people should realize that real communication may not always be easy, yet it can be a most fulfilling way to live.

Suggest that students examine the stumbling blocks between fully communicating with parents, siblings, friends, teachers, and others.

Questions for discussion:

- **1.** How does it feel to give advice?
- 2. Why do your parents respond to you as they do? Do you let your preconceived judgments get in the way of real, honest communication?
- **3.** Who do you talk to when you've got something on your mind? How can you establish better lines of communication with people in authority?
- **4.** What kind of advice do you get from your parents? From your friends? Which means more to you?



Activity Four

"Thinking for Yourself!"

This activity deals with some of the reasons that young people might give for using drugs. It is meant to examine some of the myths and alibis surrounding drug use. The participants in the activity should be guided to see the fallacy in each of the statements given on the page.

Questions for discussion:

1. Are there any "good" reasons for drug use? Does anyone really "need" to take drugs? What would you say to

someone who wanted to try drugs for the first time?

- **2.** What do you do to make friends? What makes you feel closer to your friends? Have you ever been the "new kid" in your neighborhood or at school? What was it like?
- **3.** What do you consider the most intelligent way to deal with your fears?
- **4.** Have you ever done something just because your friends wanted you to? Have you ever tried to influence someone when they really didn't want to go along with you.



Declaration

By writing a declaration of their own, students will have a chance to articulate their own feelings about drugs. When they decide to keep drugs out of their lives, and put those thoughts into words for others to see, they reinforce their own positive attitudes and identity. With a strong self-image and a firm commitment, they are asserting their own strength in a way which will better equip them to meet the pressures of growing up.

Follow-up activity:

Have the class write a petition together expressing their commitment to a drug-free life and support for the President's Drug Awareness Campaign. Each member of the class can sign it and collect signatures to add to it. Send the petition to:

PRIVATE SECTOR DRUG ABUSE AWARENESS PROGRAM

The second in a series of drug abuse awareness comic books, this one for sixth graders, was announced today by Dr. Carlton Turner, Special Assistant to the President for Drug Abuse Policy.

Appearing with Dr. Turner were Bob W. Delauter, chairman of the National Soft Drink Association, and Jenette Kahn, president and publisher of DC Comics, a division of Warner Communications. The National Soft Drink Association sponsored the printing of one million comic books for distribution to 35,000 selected elementary schools. The comic books and related educational materials were written and edited as a contribution by Ms. Kahn's staff.

Attending a news conference and receiving the first supply of comic books were sixth grade classes from Congress Heights Elementary School in Washington, D. C., and Lynbrook Elementary School in Springfield, Virginia.

Each original, drug-fighting adventure comic book features superheroes known as the "New Teen Titans." The first in this series of comic books targeted to drug education was underwritten by the Keebler Company and distributed to one million fourth graders last April. In response to requests, it was necessary to reprint another million copies.

"This is an important boost to drug abuse education and prevention in this country," Dr. Turner said. "The soft drink industry reaches into every community, providing an unprecedented opportunity to deglamorize drugs and work toward a drug-free generation of Americans."

Dr. Turner said collaborative efforts are needed to answer those who use euphemisms such as "recreational use" to color the facts about drugs. He quoted President Reagan as saying "there is nothing recreational about those children whose lives have been lost, whose minds have been ruined. Too often we've fallen into the trap of using nice, easy, pleasant, liberal language about drugs. Well, language will not sugarcoat overdoses, suicides, and ruined lives."

School principals across the nation soon will be receiving a package that includes a letter from First Lady Nancy Reagan, comic books containing motivational exercises, certificates signed by Mrs. Reagan for each child who pledges to join the drug awareness program, a teacher's guide, and a poster featuring the "Be a Hero, Stay Drug-Free" New Teen Titan message.

"Since we are not able to include all of the nation's 51,000 elementary schools, some sixth graders won't see the comic book package right away," Dr. Turner said, "But the readership of New Teen Titans adventures is such that the comics have a way of circulating very fast." He said he expects many sixth graders will take the book home and their brothers and sisters also will read it.

Distribution to schools is a cooperative effort of the Department of Education, U. S. Customs Service, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), the Federal Bureau of Investigation (FBI), and the Office of Juvenile Justice and Delinquency Prevention in the Department of Justice.

