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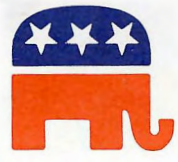

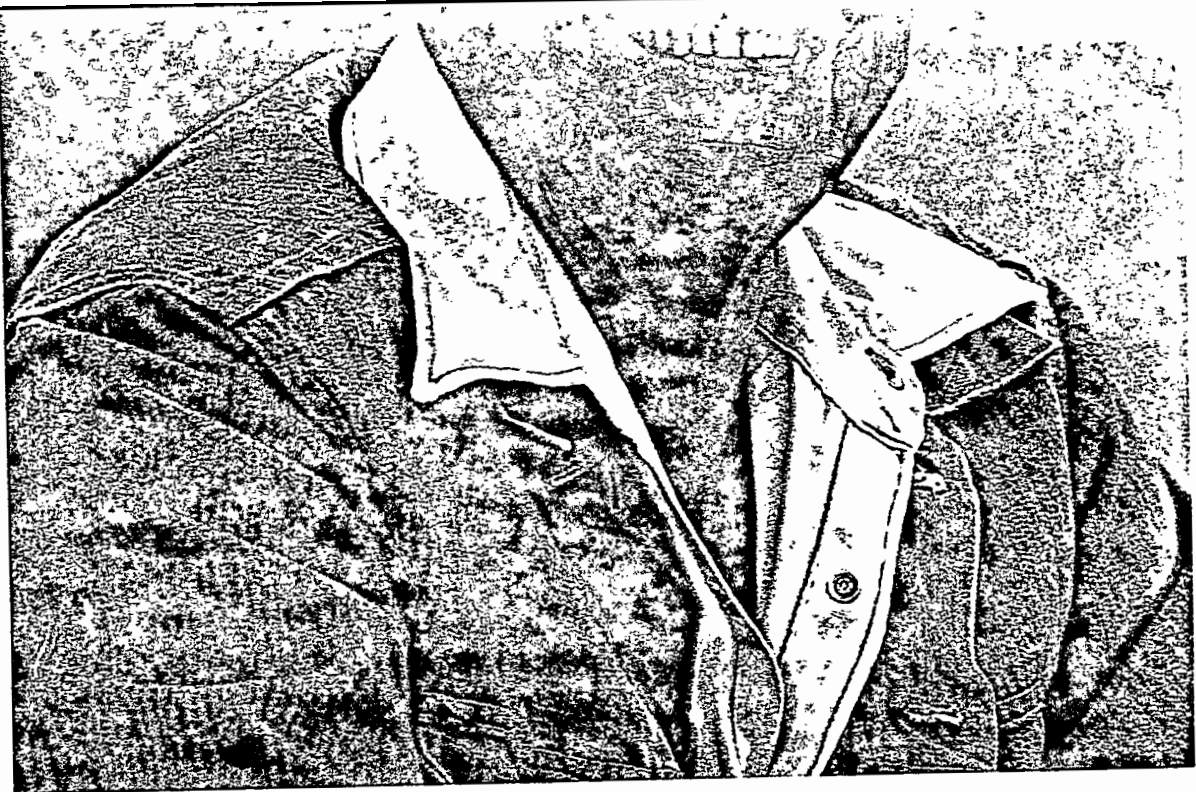

Sacrificing Animals

Each week "The Sounding Board" discusses a topic of current local, state, national or international interest and reader response on that topic is encouraged. This week's topic: Animals in lab experiments.

A veterinarian touched a sensitive and controversial topic last week when he defended and promoted the use of animals as subjects for scientific research in laboratories.

Dr. Peter J. Hand, who heads the anatomy department at the University of Pennsylvania's School of Veterinary Medicine, told an audience at Stockton State College that while animals have moral worth, there is, I think, justification for their use in research to advance our knowledge."

The use of animals in lab experiments is a primary target of anti-vivisection groups, especially when animals are used in experiments which inflict pain and suffering.

Dr. Hand, for example, using rats to determine how acupuncture blocks pain. Since the experiments concentrate on how pain is relayed through the animal's nervous system, no anesthesia can be used.

Dr. Hand acknowledges the validity of those arguments raised by animal lovers and those organ-

izations devoted to the protection of animal rights, but he insists that if animals aren't used in research, more people will die.

He also points to the millions of animals slaughtered each year for food as examples of "exploitation" which goes unnoticed by humane societies.

He said that in 1982 there were 128 million cattle and sheep killed plus millions of game fish. He said the number of animals used in lab research that same year (not counting rats and mice) was only 1.2 million which was small in comparison to the number killed for food.

How about you? How do you feel about the use of animals in laboratory experiments?

Do you agree that human needs should come first?

Or do you believe that animals should have moral and legal rights to protect them from being subjected to cruel and painful lab experiments?

The auditors finally settled on a figure of 317.

AID's auditors found that financial information from the Salvadoran banks that handled U.S. funds was "questionable," and that their accounting procedures were seriously flawed. As far as they could determine, the Salvadoran Agricultural Development Bank had used \$1.4 million of AID funds for "unauthorized purposes," and must repay it.

They also found that El Salvador had used \$2 million to compensate previous owners of expropriated land, despite an explicit ban on such use of aid funds by Congress.

Last month I reported on a secret bank account controlled

unhappy with my report. He spoke with his ambassador in Washington, Ernesto Rivas-Gallont, seven times on the day following its publication.

"The president has authorized me to state unequivocally that he has never been, nor would he ever be, part of any system or tradition of corruption," the ambassador wrote.

The ambassador confirmed the existence of the secret account, but said no U.S. funds were involved, and denied it was a political slush fund. It is, he said, "a classified military disbursements account ... used by the commander-in-chief of our armed forces for classified military and security related purposes."

In other words, the Salvadoran commander-in-chief, President Magana, is taking cover behind a cloak of "national security."
