

At the time of your call to reduce the quantities, we were about one-half completed, and all of the custom boxes were "past the point of no return".

We will be shipping the reduced quantities that you requested; however, we will complete the original quantities and place them in stock for call-outs that must be completed in six months.





Established in 1945 as a memorial to Lt. Sanderson Sloane, killed in action during World War II.

First service at the Cathedral was held on August 26, 1945.

In 1946 Cathedral of the Pines, with adjoining land and buildings, was placed in Trust for the benefit of all the public.

In 1957, Congress of the United States unanimously voted to recognize Altar of the Nation as a memorial to All American war dead.

On August 26, 1965, the most truly ecumenical service ever held anywhere at any time was held in Cathedral of the Pines. Twenty-eight representatives of all national origins and 18 major faiths participated in one service at the Altar of the Nation.

In 1967, the Memorial Bell Tower was dedicated as the only National memorial for all American women who sacrificed their lives for their country.

More than fifty different faiths, those of all differing origins, have conducted services at the Cathedral in their own accustomed manner. Approximately 100 churches and organizations hold services here each year.

Unsolicited gifts have come from governments, organizations and individuals of over 100 countries including stones for the Altar of the Nation from seven Presidents of the United States (Truman, Eisenhower, Kennedy, Johnson, Nixon, Ford and Carter).

No member of clergy, no religious body or other organization and no National or State government has jurisdiction (per se) at Cathedral of the Pines except at the time of holding their services.

Distinguished citizens of different faiths and origins comprise the Cathedral's Board of Incorporators.

No collections are taken at the Cathedral. Financial support is received through free-will offerings which are tax deductible.



Cathedral of the Pines came into being as a family memorial to a son lost in the service of his country during World War II. It stands on the very site he had selected for his future home.

This simple act — the opening of a way into a hilltop setting where tall pines form the nave of a natural cathedral — was intended to give some fulfillment to a life made short before its native gifts could find expression.

The larger family of men of all nations took this simple memorial to its war-bruised spirit and made it a monument to all who have made the supreme sacrifice.

To the millions of people from all over the world who have visited here,



Cathedral of the Pines is a special place where each has been able to worship or meditate in his own way, according to his own beliefs. Along with others who, over the past three decades have sought the quiet solace of this natural sanctuary, a visit to the Cathedral has been a spiritually uplifting experience, one best described as truly personal and so compelling as to repeat it time and time again.

The cause of individual, ecumenical worship and meditation in an atmosphere which is God-made and God-given unveils the true meaning of the Cathedral's role as a Living Memorial to human sacrifice, "dedicated to Almighty God as a place of worship for all people".



We had great feelings of joy when we heard the good news that HRH Prince Charles and Lady Diana Spencer have announced their engagement. Although I have not had the pleasure of meeting Lady Diana, I know Prince Charles well and have had the privilege of meeting other members of the Royal Family over the years. We also have been fortunate to design sculptures for some of the Royal Family's commemorative events. We were honored by a visit of Prince Charles to our Malvern Studio in England (as depicted by the enclosed).

We are proud that we are the only Americans that have a porcelain studio in England and recently celebrated our tenth anniversary at Malvern with our 250 artists and craftsmen.

In anticipation of the marriage announcement, we have been designing a meaningful porcelain floral centerpiece which will symbolize and celebrate the wedding. It is a composition of white and red roses (the Prince Charles red and the Lady Diana white) intertwined.

I am enclosing a very rough sketch of the beautiful centerpiece which will measure approximately 27" long, 12" high and about 12" in diameter. No one has seen sketches of this or knows about the actual design. We are hoping that you will accept this, with our compliments, as your wedding gift to His Royal Highness, the Prince of Wales, and Lady Diana.

If this is of interest to you, we could deliver the sculpture to the American Embassy properly packed, with detailed instructions for its unpacking; and we could wrap it either in red, white and blue to represent our flag or in white. We will look forward to hearing from you.

Thank you for your consideration. We wish you both continued good health and good wishes as "keepers" of our great country.