This comic book and classroom package is one element in a major White House effort to enlist private sector help in the war against drug abuse. Following the fourth and sixth-grade comic books will be a fifth-grade version, which is expected shortly. IBM, the National Federation of Parents for a Drug-Free Youth, and DC Comics are teaming up to provide the fifth-grade version.

A related project, the development of a drug abuse awareness activity book sponsored by E. I. du Pont de Nemours & Co. for youngsters below the fourth grade, is nearing completion and should reach younger children by the end of the year.

Dr. Turner explained the importance of an early awareness of the risks and family problems created by use of drugs and alcohol. "We need to teach our young children how to avoid peer pressure toward trying drugs," Turner said. "One of the best ways to do this is to encourage our youngsters to take the lead in applying positive peer pressure against drug-taking behavior."

NSDA Participates in White House Drug Awareness Program

NSDA, through its affiliated franchise companies and local bottlers, sponsored the production of the package whose theme is "Be a Hero . . . Stay Drug Free." The program was initiated by the White House and utilizes the soft drink industry because of the unique nature of the industry.

NSDA members comprise 1,200 bottlers throughout the U.S. who have daily contact with large segments of the population. They work closely with civic leaders, local governments and schools.

hat's the message of an innovative program being introduced. by President Reagan's Drug Awareness Campaign under the sponsorship of the soft drink industry.

As a public service, NSDA and the franchise companies are sponsoring the project to reach more than four million sixth-grade students with a message to help prevent drug abuse.

The program was initiated by the White House and is being produced by the DC Comics division of Warner Communications. The program is aimed at fourth-through-sixth graders with funding provided by other companies and industries for different age groups.

In this partnership of government and private industry, the government is responsible for coordinating, directing and distributing the comic book packages with industry providing the

operating funds.

A complete educational kit is being developed and will be introduced in 35,000 schools nationwide. A million children will receive a 32-page color comic book, which is expected to be read by at least four other school friends, or friends at home. Each kit will include a teacher's guide to classroom activities, a bulletin board poster, and certificates for the students to sign when they make a vow to remain drug-free. The program is designed to reach young people through popular comic-book characters with a message about drug abuse.

The comic book will feature "The New Teen Titans," ™ the most popular comic book sold by DC Comics today. Its sales even outstrip "Superman,"

an old DC favorite.

cause our research showed younger people look to teenagers today as role models," said Steve Jacobs, a representative of the President's Drug Awareness Campaign. "Students in the fourth-through-sixth grades look up to teenagers and seem to respect their opinions more than adult opinions," he said.

Comic books and supporting material will be distributed through the Education Department with a cover letter to school principals from Nancy Reagan. Mrs. Reagan has repeatedly expressed her concern about the effect America's drug epidemic has on the country's youth.

Dr. Carlton Turner, special assistant to the President for drug abuse policy, said, "Communicating the truth about drugs to users and potential users is one of the most effective weapons we have in the battle against drug abuse."

The comic being produced for NSDA sponsorship will feature a story line of drug pushers and users in a school setting. Increasingly, drugs are becoming more openly available in elementary and middle schools, rather

than being distributed in dark alleys.
The superhero Titans engage in lots of action tangling with the "bad guys" to keep the youngsters' interest.

Plans are now under way to encourage local bottler involvement in this effort. The target date for distribution of the

package is October 1983.

"Certainly drug abuse is an important community concern wherever NSDA bottlers are located," said NSDA President Dwight Reed. "The White House drug abuse office has presented us with alarming statistics showing how widespread the drug problem has become. Drug abuse appears to be just as prevalent in rural middle American settings as in urban areas."

The NSDA Industry Issues Committee first heard a presentation about the private sector program in conjunction with the White House last November. The project was subsequently funded by that committee and the NSDA Exec-

utive Board.

