

At the same time, the Grand National Assembly decided that Nicolae Ceausescu, General Secretary of the Romanian Communist Party, President of the Socialist Republic of Romania, be empowered to address, prior to the beginning of the Geneva negotiations, to L.I. Brezhnev, President of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR, to President Ronald Reagan of the United States of America, to the other heads of the signatory states of the Final Act of the Helsinki Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe, with a view to halting the emplacement of new medium-range missiles, for the withdrawal of the existing ones, for a Europe free of nuclear weapons.

At the end of the meeting, President Nicolae Ceausescu took the floor.

We publish the Decision of the Grand National Assembly, the Appeal of the Grand National Assembly of the Socialist Republic of Romania to parliaments, governments and peoples of European countries, the United States of America and Canada, and the speech of President Nicolae Ceausescu.

DECISION OF THE GRAND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY

to empower Comrade Nicolae Ceausescu, General Secretary of the Romanian Communist Party, President of the Socialist Republic of Romania, to address Comrade Leonid Ilyich Brezhnev, General Secretary of the CC of the CPSU, Chairman of the Presidium of the Supreme Soviet of the USSR, and Ronald Reagan, the President of the United States of America, the other heads of the states signatory to the Final Act of the Conference on Security and Cooperation in Europe, in view of halting the siting of further medium-range rockets, for withdrawing the existing ones, for a Europe free of nuclear weapons.

— adopted upon the proposal of a group of deputies of all country's counties and the capital city —

Strongly stimulated by the wide echoes of the peace initiative of socialist Romania's President, on all meridians, as well as by the inspiring ideas contained in the Appeal the Grand National Assembly addressed to parliaments, governments and peoples of Europe and other zones of the world, an Appeal that is a new remarkable expression of the high responsibility in which the Romanian people is taking action under the leadership of its President for safeguarding peace and the human kind, the country's supreme legislative forum has endorsed, upon the suggestion of a group of deputies of all counties and the capital city, a Decision that is meant to contribute to the fulfillment of the peace desiderata of all the nations in the world.

As also mentioned in the Appeal we have endorsed — the Decision reads — the negotiations that are to start in Geneva two days from now, between the Soviet Union and the United States of America, acquire, in the context of the present international life, a special importance. We

all know that depending on the resolve in which the negotiations table will be approached, on the way the problems will be tackled, on the two side's strive to step over the inherent obstacles and the mistrust accumulated in time, is the turning of a new page in the struggle for halting the aberrant arms race and passing on to disarmament, to nuclear disarmament in the first place, is a new hopeful stage in ensuring security to the peoples of the European continent, to the entire human kind.

That is why precisely at this time, that may become crucial for the fate of mankind,

- knowing the high prestige enjoyed in the world arena by the General Secretary of the Romanian Communist Party, the President of Romania, as an outstanding personality of the world political life, as an untiring militant for the peace of the world,

- setting out from the brilliant echoes of the mass movement for peace Romania has launched of late, at the initiative of our President,

- the Grand National Assembly empowers Comrade Nicolae

Ceausescu to address personally Comrade Leonid Ilyich Brezhnev, the General Secretary of the CC of the CPSU, Chairman of the Presidium of the supreme Soviet of the USSR, as well as Ronald Reagan, the President of the United States of America, the Appeal to do everything in their power in view of attaining concrete agreements regarding the halting of siting and development of new mass destruction weapons, the withdrawal of the medium-range rockets from Europe, vital problems of the world security, detente and peace.

At the same time, by virtue of the great international prestige enjoyed by our country's President, the Grand National Assembly empowers Comrade Nicolae Ceausescu to address all the leaders of the other states signatory to the Helsinki Act the call to make everything possible

— particularly over this period of time — in order to take action for developing confidence and using all the possibilities with which the negotiations are started for all states to participate one way or another in achieving understandings acceptable to all European states.

The Grand National Assembly expresses the full conviction that in these moments of great responsibility for the very destinies of mankind, the direct, personal demarche with the leaders of the Soviet Union, of the United States of America, as well as of the other nations signatory to the Helsinki Act, the detailed presentation of Romania's considerations and proposals will enjoy wide appreciation in the international arena, will actually and efficiently bear on the unfolding of the Geneva negotiations, standing for a fresh valuable contribution of Socialist Romania, of our country's President to dispelling the dangers threatening mankind, to ensuring progress, security and peace the world over.

