

Dear Senator Dole,

This is in regards to two glass art objects made by Mr. Mitsugi Ohno, Kansas State University's glass blower (photos enclosed) whom you met during one of your visits to Manhattan. Mr. Ohno has asked me to be his spokesman in this matter and he wants to work with you because he trusts you and respects your judgement.

To refresh your memory - he made the U.S.S. Constitution "Old Ironsides" and gave it to Mrs. Eisenhower. He gave former President Nixon a glass model of Independence Hall and he gave the United States his glass model of the U.S. Capitol Building for its two hundredth birthday. It is on display at the Smithsonion Institution.

He would like to present the model of the White House to President Reagan but we have been told there is no room for it at the White House. That is a standing offer if the situation should change.

The second work of art is the Himeji Temple in Japan where the Samurai warriors trained. It was featured on the T.V. miniseries - Shogun.

In the normal course of events when the President of one country visits another there is an exchange of gifts. In all probability either President Reagan will visit Japan during his presidency or the Japanese Premier will visit the United States.

Mr. Ohno would like to offer the Himeji Temple to the President for such a gift. It would be unique, as there is nothing in the world to match it. It is very well done, it is readily recognizable by all Japanese citizens, it was made by one of their people who is now a U.S. citizen, and it would not cost the government any funds.

It would seem to be an excellent gift - from the people of the United States to the people of Japan.