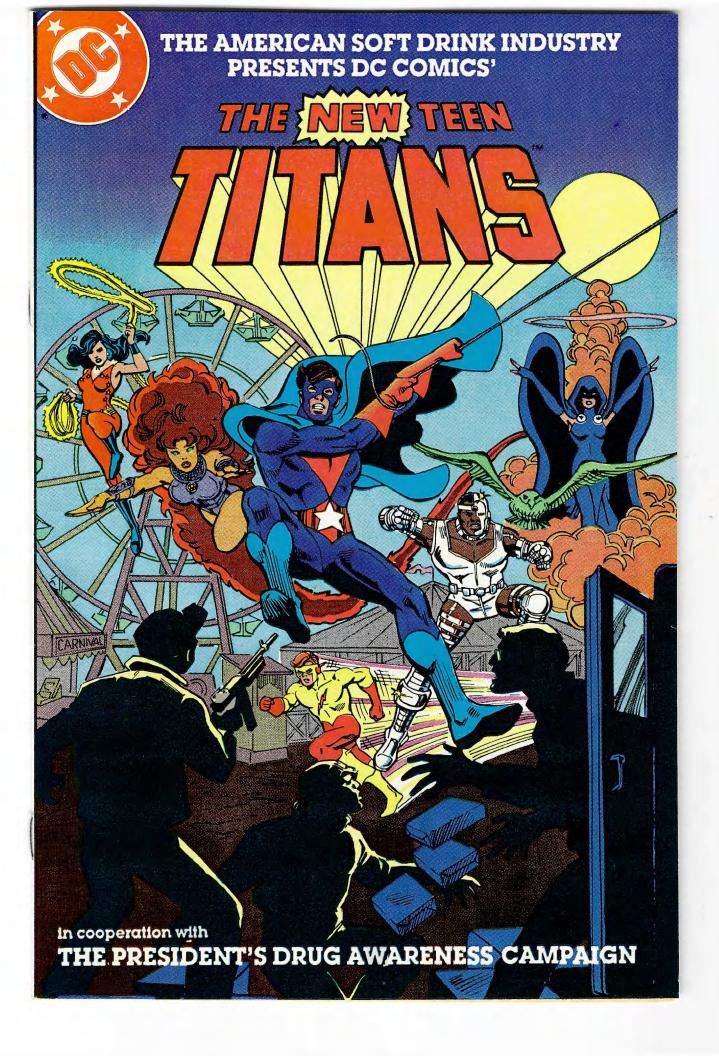
"The leaders of our industry recognized that this was the type of positive community program in which we would want to take part. We can be proud of the industry's efforts thus far, and I'm sure many bottlers will want to become even more involved in local programs in their communities," Reed said.

NSDA bottler members will receive complete kits when they become available later this summer.

A Message from Dr. Carlton Turner, Director, Drug Abuse Policy Office, The White House



We have a unique opportunity at this time to begin developing a drug-free generation of American youth. Over one-fourth of our youngster's between the ages of 12 and 17 are currently using drugs or alcohol. As a nation, and as families and individuals across the country, we can no longer accept the price of drug abuse and we are doing something about it. As teachers, you may hold the very future of America in your hands in ways that you did not anticipate.

One of the most effective weapons we have against drug abuse is communicating the truth about drugs to the user and potential user. The artificial glamorization of mind-altering and moodchanging drugs, including alcohol, confuses young people. Many of them are not aware of the profound dangers posed to their health and their futures. Our experience has shown that adults and children alike, if well-informed about the effects of drugs and how to deal with the situation, will say "no" to drug abuse. Adults can play a critical leadership role in this decision for children, and teachers have a special importance.

Frankly, we had little success with so-called prevention programs during the past decade. The Federal prevention programs were little more than education efforts which were criticized as "teaching the young people how to identify drugs" and as tending to encourage experimentation. In the past two years, peer

pressure has had a very positive impact, and young people are receptive to learning how to say "no" to things they do not really want to do. The need for social acceptance is especially important to young people, and a negative view of drug-oriented behavior is strong prevention.

With accurate and credible information available and in the hands of parents and community groups, students, school officials and health professionals, prevention efforts are taking hold. The number of Americans who use various illicit drugs has dropped significantly between 1979 and 1983. We still have an unacceptable level of drug abuse in the United States, and we are making a difference. If we can achieve a single generation free of drug abuse, it would set the pattern for the future.