APPEAL

OF THE GRAND NATIONAL ASSEMBLY OF THE SOCIALIST REPUBLIC OF ROMANIA TO THE PARLIAMENTS, GOVERNMENTS AND PEOPLES OF THE EUROPEAN COUNTRIES, THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA AND CANADA

Meeting in session on November 27-28 1981, the Grand National Assembly, showing concern and sense of responsibility for the ultimate interests of our people, for the security, peace, life and quiet of other nations, states its great concern over the deterioration of the international situation, particularly as a result of the arms race, of the huge accumulation of ever more sophisticated nuclear weapons, of the persistence and occurrence of new conflicts and states of tension among states, of the sharpening contradictions among various countries and groups of countries. We are particularly concerned over the plans to deploy medium-range nuclear missiles in Europe which are a great threat to the European peoples' liberty, security and life indeed, to world peace.

The Grand National Assembly highly appreciates and fully approves the Exposition delivered by the Party General Secretary, the President of the country, comrade Nicolae Ceausescu, to the recent Plenary Meeting of the CC of the RCP showing Romania's position to the current international situation, to the political realities on our continent, as well as our country's view of the ways to overcome tension in interstate relations, to halt the arms race, the siting and development of new nuclear missiles in Europe in particular, to free our continent of atomic weapons, of the demand for all political and social forces, all peoples to unite and avert the threat of war and safeguard international peace and security. The Grand National Assembly assesses President Nicolae Ceausescu's great peace initiative, evincing a high sense of responsibility for the fate of our people and mankind as a

whole, to have dynamised the energies and forces of our entire nation in the attainment of the lofty ideals of progress, peace and coexistence among peoples, in strengthening Romania's cooperation with all European nations, with mankind as a whole to safeguard the most precious asset — a free and dignified existence, life, peace.

Our people, like all the other European peoples — considers that under the current circumstances in Europe, the central, most pressing aim we, all the peoples of this continent, have is to stop the location of new intermediate-range missiles, achieve a passage to a substantial cut back, by both sides, of these weapons, of all nuclear forces, fully freeing Europe of the atomic weapon for ever.

The Grand National Assembly hails the impending opening in Geneva of the talks between the Soviet Union and the United States of America on halting the deployment and development as well as dismantlement of medium-range missiles in Europe. Our people, like the whole European and world public opinion, follows with keen interest the negotiations which are expected to lead to practical, concrete measures and resolutions for the constructive settlement of this vital issue of our continent, of world security, detente and peace.

In this connection, the Grand National Assembly has noted with satisfaction, welcomes and is highly appreciative of the statements made by the General Secretary of the CC of the CPSU, Chairman of the Presidium of the USSR Supreme Soviet, L.I. Brezhnev, concerning the Soviet Union's wish to come to an agreement on the complete renunciation by both sides — the West and the East — of the entire nuclear-range missile force aimed at Europe, to turn Europe into a nuclear-free continent. Likewise, the Grand National Assembly has noted with interest and assesses as positive the statement made by the President of the United States of America, Ronald Reagan, that the United States was prepared to go as far as the cancellation of new medium-range missiles in Europe and the reduction of strategic nuclear force and were ready to open negotiations on the Soviet proposals. Notwithstanding the essential differences in the statements of the two heads of state, European and world public opinion consider them to express the two states' wish to negotiate and hope the negotiations to result in an accord on the elimination of medium-range weapons, of any kind of nuclear weapon from Europe.

It would be highly important if agreement were reached on the opening of negotiations to halt the location and development of new missiles, reduce the existing ones, and if, at the end of the talks, an accord were made on reducing the medium-range nuclear force to the lowest level, and on passing to the elimination of all types of nuclear weapons to free our continent of the atomic weapon.

The Grand National Assembly considers that all the peoples and states on our continent are equally interested in the negotiations which concern to their security, freedom, independence and fundamental right to life, their present and future. Hence, the obvious, objective necessity that all the states on the continent should participate, in one form or another, in the negotiations on halting the development and location of intermediate-range nuclear rockets in Europe so as to set forth their positions and take greater responsibility in solving these questions, and contribute to the achievement of understandings acceptable to all sides.

As far as she is concerned, Romania wishes to participate directly in the debate and settlement of this cardinal question of the continent on which the peaceful work and life of our people, the lives of the other European peoples depend.

Starting from the particular importance the creation of nuclear-free zones, collaboration and good neighbourliness have in the process of disarmament, of building security, confidence and peace in Europe Romania is resolved to do everything possible to expand good cooperative relations among all the Balkan states, to turn this region into a zone of peace, free of nuclear weapons.

It is toward disarmament and peace that the great mass demonstrations under way in various European states are oriented. They are an expression of the European peoples' firm determination to say a resolute NO to the continuation of the arms race on the continent, to prevent the deterioration of the international political situation, to remove the danger of a devastating war.

It is on the same line that our people carries on a huge peace movement which is telling of its lofty political consciousness and its resolve to work, alongside the other European peoples, for disarmament, for nuclear disarmament in the first place, for security and peace.

Voicing the will and determination of our entire people the Grand National Assembly calls on all peoples, governments and parliaments of Europe, the United States of America and Canada to work most energetically and defend their vital interests in freedom, security and peace. Let us do everything possible now, before the missiles are launched and the atomic bombs dropped, now before it is too late and we are still alive and able to do something, so as to reduce and eliminate the nuclear weapon from our continent, dispel the menacing clouds that have gathered above Europe, to defend the fundamental right of our peoples, of the peoples everywhere to life, to freedom and peace!

It is our conviction that by taking energetic action in close cooperation and unity we can bar the road to war! It is in our people's power to halt the dangerous course of the international life, to ensure the resumption and continuation of the policy of detente and collaboration, to halt the arms race and pass to disarmament, to nuclear disarmament in particular.

The Grand National Assembly of the Socialist Republic of Romania welcomes the proposals and initiatives of other European states meant to prevent the further deterioration of the political life on the continent, speed up the process of disarmament, nuclear disarmament first and foremost, and considers that the activity carried on by governments and parliaments to play a major role in the attainment of this target, in the strengthening of peace, security and collaboration on the continent.

As for the Socialist Republic of Romania, the Grand National Assembly declares that she is ready to support and take part in any constructive action toward that target and authorizes the Romanian Government to take all necessary steps so as to enhance its contribution to the general efforts for disarmament, detente and peace on the continent, to the success of the negotiations on halting the development and siting of medium-range missiles and their liquidation, to the achievement of a peaceful and united Europe.

Let us do everything possible to ensure the observance of the European peoples' right to free development along the path of progress, collaboration and peace, to halt the arms race, achieve general disarmament, nuclear disarmament in the first place, strengthen security and collaboration on the continent, build a better and more just world on our planet!

SPEECH BY PRESIDENT NICOLAE CEAUSESCU

Dear Comrades,

I would like to thank the Grand National Assembly for the Decision made and for having entrusted me with addressing to the leaders of the Soviet Union and the United States of America, the leaders of the other states participant in the Helsinki Conference on Security, with a view to taking joint action for seeking out the best solutions for the halting of the emplacement of new nuclear missiles, the withdrawal of the existing ones, the building of a Europe without nuclear weapons.

The Appeal which the Grand National Assembly addressed today to the peoples, parliaments and governments of Europe, of the United States and Canada fits within the consistent activity of the Grand National Assembly, of the Romanian people for strengthening the solidarity and collaboration with all European peoples, with all peoples of the world in the struggle for disarmament, first of all for nuclear disarmament, for a world of understanding and peace.

I wish to assure you, comrades, that I will fulfill under the best of conditions the commissioning and I will be up to the confidence bestowed by the Grand National Assembly, up to the confidence of the people, answering our people's aspirations after doing everything possible so that our nation may live in peace and build the socialist and communist society, that all European nations, the whole world may live in peace and collaboration.

I wish to reaffirm on this occasion, too, what I have declared at the Plenary Meeting of the Party's Central Committee, namely that in the current international situation, there is no other problem more important than to halt the arms race, the policy of tension, to do everything possible for a passage to disarmament, for a Europe free of nuclear weapons, for a world of peace and equal collaboration among all nations.

We know that the struggle the European peoples are waging today, and in which our people actively participates, the struggle of the peoples of the world is not an easy one. There are many difficulties to cope with. Many weapons have been accumulated, and a lot of mistrust, too.

But it is a just struggle and it will triumph! The power is in the peoples' hands and we are fully convinced that, by acting united, the peoples will curb the policy which may lead to the destruction of mankind, will impose the peace, will afford the nations the possibility to ensure their progress, welfare and happiness.

I wish to express my confidence that the Appeal of the Grand National Assembly, the Decision of the Grand National Assembly, the letters to be addressed to the heads of the European states will find response with the heads of state, with governments, parliaments, with the European peoples, that they will be taken as an expression of our people's wish to see the necessary understandings reached for the life and existence of our continent and of the world, that the heads of state — and first of all the heads of state of the Soviet Union and of the United States, will act so as to meet the expectation of mankind which wishes that these two big powers which hold the atomic weapons should never use them for military purposes, that they should give up the nuclear weapons and the atom should only be used for peaceful purposes, for science, culture, for a better life.

I thank you once more for your confidence and for the Decision we have adopted and I consider, that, in full unity, the Grand National Assembly, our entire people, under the leadership of the Party must do everything possible in order to contribute to peace, disarmament, to a better life!