The New Teen Titans program, developed in cooperation with the President's Drug Awareness Campaign, is an excellent demonstration of an ongoing educational program for your school. This sixthgrade package, developed by the American Soft Drink Industry, in cooperation with the National Soft Drink Association and DC Comics, is intended to help youngsters become aware of the problems associated with drug and alcohol abuse. We hope that, as a result of the classroom activities, the student will take a stand on his or her wellbeing, declare that he or she will be drug free, and will be committed to putting his or

her vision for the future above any temporary fascination drugs may hold.

We appreciate the support of private corporations in making it possible to supply you with *The New Teen Titans* program. Their encouragement and financial support allowed for the creation of this program without tax dollars. This sixth-grade program is the result of the American Soft Drink Industry's commitment, dedication, and financial sup-

port; the use of Super Heroes characters and the enormous creative ability of writers and artists of Warner Communications/DC Comics; and our editorial input and control. I can say with confidence that this is part of an ongoing series of programs which will make a positive and lasting contribution to your students, their families, and our communities. Please join in this important effort.

Activity One

"Choices, Choices!"

This activity asks students to understand and recognize how and when they allow peer pressure to affect their decisions, and examines to what extent other people influence their lives.

The exercise is designed to emphasize the availability of choices that each person has in any given situation.

Questions for discussion:

1. Is it hard to stand behind your choices?

- **2.** Who can best describe what's right for you? Do you often take the advice of your friends?
- **3.** Is it ever okay to let someone else make a choice for you?
- **4.** Can you relate, from your own experience, a situation when you had to make a tough choice? How do you react when someone wants you to do something that you think is not the best choice for you?



Activity Two

"Being Responsible!"

These activities are designed to help students understand that they are each responsible for themselves and that there are decisions in each of their lives that no one else can make for them.

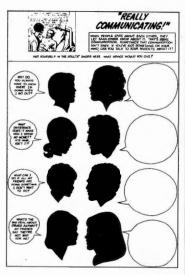
It would be valuable to discuss responsibility from the perspective of being "able to answer for one's conduct and obligations." (Webster's New Collegiate Dictionary) Suggest that students view responsibility as a framework in which they see themselves as the source of events in their lives. They should understand

that responsibility is not a burden but an important building block of an individual's character.

Questions for discussion:

- 1. What is responsibility? How much responsibility do you have for yourself at home? At school? What are you responsible for?
- **2.** Have you ever been responsible for someone else's actions?
- **3.** Is anyone responsible for you?
- **4.** Did you ever try to blame someone else for a mistake that you made?





Activity Three

"Really Communicating!"

This role reversal exercise puts the students in the position of the adult and has them answer some common questions. Young people should realize that real communication may not always be easy, yet it can be a most fulfilling way to live.

Suggest that students examine the stumbling blocks between fully communicating with parents, siblings, friends, teachers, and others.

Questions for discussion:

- 1. How does it feel to give advice?
- 2. Why do your parents respond to you as they do? Do you let your preconceived judgments get in the way of real, honest communication?
- **3.** Who do you talk to when you've got something on your mind? How can you establish better lines of communication with people in authority?
- **4.** What kind of advice do you get from your parents? From your friends? Which means more to you?



Activity Four

"Thinking for Yourself!"

This activity deals with some of the reasons that young people might give for using drugs. It is meant to examine some of the myths and alibis surrounding drug use. The participants in the activity should be guided to see the fallacy in each of the statements given on the page.

Questions for discussion:

1. Are there any "good" reasons for drug use? Does anyone really "need" to take drugs? What would you say to

someone who wanted to try drugs for the first time?

- 2. What do you do to make friends? What makes you feel closer to your friends? Have you ever been the "new kid" in your neighborhood or at school? What was it like?
- **3.** What do you consider the most intelligent way to deal with your fears?
- **4.** Have you ever done something just because your friends wanted you to? Have you ever tried to influence someone when they really didn't want to go along with you.



Declaration

By writing a declaration of their own, students will have a chance to articulate their own feelings about drugs. When they decide to keep drugs out of their lives, and put those thoughts into words for others to see, they reinforce their own positive attitudes and identity. With a strong self-image and a firm commitment, they are asserting their own strength in a way which will better equip them to meet the pressures of growing up.

Follow-up activity:

Have the class write a petition together expressing their commitment to a drug-free life and support for the President's Drug Awareness Campaign. Each member of the class can sign it and collect signatures to add to it. Send the petition to:
